## G. O. BY GOVERNMENT:

Ordered that the following Extract from the Honorable Company's General Letter in the Military Department dated the 16th June 1819, be republished in General Orders.

Para. 139. "In consequence of the numerous applications which have been preferred to us by our servants on leave of absence in this Country, for advances of money on loans, we think it proper to recal your attention to our Orders in the Military Department of the 26th February 1808, upon this subject.—Those Orders declared our determination not to make any pecuniary advances to Officers at home beyond what they are allowed by the existing Regulations of the Service, and you were required to publish them in General Order to the Army, but as a Resolution of this description, in order to be generally known to a body which is continually receiving an accession of new members should be occasionally republished, and being fully persuaded that a strict observance of this Resolution will prevent much trouble and inconvenience besides loss to the Company—We direct that our Orders above adverted to, be in future circulated for the information of the Army in the month of January in every year, and we shall take the necessary steps for reminding Officers who may arrive in England upon furlough of our determination upon the subject in question.

1st.—For disobedience of orders directing him to inspect the Horses of his Detachment, and to report such as were worn out, lame, or otherwise unfit for service, and for falsely reporting, as serviceable, the Horse of Ramjon Ally, Trooper 6th Rissallah.

2d.—For unofficerlike conduct in wilfully deceiving the Committee of Officers, assembled at Shajehanpore to inspect the Horses of the Detachment, by not producing the Horse of Ramjon Ally, which from the condition in which it was, he knew would be rejected.

3d.—For withholding, and applying to his private use, from the 14th of April, till late in May, the pay of his Detachment for February 1823, instead of immediately disbursing it, on its being received by him from the Collector's Treasury.

4th.—For withholding from Individuals a portion of their pay, even beyond the time specified in the preceding Count.

5th.—For disobedience of orders of the 14th May 1823, transmitted to him by his Commanding Officer in consequence of his unmilitary and disgraceful conduct, and directing him to send, without any delay, the Vakeel of the Rissallah, to Head Quarters.

6th.—For falsely denying the receipt of the forementioned Orders, and sending the Vakeel round to pay his out Posts instead of to the Head Quarters of the Corps.

7th.—For making stoppages, in disobedience of positive orders, from the men under his command.

8th.—For allowing Nabbee Bux, Trumpeter, to be absent from his duty without reporting it.

9th.—For allowing an Individual not in the Service to do duty as a substitute for Abdoollah Khan Trooper, such an act being in violation of the Articles of War.

10th.—For permitting men to go on leave of absence without authority, and without reporting the circumstance.

11th.—Disgracing his rank and situation by selling, or allowing to be sold, firewood and grass on his private account.

The whole or any part of such conduct being subversive of discipline, and derogatory to the character of a Native Officer.

Commander in Chief of all the Forces in India, &c. &c. &c. bearing date Head Quarters on the River, Berhampore, the twelfth day of July 1823, for the trial of Jacob Hammer, Fife Major of the 2d Battalion 4th Regiment Native Infantry, and all such Prisoners as may be brought before it.

For conduct highly unmilitary and unbecoming a soldier, in having early on the morning of the 23d May 1823, entered the house of a native woman named Mooniya, situated in the village of Khuerabad, Sultanpore (Oude), and there violently assaulting and severely wounding her with a sword. The same being in breach of the Articles of War.

*Remarks by the Commander in Chief.*

Although the Commander in Chief can entertain no doubt of the fact of Rumzaan Khan, having been privy to the atrocious attack laid in the foregoing charge, and consequently approves and confirms the finding and sentence of the Court; still, as the only material evidence adduced in support of the charge is that of his own confession, and as it appears that this confession was improperly obtained from the Prisoner, under the unauthorized promise of intercession for his pardon, The Commander in Chief feels that it would be inconsistent with strict justice to enforce, under these circumstances, the penalty awarded by the Court, and therefore directs that he be released from confinement and discharged from the Corps of which he has proved himself so unworthy a member.

3d " For having at the same time and place, on the occasion of the said Native Butcher expressing his intention of complaining to the General Officer Commanding the Division of the ill usage he had received, made use of the following expressions—you have no business to mention the General's name here, he has no business with my private affairs, or words to that effect—such conduct being highly disrespectful, and contemptuous to the authority of his superior Officer, and subversive of military discipline.

**FINDING.**—" The Court having maturely weighed the evidence for the Prosecution, and the matter which the Prisoner has alleged in his defence, is of opinion, that he is guilty of the 1st Charge, and that he is also guilty of the 2d Charge, with the exception of the words conduct unbecoming the character of an Officer and Gentleman.

" With respect to the 3d Charge, the Court is of opinion, that the prisoner is guilty of having used the words imputed to him, but acquits him of intentional disrespect.

Although the Commander in Chief concurs in the view of this case taken by the Court, still he is of opinion that there was so decided an irregularity on its part in admitting as Evidence the Proceedings of a Court of Award, which Court of Award had acted illegally in administering an oath (tho' at his own request) to Lieutenant Heriot, by which anomalous Proceeding, the prisoner is placed in the position of appearing as an Evidence on oath (and that oath illegally administered) against himself, that His Excellency has determined not to confirm the sentence of the General Court Martial.

Lieutenant Heriot is accordingly to be released from his arrest, but having more than sufficiently proved himself unfit to perform the duties of his station, and it having been represented to Sir Edward Paget by the Court that the state of his health is deplorable, he having been deprived of the use of both hands and feet by a paralytick affection, The Commander in Chief has decided to submit to Government his recommendation that he may be removed to the Invalid Pension List.

### G. O. BY GOVERNMENT.

The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to establish an Institution at the Head Quarters of the Artillery, for the purpose of completing the professional education of the Junior Officers of the Corps, and of imparting to the Non-commissioned and Privates of the Artillery, a certain degree of theoretical knowledge, in the duties of their profession.

2. The Officer appointed to the charge of this Institution will be designated "Director of the Artillery Depot of Instruction," and will have charge of the Repository of Models, and Drawings of all Ordnance Carriages, and Machinery attached to the Artillery, as well as the patterns of Stores of every description in use with that branch of the Service; the Institution to be formed, and conducted under the immediate orders and control of the Commandant of Artillery, according to a plan which has been approved of by Government.

3. This office will also be considered, the Repository of all Artillery experiments, and the proper place of record for all Artillery practice; and it will be an important part of the duty of the Director of the Depot, to arrange the results in such a manner as to be of most advantage, and of easiest access to the Officers of the Corps of Artillery; not only of such practice as may

now be on record at the Artillery Head Quarters, but such as may take place in future.

4. The Honorable the Governor in Council is further pleased to direct, that a permanent Select Committee of Artillery Officers, shall be established at this Presidency, assembling as occasion may require, to report upon such professional matters as may be submitted for their consideration.---The Committee to consist of the Principal Commissary of Stores, the Director of the Depot of Artillery Instruction, the Assistant Adjutant General of the Artillery, and the four Senior Officers of Artillery at the Mount, any five being a Committee; the Senior Officer sitting as President, and the Director of the Depot acting as Secretary, having the duty of recording all the Committee's proceedings in his Office.

5. The Commandant of Artillery will not be liable to sit upon this Committee, as he will necessarily be the channel of their reports to the Military Board, where he will always have an opportunity of recording his own sentiments, whether in concurrence or dissent; in the latter case the grounds of such dissent being always recorded at length.

