Introduction

The Motion Picture Industry is to-day passing through a crisis. The war and its concomitant horrors are chiefly responsible for the present depression in the trade of entertainments. But there is a silver lining in the cloud. The present international situation has brought nearer home the unique importance of film. War news pictures and war effort propaganda films are evoking such keen interest even among the powers-that-be who might not have been hitherto ordinarily convinced of the efficacy of Cinema. It can therefore be stated that the film as a medium of propaganda and instruction, has now established itself securely and well in the life of a nation.

But about the crisis ! The cost of production has gone up, the area of exploitation restricted and the returns at the box office have gone down to an extent that it is becoming extremely difficult for business people to maintain a standard in picture making which they would like to keep.

In our country in particular, things are even worse. The adverse effects of the war have fallen

on the industry with such heaviness that several film companies have been obliged to close their doors once for all and others are merely struggling to make both ends meet.

It, therefore behoves everybody interested in cinema to pay some thought as how best to rescue it from the grip of depression and put it on the right royal road of progress during the year of grace 1941.

In this little volume, we have tried to give "what is what" and "who is who" in films, with special reference to the conditions in South India. We trust the information may help the business man to study aright the situation with a view to solving the problems of films.

SOME FACTS AND FIGURES

Motion Picture industry in India is one of the major industries.

The estimated capital invested in the trade is Rs. 14 crores.

There are about 50 film producing studios and 150 producing units.

There are about 1,200 cinema theatres.

On the average, about 250 feature films and 100 shorts are being produced per annum.

Nine million feet of exposed foreign film is being imported into the country.

Roughly 40 000 people are employed directly or indirectly in the industry in India.

The average weekly attendance at cine theatres in India comes to 3 million people.

The production of an average talkie in India varies from 75 thousands to one lakh of rupees.

The average studio hire for one production comes to 10 to 14 thousands of rupees.

Some Facts and Figures

The average cost of raw film per Picture with copies (sound, picture negative and positive) comes to Rs. 15 to 25 thousands of rupees.

The average length of Hindi picture is 10 to 16 thousand feet.

The average length of a South Indian picture is 15 to 20 thousand feet.

On the average Rs. 15 lakhs, per annum is being paid up by film companies in India to the Railways on account of transit of films etc.

Out of their gross earnings, film companies in India, pay 25% towards the various taxes and fees— Provincial, All-India, municipal etc. etc.

Motion Picture Inventions—Important Dates

The following inventions and years are to be noted to appreciate the growth of Cinematography :

In 1873—Discovery of Solenium as a light sensitive material by Willoughby Smith.

1876—Invention of Telephone by Bell.

1877—Thomas Alvo Edison's invention of the Phonograph.

1894—Edison's Kinephone - combination of the Phonograph and the Kinetoscope.

May 1895—Cinematograph film was developed by Lumiere brothers—Auguste and Louis—in Lyons. "The Charge of the Dragoons" was the first picture shown.

1900—First demonstration of motion picture held in Paris.

1901—Ernest Rhumer's experiments with the talking Arch and the Selenium cell in the transmission of long distance sound.

1906—Eugene Lourtez's first recording of sound and picture on the same film.

1906—De Forest's Radio valve amplifier called Audion.

1908—The First processing machine came to be manufactured by an English studio.

1910—The first newsreel was produced—Funeral procession of King Edward VII.

1913—Elias Ries gets patents for recording sound on film by the singing arc method.

1921—Joseg Engl of Berlin gets patents for sound recording and reproducing from the film.

1923—Theodore Case and William put into the market their Movietone Sound-on-Film Recording by the Glow Discharge Lamp.

1925—First full length talkie pictures, "Jazz Singer" and "The Singing Fool" starring Al Jolson. They were Warner Brothers' pictures,

1926—Warner Brothers and Western Electric Company produce pictures by means of the Vitaphone Sound-on-Disc method of recording. These pictures are synchronised as a commercial possibility.

Sep. 1927—Mickey Mouse emerged from the fertile imagination of his creator, Walt Disney—the first sound cartoon "The Orphy House".

1928—Sound motion picture production started in all the important studios with the Western Electric, R.C.A. and Glow Lamp methods of sound recording.

Last week of Oct. 1934—First Radio Film: Film audiences saw for the first time a picture (of Melbourne Air Race) transmitted by "beam" wireless from Australia to England and re-printed on standard film as part of seven second "News Reel."

1936—Television picture shown.

Dec. 8, 1937—The B.B.C. television programme from Alexandra Palace was shown to-day on a large screen at a Cinema theatre in Brookly Kent.

1907—Mr. J.F. Madon of Calcutta imported a film for exhibition.

1911—Shooting of "King's Durbar" topical production at Delhi.

1913—Production of first Indian picture "King Harischandra" by Mr. D. G. Phalke.

1917—Production of first picture "Keechakavadha" in South India by Mr. R. Nataraja Mudaliar.

1926—London premiere of "Light of Asia" Indian silent picture patronised by the distinguished personages in England.

1927—Appointment of Indian Cinematograph Committee. President: Dewan Bahadur T. Rangachari, C.I.E.

1929—First talkie house in India *viz:* Elphinstone Picture Palace. Calcutta—First talkie shown: "Melody of Love".

14th March 1931—Production of first Indian Talkie "Alam Ara" (Hindi) by Mr. Ardeshir Irani of Imperial Film Company.

1933—Production of First Indian Talkie in English language *viz.* "Karma" for 'international market. Producer: Mr. Himansurai.

July 1934—First Talkie produced in South India *viz.*, "Srinivasa Kalyanam" (Tamil) by Mr. A. Narayanan.

1935 Feb, 21—First All India Motion Picture Convention at Bombay. President: Mr. B.V. Jadhav.

1936 Dec. 19—First Madras Provincial Film Conference. President: Mr. G. Ramaseshan.

1936—Dec. 26—Second All India Motion Picture Convention at Madras. President: Seth Chimaniyal B. Desai.

1938—Jan. 8 First full length colour picture produced and exhibited at Majestic, Bombay by Khan Bahadur Ardeshir Irani of Imperial Film Co. "Kisan Kanya" is the name of the Picture.

1939—April 20: Foundation of the South Indian Film Chamber of Commerce, Madras.

1939—May—Celebration of the Silver Jubilee of the Motion Picture industry in India.

1939—Sep. 1. War broke out between England and Germany and the Motion Picture trade has been thereby affected.

1940 : Dec: Production of "Raja-Nartaki", first English Picture to be produced by Indian Studio in India *i.e.* Wadia Movietone Bombay.

CINEMATIC TERMS.

Back drop : Usually a painted curtain used as a back ground for a scene.

Back-ground music : Music which is more felt than heard in the course of a picture show. It is meant to enhance the effect of different sequences.

Back lighting : Illumination on the back side of the character which is being photographed.

Campaign book or exploitation : Publicity book describing every aspect of a particular production. It is meant for the exclusive use and guidance of the distributor and theatre manager.

Camera angle : It's the view point from which a scene is taken. Ordinarily, angle is counted as being four feet six inches above ground level.

Censor : Member of Government body in India who passes pictures as fit for exhibition. Censorship fee in Madras is Rs. 5 per every thousand feet of picture censored.

Close-up : A detailed photograph of a character or object taken at close range.

Commentator : The name of the person whose voice is heard (face not seen) commenting or explaining short pictures. Normally a silent picture is taken and voice is "dubbed" on to it later.

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Composite shot : It's either several shots taken on the same strip of negative film or one scene taken through a prism.

Continuity : The gradual development of one situation to another, so as to be of guidance to the audience.

Cutting : Changing direct from one visual image on the screen to another in immediate succession. It is meant for creating psychological effects. It consists in joining of one strip of film to another, being a different photographic image.

Cut back : Repetition of a scence or any part of a scene flashed on the screen.

Director : The creater of a picture. The chief organiser who is in complete control and charge of the production of a film.

Distributor : An agent who is the medium between producer and exhibitor. He is responsible for pushing the picture into the market.

Dissolve : it's the transition from one visual image to another. The first image slowly disappears and the second image appears in its place.

Dolly : A moving trolley with rubber tired wheels, on which the camera will be put for taking pictures from varying ranges.

Double Exposure : The combination of two separately photographed parts in one scene.

Dubbing : A method of synchronising the voice to the film.

Dummy : A figure manufactured to be used as a substitute for real actors, while "shooting" scenes involving risk to life.

Echometer : A device used to discover the source of film sounds which are to be eliminated.

Editing : Complete building up of the film by putting in order all the photographed parts in their appropriated sequences.

Exhibitor : One who exhibits film for public view.

Extra : A player employed temporarily in certain minor scenes.

Fade-in : The gradual appearance of an image on the screen marking the opening of a sequence.

Fade-out : The gradual disappearance of visual image on the screen.

Flash : A swift visual image on the screen, usually occupying a foot of film.

Focus : Concentration of a light on the characters or set.

Glass-shot : A photograph taken partly of a constructed set and partly of a representation of the desired effect on a sheet of glass.

Insert : Introduction of a photographed letter or matter shown to enhance the development of the plot.

Location : Site outside the studio, selected for taking particular scenes.

Long-cutting : Use of long strips of film for creating soothing or sad effect on the audience.

Long shot : A picture taken from a distant range.

Mask : A device employed for isolating a certain portion of the visual image on the screen.

Medium shot : Picture of an object or scene taken at a moderately distant range,

Mike or Microphone : Instrument for catching sounds and transmitting to sound recording apparatus.

