The Bureau has by its timely interesting photographic and pictorial efforts done a great deal to acquaint people at large with the feature of prominent personages and has been instrumental in elucidating the pictorial history of the times. In this effort they are unique in South India and I wish their enterprise all success.

The tenth anniversary of the Press Photo Bureau, Madras, which was celebrated on the 10th of October 1927, marks an important stage in the history of Pictorial Journalism in South India. The value of illustrations in Newspapers has now come to be recognised, and the Press Photo Bureau might justly claim a share in bringing about this recognition. The chronicling in pictures of important events and occurrences of passing interest, from day to day, has suggested to the Bureau the idea of bringing out a Pictorial History of last year, which could serve the twofold purpose of a permanent record of events and of their review at a glance. The Bureau believes that a publication of this kind has an educative value.

1927 was, in many respects, an eventful year for South India. A few of the events which might be regarded as landmarks of the year might be mentioned. This Presidency was visited by many distinguished personages in the year that has gone by. H. E. The Vicerov fulfilled the long looked-for engagement of his visit to Mysore, the Premier Indian State in this Presidency, an event that created considerable public interest at the time. His Excellency availed himself of this opportunity to spend a few days among the picturesque mountain sceneries of Ootacamund, and to acquaint himself with the work of the important Government Institutions in the district of Coimbatore which is the gate-way to Nilgiri Hills. Another distinguished personage to honour the Presidency with his visit was His Excellency Sir William Birdwood, the Commanderin-Chief, who after visiting the States of Cochin and Travancore proceeded to Cape Comorin and passed via Trichinopoly and Madras to his head-quarters at Simla. The tour of Mahathma Ghandi in this part of the country, soon after his recovery from his illness, was an event of no small importance. The acclamation with which he was greeted at every place visited by him, in spite of his voluntary retirement from politics. demonstrated the hold he continues to have over the people. Madras was visited also by many members of British Parliament in the latter part of the year. The outstanding event of the year was the 42nd Session of the Indian National Congress held in this city in the last week of December. Along with the Congress were held the various national conferences. These attracted a phenomenal number of visitors from all parts of India. and from every nook and corner of this Presidency. The representations of important functions in connection with them find a place in this book. Madras might also point with pride to the successful All-India Indusirial Exhibition, which was opened during the Congress week.

Turning to the affairs of the Presidency, the pictorial account of the tours of His Excellency Lord Goschen, in connection with an important South Indian Railway Extension, and with many public functions find a prominent place. The bright side of a picture has also its counterpart. The Neil Statue Sathiagraha, and the vandalism which it provoked, resulting in the defacing of the V. Krishnaswamy Iyer Statue at the Senate House compound, at Chepauk deserve mention. The devastation caused by the cyclone, which passed over Nellore and the adjacent tracts, was of considerable dimensions. The advance of material civilization had its due share of toll, and the many gruesome motor accidents in the City are pictorially presented in these pages.

The year was eventful also in the case of some of the Indian States in this Presidency. Mysore had the honour of entertaining His Britanic Majesty's highest representative in India. The Silver Jublice of the Ruler of Mysore, a spontaneous and enthusiastic celebration by his grateful subjects, while demonstrating, the esteem and love in which the Prince is held by his people, promises to bring into existence, lasting and beneficent institutions in commemoration of the event. Travancore, under the reign of Her Highness the Senoir Maharani Regent, assisted by her able and devoted Dewan, took rapid strides in almost every branch of its administration. The State had also the honour of welcoming a distinguised guest, the Head of His Majesty's forces in India. The young Maharaja who recently in company with his mother, Her Highness the Junior Maharani went on a educative tour visiting important places, was at the end of December at Madras, and left an excellent imperssion on all the prominent men His Highness met. The State of Cochin made appreciable progress with its Harbour scheme and under the guidance of His Highness the Maharaja and His Highness's able consort maintained the even tenour of its administration. Pudukotah, with its model system of administration, had some important questions to face, which formed the subject of some agitation among its subjects.

All these events, thus briefly referred to, are represented in pictorial form in the pages of this book, which, the editor hopes, will meet with favourable reception at the hands of the public.



























SIR ANNAMALAI CHETTIAR'S EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATIONS, CHIDAMBARAM.