6. The Military Board through the Commandant of Artillery, will be the channel of all references to the Select Committee, upon questions on which their report may be required whether originating, with superior authority or otherwise, and any reports required by the Military Board in the course of their own proceedings, will be procured in like manner. In order however to encourage enquiry and useful professional discussion amongst the Officers of the Corps of Artillery, an exception to this rule will be allowed in their favor, and any of them having improvements to bring forward, will accordingly be at liberty to apply as usual, to the Commandant of Artillery, who may refer the subject at once to the Select Committee, laying the result if necessary, before the Military Board with his own opinion; a mode which will afford every facility to the Officers of the Corps, without carrying the discussion beyond it, unless the advantage to the Service should be evident to the Select Committee, and the Commandant of Artillery.

7. No alterations of the Ordnance Carriages or Articles of Artillery or Magazine Equipment, will in future take place, without being previously reported on by the Select Committee, and in cases where the Military Board may be desirous of introducing changes contrary to the opinion of the Committee, a reference on the question at issue, will be made for the final decision of Government.

8. No part however of these Regulations or of the plan now generally approved of, is meant to give authority for the adoption of changes in the Ordnance Department, involving increased expense, without the previous sanction of Government.

9. The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to appoint Captain J. H. Frith, of the Artillery to be Director of the Artillery Depot of Instruction, on the allowances of a Commissary of the first Class and the Full Batta of his rank; with the following Establishment, viz.

and when any men are ordered by the Commander in Chief to receive dry batta in full, in lieu of provisions on indent, they are to be paid at the rate of 3 fanams 30 cash per diem, on the bills for dry batta being signed by the Commanding Officer of the Company and Corps, with a receipt annexed according to the usual form, which voucher, with a copy of the order of the Commander in Chief for the payment of such batta, is to accompany the bill of the Commissary."

8.—Officers in Command of Corps and Detachments, or in charge of Departments, will accordingly be entitled to indent on the Commissariat for these articles in the above proportions, with exception of the Hammocks, which will be shipped by the Commissariat and placed in charge of the Commanders of the Transports.—The Indents are required to be sent to the Quarter Master General of the Army, to be checked and passed, when the articles will be issued to Corps, Detachments and Departments, before their embarkation, under such arrangements as may be made for that purpose by His Excellency the Commander in Chief.

9.—The Commanders of the Transports are held responsible for the Custody and Expenditure of the Provision Stores embarked on board of their respective Ships, and will receive from the Officer Commanding the Troops Daily Indents for the daily issues, which indents will specify the number of Troops and of Followers, whether Public or Private, and the gross quantities of each article required for each description of persons. The Commanders of the Transports are required to issue the gross quantities included in these daily indents, to such persons as may be appointed by the Senior Officer on Board, to receive them, for the European and Native Troops, and for the Public and private Followers; the sub-division, or detailed distribution, of which to the parties concerned, will be conducted by those persons under such arrangement as may be found most convenient for the purpose, by the Commanding Officer.

10.—Commanding Officers of the Troops on board of the Transports will be answerable for the correctness of the gross quantities indented for, agreeably to the Forms and Tables of Rations which will be communicated to them for their guidance by the Commissary General, who will likewise furnish

the necessary instructions to the Commanders of Transports for their guidance, in conducting the expenditure of the Provision Stores, and in keeping an account of the same.

# GENERAL ORDERS,

*By His Excellency The Commander in Chief.*

HEAD QUARTERS : CHOULTRY PLAIN,

3D APRIL 1824.

His Excellency the Commander in Chief is pleased to direct that the following Regulations shall be at all times strictly observed by Troops embarking for Foreign Service from this Presidency:

There is no situation in which the Troops more urgently require the personal superintendence and care of their Officers, or in which the strictest conformity to Regulations is more indispensibly necessary than on board Ship.

No Officer is, under any pretence whatever, to quit his Ship without the sanction of the Officer Commanding on board.

No Officer is to sleep out of his Ship, without special leave (if a Battalion is embarked) of the Commanding Officer; if only a Detachment, of the General or other Officer under whose direction the embarkation takes place.

The Command on board each Vessel will of course be vested in the Senior Officer, to whatever branch of Service he may belong, and he is equally bound to exercise that Command, and is equally responsible for any breach of discipline which may occur, whether the Officers and Men embarked with him belong to the same Corps with himself, or are Detachments from different Corps:

It is advisable that every Soldier on embarking, except for short passages, should be provided with a coarse canvass frock, or other fatigue-dress, to wear while on board.

As soon as the Troops are on board, and before they are dismissed, the Commanding Officer is to see that the arms and accoutrements are deposited in the racks which are fitted up for their reception, and that the accoutrements are placed in order over the Men's Births; if cleats or slings are not already prepared to fix them, they must be immediately put up.

The Officer in Command of the Troops embarked on board each Transport, will use every precaution to prevent the arm-racks being damaged or destroyed, and will give to, and receive from the Master, a certificate of the state of the arm-racks upon his disembarkation.

The Men (Europeans and Natives) must be allotted to Births, regularly by Companies, and their Packs, Caps or Turbands must be hung up near their Births; while this arrangement is making, Europeans are to be divided into Messes, after which each Man is to be shewn his Birth.—The Commanding Officer will not permit on any account, any interference with the food of the Natives—He will personally attend to this essential duty and see that every Man gets the Provisions which have been ordered:

In instances where Troops embark under circumstances which render it necessary that they should keep their ammunition in their Pouches, the greatest caution is to be observed—the quantity of ammunition left in the Pouches should be limited by circumstances, the reserve ammunition is to be in custody of the Commanding Officer, and the Pouches themselves are to be carefully secured; each Man's near his own Birth.

The Non-Commissioned Officers and Men (European and Natives) on board each Transport are to be divided into two or three Watches, one of which is to be constantly on Deck, with at least one Subaltern Officer having the charge of the Watch.

An Officer of the Day is to be appointed on board each Transport—It is his particular and immediate duty to see all orders obeyed, and every Regulation for Troops on board Transports carried into effect—This Officer is likewise to be considered as the Officer of the Guard—When the numbers embark

ed will permit it, a Captain of the Day is to be appointed, to whom the Officer of the Day, and the Subaltern Officer of the Watch, will report all extraordinaries for the Commanding Officer's information.

A Guard, the strength of which will be in proportion to the number of Soldiers embarked, or regulated by the Sentries required, must mount every morning at nine o'clock.---In Harbour and at Sea, in fine weather, the Guard will be exercised with arms previously to marching off, such Sentries are to be furnished as the security of the Vessel, and the maintenance of order, shall require---In Harbour, the Sentries upon Deck are to mount with their Arms; at Sea, with their Bayonets only.

The Men of each Watch are to be appointed to Stations, so that they best assist the Sailors in working the Vessel. The Non-Commissioned Officers and soldiers not belonging to the Watch are to be ordered below, when required by the Master of the Transport, in order that they may not impede the working of the Ship.

The Officer Commanding on board each Transport must make an arrangement in concert with the Master of the Vessel, for Quartering his Men, so that in case of alarm either from Fire, or an Enemy, every Man may in an instant repair to his station---In making this distribution, the Commanding Officer must be careful not to have too many Men upon Deck---those who are not wanted at the Guns or cannot conveniently be employed with small arms, or in assisting the Sailors, are to be formed as a reserve between Decks.

The Troops are to parade at o'clock A. M. (the Europeans without shoes and stockings in warm weather) when every Man must appear as clean as his situation will allow, his hands, face, and feet washed, and his hair combed; they are to parade again at half an hour before sun set.

The Cooks attached to Europeans are to appear clean on parade once a day.

