To MR: PHILIP NODEN

MERCHT: ATT MADDAPOLLAM

The R*: Hon^{ble}: Comp*: haveing long since Ordered the withdrawing of Metchlepatam Factory, and Maddapollam Factory in Order to the better resettlem¹: when occasion shall serve there has notwithstanding remained in each Factory sev¹!: Goods & household stuffs, and a considerable yearly charge of Serv¹s: wages and reperation has been continued contrary to their order and it being not thought expedient to make any present settlement at either of those Factorys at least untill the Mogulls own Phirmaund be obtained, we have therefore thought fitt to write Letters to the Bramine & Dubash att each Factory (copy whereof comes inclosed) ordering them to send hither forthwith by hired boats all the Goods and household stuff belonging to the R*: Hon^{ble}: Comp*: whereof Mr. Brough has left a List w¹s: you in w²s: wee observe there is a good quantity of Brimstone w²s: take care to send, wee desire you to lett y³s: have a Copy of said list for their directions and furnish y³s: w¹s: w¹s: money left in your hands by Mr. Brough w²s: by the ballance of his Acco¹: delivered in, is Pago⁴s: 109: 34; Fanams.

Wee have written to Sanco Narso about y^e : difference in Acco^{ts}: between you and him as you will perceive by y^e : inclosed Copy w^{eh} : wee hope will prevent his Giveing you any trouble w^{th} : y^e : Countrey Goverm': And wee doe hereby requier you, as you Expect any favour protection from the R^t : Hon^{ble}: Comp^a: y^t : by the first oppertunity you repair hither w^{th} : y^e : family, for while the Goverm': of those parts continues so unsetled it will not be safe for you to continue there, and If you shall by your non observance of our Order bring yo': selfe & Family into any

trouble, you cannot reasonably expect any assistance from us.

Mr. Brough gives us an Acco[†]: y[†]: there is due for rent at Metchlepatam as Follows viz[†]: To Burze Meo for 4 years 7 months end: 25th Feb^{ty}: 1691 at 12 Pag^{ds}: per month, 55: To Mustapha for 4 years 8 months end: 29th: Feb^{ty}: 1691–2 at Pag^{ds}: 3 per month: 14: 00: To Mahomud Hussen 5 years 4 months ending 29th: Feb^{ty}: 1691–2: Pago^{ds}: 15: [\$\psi\$] mens: 80: 00: and y[‡]: he has cleared the debt of Pag^{ds}: 80: to Mahomud Hussen for halfe and y[‡]: y^e: rent due to y^e: other two is to be cleared after the same manner w^{ch}: wee desire you to doe accordingly, and y^e: remainder of the R[‡]: Hon^{ble}: Comp^{*s}: Cash If any be left, send to us by y^e: first oppertunity, There being no occasion for any further charges either of reperation or Wages at either of y^e: Factorys for the Present.

The matter herein recommended to you is of noe small importance & deserves Good consideration &c*: prudent managem*: both in the beginning of y*: Goods &c*: of the R^t : Hon^{ble} : $Comp^a$: and yo*:selfe and family.

If you find the Goverm¹: either at Metchlepatam or Maddapollam oppose make no disturbance but only cause a List to be written of the things in the Factory and Lett y¹: w¹h: y॰: Key of y॰: Factory to be left w¹h: y॰: Gov²: and as to yo¹: own removeall you must give those Persons Good words w¹h: whome you have a difference in Acco¹s: to perswade yⁿ: rather to deferr the determination of yo¹: Acco¹s: to us, then to the Countrey Goverm¹: there, who will abuse you both, & wee urge this necessary caution to you because wee would very willingly prevent those mischiefs w²h: may probably happen to you, if either the good likeing you may have of y²: place or any other consideration whatsoever should prevaile w¹h: you to continue there against our Expresse Ord¹: w²h: will put it out of our Power to doe you any kindnesse, If you should thereby bring yo¹: selfe into any future trouble.