Mixer : The process of controlling, regulating and intensifying the volume of voice in the making of a picture.

Montage : The act of assembling strips of celluloid, bearing photographic images and also of assembling material of scenario or studio.

Multi Scene : A scene taken by means of an arrangement of mirrors. It is possible to take a long scene of unending display of human splendour.

Out of Focus : A scene which is not very clear on the screen. It is due to incorrect focus of lense. Sometimes it is intentionally employed to create artistic effects.

Pan to : The horizontal and vertical movement of the camera, the actual position of the camera remaining steady, or Panoramic Camera shot.

Panchromatic stock : Film which is sensitive to larger range of light than ordinary stock.

Positive film : Film on to which negative film is printed. Positive film is projected on to the screen.

Preview : An advance showing of a picture preferably to press representatives and select few.

Producer : The person or concern bearing the financial responsibility of the production.

Prop or property : Article used in a scene.

Reel : Part of a film folded into a separate reel. Usually a reel is 1,000 ft. which takes approximately 11 minutes to run on the screen,

Rushes : The day's " takes " of a film projected inside the theatre of a studio for the examination by the director.

Scenario plan : The manuscript screen version of a story, in terms of " Shots ", scenes and sequences.

It contains a detailed description of the visual images relating to sets, situations, characters, of the camera positions etc.

Sequence : A natural division of the narrative incidents into sections.

Set : A structural erection in studio or exterior, meeting the requirements of the scenario.

"Shooting" Art of taking the picture.

Short : A short picture usually a comic story or educational or topical picture.

Short-cutting : Introduction of swift flashes in rapid succession.

Soft focus : A picture having on the screen a soft effect. This is due to the employment of varying thickness of gauze or focus disc.

Splicing : Cementing together pieces of film.

Still photograph : A static photograph of an exclusive "short" of a film, either taken during production or enlarged afterwards from the film itself.

Stock Shot : Films of some stock scenes purchasable for insert in order to lend atmosphere effect to a certain situation.

Split Stage : A device used to photograph double exposure or a single player taking two roles.

Spot : Exposure of glaring light like spot-light in a stage.

Sunlight Arc : A light whose rays give out large illumination.

To Superimpose : To photograph two or more scenes on the same strip of negative.

Synchronisation : Usually dubbing of voice on the film.

Talkie : A talking picture, sound and picture waves being together projected on the screen

Telephoto lens : Camera lens having a long focus which can clearly take a close up photograph of a distant object.

Title or sub-title : A textual matter included in film, explaining the continuity of course of the narrative.

Throw : The distance between the screen and the projector in a Cinema Theatre.

Niggers : Black camera diffusers that protect the lens from too much light.

Spiders : Switches to plug lights into.

Blimps : Sound-proof coverings, made of sorbo rubber wood-which are spread over cameras to deaden the whir of machinery.

Inkies : Incandescent lights.

Gaffers : Head " Juicer " (electricians) or the men who tell their crews to take the silk off (remove the silk diffusers from a large side lamp) and " hit a sago pudding and spread across the floor " (insert a special glass screen into a lamp and spread its rays in a certain direction).

Lense-lizards : Scene stealers.

Footage-eaters : Slow movers.

Line biters : Quick speakers

Yodellers : High voiced stars.

When the director calls " cut " and the " take " is completed, the " gaffer " warns his crew to " save " them (switch off the lights) and the " Juicers " on " cat-walk " are told to " hit the deck " (come down to the floor). The cameraman puts the film " in the can " and sends it away to laboratory to be dipped in " soup ". The next day the director sees the " rushes " of the previous day's " stuff " (exposed film is " stuff " and unexposed film is " stock ") He may comment that it contains too much " grief " (footage which may as well be cut out) or the shot may be n g. (not good) in which case even a " re-take " will be necessary. If the work is satisfactory, the director murmurs " O. K. " a sigh of relief goes up and a precious reel of celluloid is stored in the " magazine ".

Reel after reel is thus added and a complete picture is produced.



SECTION II

THE CINEMATOGRAPH ACT, 1918

[Following is the digest of the Act and the Rules directly relating to cinematography in Madras Presidency :]

1. (1) This Act may be called the Cinematograph Act, 1918.
- (2) It extends to the whole of British India including British Baluchistan.
- (3) The Provincial Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette direct that the whole or any of its provisions shall come into force in any Province or part of a Province on such date as may be specified in the notification.

Definition

2. In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context :—

"Cinematograph" includes any apparatus for the representation of moving pictures or series of pictures;

"Place" includes also a house, building, tent or vessel and

"Prescribed" means prescribed by rules under this Act.

Cinematograph exhibitions to be licensed

3. Save as otherwise provided in this Act, no person shall give an exhibition by means of a cinematograph elsewhere than in a place licensed under this Act, or otherwise than in compliance with any conditions and restrictions imposed by such licence.

Licensing authority

4. The authority having power to grant licences under this Act (hereinafter referred to as the "licensing authority") shall be the District Magistrate, or in a Presidency town the Commissioner of Police;

Provided that the Provincial Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, constitute for the whole or any part of a Province such other authority as it may specify in the notification to be the licensing authority for the purposes of this Act.

Restrictions on powers of licensing authority

5. (1) The licensing authority shall not grant a licence under this Act, unless it is satisfied that—

(a) the rules made under the Act have been substantially complied with; and

(b) adequate precautions have been taken in the place in respect of which the licence is to be given to provide for the safety of persons attending exhibitions therein.

(2) A condition shall be inserted in every licence that the licensee will not exhibit, or permit to be exhibited, in such place any film other than a film which has been certi-

fied as suitable for public exhibition by [an authority constituted under section 7], and which, when exhibited, displays the prescribed mark of that authority, and has not been altered or tampered with in any way since such mark was affixed thereto.

(3) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this section, and the control of the Provincial Government the licensing authority may grant licences under this Act to such persons as it thinks fit, and on such terms and conditions, and subject to such restrictions as it may determine.

Punishment for contravention of this Act and rules made thereunder

6. (1) If the owner or person in charge of cinematograph uses the same or allows it to be used, or if the owner or occupier of any place permits that place to be used, in contravention of the provisions of this Act or the rules made thereunder, or of the conditions and restrictions upon, or subject to

which, any licence has been granted under this Act, he shall be punishable with fine which may extend to one thousand rupees and, in the case of a continuing offence, with a further fine which may extend to one hundred rupees for each day during which the offence continues, and his licence (if any) shall be liable to be revoked by the licensing authority.

(2) If any person is convicted of an offence punishable under this Act committed by him in respect of the film, the convicting court may further direct that the film shall be forfeited to His Majesty.

7. (1) Any Provincial Government may by notification in the Official Gazette, constitute as many authorities as it may think fit for the purposes of examining and certifying films as suitable for public exhibition, and declare the area (hereinafter referred to as the 'local area') within which each such authority shall exercise the powers conferred on it by this Act. Where an authority so

constituted consists of a Board of two or more persons, not more than one-half of the members thereof shall be persons in the service of the Crown.

(2) If any such authority after examination considers that a film is suitable for public exhibition, it shall grant a certificate to that effect to the person applying for the same, and shall cause the film to be marked in the prescribed manner. The certificate of any such authority shall, save as herein-after provided, be valid throughout the territories in which this Act is in force.

(3) (a) If the authority is of opinion that a film is not suitable for exhibition in the local area, it shall inform the person applying for the certificate of its decision, and such person may, within thirty days from the date of such decision, appeal for a reconsideration of the matter by the Provincial Government by which the authority was constituted.

(b) If the Provincial Government rejects the appeal it shall, by notification in the

Official Gazette, direct that the film shall be deemed to be an uncertified film in that local area, and such direction shall have effect notwithstanding the subsequent grant of a certificate in respect of the film by any other such authority.

(4) Any such authority may demand the exhibition before itself of any certified film which it has reason to believe is about to be publicly exhibited in its local area, and may by order suspend the certificate of any such film pending the orders of the Provincial Government and during such suspension the film shall be deemed to be an uncertified film in that area.

(5) The District Magistrate, or, in a Presidency town, the Commissioner of Police, may by order suspend the certificate of any film pending the orders of the Provincial Government and during such suspension the film shall be deemed to be an uncertified film in that district or town,

(6) A copy of any order of suspension made under subsection (4) or (5), together with a statement of reasons therefor, shall forthwith be forwarded by the authority or the officer making the same to the Provincial Government by which the authority was constituted or, to which the officer is subordinate as the case may be, and such Provincial Government, may, either discharge the order or, by notification in the Official Gazette, direct that the film should be deemed to be an uncertified film in the whole or any part of the Province.

(7) A Provincial Government may, of its own motion, by notification in the Official Gazette direct that a certified film shall be deemed to be an uncertified film in the whole or any part of the Province.

(8) The exhibition of a film to which any order or direction under clause (b) of sub-section (3) or sub-section (4), (5), (6) or (7) is for the time being applicable shall, in the area to which such order or direction relates,

be deemed to be a contravention of the condition mentioned in sub-section (2) of section 5.

Power to make Rules

8. (1) The Provincial Government may make rules for the purpose of carrying into effect the Provisions of this Act.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, rules under this section may provide for—

(a) the regulation of cinematograph exhibitions for securing the public safety ;

(b) the procedure of the authorities constituted for examining and certifying films as suitable for public exhibition, and all matters ancillary thereto, and the fees to be levied by those authorities ;

(bb) the appointment of officers subordinate to authorities constituted under section 7 and the regulation of the powers and duties of such officers ; and

(c) any other matter which by this Act is to be prescribed.