In warm weather the frequent washing of every part of the body is strongly enjoined as an essential requisite to the preservation of health---when circumstances will admit of it, two large tubs are to be fixed upon the Forecastle for this purpose---When this accommodation cannot be obtained, Buckets of water being poured over the body will prove an efficient substitute.

The European soldiers are to wash, comb and brush their heads every morning; they are to be shaved, and put on clean shirts twice a week at least; and it is essential that they should be furnished with the means of changing their clothes when wet.

It is also of great importance to the health of Native soldiers to encourage cleanness in their persons and clothes as much as possible.

Great attention is to be paid to the cleanliness of the Privies; Buckets of water are to be thrown down frequently in the day to prevent the soil from sticking to the sides of the Ships.

The Bedding is to be brought upon Deck every morning, if the weather will permit by o'clock, and to be well aired.

The Bedding being brought up, the Men are to proceed in sweeping, scrubbing, and scraping the Births and Decks; the upper Decks are to be washed every morning by the morning Watch, previous to the Bedding being brought up, but no washing between Decks is to take place oftener than once a fortnight, and then only when the weather is dry.

The Boards of the Lower Births to be removed once or twice a week, to admit of cleaning under them.

The Officer of the Day is to be always present, and directing, at the cleaning of the Births, &c. and when this duty has been performed, he is to report to the Captain of the Day, or to the Commanding Officer.

At Dinner time, the Officer of the Day is to attend to see that the European Soldiers are regular at their Messes; that their liquor is mixed with at least three parts of water to one of spirit; and should he observe any circumstance of neglect in victualling the Troops, he is to report the same to the Officer

Commanding on board, who, if necessary, will make his complaint thereupon, as also on any other matters touching the conduct of the Masters of the Vessels to the Officer Commanding the Division. Minutes of all these circumstances should be taken by the Commanding Officer, and kept by him.

The greatest care is to be taken that the Coppers be well and regularly cleaned, both before and after use.

Every precaution is to be taken to prevent any liquor from being brought on board for the purpose of being disposed of among the Men.

At Sun-set the Bedding is to be taken down, and at any time during the day, on the appearance of bad weather.

At 8 o'clock in the evening every man is to be in his Birth, except the Men on Guard and of the Watch; the Officer of the Day to go round with a Lantern, to see that the above has been complied with.

With a view of preventing accidents from fire, a sentry is constantly to be placed at the Cooking place or Caboose, or one on each side, if the number of soldiers on board the Vessel is sufficient, with orders not to allow fire of any kind to be taken without permission.

All Lights are to be extinguished at eight o'clock at night, except the lights over which there may be Sentries; a report of this order being complied with is to be regularly made at the time to the Commanding Officer by the Officer of the Day; the Officers' Lights to be extinguished at ten o'clock, unless the Commanding Officer on board should give his permission occasionally for a longer time, which, however, he is only to grant in cases of sickness or other emergency.

No smoking is to be allowed between decks, or any lights among the men, except in lanterns.

For the sake of Exercise, the Troops should occasionally be required to repair to their respective Quarters by the beat to arms.—Such portion of the troops as are quartered to Guns should be frequently instructed and practised in that exercise.

The Arms and Accoutrements must be inspected frequently. The locks and barrels must be greased, and care taken to prevent their contracting rust, to which, at Sea, they are particularly liable.

The troops must be inspected in Marching Order once in each week, when the Officers will see that their necessaries are properly packed, and the packs well put on, and ascertain that the whole of their appointments are kept in serviceable order.

The frequent fumigation of the Ship is deemed highly material, in order to prevent mischief from confined air.

For fumigation, the following ingredients are required:—Common Salt, four ounces; Oxide of Manganese in powder, one ounce; Sulphuric Acid, one fluid ounce; and Water, two fluid ounces. The water and acid must be mixed together, and then poured over the other ingredients in a bason, which should be placed in a chatty of hot sand.

During voyages in hot weather, the most beneficial effects are derived from the use of wind sails. The Master of the Transport should be desired to have them made immediately, if not already provided, and they should be constantly hung up. These sails throw a stream of cold air between decks, and it is not an unusual practice amongst the men, at least amongst inexperienced soldiers, to tie up the bottom of them, by which this salutary purpose is defeated. The serjeant of the watch must be responsible that this irregularity is never committed.

Officers are enjoined to pay the strictest attention to prevent the Men sleeping on Deck in the warm weather, which they are very apt to do. This practice is generally productive of Fevers and Fluxes.

Exercise being indispensibly necessary for the preservation of health, every encouragement must be given to the Men to use such as may be found practicable, but as the space on board a Transport does not admit of the whole of the Troops receiving a due portion of exercise, the Commanding Officer

will cause them (Europeans and Natives) by squads of twenty or more, to move round the vessel in double-quick-time, each squad for ten or twelve minutes, so that the whole may receive a certain degree of exercise. This is to be practised when circumstances will permit, for an hour in the forenoon, and for the same time in the afternoon.

When in Harbour, if no danger is to be apprehended from sharks, the Troops may be permitted to bathe, provided a Boat, manned, be at hand for the purpose of attending to the Bathers, only ten of whom are to be allowed to be in the water at the same time, and those upon the same side of the ship with the Boat: without this precaution no man must be allowed to bathe from on board.

The Surgeon or Assistant Surgeon is to examine the Men at morning Parade, (Europeans and Natives), and to observe whether there be any appearance of disease in any of them.

The sick are to be separated from those in health as much as possible: upon the first appearance of any acute infectious disorder, the signal is to be made to the Hospital Ship, and the diseased Man removed to her.

The requisite Medical comforts are placed on board of Transports, and are to be considered as intended solely for the use of the sick, or convalescent soldiers embarked.

The articles are placed under the charge of the Medical Officer on board, who on arrival at his destination, is to account for the same, through the Senior Medical Officer at the station, to the Superintending Surgeon of the Division.

It is the duty of the Medical Officers to guard the Men, against costiveness, and as on the arrival of the Transports at any Port, a great number of Canoes usually come off with fruit, plantains, &c. generally very green and bad, the European soldiers are not to be allowed to buy such trash, and should only be supplied with fruit and vegetables, as the Medical Officer on board may deem proper.

If the European soldiers are cleanly, well messed, and attended to in the several particulars above directed, every reasonable hope may be entertained of their continuance in health.

Regularity and decency of conduct, which are on all occasions highly estimable in the Military Character are particularly requisite on board of ship; and it is the duty of the Commanding Officer to repress, by the most decided and summary measures, any tendency to insubordination, and to check every species of immorality and vice, and to discountenance to the utmost of his power, in any individual under his Command, whatever may disturb the comfort of others, or interrupt the harmony and good understanding which should subsist on board.

The foregoing Regulations cannot be so properly concluded, as by most earnestly recommending to the Officer Commanding on board each Ship in which European Troops may be embarked to cause Divine Service to be performed on every Sunday when the weather will permit. In case there be no Clergyman on board, the Commanding Officer is to perform this duty, or to commit it to some intelligent and respectable Officer. Independent of the strong reason which, in a religious view, demands the discharge of so important and sacred a duty, the regular performance of Divine Service has ever been found to produce and promote cleanliness and good order among the European soldiery.

The Regulations of the Service dispense with the Muster of Camp Equipage and Carriage when on Foreign Service without prejudice to the Tent Allowance of Officers.

The Troops European and Native, will receive Rations agreeably to a Table which has been published in Government Orders.