If y°: Goverm*: will not permitt y°: Carrying of of y°: Goods &ca: from Metchlepatam, there is no reason y*: wee should pay y°: rent demanded by Burze Meo &ca: but If they doe permitt, yn: clear the Acco*: wth: ym: as well as you can & If y°: money in yo': hands be not sufficient to discharge yt: & the whole boat hire you may agree wth: y°: boat men to receive their hire or halfe of it here, or Draw a bill upon us for any small summe yt: shall be necessary for the executing

Forgett not to demand your merchts: Answer concerning the Neckeloths & If they can be had cheap wee may enlarge ye: Investmt: therein, being a good

commodity in Europe.

Take ye: 1st opportunity of a ship or Deckt vessell comeing this way for sending us ye: bales you have in readynesse, wee expect ye: Briganteen from Vizagapatam, & a ship from Bengall long before now & intended to have sent one down to you but since wee are disappointed wee depend upon you Freighting ye: Goods upon some of ye: Countrey ships weh: are in your river and bound hither.

Pray make further Enquiering into ye: Matt of yor: fanams because Ezam Rauze & those wth: him doe give a different Accot: from wtt: you write us in

yours of ye: 13th: past.

Wee have paid ye: two bills you mention to have drawn upon us in yor: Generall Lre: dated ye: 5th: for Pagods: 2000 & in yor: Generall dat: 13th: Do: for Pago^{ds}: 750 for w^{ch}: you are to Give us creditt.

Wee have accepted your bill drawn for Pagois: 500: mentioned in yours of

Wee are glad you have recd: ye: two thousand Pagods: sent you by Dr. Blackwall Concerning weh: wee heard some doubtfull reports, & ye: Passage by land uncertain, you must loose no oppertunitys of Drawing bills upon us till you are furnished wth: Enough to comply wth: yor: contracts but draw no more than necessary.

Wee want ye: Copy of yor: Paymasters Accots: concerning weh: you write y^t : you want assistants to Copy y^m : If your meaning be y^t : they Cannot be Copyed till more Assistants come to you from hence, lett us know it, y^t : wee may

noe Longer depend upon ym: in vain.

If you have a markett for the Allum sell it as well as you can, wee haveing more here then wee can dispose of; Pagds: 27: per halfe peeice Broad cloth is a better price then wee can gett here, for damaged broad Cloth, and If you can sell ye: 9 peeices at an Abatement proportionable to the damage lett itt Goe, wee have none to send you neither good nor damaged.

The 5 Fanams sent us is under Assay whereof wee shall advise you the report, continue you to send us 5 monthly If you write.

Wee have recd: the 4 percills of Musters of Blue Cloth, repair yor: Cuddalore Fortification so far as is necessary especially ve: Northermost point, weh: Mr. Hatsell informs us was designed before he came, and as soon as you have gott a stock of bricks, & Chinam enough, goe on with: ye: reperation of yor: curtain upon ye: old foundation & hasten it with: all Expedition.

By every Genl: Letter give us an Accot: (as you have done in yors: of ve: 13th: past) of ye Quantity of Cloth mesured Embaled & at whitening to weh: add an accot: of ye: quantity turned out as short cloth. And wee strictly require yt: you take care yt: none of ye: Cloth won: is turned out be disposed of to any but ye: Compa: & it is high time to begin (if you have not already) to take it in for ye: Rt: Honble: Compas: use at such abatements for ye: shortnesse & badness as may discourage ye: Merchts: from bringing in Cloth below muster.

Wee have here agreed wth: our Merchts: to abate 5 per cent on ye. short Cloth, besides a proportion in ye: respective prices for wtt: each peeice falls short

in Length and Breadth.

Our Fort St. George Merchts: have about 1700: Pagoas: at and near Cuddalore to be invested in Cloth, lett not yor: Merchts: give them any obstructions in y°: Investmt: of yt:, & o': Merchts: have promised to send no more; Wee are

Since the foregoeing wee rec^d: yo^{rs}: of y^e: 5th: & 6th: Ins^t: each Accompany'd wth: a Lr̃e: from Gov̄^r: Pitt, Wee haveing wholy removed from Conimeer Factory it is not convenient to be at any charge for y^e: defending it from y^e: Acceptance of y^e: Moors, & Morattas, & you did well in forbearing to send men thither, who would be driven out wth: disgrace unlesse you sent enough to maintain, & y^t: wo^d: be too great & needlesse Expence.