(4) All rules made under this Act shall be published in the Official Gazette and on such publication, shall have effect as if enacted in this Act.

Power to exempt

9. The Provincial Government may, by order in writing, exempt, subject to such conditions and restrictions as it may impose, any cinematograph exhibition or class of cinematograph exhibitions from any of the provisions of this Act or of any rule made thereunder.

PART I GENERAL.

1. These rules may be called the Madras Cinematograph Rules, 1933.

2. (1) These rules shall apply to all cinema premises in the Province of Madras

which come into existence after the date of issue of these rules.

(2) These rules, except rules 37 and 39 and sub-rules (6) to (11) of rule 45, shall apply to all cinema premises existing in the Province of Madras on the date of issue of these rules, on the expiry of a period of one year from the said date, during which period they shall continue to be governed by the rules in force on the day immediately preceding the said date.

(3) Rules 37 and 39 and sub-rules (6) to (11) of rule 45 of these rules shall apply—

(a) to all cinema premises existing in the City of Madras on the date of issue of these rules from such date as may be notified in that behalf by the Government;

(b) to all cinema premises existing on the date of issue of these rules, in any mofussil town which is specially notified in that behalf by the Government, to such extent, and from such date as may be specified in the notification.

3. In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context—

(a) 'auditorium' means the portion of the licensed place in which accommodation is provided for the public to view the cinematograph exhibition ;

(b) 'enclosure' means the portion of the licensed place in which the cinematograph apparatus is erected ;

(bb) 'Government' means the Government of Madras.

(c) 'permanent building' means a building which is constructed for permanent use with stone, mud, brick, mortar, cement or other non-inflammable material.

Explanation.—Where the floor, roof, side-walls, galleries and stair-cases of a building are made of non inflammable material, the building shall, for the purpose of these rules, be deemed to be a permanent building ; and

(d) 'temporary building' means a building which is not a permanent building.

4. No person other than a company or association shall be entitled to obtain or hold any licence under the Act unless such person has attained the age of 20 years.

5. If any question arises as to the interpretation of these rules otherwise than in connexion with a prosecution for an offence, the question shall be referred to the Government whose decision shall be final.

6. These rules, printed in large type, together with the name and address of the licensee affixed thereto, shall be kept during public entertainment always posted in some conspicuous place at the principal entrance at a height of not more than four feet from the floor so that all persons entering the licensed premises may be acquainted with them and any breach of these rules should at once be reported to the licensing authority.

7. (1) Every enclosure, cinematograph plant and electric installation shall be inspected—

(a) When first erected and thereafter at least once every year by the licensing authority or an officer deputed by him ;

(b) when first erected and thereafter annually by the Chief Electrical Inspector or an officer deputed by him ; and

(c) at every renewal of the certificate of registration in Form D by the Chief Electrical Inspector or an officer deputed by him.

For the inspection under clause (b) of the enclosure, the cinematograph plant and the electrical installation when first erected a fee of one hundred rupees shall be paid in advance by the applicant for the licence and for each subsequent annual inspection under the said clause, a fee of fifty rupees shall be paid in advance by the licensee.

(2) The licensing authority, the Chief Electrical Inspector or any officer deputed

by either in that behalf or any Magistrate having jurisdiction over the area or any police officer specially deputed to keep order in the premises may, at any time, enter and inspect the premises and plant.

8. The licensee shall comply with such of the provisions of the Indian Electricity Act, 1910, and of the rules made thereunder as are applicable to the premises. In cases where the notice referred to in section 30 of the said Act has to be given to the District Magistrate or the Commissioner of Police, no licence shall be granted until such notice has been given and the licensing authority has informed the Electrical Inspector of the decision to issue the licence.

9. (1) The Chief Electrical Inspector or any officer deputed by him, inspecting an installation under rules 7 and 12, shall, if he discovers any defect therein, issue written orders, to the owner or person in charge, for their rectification and prescribe a

reasonable time within which such orders should be carried out.

(2) If, in the interval between two such inspections, any further inspection shall, in the opinion of the Chief Electrical Inspector or the officer deputed by him, have become necessary owing to the neglect or failure of the owner or person in charge to carry out any written orders of such officer issued under subrule (1), within the time prescribed by him, a fee of fifty rupees shall be charged for such further inspection and such fee shall be paid by the licensee on demand by the Chief Electrical Inspector.

Provided that in the case of travelling cinematograph shows, the fee chargeable for any inspection shall be thirty-five rupees.

PART II—LICENCES

10. No licence shall be granted under the Act in respect of any building unless—

- (i) such building has a road frontage on the public thorough-fare upon which the site of such building abuts;
- (ii) there are suitable means of entrance and exit for the public in such frontage; and
- (iii) in addition, these are reserved for service in case of emergency, entrances and exit opening on two separate and distinct passages leading either to the said public thoroughfare or to other suitable thoroughfares and such passages are not less than five feet in width.

11. Every application to the licensing authority for a licence under section 3 of the Act shall be in writing and shall be accompanied by—

- (i) complete plans, elevations and sections in duplicate of the premises and of all erections or buildings thereon drawn correctly to a scale of one-eighth of an inch to a foot and showing the position of the electrical machinery and cinematograph apparatus and

(ii) a block plan in duplicate on a separate sheet showing the position of such premises in relation to any adjacent premises and to the public thoroughfare upon which the site of such premises abuts, drawn to a scale of not less than one-fortieth of an inch to a foot.

The cardinal points shall be marked on such drawings. All drawings shall be coloured to distinguish the material employed in the construction of buildings and erections.

The width of all staircases and the number of steps in each, the width of corridors, gangways and doorways together with the height of any galleries or tiers in such premises and in any of the erections or buildings in connexion therewith as are more than one tier in height shall be indicated on such drawings, as well as the floor and roof ventilation and the details of any intended gas or electric installation. The thickness of the walls and scantlings of the various materials used shall be clearly

shown on such drawings by figured dimensions.

12. (1) The licensing authority shall forward the application, plans and drawings and other connected papers to the Chief Electrical Inspector. The Chief Electrical Inspector or an officer deputed by him shall examine them, inspect the enclosure, the cinematograph plant and the electrical installation and if he is satisfied that a licence may issue, he shall forward to the licensing authority a certificate in Form D referred to as the Chief Electrical Inspector's certificate as to the suitability of the enclosure, the cinematograph plant and the electrical installation and shall also certify that the enclosure, the cinematograph plant and the electrical installation fulfil the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Chief Electrical Inspector's certificate shall be valid for a period of one year provided that the officer granting the certificate may for sufficient reason reduce the

period of validity of the certificate to six months or three months

13. On the receipt of such certificate, if the licensing authority is satisfied that the other requirements of these rules are fulfilled, he shall issue to the applicant a licence signing and dating it: provided that the licensing authority may, in the case of a temporary building, refuse a licence if in his opinion any portion of such building is dangerously near to any other building provided further that the licensing authority may, in the case of a permanent building, obtain a certificate from the Executive Engineer as to the structural soundness of the building, and may refuse a licence if, after obtaining such certificate, he is of opinion that the building is not structurally sound. A copy of the plants and drawings referred to in rule 11 shall be attached to the licence. The Chief Electrical Inspector's certificate, shall also be delivered to the applicant along with the licence. A duplicate

of the Chief Electrical Inspector's certificate may be granted by the Chief Electrical Inspector on payment of a fee of Rs. 3 provided that the application is submitted through the licensing authority.

14. For every licence, when granted or renewed, a fee shall be charged according to the scale laid down below :—

For an annual licence.—Rupees five for an area of 1,000 square feet or less with an additional fee of Rs. $2\frac{1}{2}$ for every 500 square feet or fraction thereof in excess of 1,000 square feet.

For a temporary licence for a period not exceeding three months for a building thatched or constructed of wood or mats or other inflammable materials or for a tent.—Rupees five for a period of three months or for a portion thereof for an area of 1,000 square feet or less with an additional fee of Rs. $2\frac{1}{2}$ for every 500 square feet or fraction thereof in excess of 1,000 square feet.

For a temporary licence for a period not exceeding three months for a building not thatched nor constructed of inflammable materials.—Rupee one for a month or for a month or a portion thereof for an area of 1,000 squarefeet or less with an additional fee of annas 8 for a month or for a portion thereof for every 500 square feet or fraction thereof in excess of 1,000 square feet.

Annual licences shall be granted only in respect of permanent buildings. The fees for temporary licences shall be leviable at half of the above rates, where the buildings or enclosures are used solely by day and without lights.

Explanation.—Where the place consists partly of a structure and partly of a mere unroofed enclosure, the fee shall be calculated on the area of the structure alone.

Duplicate of a licence may be granted on payment of a fee of Rs. 5.

14-A. (1) If, on an application for the renewal of a licence presented under rule 11, the licensing authority does not for any reason before the date of expiry of the licence, either renew and return the licence or refuse to renew the same he shall grant a temporary permit provided that Chief Electrical Inspector's certificate continues to remain valid.

(2) Such temporary permit shall be subject to the conditions of the licence sought to be renewed, and shall be valid for a period of one month from the date of the grant thereof and may be renewed by the licensing authority for further periods of one month at a time:

Provided that the temporary permit shall cease to be valid and shall be surrendered to the licensing authority on the applicant receiving the licence duly renewed or on his receiving an order refusing to renew the licence:

Provided further that the temporary permit shall be surrendered to the licensing authority on demand made at any time in that behalf.

(3) No fees shall be levied for the grant of such temporary permit.