When Troops are embarked on board of Ships of War, or other ships regularly commissioned, the Officers and soldiers, (Europeans and Natives) from the time of Embarkation, are (as enjoined by the 23d. Section of the Articles of War) to conform themselves strictly to the Regulations established for

the government and discipline of the Ship in which they are embarked, and to consider themselves as under the Command of the Senior Officer of the Ship, as well as of the Superior Officer of the Fleet (if any) to which such Ship belongs.

European and Native soldiers embarked on board Transports are under the Command of their respective Officers, and are to be punished by order of the Military Commanding Officer only. Every attention is to be paid to the request of the Commanders of Transports, who will always apply to the Commanding Officers for assistance, and although the Native Troops are not to be forced to assist in working the Ships (unless on emergency) the Commanding Officer on board will encourage them to assist and promote harmony and good will between the Soldiers and Sailors as much as possible.

We have the honor to report, that agreeably to the instructions contained in the letter of the Adjutant General to our address of the 17th instant, we proceeded to the examination of Lieutenant Chalmers of the 1st Battalion 11th Regiment N. I.

The usual tasks being assigned to Mr. Chalmers, both were speedily performed in a most satisfactory manner—The translation from English into Hindostanee exhibited a knowledge of Grammar and a command of Language which entitle Mr. Chalmers to a place amongst the first class of our Hindostanee Scholars—It was indeed executed in so masterly a manner, as would have reflected credit even on an experienced Moonshee: and in neither of the translations were we able to detect an error of any description—The writing of Mr. Chalmers also in the Persian Character is particularly good.

Mr. Chalmers expresses himself with considerable fluency, but his pronunciation is perhaps not quite sufficiently distinct.

2. Commanding, Staff and Field Officers, when entitled to

Puckallies, are authorized to draw the established Pay and Batta on their account, without being required to muster those followers.

3. The regulation under which European and Native Commissioned Officers receive the pay of the advanced Rank on Regimental promotion, from the date of the Casualties to which they succeed, is extended to the European and Native non-commissioned Ranks of all Corps.

4. When the established Medical allowances on account of Troops and followers, may be drawn by Medical Officers whose appointment or nomination to such medical charge may not have been communicated to the office of Audit, the Military Auditor General is authorized notwithstanding to pass their charges on the countersignature (to the Abstracts) of Commanding or Staff Officers, who will be held responsible that the Medical Officers were in regular charge, and performed the duties during the period drawn for---this provision is not however to prevent the usual reports of Medical appointments being made by Commanding Officers for the confirmation of His Excellency the Commander in Chief.

5. The 2d Paragraph, Page 74 of the code of Pay Regulations prescribing that a copy of the authority, under which Deserters are received and brought on the strength of Corps shall be forwarded to the Office of Audit with the Regimental Abstracts is rescinded; and the Military Auditor General is authorized to pass the regulated charges on their account altho' supernumerary to the establishment, on the authority of the Muster Rolls specifying that the Men have been received from Desertion; but the sanction of His Excellency the Commander in Chief is, notwithstanding, to be obtained as heretofore without which the Deserters are not to be brought on the returns.

6. Questions having arisen regarding the right of Officers, when proceeding on service by Sea, to draw for the periods of being on board Ship the established allowances on account of Regimental Messes, and for carriage of Treasure, of Regimental and Battalion Books, and of Medicines, the Honorable the Governor in Council, is pleased to authorize those charges, it being presumed that the Officers concerned incur expenses connected therewith preparatory to the service on which they may be employed.

7. The Commanding Officer's Certificate that a well regulated Mess has been established as prescribed by the 27th Paragraph, Page 372 of the Code of Pay Regulations to be forwarded each month with the Regimental Abstracts of Corps in support of the charge of Mess allowance is dispensed with, in cases of Field and Foreign Service; but Commanding Officers of Corps will be held responsible that the allowance is not drawn unless a regular Mess is kept up.

8. That part of the 13th Paragraph, Page 238 of the Code of Pay Regulations which directs the names of Horsekeepers and Grasscutters attached to European and Native Regiments of Cavalry to be inserted in the Muster Rolls is rescinded, and it will be sufficient in future that the aggregate numbers of each are included in the Abstract Muster Rolls.

1. The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to publish the following additional regulations in continuation of those contained in the General Order of the 30th ultimo, on the subject of rations.

### TABLE OF RATIONS FOR HORSES ON BOARD SHIP.

Hay or Straw.....	14 lbs.....	For each Horse per diem.
Chenna or Paddy....	4 Seers.....	Do. Do.
Water.....	5 Gallons..	Do. Do.
Horse Buckets.....	1.....	For every two Horses.

N. B.—As black Pepper may occasionally be necessary for the health of the horses, a proportion not exceeding half an ounce for each horse, for every day's forage ordered to be embarked will be shipped for their use.

2. The subsistence of horses being private property, is to be paid for by the owners, at the rate of one Rupee a day, and the amount is to be recovered by stoppages in the usual manner.

3. Native Followers allowed to be attached to Native Commissioned Officers and Sepoys, and to European Non-commissioned Rank and File, and all public Office Servants not being *Europeans*, Conicopolies, &c. are to receive rations on Ship board, the same as the Native Troops, and gratis.

4. Rations will also be issued to private Servants on Ship board in the same proportions as allowed to the Native Troops, but are required to be paid for, at the rate of four Annas daily, for each person; the amount being recoverable from the Officers to whom the servants belong, by stoppages; rolls of such followers and of the Officers to whom they are attached, being furnished to the Paymaster by the Senior Officer of the Troops on board of each Transport.

5. As in the course of service cases of emergency may happen when the European Commissioned and Warrant Officers may find it impracticable to supply themselves with provisions on shore, they will be permitted, in such cases only, to draw from the Commissariat, the same daily rations as are allowed to the European Troops, paying for the same at the rate of 8 Annas per diem.—The Officers to whom rations may so be issued will be included in the usual victualling Registers furnished from the Commissariat to the Pay Department, in order that the amount may be recovered from the parties.

6. Office Servants and private Followers in like manner, may sometimes find it impracticable to subsist themselves, on shore, and they will be permitted also, in such cases of actual emergency, to receive one Seer of rice daily from the Commissariat Stores, upon Indents from the Corps or Departments to which they belong. The private followers allowed to the Native Troops and to the European Non-Commissioned Rank and File and who *bona fide* embarked with them from India, and Office Servants, will receive that allowance, gratis; but the private followers of Officers, Commissioned or Warrant, will pay for this issue at the usual rate on field service, viz. One Fanam (or Anna & Pice 2½) per seer, the amount being recoverable from the parties to whom such followers belong—on no occasion however will Officers be entitled to draw rice for their private servants beyond the following numbers, viz.

The Honorable the Governor in Council has been pleased to establish the following Regulations for the Regimental Pay Department of Corps of the Company's Service.

2. All Pay and allowances at the Head Quarters of Corps are to be drawn by the Regimental Paymasters, whose duty it also is to procure and forward to Station, Division, and Field Paymasters, as the cases may be, the regular vouchers and explanations in reply to objectionable charges and retrenchments from the abstracts of their Corps---to pay particular attention that the replies so forwarded, (which are in all cases to be countersigned by the Officer Commanding), are competent to remove the objections made to the charges---and to superintend generally the whole Pay Department of their Corps.

3. Regimental Paymasters are to consider it their duty to ascertain, and bring forward all just claims of the Non-commissioned Rank and File within the regulated periods, in order to prevent their being forfeited by delays, whether arising from the ignorance or inattention, of the parties immediately concerned.

