He had a large well-furnished house, and received with a hearty welcome as his guests all who chose to come to it. He had a cellar or godown's as it is there styled, full of the choicest liquors, and amongst the rest, pipes of Madeira of various agés, slung by ropes from the roof, to which he decreed an "Europe voyage" as he called it every time the door was opened, by making a servant swing them about for some minutes. His wine was never fined, and seldom bottled, but drawn for immediate use. He was a man of few words, and directed his servants by snapping his fingers, or by whistling. A native of Sawey, or Portugal, of a diminutive form being under the middle size, with a visage more resembling a baboon than the human species, and manners the most uncouth and outré, Colonel Martina was still the father of his corps, and the kind friend of all his little community; and to sum up his character in a few words, was generally known, much beloved, and wanted only the outward forms of religion to be universally respected and esteemed."

late Colonel du Perron of the Regiment of Pondicherry. Her first husband's father was the well known Eyles Irwin (1751—1817) who married Honor Brooke. was dismissed from the Service in consequence of the part he played in derouncing the deposition of Governor Pigot but returned to Madras with Lord Macartney, whom he afterwards accompanied on the embassy to China. He was one of the first to take the overland route. He wrote two volumes of travels and innumerable books of poetry of the age, and was a friend of Hayley. His parents were James Irwin, H. E. I. C. S. of Hazelegh and Sarah Boale, daughter of Mary Beale "from St. Helena," baptized at Calcutta Feb. 28th 1728 and buried at St-Helena 8th Septr. 1792. Sarah Beale married 3 times, (1) Captain Henry Palmer, of the family of Lord Selborne, a private merchant, who died in 1743; (2) James Irwin, who died 20th June 1752; and (3) Rev. Robert Mapletoft, chaplain of Fort William 1750-77, one of the most interesting persons in the ecclesiastical history of Bengal. Mapletoft's portrait hangs in the vestry room of St. John's Church, Calcutta. He went through the siege by Surajah-ud-Dowlah, only to die at Fulta of his sufferings. He and his wife are honorably mentioned by Holwell Mr. Hyde informs us that Mrs. Mapletoft "upheld the cause of the pretender to her latest days and used, so tradition says, to fling a pinch of snuff over her shoulder in contempt of the Hanoverians, when King George was prayed for in Church."

9th March 1819 ELLIS, FRANCIS WHATE HENRY MILLER, Lieut and Adjutant HENRY MILLER of the 4th N. V. Ba., who served the Honorable Company 28 years. He was a sincere Christian and an affectionate husband whom it pleased God to call away at the age of 48 on the 25th April in the year of our Lord 1817. This tribute of affection is erected by his disconsolate and affectionate wife Ann Miller.

FRANCIS WHYTE ELLIS Esquire of the Madras Civil Service, whose valuable life was suddenly terminated by a fatal accident at this place, on the 9th March 1819 in the 41st year of his age. Uniting activity of mind with versatility of genius, he displayed the same ardour and happy sufficiency on whatever his varied talents were employed. Conversant with the Hindu Languages and Literature of the Peninsula, he was loved and esteemed by the Natives of India with whom he associated intimately, and his kind and playful disposition endeared him to his own countrymen among whom he was distinguished no less by his capacity as a public servant than by a mind fraught with intelligence and information & alive to every object of interest or utility. The College of Fort Saint George which owes its existence to him is a lasting memorial of his reputation as an oriental scholar, and this stone has been erected as a tribute of the affectionate regard of his European and Native friends. (The monument is of marble.)

Note.—On the other side of this monument is an inscription in Tamil, a translation of which follows:—Sacred to the memory of him called ELILIS who entered into his rest, to the deep sorrow of the Goddess of Earth, on the 9th March 1819 a. b. (174 to f the Salivafiana Bra) at Muhavai, otherwise called Rammad, during one of his tours

from Madras to the Districts of the South. He was doesply learned in the Buglish language, that language which spreads like a creeper penetrating into every nook and corner of the world. In his profound learning, he shone like a sun, wherever he went, dispelling the darkness of ignorance. He was well versul not only in the 3 kinds of Tamil, but also in Sanserit. His Tamil was as were as fresh Ambroist, he translated into English all that bore upon litigation and morals in the Code of Mann. He wrote a wenderful version in English on the lat part of the sacred Kural of Tiruvalluvar which treats of virtue. Again, he translated into English in criptions on stones and copper plates reciting the mutual dutties of Kings and of their subjects. He caused 37 wells and tanks to be dug that people might be benefit-ted.

Sir Walter Elliet in presenting to the library of the India office a valuable Tamil manuscript, the Tembersani of Beach, obtained by Mr. Blilis, gives the following account of him in the pages of the Athenaum. "For upwards of twenty years he devoted all his spare time to the cultivation of Sapserit and the various dialects peculiar, to Southern India. Having determined to publish nothing until he had exhausted every available source of information, he had anseed a vast amount of material, the elaboration of which would have shed a food of light on the still obscure history of that region, and likewise anticipated much of the knowledge of its philology and literature which recent ve-