(4) The temporary permit shall, during the period of its validity, be deemed to be a licence for the purpose of these rules.

15. No subsequent addition or alteration shall be made to premises in respect of which a licence has been granted or any part thereof, without the sanction of the licensing authority being obtained there for and the plans and drawings relating to such addition or alteration being approved by him.

16. The licensee shall give notice in writing to the licensing authority of his intention to add or alter the licensed premises or any portion thereof and such notice shall describe clearly the intended

additions or alterations and be accompanied by complete plans, elevations and sections and block plan and specifications of the work proposed to be executed, drawn up in duplicate in the manner required by rule 11. The licensing authority shall, before according sanction to the proposed addition or alteration, follow as far as may be the procedure laid down in rules 12 and 13.

17. No addition to or alteration of any part of the electric installation or of the apparatus for the production of any other illuminant in use in the lantern shall be made without the sanction of the licensing authority being obtained therefor. The licensee shall notify in writing his intention to make such addition or alteration to the licensing authority who shall communicate the notice to the Chief Electrical Inspector. The licensing authority shall not accord his sanction for the addition or alteration unless the Chief Electrical Inspector or the officer deputed by him certifies that the alteration

or addition fulfils the requirements of these rules.

18. The licence and the plan and description attached there to shall be produced on demand by any police officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector or by the licensing authority or by any person authorized by him or by the Chief Electrical Inspector or by any person authorized by him.

19. The licensee, his servants and agents shall comply with all orders issued by the Chief Electrical Inspector, the licensing authority or police officers acting on their behalf from time to time or as occasion arises, for the safety or convenience of the public or for the preservation of order or of the public peace. The licensing authority may, if special circumstances so require, impose safeguards in addition to those laid down in these rules.

PART III—ENCLOSURE.

20. The cinematograph apparatus shall be placed in an enclosure of substantial

construction, made of, or lined internally with, fire-resisting material, and of dimensions sufficient to allow the operator to work freely.

21. The enclosure shall be outside the auditorium, and where a rewinding room adjoins the enclosure, each shall have its independent exit.

22. The door of the enclosure and of any rewinding room and all openings, bushes and joints shall be so constructed and maintained as to prevent, as far as possible, the escape of any smoke into the auditorium. Ventilators shall be provided for the enclosure and for any rewinding room but the ventilation ducts shall not communicate direct with the auditorium. The area of the ventilating ducts of the enclosure shall not be less than one per cent of its floor area.

Explanation.—By 'bush' is meant packing inserted in the holes through which the pipes and cables pass in order to render such holes reasonably smoke-proof.

23. The openings in front of the enclosure shall not be larger than is necessary for effective projection and observation. No such opening shall exceed eight inches square.

24. Each opening shall be provided with a plate glass screen not less than 3/16th of an inch in thickness fixed in position with a smoke-tight joint;

Provided that for openings of less than twenty square inches the thickness of the plate glass screen shall not be less than one-eighth of an inch.

25. No unauthorized person shall be allowed to enter the enclosure.

26. Smoking shall not be permitted within the enclosure.

27. No inflammable article shall unnecessarily be taken into, or allowed to remain in, the enclosure.

28. Lanterns shall be placed on firm supports constructed of fire-resisting mate-

rial and shall be provided each with a metal shutter which can be readily inserted between the source of light and the film gate.

Where the electric pressure in the enclosure exceeds 125 volts, all metal supports of the lantern shall be connected to the earth.

29. Cinematograph projectors shall be fitted with two metal film boxes of substantial construction to and from which the films shall be caused to travel. The film boxes shall be made to close in such a manner and shall be fitted with a film slot so constructed, as to prevent the passage of flame to the interior of the box.

30. Films shall be wound upon spools in such a manner that the wound film shall not at any time reach or project beyond the edges of the flanges of the spool. The rewinding of films shall not be carried out in the enclosure while an exhibition is in progress.

31. All films, when not in use shall be kept in separate close metal boxes. The metal boxes shall be of substantial construction, the plate used being not less than .022 of an inch thickness. Each box shall have a hinged cover secured by hasp and staple. A rack shall be provided for storing the closed metal boxes without piling. Films shall not be stored in any part of a building which is at a lower level than any other part thereof used for residential purpose.

32. Cables for cinematograph lamps shall be taken as separate circuits from the supply side of the main fuses in the general lighting circuit.

33. An efficient double-pole switch shall be fitted within the enclosure in the cinematograph lamp circuit.

34. Within the enclosure the insulating material of all electric cables, including those leading to illuminating lamps, shall be covered with fire-resisting material. Where

the electric pressure exceeds 125 volts, all cables shall be enclosed in screwed metal conduits connected to the earth. Lead covered cables shall not be used unless enclosed in such conduits.

35. All resistances, with the exception of a resistance for regulating purposes, shall be placed outside the enclosure and, if reasonably practicable, outside the auditorium. If placed inside the auditorium, such resistances shall be protected by an earthed wire guard or other efficient means of preventing accidental contact.

36. (1) enclosure shall be in the charge of a competent operator who shall be not less than 18 years of age, and shall be present in the enclosure during the whole time the machine is being operated.

(2) The operator shall satisfy himself, before the commencement of each performance, that all cables, leads, connexions and resistances as also the fire extinguishing

appliances in the enclosure are in proper working order.

(3) Such number of persons as may be necessary shall be specially appointed to be in charge of the fire extinguishing appliances in the auditorium during every performance.

PART IV—BUILDING

37. All such premises shall be in communication with the nearest fire brigade station by telephone which shall be fitted in such place and manner as the licensing authority may direct. The installation and maintenance of the complete telephone connexion shall be carried out at the cost of the licensee.

38. (1) The following fire extinguishing appliances shall be provided :—

In the enclosure.—A bucket of dry sand and a portable fire extinguisher of a pattern approved by the licensing authority.

In the auditorium.—A supply of not less than 5 gallons of water per 100 square feet of floor area stored in buckets and four portable fire extinguishers of a pattern approved by the licensing authority.

(2) These appliances shall be so disposed as to be readily available for use. The buckets shall have round bottoms and handles. They shall be painted red with the word 'Fire' painted on them in large black letters in English and the local vernacular.

(3) The portable fire extinguishers shall be of two-gallon size; they shall be installed at an adequate height from the ground. A record regarding the maintenance of portable extinguishers shall be kept. Tetrachloride extinguishers shall not be permitted in the enclosure.

(4) Where a portable fire extinguisher of the chemical combination pressure type is older than five years or has not been tested previously, it shall be tested by

hydraulic pressure by the Electrical Inspector or by an engineering firm or mill authorized in this behalf by the licensing authority, to show that it can withstand for one minute a pressure of 250 lb, per square inch and a certificate of such test shall be submitted to the licensing authority. Similar tests shall be repeated every two years thereafter.

(5) In addition to the requirements of sub-rule (1), there shall be provided such other facilities for fighting fire as may be required by the licensing authority.

39. The floor, roof, ceiling, private boxes, balconies, galleries, tiers, partitions, and every room, lobby, corridor and passage intended for the use of the public shall be constructed of fire-resisting materials.

Provided that the following materials may be used for this ceiling, namely :—

Acoustic Celotex

Asbestos Spray

Canec

Celotex

Heraklith

Insulite Building Board

(Termitox) and Insulitation

Hard Board

Ljusne woxna

Insulwood

Treetax and

Upson Insulating Board.

40. The premises shall be enclosed with proper external or party walls of brick or stone. This rule shall not apply to buildings in respect of which temporary licences are granted.

41. Where the first tier or balcony extends over the pit or stalls, the height between the floor of the pit or stall and such tier or balcony shall not, in any part, be less than 10 feet; the height between the floor of the highest part of the gallery and

the lowest part of the ceiling over the same shall not, in any part, be less than 12 feet. The height between any tier and the tier or ceiling above it shall, in no case, be less than 8 feet.

42. (1) No passage, gangway or corridor shall be used as a cloak-room and no pegs for hanging hats, cloaks, etc.. shall be allowed therein nor shall any such passage, gangway or corridor be used for storage purpose or for any purpose whatever except for exit and entrance from and to the auditorium.

(2) There shall be no recesses or projections in the walls of such passages, gangways or corridors within 6 feet of the ground; lights shall be not less than 6 feet 8 inches . above the ground.

(3) No corridor leading to any staircase communicating with any exit shall be less than 5 feet in width in any part thereof.

(4) Where possible, gradients or inclined planes shall be used instead of steps, but no

gradient or inclined planes shall be steeper than 1 in 10.

43. Where cloak-rooms are provided they shall be so situated that the use of them shall not obstruct the free use of any exit.

44. (1) All outside doors for the use of the public shall be made to open outwards and all internal doors shall be so fitted as not to obstruct, when open, any gangway, passage, stairway or landing. Such doors, when open, should engage on an automatic spring.

(2) The size of the doorways shall not be less than 7 feet by 5 feet, the width being measured between the leaves of the door in the open positions:

Provided that in the case of buildings constructed on or after 23rd May 1939 the size of the doorways shall not be less than 8 feet by 5 feet the width being measured between the leaves of the door in the open position.

45. (1) All staircases shall be constructed entirely of stone, cement or concrete with fire-resisting roof and ceiling and shall have solid square (as distinguished from spandrel) steps and landing of approved stone or of such other fire-resisting material and construction as may be approved by the licensing authority with treads not less than 11 inches wide and with risers not more than 6 inches high (each lapping at least 1 inch over the back edge of the step below it) in flights of not more than 15 or less than 3 steps.

(2) The floors of all landings shall be 6 thick.