4. The receipts (in words at length) to the abstracts of Regimental Paymasters, and all Officers drawing the Pay of Troops, Companies, &c. are not merely to be signed, but written entirely by those Officers; and, in order further to guard against the interpolation of unauthorized charges in the general Abstracts, or alterations in the figures to encrease

their totals, (several instances of which have occurred), it is directed that an abstract statement in the form given in the margin shall be annexed to each general Monthly Pay Abstract.

5. Every regimental Paymaster is, in future, to receive the Pay of his Corps at the Station or Field Pay Officer in person (assisted by the Vakeel), taking a list of the coins in which it is paid---Officers Commanding Detachments who draw the pay of Troops, Companies, &c. are likewise to attend at the Pay Offices to receive the amount in person; and Division, and Field Paymasters are accordingly directed not to issue the Pay of Corps or Detachments, except to the Officers in person who pass their receipts for the amount.

6. On receipt of the monthly pay of Corps, regimental Paymasters are to make immediate reports to their Commanding Officers specifying the amount and the coins, with their rates, in which the Abstracts have been discharged, which coins are to be paid at the same rates to Officers Commanding Troops, Companies, &c. and those issued to each invariably recorded in the regimental Paymaster's Books.

7. When the receipt of the pay of a Corps shall have been reported, as above directed, Commanding Officers are to order the personal attendance of the Officers in charge of Troops, Companies, &c. at the office of the Regimental Paymaster, in order to receive the amount drawn for each---and it is specially required of Commanding Officers to enforce uniform attention to this and the foregoing provisions.

8. The Governor in Council considers it necessary to direct the most particular attention of regimental Paymasters to the Family Certificate Department of their Corps, and to declare them responsible for the amount of any deficiencies in the stoppages, to be made on that account except in the case of casualties or other unavoidable prevention.

9. In order further to ensure a strict observance of these provisions monthly reports, for regimental record, are to be made by all Regimental Paymasters, to their immediate Commanding Officers, of the stoppages brought to public credit in each month on account of Family Payments; and, if deficient of the amount of the Family Certificates, their reports are to contain the most particular detailed account of such deficiency, with the requisite explanations in reference to the instructions of the Superintendent of Family Payments applicable to the contingencies which may have prevented the recovery of the amount.

10. It is considered necessary on this occasion, to make known that the aggregate Staff Pay and allowances granted to Quarter Masters of Corps of the Company's Service are considered by Government as a remuneration equally for their duties in the Pay Department, as for those in their capacities of Interpreter and Quarter Master.

Para. 1. The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to establish the following Regulations in the Medical Department for the Troops proceeding on Foreign Service.

2. Surgeons of European Corps are authorized to draw one Anna and three Pice per man per day for the strength of their Corps including those only (Officers and Men) who embark with them.

3. Surgeons of European Regiments and Surgeons of Field Hospitals are authorized to indent on the Commissariat for provisions and firewood for the number of European sick in Hospital—to be paid for at the rates issued to the Troops.

Companies, 5 Lascars,  
Native Corps, 4 do.

4. Store Lascars from the Ordnance Department as detailed in the margin being allotted to European and Native Corps and Detachments for the Carriage of Medicines, the allowances authorized by the existing Regulations on that account are not to be drawn by the Medical Officers in charge.

5. If on the landing of the Troops in the Country to which they are proceeding, the Carriage as above detailed should be found insufficient, it will be the duty of the Medical Officers to represent the case to the Superintending Surgeon in order that the subject may be brought under the consideration of the Officer Commanding the Force, who will authorize such further assistance in this respect as may be found requisite either by additional public carriage or an allowance in money to be drawn by the Medical Officers on that account, according as circumstances may render most expedient.

6. Regarding the sick of His Majesty's Regiments and of the Madras European Regiment, who may not proceed with their corps on foreign Service—those who may be placed in Garrison Hospital on the embarkation of their Regiments are to be drawn for by the Garrison Surgeon until discharged therefrom at the established rate of six Annas and ten pice per Man per day as public charges—all the others as well as the Men in Hospital when discharged therefrom are to be drawn for at the established (sick and well) rate of one Anna and one Pice per day.

O. of the 9th instant for the conduct of Regimental Paymasters of the Honorable Company's Service in regard to Family Certificates are to be considered in every respect applicable to the Paymasters of the King's Regiments proceeding on Foreign Service, and the particular attention of the Officers Commanding is accordingly enjoined to the important duty directed by those provisions.

**GENERAL ORDERS,****HEAD QUARTERS,****CHOULTRY PLAIN,***April 1824.***G. O. BY THE COMMANDER IN CHIEF.**

The following Extracts from General Orders issued by His Excellency the Commander in Chief in India, are by His Excellency's Orders published to the Army serving under this Presidency.

Extract from the Proceedings of an European General Court Martial assembled at Secrole, Benares, on Monday the 29th September 1823, in pursuance of instructions and by virtue of an order from His Excellency General The Honorable Sir Edward Paget, G. C. B. Commander in Chief of all the Forces in India for the trial of Major John Staples Harriot, 2d Regiment Native Infantry.

*President.*—Major General Thomas Brown, Commandant of Buxar.

*Deputy Judge Advocate General*—Lieutenant J. Hamilton.

*Interpreter.*—Captain Fell, 10th Regiment N. I.

**CHARGES** preferred against Major J. S. Harriot, 2d Regiment Native Infantry:

1st.—For oppression and cruelty to the Invalids placed under his Command particularly in the following instances, viz. in having on or about the month of December 1822 used cruel and illegal methods of punishment to European and Native Soldiers by chaining them to a Log, or holding out threats to do so, in having, on or about the month of April 1823, persisted in compelling Gunga Deen Dhoobie, Sepoy 1st Company 2d Battalion Native Invalids (tho' incapacitated by the loss of the use of his right hand) to perform military duty in the full dress of a regular soldier, and having by a harassing and vexatious system, driven the said Gunga Deen Dhoobie, after a service of 18 years, to take his discharge from the Invalid Establishment; also in having on or about the same period harassed and annoyed some of the Pioneer Corps and old men from the Gun-Lascars, by compelling them to attend drill with Musquets, and Arms, which they never had been accustomed to.

2d.—For disobedience of orders in having on or about the month of April 1823 interfered with the half Mounting of the Invalids, and endeavoured to effect a change by directing that various articles of Dress should be made up according to particular patterns shewn on parade.

3d.—For having on or about the middle of December last compelled helpless and maimed European Invalids to do duty, although they presented certificates, signed by the Garrison Surgeon, of their incapacity and inability to do so, also for forcing the individuals of the Pension Company to do military duty, tho' labouring under paralytic affections, blindness and other causes rendering them physically unfit for such employment.

4th.—For encouraging inebriation among the Men by granting them on or about the months of December and January last, orders on the Commissariat Store for large quantities of Liquor, without discrimination, and by giving them passes to cross the Jergoo to procure deleterious spirits in unlimited quantities.

5th.—For on or about the month of December 1822 and January 1823 punishing men for intoxication after having given them encouragement and opportunity to get drunk, also for punishing men illegally, and refusing to allow their conduct to be investigated by a Court Martial.

6th.—For scandalous and infamous conduct unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman in having repeatedly between the 2d of November 1822 and 1st May 1823, used opprobrious and abusive language to the European Soldiers under his command comparing them to Pariah Dogs, styling them skulkers, shamers, who ought to be doing duty in the Field, malingerers and not worthy of the name of Soldiers—also occasionally shaking a stick in their faces, and violently threatening them, thereby exciting a degree of irritation in their minds, highly prejudicial to the Service; all of which Charges or any part of them being in breach of the Articles of War.