Chidambaram, the City of the Immortal Dance, is one of the famous places of pilgrimage in Southern India. It is held in great veneration by the Hindu Public in general and by the members of the enterprising Nattukottai Chetty Community in particular. It owes a great deal to the munificence and large-hearted generosity of the Hon. Dewan Bahadur Sir S. R. M. Annamalai Chettiar, a very distinguished member of the community and well known for his liberal support of all good causes. Meeting with some opposition in his endeavours to raise the status of the Madura College at Madura and expand its scope of usefulness and

feeling the absence of facilities for higher education over a wide area between Madras and Kumbakonam, he chose Chidambaram for the exercise of his princely generosity and has made Chidambaram a great educational centre, providing instruction both on the modern and Oriental sides of education. With this end in view, he founded the Sri Minakshi College on a spacious site on the outskirts of Chidambaram. The site selected is one made holy by tradition and by its association with the Tapas of Arjuna for obtaining the valued Pasupatastram from God Paramasiva and lies just to the east of Chidambaram.

On the 24th of June 1920 Mr. Littlehailes, the Director of Public Instruction, Madras, opened Sir Annamalai Chettiar's Sri Minakshi College at Chidambaram In 1922 the College was affiliated in B.A. Pass Courses and liberally endowed by its Patron. As early as 1921 the need for an extensive site outside the town had been felt, and towards the eventual removal of the College to its present habitation, a spacious site of about 200 acres was bought in Tiruvetkalam, sacred to the memory of great Saivite saints and philosophers, and building was started. A storied building of 250 feet by 50 feet on each of its floors was commenced in 1921, and made ready for occupation in 1923.

The Arts Block has eight large halls and four small rooms and cost about a lakh and three quarters. The College was moved to these new buildings in July 1923. Then the need for residence for students was felt by the Management. Temporary structures to house about 150 students were put up under the shade of a grove in the College premises, and quarters for a Warden were also provided.

By 1924 the College had risen to a noble pile of buildings with its Arts Block, its dining halls and its residential rooms. The need for more room for students was next met by the construction of permanent residential blocks, constructed at a cost of over three lakhs of rupees.

In 1924 the College took a further step in its onward march obtained affiliation and started instruction in the Science group of the

Intermediate Course. A portion of the Arts Block was temporarily fitted as Chemistry and Physics Laboratories, and in the same year a Science Block on a more generous scale than even the Arts Block was begun. Spacious well equiped Iaboratories were provided at a cost of Rupees 3.80,000 during 1924 and 1925.

By July, 1926, the Science Block was almost ready for occupation and it was formally opened on the 15th October, 1926, by His Excellency Lord Goschen, the Governor of Madras. Affiliation for Physics and Chemistry of the B. A. Pass Course, as also for the History, Economics and English Courses of the Honours Standard, was obtained. The College has now grown to 600 strong, with residential accommodation for 400 students divided into six sections for purposes of boarding.

To provide Physical Recreation for the students, the sandy open spaces round the College are being made into playing fields for English and Indian games. Football, Hockey, Tennis and Badminton have now been provided for.

Students' Unions attached to the College are doing excellent work.


The College Library and Reading Room have been furnished with great care and at great cost. The Library now consists of more than

10,000 volumes at a cost of nearly Rs. 50,000—affording facilities for study in English Literature, Indian History and other directions. The Reading Room is well provided with Journals, Indian and Non Indian, and well used by the staff and students.

Spacious quarters for a Warden and three Deputy Wardens at a cost of about Rs. 60,000 are in course of construction and will be ready for occupation by the beginning of the next academic year.

The total cost on buildings, laboratory, equipment, hostels, wardens' quarters, playing fields, the purchase and preparation of the site, and the laying out of roads has been about thirteen lakhs, excluding the endowment of twenty lakhs of rupees.

Thus Sir Annamalai Chettiar has been instrumental in providing for Chidambaram and the University of Madras a first class Honours Residential College

This, the first residential College, attracts students from all over the Presidency; the Andhra section and the Malayalee section may be instanced as proofs of the widespread fame of the Institution. It seems more than likely that eventually this institution will, in itself, become a University of the Unitary type. Educational opinion, both official and non-official, appears to regard this as a natural development. The Director of Public Instruction, the Ministers in charge of the portfolio of education in the Government of Madras, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Madras, and very many prominent gentlemen who can speak with authority on matters educational have all, so expressed themselves.

In the short space of three years a number of sister institutions have risen under the same guidance and financial backing.