(3) Every staircase forming an exit from an upper gallery or tier of the auditorium shall be enclosed on both sides with walls of brick or of fire-resisting materials in the storeys through which it passes, and no openings shall be made into auditorium except the one required for exit from the gallery or tier which it serves-

Provided that staircases leading to the first or lower gallery or tier may be left open on one side in which case the open side shall be provided with extra stout handrails and balusters, but in no case shall staircases be left open on both sides.

(4) All enclosed staircases shall have on both sides strong handrails firmly secured to the wall by strong metal brackets about 3 inches clear therefrom and about 3 feet above the stairs but such handrails shall not run on level platforms and landings where the length of such platform or landing exceeds the width of the stairs.

(5) Were the flight of steps returns upon itself, the newel wall shall be chased so as to allow the handrails to turn without projecting over the landing.

(6) The treads and risers of steps on each flight shall be of uniform width and height.

(7) Each flight of steps shall be properly supported and enclosed to the satisfaction of the licensing authority.

(8) No staircases shall have more than two flights of 15 steps without a turn and the width of the landing between such flights shall be at least the same as the width of the staircase.

(9) There shall be at least two staircases each not less than 4 feet wide to provide access to any gallery or upper floor.

(10) Stairs turning at an angle shall have a proper landing without winders being introduced at the turn.

(11) There shall be no recesses or projections in the walls of such staircases within 6 feet of the floor, and any fittings for lighting shall be at least 6 feet 8 inches above the steps or landing.

46 (1) The electric lighting of the premises shall have at least three separate and distinct main circuits as follows:—

- (a) For the enclosure and thence through a dimming regulator to the central lighting of the auditorium;
- (b) for approximately one-half of the auditorium, passage ways, stairways, exits and parts of the building open to the public and
- (c) for the remaining half of the auditorium, passage ways, stairways, exits and parts of the building open to the public.

The control of the circuits in respect of the two halves of the auditorium referred to in clauses (b) and (c) shall be remote from each other.

(2) The general lighting of the auditorium shall be capable of control from inside the enclosure and also from outside and away from the enclosure. A competent person shall be appointed to be present and to be in charge of the general lighting while the public are on the premises.

(3) A plan (in single line) of the wiring shall always be kept in a prominent place in the

office of the Manager. The plan should conform, as far as may be, to the model, wiring diagram.

(4) Whenever required by the licensing authority or a police officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector, a sufficient number of approved oil or candle lights shall be provided for use in case of failure of the electric lighting in the auditorium, gangways, passages and exits. These lights shall be kept burning during the whole time the public are on the premises.

(5) Whenever any illuminant other than electricity is used for the lantern, its use and the apparatus for its production shall be subject to the approval of the licensing authority.

(6) Ordinarily, no open or naked lights shall be allowed, but if the nature of the performance or exhibition absolutely necessitates the use of naked lights, this fact shall be mentioned when application is made for a licence.

47. (1) No building shall be used for cinematograph exhibitions to which the Act applies, unless it is provided with an adequate number of clearly indicated exits so placed and maintained as readily to afford the audience ample means of safe egress, and with a passage 3 feet in width for every ten rows of seating accommodation. By 'adequate' is meant 5 linear feet of exit way for 500 square feet of sitting space inside.

(2) (a) The number of persons admitted into any part of the auditorium, shall not exceed the number prescribed in the licence for that part of the auditorium. The number prescribed for each part shall be clearly indicated in such part by means of a board or otherwise.

(b) The number prescribed under clause (a) in respect of any part of the auditorium shall not exceed the following limits, namely;—

In the case of a permanent building.—The number arrived at by calculating at the rate

of 20 persons per 100 square feet of floor area in respect of such portions as are provided with chairs having backs and arms, and at the rate of 25 persons per 100 square feet of floor area in respect of other portions after excluding the area of the entrances, the passages and gangways, the stage, the stairs, cases, and all places to which the public are not admitted.

(ii) *In the case of a temporary building.*—The number arrived at by calculating at the rate of 25 persons per 100 square feet of floor area, after making the exclusions referred to aforesaid.

(3) A common place of egress may serve as the exit, for the floor and the first tier of the auditorium, provided the capacity of such place of egress is equal to the aggregate capacity prescribed by these rules for the necessary outlets from such floor and tier.

(4) If the floor or any tier of the auditorium is divided into two or more parts,

separate exits as prescribed in the rules shall be provided for each such part.

(5) All doors shall open outwards and shall be distributed round the hall and not merely at one end or side.

(6) All exit doors shall be kept unbolted during the performance. All the top and bottom bolts of such doors shall, wherever possible, be capable of operation from one central handle on each pair of doors.

(7) The words "No Exit" shall be painted over all doors or openings which are in sight of the audience but which cannot be used as exits.

(8) A notice shall be clearly painted on the exit doors indicating the method of opening.

(9) Each exit notice shall be illuminated by a light; such lights shall be kept burning during the whole time the public are on the premises.

10 The public may leave at the end of a performance or exhibition by any exit door.

(11) No chair or other obstruction shall be placed in any passage, gangway or staircase.

(12) No person shall be permitted to sit or stand in any gangway intersecting the seating or to sit in any gangway or between the screen and the barrier referred to in rule 48.

48. The following provisions shall be observed in providing seating accommodation :—

(a) Chairs shall be battened together in complete lengths.

(b) In all cases there shall be an intervening space of at least one foot between the back of one seat and the front of the seat immediately behind measured between perpendiculars.

(c) The gangways shall be not less than 3 feet in width and shall be so arranged that

no seat shall be more than 10 feet from a gangway.

(d) The angle of elevation subtended at the eye of any person seated in the row nearest to the screen by the length of the vertical line dropped from the center of the top edge of the picture to the horizontal plane passing through the observer's eye shall not exceed 35 degrees, the height of the eye of the person so seated being 3 feet 6 inches above the floor level. A strong barrier or other efficient partition shall be provided to enforce this provision.

(e) The angle between the vertical plane containing the upper edge of the picture and the vertical plane containing the observer's eye and the remote end of the upper edge of the picture, shall not be less than 25 degrees. A strong barrier or other efficient partition shall be provided to enforce this provision.

49. Whenever required by the licensing authority, sufficient and approved artificial

means of ventilation shall be provided. Guards shall be provided for ceiling fans with less than 7 feet clearance; the height between the guard and the floor shall not be less than 6 feet 8 inches:

Provided that, in the case of a permanent building for which an annual licence is granted for the first time on or after 23rd May 1939 the licensing authority may require that the auditorium shall be provided with exhaust fans at the rate of one exhaust fan for a floor area of 500 square feet or fraction thereof.

PART V

TRAVELLING CINEMATOGRAPH SHOWS

50. The rules in this part shall apply only to travelling cinematograph shows.

51. In this part—

(a) 'building' shall include any booth, tent or similar structure; and

(b) 'travelling cinematograph show' shall mean an outfit comprising cinematograph

apparatus and plant taken from place to place in the Province of Madras for giving cinematograph exhibitions.

52. The licensing authority may refuse a licence if the building is constructed in whole or in part of a material which is, in his opinion, so inflammable as to be a public danger or if in his opinion any portion of the building is dangerously near to any other building.

53. In every pandal constructed of inflammable materials, there shall be on each side an aperture at least 7 feet high and 18 feet wide. This aperture may be closed by tatties fixed on split bamboo frame and fastened by twine on the inside.

54. Doors and apertures not ordinarily in use may be made of or covered or closed by mat, screen or similar material which can be removed by a slight pressure from inside the building.

55. No external fencing shall be allowed within a distance of 10 feet from the building

56. No building constructed of inflammable materials shall be licensed to exhibit shows in any place for a period longer than four months in the aggregate within any continuous period of twelve months.

PART VI

SPECIAL PROVISIONS IN THE CASE OF CERTAIN CINEMATOGRAPH EXHIBITIONS.

57. The rules in this part shall apply to—

(a) cinematograph exhibitions given in schools or halls for occasional public use ;
(b) cinematograph exhibitions given in the open air or in pandals where the sides cannot be enclosed ; and

(c) cinematograph exhibitions given in any place with an enclosed bulb projector with films not greater in width than 16 millimeters.

58. (1) In the case of cinematograph exhibitions given in schools or halls for occasional public use, the following provisions shall apply, namely :—

(a) Where it is not practicable to have a fireproof enclosure, a clear space of 6 feet shall be railed off all round the cinematograph apparatus.

(b) No drapery or unprotected combustible material, other than that composing the floor, shall be within 6 feet of the apparatus.

(c) The following fire extinguishing appliances shall be provided near the enclosure :—

(i) two portable fire extinguishers in accordance with rule 38 ;

(ii) one blanket ; and

(iii) three buckets of water with one large sponge in one of the puckets.

(d) Two hurricane lanterns burning dim shall be placed near the lantern.

(2) In the case of cinematograph exhibitions given in the open air or in pandals where the sides cannot be enclosed, the provisions contained in clauses (a) and (b) of sub rule (1) and rule 55 shall apply,

59. Save as provided in rule 58, the rules contained in Part II, III, IV and V shall not apply to any cinematograph exhibitions to which this part applies :

Provided that the licensing authority may in consultation with the Chief Electrical Inspector, apply to any such exhibition such of the rules contained in the said parts and with such modifications as he may consider necessary.

PART VII—CERTIFICATION OF FILMS

60. (1) When the importer of a film or his authorized agent, or the proprietor or manager of any place (or the producer of a film or his authorized agent) desires to have a film certified for public exhibition he shall submit an application in writing to the President, Madras Board of Film Censors.