**ADDITIONAL CHARGES** preferred by Lieutenant Colonel Robertson against Major J. S. Harriot, 2d Regiment Native Infantry.

For gross contempt of my station as Commanding Officer of the Garrison of Chunar, and for conduct unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman in the following instances.

1st. For falsely asserting in a letter dated 15th September 1823 and addressed to Captain Baldock, M.B. Benares, that I had encouraged men under his Command "not only to make every possible unfounded complaint, and to state every imaginary grievance without the power of a reply on his part, but to dispute his authority afterwards as their Commanding Officer."

2d. For accusing me in the abovementioned letter of abuse of authority, and imputing dishonorable motives to me his superior Officer, by stating, as follows, "where an Officer in Command of this Garrison and Station thus uses the temporary power committed to his charge, the ends of substantial justice can never be answered, and in thus sending for men by scores at a time in order by private examination at his own house to encourage these men to come forward not on their own account certainly but merely to establish, if possible, something like a case to support those groundless allegations with which he has voluntarily come forward without the slightest consideration."

3d. For having in the same letter falsely and maliciously insinuated and stated as follows, "for Lieutenant Colonel Robertson has no right to adopt such arbitrary and in Military Annals unheard of measures as that of privately inviting every possible complaint against me on the part of acknowledged malingerers, drunkards and idlers, whom it is his duty as much as my own to restrain, using his present temporary and personal authority to the former purpose alone; while he has issued an order to Captains Weston and Jeffries (if I understand them right) not to allow me to make a reference to any one official document or book contained in my late Office," all and every part of which conduct being disgraceful to the character of an officer and a gentleman, and in breach of the Articles of War.

**SENTENCE.**—The Court having maturely weighed the whole of the evidence before it, together with what the Prisoner has urged in his defence, is of opinion—That he is not guilty of the 1st charge.—That he is not guilty of the 2d charge.—That he is guilty in a lesser degree of the 3d charge in as much as Guaner Gall was compelled by him to do duty which he from his infirmities was unequal to.—That he is not guilty of the 4th charge.—That he is not guilty of the 5th charge.—That he is not guilty of the 6th charge.

With respect to the Additional Charges.

That he is guilty of the 1st charge.

That he is guilty of the 2d charge.

That he is guilty of the 3d charge.

The Court having found the Prisoner guilty in part of the 3d original charge, and of the three (3) Additional Charges, but not to the extent contemplated by the 20th Article of the 12th Section of the Company's Articles of War, does sentence him (the late Major now) Lieutenant Colonel John Staples Harriot, 32d Regiment Native Infantry to be suspended from rank and pay for six (6) calendar months, and to be reprimanded in such manner by The Commander in Chief as His Excellency shall deem proper.

In confirming the foregoing sentence The Commander in Chief finds it necessary to make the following remarks.

The XXth Article of the XIIIth Section of the Act of the 21st of George the Second for the Punishment of Mutiny and Desertion, &c. enacts that whatsoever "Commissioned Officer shall be convicted before a General Court Martial of behaving in a scandalous infamous manner, such as is unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, shall be discharged from the Service."

By the finding and sentence of the Court upon the Additional Charges the Commander in Chief is led to infer, that altho' Lieutenant Colonel Harriot is adjudged guilty of a high breach of subordination, he nevertheless is not considered to have behaved in a scandalous infamous manner, such as is unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, and consequently that the falsehood and malice imputed in these charges (which are the most un-officer-like and most ungentlemanlike of crimes) fall to the ground.

With this understanding of the Court's intention in introducing the words, "but not to the extent contemplated by the 20th Article," The Commander in Chief has not hesitated to confirm the sentence.

He should be very glad to stop here, but circumstances of this case render it necessary to state that the loose and disorderly habits of the Invalids, and especially the European, stationed at Chunar were so shamefully notorious, as to induce the late Commander in Chief to select Lieutenant Colonel Harriot as a fit Officer to correct and reform these abuses.

A more difficult and irksome duty could not have been imposed upon an Officer, and it is with pain that the Commander in Chief is compelled to add, that if Lieutenant Colonel Harriot had received from the Commandant of the Garrison that countenance and support in his labours which he had a right to expect at his hands, he has little doubt that success would have crowned his efforts.

Of the six original charges preferred by Lieutenant Colonel Robertson against Lieutenant Colonel Harriot, the Prisoner is most properly acquitted of five, and with respect to the remaining Charge the Court has found, "that he is guilty in a lesser degree of the 3d charge, in as much as Gunner Gall was compelled by him to do duty which he from his infirmities was unequal to." For this and for the offences contained in the three Additional Charges, Lieutenant Colonel Harriot is sentenced to six months suspension and to be reprimanded in such manner, as the Commander in Chief shall deem proper.

The Commander in Chief is satisfied, that if Lieutenant Colonel Harriot knowingly and wilfully compelled a man to perform a duty which he from

his infirmities was, unequal to, the recollection of such a fact will occasion to him a much more severe pang than any censure of his could inflict.

With respect to the letter to Brigade Major Baldock on which the three additional charges are founded, the Commander in Chief thinks it necessary in the most unqualified terms to express his marked disapprobation and condemnation of the intemperate language in which that letter was couched, but in consideration of Lieutenant Colonel Harriot's contrition at having penned it, of his having requested to withdraw it, and to apologize to Lieutenant Colonel Robertson for its contents, and in further consideration of the grievous difficulties with which he had to contend in the execution of his arduous duties in the Garrison of Chunar, His Excellency is pleased to remit that part of the sentence which awards the suspension for six months from rank and pay.

**CHARGES** against Captain Ringsted Plantagenet Field of the Corps of European Invalids and Fort Adjutant at Buxar.

For scandalous infamous conduct, such as is unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, in the following instances.

1st. In having towards the latter end of last year, or the beginning of the present (1823), in direct disobedience to the Orders and Regulations of the Bengal Army laid himself under pecuniary obligations to William Jackson, Garrison Serjeant at Buxar, in the following transactions, viz.

First. In borrowing from the said Serjeant Jackson a sum of money to the amount of eleven hundred (1100) Rupees, or thereabouts, for which he granted a Promissory Note to the said Serjeant Jackson, which Note was taken up and discharged by him (Captain Field) on or about the 4th of August last, subsequent to certain complaints having been preferred against him by the Serjeant.

Second. In borrowing from the said Serjeant Jackson several articles of household Furniture

Third. In borrowing from the said Serjeant Jackson the sum of three thousand (3000) Rupees, or a considerable portion of that amount, with which he purchased a Bungalow of which he pretended to be, and for some time was the ostensible proprietor, though he had subscribed an acknowledgment that it was the property of the said Serjeant Jackson.

2d. In having, about the month of January last, seduced and violated the person of Barbara Jackson, daughter of Serjeant William Jackson, the said Barbara Jackson being at the time residing in or frequently visiting at Captain Field's House at the particular request of, and in attendance upon, Mrs. Field his own wife.

3d. In having, at various periods subsequent to such violation

and seduction administered and attempted to administer and endeavoured to persuade the said Barbara Jackson to take certain deleterious drugs and potions with the criminal intention of thereby procuring abortion.

All and every part of such conduct being in violation of good order and military discipline and in breach of the Articles of War.

The Court having maturely weighed and considered the evidence adduced, with what the prisoner has urged in his defence, is of opinion, with respect to the first count of the first charge, that he is guilty "of borrowing from the said Serjeant Jackson a sum of eleven hundred (1100) Rupees, or thereabouts, for which he granted a Promissory Note to the said Serjeant Jackson, which note was taken up, and discharged by him (Captain Field) on or about the 4th of August last," but acquits him of scandalous infamous conduct, such as is unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, also of acting in direct disobedience to the orders and regulations of the Bengal Army.