We have sent you by these Peons 2 parcells q^t : 5 Quier of Paper royall, 3 Quier 2^d : sort, & 4 Quier of y^e : 3^d : sort for yor: present supply, wee shall furnish

This incloses invoice & bill of Ladeing for Lead and stores sent you by the Brigantine Robert Atkinson Master Amotos: to Pagodos: 1398: 19: 02: for wth: you are to give us Creditt, hasten y^e : unladeing of y^e : Brigantine & dispatch her to us againe as soon as possible wth: as many bales as she will take in, & send us y^e : rest of yo^r : bales by y^e : first oppertunity, Wee intend to send you more stores by a sloop of Moedum Nino's wth: wee have hired & hope to dispatch to you in two days.

Give the Master-order to [lacuna] the Brigantine for preservation of the bales

from damage.

Haveing two Ministers here, wee can spare Mr. Brideoak to Officiate at Fort

St David where he may continue till our further order.

By this Brigantine come Thomas Walton who came out a writer on y°: Sampson arrived y°: 1st: October last, and Charles Bugden who came out a writer on y°: Charles y°: 2st: arrived in Ballasore y°: 3lt. October & from thence took passage on y°: Berkley Castle arrived here y°: 2sth: November but whether his sallary commences from y°: time of arriveall at Bengall, or Fort St. George, you must determine by his Indentures w°h: cause him to produce, and enter y°: same in your Consultation Booke.

Inclosed is an order made here concerning all ships and cargoes to Bengall being Consigned to the Agent, whereof the R^t: Hon^{ble}: Comp^a: doe Expect a

strict observance.

Allso our order concerning the Exportation of Powder & saltpetre we^h: you are to Publish wording it as may be agreeable to your place and Execute due Complyance wherein you are particularly to take care y^t: noe saltpetre be sold or conveyed directly or indirectly to or for y^e: use of the French, but you are not to lett it be known that the said order is so intended, wee are

Our last was $y^e \colon 23^{\text{th}} \colon \text{Ins}^t$: wee have received yours of $y^e \colon 23^{\text{th}} \colon \& 24^{\text{th}} \colon \text{Ins}^t$ & take notice of the contents tho little thereof requires our answer only wee have paid your bill for Pag^{ds}: 1000 Drawn $y^e \colon 23^{\text{th}} \colon \text{Ins}^t$: payable to Mr. Hatsell for w^{ch} : you are to give us Creditt

Lett Verdapa your Mint Bramine come hither, If ye: Mint businesse does per-

mitt his absence for a Fortnight, he haveing requested for leave.

Goe on wth: yor: Repayres of the Fortification & make Provision allso of Chiniam & Brickes for Building Goodownes & Lodgeings, wth: Mr. Hatsell has represented to us to be necessary and wee shall by yo: first oppertunity send you a supply of Maddapollam Teake.

After you have sent us the bales you intend by yo: Brigantine, & Wellfair,

Continue to send more as your Cloths come in and as Oppertunity offers.

This Evening wee rec⁴: yo': of 26th: wee have not small guns enough to supply your wants for Cuddalore. This sloop brings you Gunpowder and small shott.

Mr. Hatsell acquaints us y^t: y^e: renters had a promise of protection at their first comeing but tis not to be supposed to have been intended a Protection against

their own Prince but against their Enimyes.

If you make a practice of such Protections, you cannot expect to live in peeice \mathbf{w}^{th} : y^s : Governt: but they will be allways makeing demands of their servts: and Debtors and obstruct your businesse. Therefore if Rama Raja dos persist in his demands you may fairly enough tell y^m : y^t : at their first comeing you promised to secure y^m : from y^s : Moors, but now, they being Gone, & Rama Raja Demanding their Accots: they must render Accots: to their Prince, \mathbf{w}^{ch} : you doe not understand nor can undertake to determine, is It then very probable \mathbf{y}^t : they will of

themselves contrive wayes for their own security & Escape & free you from quarrelling wth: Rama Raja in their behalfe, wth: If you should once engage in, & should at last be forced to dd: ythemselves, you write, Therefore order ythemselves, to repair forthwith to their respective habitations and write Rama Raja ythemselves, when his Enimyes made Incurtions into those parts you protected his subjects who fled to you for security of their persons but the enimyes being gone, you have ordered them to goe home & ythemselves, you have received orders for so doing.