(2) Every such application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

- (a) the exact length of the film, the number of the reels and the length of the film in each reel;
- (b) the name of the film;
- (c) the name of the person or company by whom the film was produced;
- (d) the name of the country in which the film was originally produced;
- (e) a statement as to whether the film has or has not been previously submitted to any authority in British India constituted under section 7 of the Act, and as to the orders, if any, which have been passed by such authority.

If the application submitted to the authority aforesaid was withdrawn, whether the permission of such authority was or was not obtained for such withdrawal, and in the latter case, the reasons for the withdrawal;

(f) the licensed place at which the applicant desires to produce and exhibit the film at his own cost before the Board for examination;

(g) the date and the time most suitable to the applicant for such examination; and

(h) the number of copies imported or manufactured.

(8) Every such application in respect of a film shall be accompanied by three typed or printed copies of its synopsis and cast and in the case of talkies, the words of the songs.

(4) Every such application shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in this part.

61. On receipt of such application the President shall, within a period of seven working days, constitute a Board consisting of at least two members, to examine the film and to report to him the nature of the film and its suitability for public exhibition.

62. (I) In the event of the Board deciding that the film can be certified only after

certain specified parts have been removed therefrom, the parts removed from the film or from all copies of the film in the applicant's possession and intended for exhibition in British India shall be handed over to the Board's office to be kept for one year and afterwards destroyed provided that single excisions exceeding 75 feet in length shall be kept for two years before destruction.

The film shall thereupon be certified as suitable for public exhibition, the certificate issued being endorsed with a description of the parts required to be omitted and with a statement of the exact length or lengths cut out.

A clearly visible triangle shall be drawn in the left hand bottom corner of every certificate bearing such an endorsement.

(2) In the case of a film already certified by the Board and regarding which a representation has been received from any member of the public or from the person who applied for its examination and certi-

fication, or in the case of a film certified by a Board in another Province constituted under the Act and regarding which a report has been submitted by a member of the Board in this Province, the President may appoint a committee to examine the film and to submit a report to him.

(3) No fee shall be charged for the examination of a film already certified by a Board in India, constituted under the Act.

62-A. When a film has been notified as uncertified under subsection (6) or (7) of section 7 of the Act, it is open to the owner of the film to apply anew for certification after excising the objectionable parts or fulfilling such conditions as the Board or the Government may require. In all such cases, the usual examination fee shall be charged.

63. If the Board decides that a film is not suitable for public exhibition, the President

hall communicate such decision within three days thereof, to the applicant.

64. All certificates granted by the Board shall be in Form B annexed to these rules and shall bear the signature of the President. The prescribed mark of the Board shall be a copy of the certificate which shall be affixed to the film certified.

65. In exceptional and urgent cases, provisional certificates may be granted by the President on his own authority, subject to confirmation by the Board.

In respect of all topical films and news reels, the President shall grant certificates without examination by a regular Board when he is satisfied from the synopsis that there is nothing objectionable

66. A fee of Rs. 5 shall be charged for the examination of every 1,000 feet of film or fraction thereof.

No separate fee shall be payable for the grant of a certificate; but a fee of Re. 1

shall be charged for the grant of a duplicate certificate.

67. Examination and certification of, duplicates of films previously certified shall not be necessary if it can be shown by the synopsis and the cast that the second film is identical with the first.

67-A. If any film is altered by excision addition or otherwise after it has been certified by the Board, it shall not be exhibited unless it has been reexamined and a fresh certificate obtained in accordance with these rules. The fee for such re-examination shall be the same as that laid down in rule 66 for the examination of films.

68. The Board shall have power to reduce or remit at its discretion, the fee payable for examination in respect of scientific or educational films, or to remit the fee in the event of a film being withdrawn before examination or in the case of a miniature film.

69. The President shall maintain a register in which shall be entered the following particulars, namely :—

- (a) the name of every film examined ;
- (b) the name of the person applying for the certificate ;
- (c) the name of the person or company producing or releasing the film ;
- (d) the name of the country in which the film was originally produced ;
- (e) the date of examination ;
- (f) the length of the film in feet, the number of reels and the length of each reel in feet
- (g) order of the Board on such examination ; and
- (h) the number and date of certificate issued, if any, together with a copy of any endorsement made on such certificate.

Copies of the entries in such register shall be sent monthly to all other authorities

constituted under the Act for the examination and certification of films in British India.

70. Any member of the Board or any police officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector may enter any place licensed under the Act for the purpose of seeing that the provisions of these rules are being carried out.

Conditions of licence.

This licence is granted subject to the provisions of the Cinematograph Act, 1918

and the rules made thereunder. It is also subject to the following conditions :—

(1) This licence does not exempt the licensee or his servants, or agents from taking out any other licence required by or otherwise complying with any other law or rule or by-law made thereunder.

2. The licensee shall not exhibit or permit to be exhibited any film other than a film which has been certified as suitable for public exhibition by the authority constituted under section 7 of the Act, and which when exhibited, displays the prescribed mark of that authority, and has not been altered or tampered with in any way since such mark was affixed thereto.

(3) The licensing authority and any subordinate duly authorized by him in that behalf and any police officer deputed to keep order during any entertainment in the licensed premises shall at all times have free access to the said premises in order to see

whether the conditions of the licence are fulfilled.

(4) The licensee shall, when and so often as the Government of Madras may prescribe, exhibit films provided by the Government, and on such terms as regards remuneration as the said Government may determine.

(5) No firework shall be used as an adjunct to a cinematograph exhibition.

(6) No person shall be admitted within a line . . . feet in front of and parallel to the screen A strong barrier or other efficient partition shall be provided for enforcing this condition.

(7) The licensee shall not, without the permission of the licensing authority, assign, sublet or otherwise transfer the licence or the licensed premises; nor shall the licensee without permission as aforesaid allow any other person, during the period of currency of the licence, to exhibit films in the licensed premises.

(8) In the case of travelling cinematograph shows, the address on the first day of each month and of every subsequent change of camp shall be notified to the Electrical Inspector.

(9) The licensed premises shall not be kept open after * on any day without obtaining special permission in writing from the licensing authority in respect of such day.

(10) This licensee shall be subject to cancellation or suspension for the breach of any of these conditions or of the special conditions specified on the reverse.

MADRAS FILM CENSOR BOARD

Madras Film Censor Board : The Board was first constituted in June 1920. The term of office is for one year. The Board works on a self supporting system. No fees are paid to the members for attendance at the Board meetings. But a sum equal to fees levied for certification of new films is equally distributed among the members who witness an exhibition.

In exercise of the powers by Sub-sections (1) of Section 7 of the Indian Cinematograph Act 1918, as amended by Act XXIII, of 1919, the Government of Madras have constituted at Madras, with effect from the 21st November 1940, a Board consisting of seventeen members to be the authority for the purpose of examining and certifying films as suitable for public exhibition in the province of Madras for one year.

Cinema censorship code-General Principles, in Bombay.

The following principles are generally noted in the censorship of films.

1. No generally and rigidly applicable rules of censorship can be laid down.
2. It is essential to be consistent but impossible to aim at strictly logical decisions.
3. Each film must be judged on its own merits.
4. Nothing should be approved which in the Censors' honest opinion is calculated to demoralise audience or any section of it.
5. The following kinds of films are liable to objection.

Those which :

(a) Extenuate crime: or which familiarise young people with crime so as to make them conclude that theft, robbery and crimes of violence and normal incidents of ordinary life not greatly to be reprobated: or which exhibits the actual methods by which thieves carry-out their purpose and make the methods of crime the chief theme: or in which crime is the dominant feature of a serial and not merely an episode in the story.

(b) Undermine the teachings of MORALITY, by showing vice in an attractive form even though retribution follows: or casting a halo or glory or success round heads of the vicious: or suggesting that a person is morally justified in succumbing to temptation in order to escape from circumstances or ungenial work: or bringing into contempt the institution of marriage: or suggesting abnormal sexual relations: or lowering the sacredness of the family ties.

(c) Exhibits indecorous dress or absolute nudity of living (except infants: and small children, or nude statues or figure in suggestive positions.

(d) Bring into contempt public characters acting as such e.g., soldiers wearing H. M. uniform Ministers of religion, Minister of the Crown, Ambassadors and official representatives of foreign nations, judges, the police, civil servants of Government etc.

(e) Are calculated to wound the susceptibilities of foreign nations or of members of any religion.

(f) Are calculated or possibly intend to foment social unrest and discontent: (i.e. not scenes merely depicting realistically the hard condition under which people live, but depicting the violence that results in an actual conflict between capital and Labour)

(g) Are calculated to promote disaffection or resistance to Government or promote a breach of law and order.

6. Inspectors should consider the impression likely to be made on an average audience in India, which included a not inconsiderable proportion of illiterate people or those of immature judgement.

7. Inspectors should remember that a film may be in itself innocent yet dangerous because of the bad reputation of the book it reproduces, and that a book may be harmless but a film of it dangerous.

8. Inspectors should distinguish between errors of conduct caused by love, even guilty love, and those that result from the pursuit of lust.

9. Objections to films may be removed by the Board either (1) by modification or removal of titles and sub-titles or of the film narrative or description, or (2) by cutting out portions of films, or (3) by both.