That he is guilty of the 2d count of the first charge, viz. "In borrowing from the said Serjeant Jackson several Articles of Household furniture" but acquits him of scandalous infamous conduct such as is unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, also of acting in direct disobedience to the orders and regulations of the Bengal Army.

That he is not guilty of the 3d count of the 1st charge.

That he is not guilty of the second charge, and honorably acquits him of it.

That he is not guilty of the third charge, and honorably acquits him of it.

The Court having found the Prisoner Captain R. P. Field of the European Invalid Establishment, guilty of the first count of the first charge, and of the 2d count of the first charge, as specified in the Finding, which being in breach of the Articles of War, does sentence him to be reprimanded in such manner as His Excellency The Commander in Chief shall be pleased to direct.

Captain Field having been honorably acquitted of the weightier parts of the foregoing Charges, the Commander in Chief would gladly have confirmed the above sentence without observation or remark, if in so doing he did not feel that he should thereby stamp with his authority as dangerous and pernicious a doctrine as ever crept into the Proceedings of a General Court Martial.

Here is an Officer clearly and distinctly convicted of borrowing money from a Non-Commissioned Officer to a large amount, and for this grave offence against those high principles of honor and decorum which ought to actuate every military man and to teach him that his authority and controul vanish from the instant, he is degraded by laying himself under pecuniary obligations to one whose duty it is to obey him, and whose inclination it ought to be to respect him — For this grave offence, striking at the very root of discipline, of which almost every page of these proceedings affords illustration and proof, the General Court Martial it seems is of opinion that a reprimand is an adequate punishment.

Be it so, Captain Field stands reprimanded. He is forthwith to be released from arrest and return to his duty. But having thus carried into effect the decision of the Court; the Commander in Chief owes it to himself and to the Officers of the Army to declare that a due regard for their honor, their respectability, their authority must necessarily induce them to bear this verdict in their recollection not as a beacon for their guidance, but as a dangerous rock to avoid.

The Commandant of Buxar will keep a vigilant eye upon the future conduct of Garrison Serjeant Jackson, whose past misbehaviour and disrespect to Captain Field would be fit subject for condign punishment, if the Captain had not forfeited his claim to protection by his unworthy money transactions with the Serjeant, affording another tolerably potent illustration and proof of what is likely to become of the order and discipline of this Army, if such acts as those of which the Captain stands convicted are only to be checked by the tender voice of reprimand.

The Commander in Chief cannot close these remarks without noticing for the serious consideration of future Courts Martial, that Captain Field will have been unnecessarily kept in arrest during a period of five or six weeks in consequence of the Finding of the Court having been so unintelligible as to render it necessary to return the proceedings for explanation and amendment.

Commanding the Dinapore Division of the Army, being thereunto authorised by a Warrant from His Excellency The Commander in Chief, bearing date 3d March 1823, for the trial of Captain P. P. Morgan, 2d Battalion 26th Native Infantry, and such other Prisoners as may be duly brought before it.

**CHARGES**.---Captain P. P. Morgan, of the 2d Battalion 26th Regiment Native Infantry, placed in arrest by Major Watson, Commanding the Battalion, on the following charges.

For conduct unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, in having, in a letter dated Cuttack 30th September 1823, addressed to Lieutenant T. Roberts of the same Corps, introduced the name of his immediate Commanding Officer, Major Watson, in a manner highly disrespectful and insubordinate, and in having, in the said letter, most unwarrantably thrown out various insinuations or aspersions derogatory to the character of his said Commanding Officer particularly in the following instances, viz.

"You must long ere now be aware that this apprehension was groundless. In as much as the information on which it was founded was itself *false*, in as far as the residents are concerned ; as also with regard to the great majority of the Officers of the Battalion, it is likewise *false* in their case. They having all called on me whilst I was yet in your Bungalow, or subsequently to my having left it for my *own*."

"2dly. We shall now proceed to investigate the origin of this *false* and malicious libel, and to enquire to whom it is to be attributed."

"In answering this query, Colonel Carpenter's name must be left entirely out of the question."

"To whom then can it apply, but to Major Watson, Captain Stewart, or Lieutenant Auberjanois."

"Having now reduced to the cabalistic number three these ho

amongst whom is to be sought the libeller, who has had the *audacity* to dictate to you, with whom it is his pleasure that you should associate ; I will ask now what possible objection even these three persons could have to calling on you, there being a possibility of meeting with me at your house."

"To this it is impossible to offer any but one answer, namely, that his conscience pricked him and told him that he had been guilty of injuring (or at least endeavouring to injure) me—and he dared not look me in the face, through dread of betraying his conscious guilt, and one thing, which low and grovelling minds can never *forgive* is, to see the person, whom they have traduced rise, through the force of conscious integrity, superior to their malevolent aspersions---But how, I will ask, are these calumniators, or perhaps I should say is this calumniator, to avoid meeting with me, elsewhere ; for as far as I can observe, you are the only person whom they have *dared* to insult by their dictation."

"How can he or they be certain that they will not meet me at the house of any other person, when he or they may call, or what security have they that I may not come in where they may be *one or two*, or all *three*; and one thing, is certain, namely, that I will never take the trouble to avoid them nor you, nor any other who may blindly lend himself to their calat."

"Those alone, whose deeds are evil seek the shade, I, on the contrary, (conscious of my own integrity) have ever sought the light, and ever will."

"3dly. We will now appropriate a few lines to the objections of these persons to meeting with me (as I can conceive none others) to whose opinions you appear to bow with so much reverence.

And first for Major Watson.

What has he to complain ?

Why a great matter truly, I required of him to act like a Gentleman !!! an unreasonable request doubtless ! and perhaps not so easily to be followed as recommended !"

The whole or any part of such conduct being subversive of Military discipline and in breach of the Articles of War.

ADDITIONAL CHARGE preferred against Captain P. P. Morgan, by Brigadier Carpenter, Commanding at Cuttack.

For having while under arrest on the foregoing charges addressed a letter to Brigade Major Faithful, dated Cuttack the 21st November 1823, conveying highly offensive and unjustifiable imputations on my conduct particularly in the following paragraphs, viz.

"I do however most solemnly protest against such decision, as well as the debarring me from reference to superior authority, as acts of the utmost cruelty."

"This is I believe the first time of an Officer under arrest, being placed at the mercy and discretion of his declared and professed enemies. For such, and unprovokedly such, do I conceive Major Watson and his Staff Officers to be—and it is well known that no enmity is so implacable as that which is gratuitously adopted."

"From these Officers I do expect nothing but indignity and oppression, and whilst impressed with such an opinion, I cannot refrain from expressing abhorrence of the cruelty and injustice of subjecting me to their authority."

The same being subversive of Military Discipline and in breach of the Articles of War.

The Right Honorable the Governor General in Council is pleased to authorize the Collectors of Revenue and the Paymasters and Deputy Paymasters of this Presidency to whom the application may be made to pay monthly during the term of their leave of absence, to Native Commissioned and Non Commissioned Officers and Privates belonging to either of the Presidencies of Fort St. George or Bombay such portion of their Pay as shall be specified to be admissible, to them, during their furlough, upon a Certificate according to the annexed form with which they will be furnished for that purpose.