However you doe well to consider yor: own security by strength[en|ing those parts weh: are most likely to be attacked, you have now a good supply of stores wee will suddingly send some men by boats weh: Necessary Commissions for

Officers and the steel wch; was before omitted.

Wee have formerly write to you for a true $Acco^t$: of your remaines ultimo September last hasten it to us by y^e : very first oppertunity We are

tions weh: will be ready by yt: time.

Wee have recd: yors: of 7th: Inst: as to ye: Morattas it is probable yt: they will emprove all oppertunity of Quarrilling with you when freed from their enimy yt: they may have some pretence to obstruct yor: businesse & force money from you for clearing it, and this has been ye: Constant practice of ye: Countrey Goverm': & is ye: reason why wee are not to Give ym: just occasion, as wee shall doe by harbouring & protecting y°: Duans servants & Debtors against their Masters demands. If a servant & Debtor to y°: R*: Honble: Comp*: should run away from us & shelter himselfe under ye: protection of Countrey Gov": wee then should thinke it very hard yt: they should detain & protect him, & bid us come to their Court and make our demands, Have wee more reason or Authority to detain & protect Rama Rajas Servants & Debtors and bid him send his Attornys into our Courts & prove his demands & wee will doe him justice. By wit: Authority doe wee pretend to sett up Courts of Justice in his Countrey to deside Causes & Accots: depending between him & ye: farmers of his revenues, but if you doe erect such Court doe any of you understand how to adjust & give a true judgment in such matters, or if you did it is rationable to thinke yt: Rama Raja. will not submit to your Judgement if it be given against him it is not our businesse or interest to assume or aime at such a jurisdiction & Dominion over Princesse, It is enough for us if wee can protect & governe our own servants, Merchts: & Inhabitants, who thô they are originally his subjects yet are by vertue of our Cowle become ours & wee must clame & maintain our right to protect ym: & so long as he permits us to enjoy yt: wee may very well allow him to Governe his owne servants & Subjects whome wee are not concerned wth: our maine designe is trade wch: cannot be managed within our own bounds wee must be obliged to Rama Raja for permitting our Merch¹⁰: to buy Cloth for y⁰: R¹: Hon⁵: Comp⁵: out of our wall & therefore it is our interest to keep peeice w¹¹: him as long as wee can, you have a Garrison to defend you when he invards [sic] you y": will be yo': time to bring y": into better manners, But there is no occasion to invite him or provoke him to invade you for the sake of ye: Renters, for you cannot by their assistance or your own forces carry on a trade in his Countrey whether he will or no, If you thinke you can, pray lett us know it, and we will consider further thereof it.

a Fleet at Zealon to watch their motions.

You express yourselves very wittily and sharply about y°: Timbers sent you hence yt: they seem to be old refuse of many years standing in Madrass, They never were ashoare in Madrass, but recd: and bought in the boat yt: bort them, and they being but of 12 or 15 foot long were not designed to make beams of 21 foot long wch: are intended to be sent you as soon as wee can gett a conveyance, the Countrey boats cannot take ym: in, & these were thought a good Pennyworth, Considering y°: Freight &cc: Charges saved, & wee know not how to send you any so cheape, 'tis true they are old Maddapollam Timbers, but the better for use, and those of 15 foot long if not rotten worth about 4 Pagods: in Madrasse wch: makes amends for the rest, wee are.

peace with all men and Give strict orders to my Servants that noe stranger suffer any abuse in my Goverm^t: under the Colour of Merch^{ts}: and Buzarmen I understand there have come severall people into this town of late because all adjacent parts are troubled with Armyes and soldiers sometimes those that belong to Arsuma Nague and sometimes those that belong to Rama Raja and when they are afraid they come hither, I dont know nor consider who they are, and while they live quietly and peaceably all strangers are alike wellcome, being not concerned in any warr and if anybody makes a disturbance hereabouts, I dont care for their company, and therefore many days agoe gave strict order never to suffer Gopall Naranda to returne hither, who it seems came in privately and went out againe, and has made a nois in the Countrey, yt: I have not the good fortune to know you but my servants all tell me yt: you are a very wise man and doe very well understand all this Countrey, you know our customs and manner of liveing that wee always give a free liberty for all men to come and goe and buy and sell as they please and dont inquier who they are and whence they come and whether they goe, and how can I act otherwise, If you were in my place what would you doe, Pray give me your advice and Continue our old freindship for this place and to mee.