10. Two Inspectors or the Secretary and one inspector should be present at the inspection of a film.

1. Indecorous, ambiguous and irreverant titles and subtitles.
2. Cruelty to animals.
3. The irrelevant treatment of sacred subjects.
4. Drunken scenes carried to excess.
5. Vulgar accessories in the staging.
6. The MODUS OPERANDI of criminals.
7. Cruelty to young infants and excessive cruelty and tortures to adults, especialiy woman.
8. Unnecessary exhibition of feminine clothing.
9. The exhibition of profuse bleeding.
10. Nude figures.
11. Offensive vulgarity, and impropriety in conduct and dancing.
12. Indecorous dancing.
13. Excessively passionate love scenes.
14. Bathing scenes passing the limits of propriety.
15. References to controversial politics.
16. Relations of Capital and Labour.
17. Scenes tending to disparage public characters and institutions.
18. Realistic horrors of warfare.
19. Scenes and incidents calculated in times of war to afford

information. 20. Incidents having a tendency to disparge other nations, 21. Scenes holding up the King's uniform to contempt or ridicule. 22. Subjects dealing with India, in which British or Indian officers are seen in an odious light, and otherwise attempting to suggest the disloyalty of Native States or bring into disrepute British prestige in the Empire. 23. The exploitation of tragic incidents of the war. 24. Gruesome murders and strangulation scenes. 25. Executions. 26. The drug habit e.g. opium, morphia cocaine etc. 27. The Cinematograph Act 1918

The authority having power to grant licences under this Act shall be the District Magistrates or the Commissioner of Police.

The Madras Cinematograph Rules of 1933 are operative along with the Act.

Fees.—For every licence under the Act for a permanent cinema theatre the annual fee shall be Rs. 5/- for an area of 1000 sq. feet or less with an additional fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every 500 sq. ft. or fraction thereof in excess of 1000 sq. ft.

For a temporary building, thatched or constructed or tent. Rupee one (Re. 1/-) for a month or for a portion thereof for an area

of 1000 sq. ft. or less with an additional fee of annas eight for a month or for a portion thereof for every 500 sq. ft. or fraction thereof in excess of 1000 sq. ft.

Film censoring fees

A fee of Rs. 5/- shall be charged for every 1000 ft. of film or fraction thereof. One rupee shall be charged for every duplicate certificate

Electrical Inspection fees

Permanent Cinemas—

(1) 1st. inspection after the Cinema Theatre is newly erected Rs.100 per annum.

(2) For every subsequent inspection carried out every year Rs 50/- per annum.

Touring Cinemas

After 21st April 1939, all touring cinemas are charged an annual fee of Rs. 35/- only for each inspection whether it is for the first inspection or for subsequent inspection.

PUBLIC RESORT ACT

In the city of Madras, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 36 and 39 of the Madras City Police Act (Madras Act III of 1888) the Commissioner of Police, Madras with the approval of the Governor in Council, has made rules called "Places of Public Resort—Rules" for ensuring order and decency and for the public safety at all places of public entertainment or resort in the City of Madras. The application has to be made to the Commissioner of Police.

Fees—Rs. 2/- per annum—licence fee for permanent building per annum.

Rs. 1/- for temporary licence for 3 months.

In the Presidency

In the rest of the Municipalities in the Madras Presidency, the Public Resort Act 1888 is operative. The application under the Act shall be made to the Chairman of the Municipality or to the District Magis-

trate, as the case may be, having jurisdiction in that area.

Fee-- Licence fee for one year for permanent building. Rs. 5/- for 1000 sq. ft. or less with an additional fee of Rs. 2-8-0 for every 500 sq. ft. or fraction in excess of 1000 sq. ft.

The same rate holds good in the case of temporary building like touring cinema.

THE MADRAS ENTERTAINMENTS TAX ACT 1939.

The Act came into force in the presidency of Madras with effect from 1st August 1939.

Four methods are prescribed for the payment of the Tax.

1. Payment by means of stamps.
2. Payment at a specified percentage (20% of the gross proceeds) of the gross proceeds on the basis of returns.
3. Payment of the Tax by composition,

4. Payment of the Tax in cases where admission is controlled by mechanical contrivance.
5. Payment of the Tax on admissions to entertainments on payment of subscriptions or contribution to an institution.

Rates

The Government of Madras, have issued a communique dated July 16th to the effect that the Provincial Entertainment Tax will come into force throughout the presidency from 1st August 1939.

CINEMATOGRAPHY IN S. INDIAN STATES

ACTS AND REGULATIONS

Mysore

Mysore Cinematograph Regulation 1923 as amended by Regulation of 9th July 1935 is operative in Mysore:

Rules are published under this Regulation for the regulation of Cinematograph exhibition in Mysore state. The rules are

substantially the same as in Madras, except for certain differences. The salient 'differences may be mentioned as follows:—

In respect of films which have already been certified by the Board of Censors in British India when such certificates are accepted in Mysore without further examination, a fee of Re. 1 for every 1000 feet shall be paid to the certifying authority before the film is exhibited in public.

In cases where the Board in Mysore considers for any reason that it is necessary to re-examine the film and does so re-examine it, a fee of Rs. 5/- per 1000 feet shall be paid to the certifying authority.

Copies of certificates issued under Rule 2 will be granted, on sufficient cause being shown, on payment of a fee of one rupee for every copy of a certificate in respect of a film upto 5,000 ft. in length, Re. 1-8-0 for a copy in respect of a film above 5,000 feet and upto 10,000 feet (inclusive) and Rs. 2/-

for a copy in respect of a film above 10,000 ft. in length.

Cinematograph licence for theatres :—

For every licence when granted or reviewed a fee shall be charged according to the scale laid down below :

For an annual licence—Rs. 11-8-0 for an area of 1000 sq. ft. or less with an additional fee of Rs. 6 for every 500 sq. ft. or fraction thereof in excess of 1000.

For a temporary licence for a period not exceeding three months for a building thatched or constructed of wood or mats or other inflammable materials or for a tent,	Rs. 11-8-0 for a month or for a portion thereof for an area of 1000 sq. ft. or less with an additional fee of Rs. 6-0-0 for a month or for a portion thereof.
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For a temporary licence for a period not exceeding three months for a building not thatched nor constructed of inflammable materials but only occasionally used as a place of public resort or entertainment.

} Rs. 2—8—0 for a month or a portion thereof for an area of 1000 sq. ft. or less with an additional fee of Re. 1-8-0 for a month or for a portion thereof for every 50 sq. feet or fraction thereof in excess of 1000 ft.

In Travancore

The Travancore Cinematograph Regulation 1 of 1927 corresponding to 24th May 1927 is operative in Travancore. The rules published there under are substantially the same as in Madras.

Censoring of pictures is done by a Board, presided over by Rajaseva Pravina Khan Bahadur G. S A. Karim O. B. E., Inspector General of Police of Travancore.

There is no Entertainment Tax in Travancore, except it be that a fee of Rs. 700 is paid to the municipality per year.

In Cochin

The Cochin Cinematograph Regulation and rules operative in Cochin State are substantially the same as in the Madras Presidency.

Pudukkottai

There is a regulation called Regulation III of 1936. This Cinematograph regulation is adopted from British Indian Acts and amended by Regulation VIII of 1926.

MADRAS CITY MUNICIPAL ACT

CORPORATION OF MADRAS (Advertisement Tax)

(Revised schedule of rates as per Resolution of the council dated 16—8—38).

In respect of advertisements on cloth hung across streets, the rate of advertisement tax shall be Rs. 10 per calendar month or less in a street 10 ft. to 20 ft. broad and Rs. 20 per calendar month or less in a street 20 ft. broad upto 50 ft. This kind of advertisement will not be allowed in streets broader than 50 ft.

STORING OF FILMS

Licence under section 290 and the bye-laws framed under Section 349 (13) of Act IV of 1919.

Conditions under which Licence is Granted

1. Not more than one ton in weight of celluloid goods and not more than one ton in weight of cinematograph films shall be kept in any store and in no case shall the aggregate of all such goods in any store exceed one ton in weight.

2. The storage shall ordinarily be confined to top floors and not below residential floors.

3. In the case of shops or godowns, the upper floors of which are used for dwelling purposes not more than 4 cwts in weight of celluloid, celluloid goods and not more than 20 lbs. of cinematograph films shall be kept except with the special permission of Commissioner.

4. All celluloid, celluloid goods and cinematograph films kept under a license shall be in securely closed fire resisting respectacles which shall not be used for any other purpose, provided that instead of being kept in such a respectable, the same may be kept in separate well ventilated chamber constructed of fire resisting materials, but such chamber, shall not be used for any other purpose, and shall be kept securely locked.

5. Each reel of cinematograph film shall, except when required to be exposed for the purpose of examination, cleaning, packing, rewinding or repair, be kept in a seperate properly closed metal box.

6. The examination, cleaning, packing, rewinding or repair of cinematograph films shall be carried on in a separate suitable room called the examination room which shall not be used for any other purpose.

7. Not more than 10 reels or 40 lbs. of cinematograph films shall be exposed in the examining room at any one time.

8. Cinematograph films shall not be kept in the examination room except for such time as may be necessary for the purpose of Examining, cleaning, packing, rewinding or repair.

9. The fittings of a celluloid and/or celluloid goods store and cinematograph filmstore and examining room shall, so far as practicable, be of noninflammable or fire resisting material, and there shall be no fire place in such store or room.

10. No fire or flame or substance liable to ignite celluloid or celluloid goods or cinematograph film and no electrical or other

appliance likely to produce an exposed spark, shall be allowed in any celluloid or celluloid goods store, film store or examining room, except under such conditions as may be imposed by the Commissioner.

