Nehru Memorial Museum and Library

In 1968, the Nehru Memorial Library started a project for microfilming old Indian newspapers both in English and regional languages. The main object of this undertaking was to augment research resources of the Library and make available to scholars scarce newspaper material, not ordinarily found in Indian libraries. It was also felt that microfilming of newspapers would help to preserve many of the back files of newspapers which were rapidly deteriorating and would have been lost in a few years. Microfilming was also intended to enable libraries and centres of Indian studies in our own country and abroad to acquire copies of these valuable research materials.

The project had a modest beginning, but it has continued to be developed systematically. During the past nineteen years 393 titles have been microfilmed. The microfilms include several national and regional papers in English. Among the Indian language newspapers microfilmed so far are those in Hindi, Urdu, Malayalam, Marathi, Punjabi, Gujarati, Tamil, Telugu, Bengali, Kannada and Assamese.

The project is a continuing one and new titles are being added with the object of establishing a collection representative of different regions of India. Although the selection of titles for the project is primarily based on the needs of the Nehru Memorial Library, suggestions for inclusion of new titles from individual scholars and research institutions are welcome. Often the priorities of the Library are the same as the requirements of scholars and institutions interested in South Asian Studies.

The microfilm copies prepared by the Library have certain gaps owing to lacuna in the files available for filming. These

gaps are being filled as far as possible. Microfilming of a number of newspapers, such as The Amrita Bazar Patrika, Hindustan, The Hindustan Times, The Tribune, The Mail will continue until their entire files are filmed.

Library now holds 35 mm negative microfilm in roll format of the titles listed in this catalogue, except *The Modern Review* which is on microfiche. The newspapers and periodicals are mostly in English. The language of non-English newspapers is indicated.

Silver positive microfilm copies can be supplied to order to individual scholars, libraries and research institutions for purpose of reference and study. The length of film in each set is given at the end of the entry. The current price is Rs. 10 a metre, for institutions/individuals in India. For overseas institutions/individuals the price for a roll is £ 30 if a negative exists and £ 75 if no negative exists. There is a minimum charge of Rs. 50 or £5 for any single item. These rates are exclusive of the cost of spool (Rs. 10/-each) and the charges for packing and mailing. For microfiche rates are Rs. 30 a microfiche for institutions/individuals in India and £15 for overseas institutions/individuals.

Microfilms of copyright material can only be supplied by permission of the copyright holder.