2d: Wee are glad to hear you are in peace wth: all yor: Neighbours and desire you to doe your utmost Indeavors to Continue it wth: them, for our

Rt: Honble: Masters Interest there is not warr, unlesse forced thereto.

3d: Wee have laden the Maddapollam with Provisions and stores from England and Bengall wth: armes and Amunition Treasure &ca: Amots: as per invoice and bill of Ladeing Pagods: [lacuna] and allso sent upon her an Ensigne a Serjant & 12 soldiers, and Mr. Willson who was sent out to be Second to the Gov : at Bencoolen whome wee require you to receive accordingly and Mr. Butterfeild is to returne to us hither by ye: 1st ship if Mr. Fleetwood and Mr. Samuel Wilson shall be then liveing, Wee have allso sent Mr. John Vere who came out a writer for your place, and because wee know not wit: want of writers you may have, and knowing how hard it is to gett any out of England wee have entertained Robert Henderson and David Davis, as writers haveing taken their owne bonds and Comended them as such home, who you may make use of till our Masters pleasure is known concerning them and they have given security in England for their trust.

4th: By ye: Invoice you will see wee have supplyed you wth: 19680 5 of Mexicoe Dollars for to buy pepper to send hither the Sampson being now in Bengall and thought cannot be laden thence in March, therefore wee have ordered the Agent and Councill to send her away in March to you and would have you when she arrives with: you if you can fill her up with: pepper to the saltpetre she brings, to Compleat her ladeing and send her home to England from thence, but if you cannot procure pepper enough to compleat her ladeing yⁿ: send her to us to Madrasse wth: w^{tt}: pepper you can get w^{ch}: if you doe wee charge you not to keep her their nor the Maddapollam neither beyond the middle or at

the utmost the 20th July next.

5. private interest will sett up against this Publique Good.

Wee requier you to be very frugall in all sorts of your expences both in ye: Garrison and otherwise, for it is a vast expence and all out of Pockett whilst the warr in Europe hinders yt: trade yt: should bear it, & allso wee recommend to yo': great care the dilligent promoteing and raseing ye: Rt: Honbite: Compastrevenues in all things reasonable that may be lade without prejudice to the Good of the place, and the Commissary hopes you will so effectually performe it yt: he may find nothing at his Comeing thither to add to itt.

By the Pearle you rec⁴: 10 Maddagascar slaves by y^e: Tonqueen Merch^{*}: 100 & by y^e: Little Josia 100, a great Number w^{ch}: have cost y^e: Company a great Sum & y^e: they may be employ'd & Govrd: to advantage, wee recommend to you the Following Rules viz^e: The Slaves are to be constantly employed in some worke or other, according as they are fitt for it viz^e:

Some under Carpenters, Bricklayers, Smiths, Sawyers, &c*:, in makeing Bricks & Chinam In carrying Pepper &c*: Goods, & in y*: Cookroom to keep y*: Factory and Lodgeing roomes clean & sweet. In planting and gardening y*: ground being reported so fertile as to bare allmost anything wh: little tillage, for w**: purpose certain peices of Ground to be lade out for the maintenance of y**: selves & y*: rest of the slaves. Cutting or draining the swamp or Moorish ground under the Fort Hill.

Twenty or thirty as soldiers, but to be kept under very sevear and strict discipline & Comand, & never to have armes in their own keeping but when they

are in Exercise or upon duty.

10. Those that are perverse, surly and lazy or theirish or Comitt any other crime to be punisht wth: severity but without cruelty, But those that are dilligent willing to worke or doe any signall service, to be rewarded wth: some allowance of Wages, or better Cloths or Lodging &c*:

by Lines and greatify them in all their reasonable requests.

26. If Hoggs are offensive to the Malays lett them be kept in Compounds to

prevent their runing into the Malay Town.

27. Among the soldiers, Willis who came out a Serjant from England pretends to be a Carpenter & therefore wee have sent him, the otherwise not so fitt for your place being troublesome wn: in Drinke he has promised Reformation & if he proves sober, make use of his Carpenters art as you have occasion, but if he proves troublesome return him to us.