11. Waste celluloid, celluloid goods, or Cinematograph film shall not be allowed to accumulate on the floor, but shall be collected at frequent intervals and placed in a strong metal receptacle with hinged lid.

12. Adequate means for extinguishing fire having regard to the quantity of celluloid or celluloid goods or cinematography films kept on the premises at any time shall be provided to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

13. The licence shall be affixed or kept hung in some conspicuous part of the licensed premises.

14. The licence is not transferable either as regards the person to whom, or the premises for which it is granted, without the written permission of the Commissioner.

In case the business or trade is found to be a nuisance or otherwise objectionable the commissioner reserves to himself the right to revoke the licence at any time.

Licensing of cinema operators.

The Government of Madras have decided that examination for cinema operators should be conducted by a Board consisting of the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government or his nominee and four members nominated by the South Indian Film Chamber of Commerce. The Board will grant competency certificates to candidates who pass the examination: on the strength of the certificate the Chief Electrical Inspector will grant licens to cinema operators.

These licences will be permanent unless revoked for good and sufficient reason.

Syllabus: The syllabus will be as shown below.—

- (i) a working knowledge of bioscope machines, and a particular technical knowledge of the type of machine which the candidate is at the time employed in operating;
- (ii) a knowledge of the municipal by-laws and other rules relating to cinematograph exhibitions and precautions against fire;
- (iii) a knowledge of the most speedy and effective methods of dealing with fire;
- (iv) a knowledge of the elements of electric power, direct and alternating current, voltage amperage, etc., or in the case of mafasil operators, of petrol and oil engines; and
- (v) proficiency in handling, winding, repairing and efficient cleaning of films.

3. Fees: A fee of rupees five will be charged by the Board for the examination and issue of a competency certificate, and Rs. 5 will be charged by the Chief Electrical Inspector for the issue of a licence to a cinema operator.

4. **Exemption:** No exemption from the examination will be granted, but every cinema operator already in employment will be allowed one year from 1st April, 1941 to obtain a competency certificate and licence.

His service shall only be certified and attested to by the Manager or Proprietor of cinema.

5. **Age** A Candidate appearing for the examination must not be less than 18 years of age.

6. **Qualifications for Candidates:** A candidate will be eligible to appear for the examination (i) if he knows to read and write in his mother tongue and (2) (a) if he has, previous to the date of appearing for the examination, put in apprenticeship or service for a period of not less than two years in a cinema theatre under the supervision of a licensed operator or (b) if the candidate is a holder of a degree or diploma in Electricity of a University or a recognised institute, and has, previous to

the date of appearing for the examination, put in apprenticeship for not less than one year in a cinema theatre under the direct supervision of a licensed operator.

The record of such apprenticeship or service, by a candidate will be certified and attested to both by the licensed operator under whose supervision he had worked and by the Manager or Proprietor of the theatre in whose theatre he had worked for the period specified.

The Rule 6 does not apply to the existing operators who are in employment as operators, having put in two years service on the date of application for the examination.

The dates, centres of examinations, and other particulars relating thereto, will be notified shortly. Any enquiry may be made to the South Indian Film Chamber of Commerce, Khalleel Mansions, Mount Road, Madras, by sending postage for the reply.

Ry. Concession to film producing Companies

Over the State managed Railways viz East Bengal, East Indian, Great Indian Peninsula and North Western Railway, Film Producing Companies are allowed the same concession as is granted to bonafide professional entertainers, subject to the following conditions :

- (a) That not less than 20 persons travel by the same train.
- (b) That the minimum distance for charge is 100 miles.
- (c) That the journey is being undertaken for the production of films.

Factories Act 1934

The following are relative clauses in the Factories Act 1934 (as modified up to 15th August 1937) which are made applicable to Cinema Studios :

Section 2, Sub-section (J) States :

“ Factory ” means any premises including the precincts thereof whereon twenty or

more workers are working or were working on any day of the preceding 12 months, and in any part of which a manufacturing process is being carried on with the aid of power or is ordinarily so carried on.

Power to declare places to be factories under Section 5 (1) states :

Notwithstanding anything contained in clause (J) of Section 2, the Provincial Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, declare any place wherein a manufacturing process is carried on whether with or without the aid of power and wherein on any one day of the twelve months preceding the notification ten or more workers were employed, to be a factory for all or any of the purposes of this Act.

Under the Act, the following exemptions are allowed in the case of workers in the Cinema Studios ;

Factories Act of 1934;

Exemptions from the Factory Act. (Rules Practised in Bombay.)

The Factory Act is not applicable to the following persons : 1. Author, 2. Photoplay wright, 3. Scenario writer, 4. Composer of songs, 5. Production Manager, 6. Costume designer and his assistants. 7. Assistant production Manager, 8. Art director and his assistants 9. Cameraman-in-chief. 10. Music Director, 11. Sound Engineer, 12. Chief recordist, 13. Sculptor, 14. Make-up supervisor, 15. Painter, 16. Decorator, 17. Property Man, 18. Orchestra, 19. All artistes who have continuity make-up for film shooting (actors and actresses, be they men, women or children) 20. Director and his assistant, 21. Head Electrical Engineer, 22. Film Editor and 23. Assistant film editors.

Persons who are engaged in the erection or dismantling of " Settings " or the makeup of actors and actresses in the cinema studios

are exempted but the period of work shall in no case exceed 11 hours on any one day.

Persons who are engaged in showing reflectors and shifting of furniture on the set or as clap boys in the process of shooting films in cinema studios.

The Payment of Wages Act 1936

The Payment of Wages Act of 1936 as modified upto 1st May 1937, is made applicable to cinema studios in Madras presidency.

Sec. 3 : Says :

Every employer shall be responsible for the payment to persons employed by him of all wages required to be paid under this Act.

Sec. 4 : Says :

(1) Every person responsible for the payment of wages under section 3 shall fix periods in respect of which such wages shall be payable. (2) No wage-period shall exceed one month.

Sec. 5 : Says :

(I) The wages of every person employed upon or in.—

(a) any railway, factory or industrial establishment upon or in which less than 1000 persons are employed shall be paid before the expiry of the seventh day.

(b) any other railway, factory or industrial establishment, shall be paid before the expiry of the tenth day.

After the last day of the wage period in respect of which the wages are payable.

The authority under the Act is The Commissioner for Industrial disputes.

Income Tax

Depreciation on written down Value

[The Central Board of Revenue have allowed for the purpose of income-tax, depreciation on written down value as follows :]

Recording equipment; reproducing equipment, developing machines, editing machines, synchronisers and studio lights.] 20%

Projecting and reproducing equipment of film exhibiting concerns.]

Renewal of bulbs of studio lights will be allowed as revenue expenditure.

[Originally the Central Board of Revenue proposed that only 15% be allowed while bulbs were not allowed as revenue expenditure. In 7 years this would have enabled the writing off of 68% of the original value, The 20% now allowed means that 78% of the

value can be written off in the same period and is a distinct gain of 10%.

If the balance of 25% has to be recovered in subsequent years, that is in conformity with the allowances conceded to other industries the Government cannot make any exception in the case of the film industry. Should a particular article become entirely unserviceable necessitating replacement by a new one without hope of redeeming anything even as scrap material either before or after this 78% is written off, the whole of the unwritten cost should be written off in the year in which the article becomes unserviceable. On the other hand if some value is realised the amount to be written off would to that extent be less.

Railway Concessions

Bonafide professional entertaining companies (Theatrical, concert or variety including bioscope and cinema companies) are given concession on M.S.M.Ry. & S.I. Ry.

The concession allowed for the above companies, excluding coolies and others who travel invariably in third class, is as follows :

The party must be travelling to give public performances. They must produce a letter of authorisation signed by an authorised officer of the Railway namely: The application must be made to the Chief Transportation Superintendent of the concerned railway) and on the production of the same, concession tickets will be issued in the following way :

First and second class tickets on payment of half-fares and simple inter class tickets, on a payment of third class mail fares, subject to (a) a minimum of 4 concession fares. (b) a minimum distance for charge of 100 miles. N.B. the whole party must travel by the same train but not necessarily by the same carriage.

Duty on Raw Films.

The duties announced under Ottawa Pact giving preferential treatment to articles of the British Manufacture in preference to those of Non-British origin, have been of late modified. Ottawa pact was replaced by the United Kingdom India Trade Agreement (about April 1939) by which the preferential rate was abolished.

As per the latest agreement (since April 1939) the Customs duty on films are as follows :—

1. Raw Cinematograph films (unexposed) 20 % irrespective of the Country of origin.
2. Exposed cinematograph films $37\frac{1}{2}\%$.

For feature films (exposed) the tariff value is calculated at the rate of As. 7 per foot and the duty is collected at $37\frac{1}{2}\%$ thereon. For other exposed films (shorts, documentaries, educational pictures topicals etc.,) the value of film is calculated at As. 3. per foot and $37\frac{1}{2}\%$ customs duty is levied thereon.

The Performing Right Society Limited

Agents for Southern and Western India-Vernon & Co. 36 Second line Beach, Madras:

The Performing Right Society is an Association of composers, authors, publishers, and proprietors of copyright musical works, relating to non-Indian films.

The policy of the Society is to grant licences for a moderate annual fee to responsible proprietors of premises where copyright music is played.

The Cinema licences issued by the Society cover the performance of copyright music at Cinema entertainments only and should Cinemas be leased out for other entertainments at which copyright music is performed, then either a separate licence has to be taken out or if such entertainments do not exceed five in number during any one year, they can be covered by individual permits at a fee of Rs 16 per day.

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