The Collector or Paymaster to whom the application for Payment may be made, will note upon the Certificate the payment for what month and when disbursed, transmitting a Copy of the Pay Certificate above described, with the receipt of the party for the Payments made, to the Office of the Military Auditor General for Audit, and in order that the Sums so disbursed may be duly charged to the Presidency, to which the party belongs.

Should the bearer of a Certificate of the nature above mentioned after having arrived at Fort William, be desirous of proceeding for the remainder of his furlough to an inland station, payments of such arrears as are due may be made by the Paymaster at the Presidency who will note upon the Pay Certificate the payments he may have issued, for the guidance of the Collector or Paymaster in the future issues to be made upon such Certificate.

When the party shall cease to draw pay in Bengal his original Certificate shall be returned to him, care being taken, that the several payments are distinctly specified thereon, as well as the dates on which they have been made under official signature of the Collector or Paymaster.

2d. For making use of the following mutinous expressions, viz. 1st. " That he was sorry that the knife was not deeper into him, (meaning " Campbell) and that the knife had disappointed him by bending" or words to that effect—2d. " If he should ever have an opportunity he would " put an end to Campbell's life," or words to that effect—3d. (On the prisoner's enquiring if Campbell was dead and being told that he was not, for replying) " he was very sorry for it—that it was not his fault—he " wished it had been any thing else besides a knife—that a ball would " have been the thing," or words to that effect—such conduct and expressions being on the whole or in part, in violation of the Articles of War.

1st. including all Ranks, whether Members of the Medical Board, Superintending Surgeons of Divisions, Civil Station Surgeons or Assistants, as well as those who have given up promotion for permanent Stations.

8th. An additional General Officer on the Honorable Company's Establishment, is authorized for the Staff of each Presidency; and the Generals of Artillery and Engineers are rendered eligible to the Staff, the Command of those Corps devolving to the Senior Colonels or Field Officers.

9th. The Honorable Court having entirely separated the Senior List of each Presidency from the effective strength of the Army, no casualties occurring in it, after the 1st May 1824, are to give promotion, as heretofore.

10th. The Regiments of Cavalry on the Bombay Establishment are to be placed on the same scale of organization, in respect to Officers and Men, as those on the Bengal and Madras Establishments; and from the date of carrying this arrangement into effect, the Field Officers of Cavalry at Bombay who now rise in line with the Infantry, are to be promoted in a line amongst themselves, as at the other Presidencies.

11th. No Half Mounting Stoppages are to be made from any branch of the Native Armies, from the receipt of these Orders—further Regulations will be issued on this subject.

12th. So soon as the Infantry promotions are effected, the several Regiments of European and Native Infantry will be divided into two Regiments

each, by the final separation of Battalions; and the Officers posted alternately—i.e. all the odd or uneven numbers of each Rank to the *first* and the even numbers to the *second* Battalions of their present Regiments; when the several Regiments on this new formation will be numbered in the order in which they were *first* raised and formed. Casualties anterior to the 1st of May to be filled up at each Presidency, if known on the date of promulgating the posting of Officers to Regiments of single Battalions.

13th. It is not intended that in carrying the present Orders into effect, Officers should be permanently removed from the particular Battalion in which they may long have served and wish to remain, provided that by an interchange between Officers standing the same number of removes from promotion, each could be retained in his particular Battalion, and both are willing to make the exchange and shall prefer an application for that purpose within four months from the date at which the present arrangement shall take effect, or within twelve months where either of the parties shall be absent on furlough.

14th. The Officers who by the above arrangement become Colonels or Lieutenant Colonels Commandant of Regiments or Battalions in each branch of the Service, shall succeed according to Seniority to a Half Share of Off-reckonings, the two Seniors being admitted to this benefit on the occurrence of each vacancy among the present Colonels of Regiments: But each Officer who stands first at the date assigned to this arrangement, for succession to the benefits of the Off-reckoning Fund in each branch of the Service, and all who may succeed to Off-reckoning Shares within *two years* from the same date (1st May) shall receive direct from the Treasury an allowance equal to the difference between the Amount of the Share actually enjoyed by him under the new plan and that which he would have been entitled to under the existing system, and from such date only as he would have been entitled had that system continued.

15th. His Excellency The Commander in Chief will be pleased to give effect to this arrangement as early as possible, as far as respects the Bengal Army; and the Governments of Fort Saint George and Bombay are requested to issue the necessary Orders to the Armies of those Presidencies respectively.

The Commander in Chief has much satisfaction in publishing to the Army the following Extracts from the Proceedings of Committees assembled at Trichinopoly and Secundrabad, for the examination of Officers in the Hindoostanee Language.

From the Committee assembled at Trichinopoly.

26th Regiment N. I. (late 2d Bat. 19th Regiment N. I.)

Lieutenant Johnson, considering the very short time that he has regularly studied the language, has passed his examination in a manner highly creditable to himself.

"In reading and translating from the Char Derveish and Nusr-é-bé Nuzeer he was perfect—His translation from English into Hindoostanee exhibits a knowledge of words and idiom which convinces the Board that he has studied diligently, and that if he perseveres, he must be a perfect master of the language.

"In conversation Lieutenant Johnson does not possess the fluency that could be wished, but his terms are well chosen, and the Board have no doubt from the solid foundation he has laid, that a short continuance of his meritorious exertions, will make him master of this comparatively easy part of his pursuit."

From the Committee assembled at Secundrabad.

40th Regiment N. I. (late 2d Bat. 30th Regiment N. I.)

Ensign Dyce's translation from Hindoostanee into English, an exercise which in his former examination was somewhat disfigured by error, was in the present, executed with great accuracy, and discovers a very considerably improved knowledge of the idiom of the language.

"The style of Mr. Dyce's version from English into Hindoostanee, was remarkably pure and correct: his conversation, though not equal to his written performances, is sufficiently fluent and intelligible.

"The Board on the whole conceive Mr. Dyce to have attained a very considerable proficiency in the Hindoostanee language."

4TH JUNE 1824.

“ The Proceedings of a Native Line Court Martial were also given to Lieutenant Douglas to translate into Hindoostanee, which he effected in a short space of time, and which, although not free from trifling errors, shewed him to possess a very competent knowledge of the Idiom of the Language—His translation from Hindoostanee into English was performed in a free style though the sense of the original was preserved.”

“ In the Colloquial part, Lieutenant Douglas expressed himself with great ease, and fluency, and the Board have no hesitation in pronouncing their opinion that he is well qualified to fill the situation of an Interpreter ”

The leave granted to Cornet C. B. Lindsay, 3d Regiment Light Cavalry to proceed to the Eastern Coast on sick certificate, is extended to the Presidency.

The remaining portion of the leave granted to Lieutenant W. E. A. Elliott of the 29th Regiment Native Infantry (late 1st Battalion 15th Regiment) in General Orders of the 8th Instant to visit the Presidency, is cancelled at that Officer's request.

19th June 1824.

With reference to the recent alteration in the numbering of Corps of Infantry, the Commander in Chief directs, that the several Regiments of Infantry, according to their new Numbers, will retain the Colour of Facings and Lace, each respectively wore as a Battalion of a Regiment.

The 2d European Regiment will wear White Facings and Gold Lace.

The following Extracts from the Confirmed Proceedings of an European General Court Martial assembled at Saint Thomas's Mount, on Thursday the tenth day of June 1824, by virtue of a Warrant from His Excellency General Sir Alexander Campbell, Baronet, and K. C. B. Commander in Chief, are published to the Army.

Lieutenant P. Lihou, 1st Battalion 1st Regiment N. I. placed under arrest by me on the following Charges

*First Charge.*—For conduct disgraceful to the character of an Officer and a Gentleman in being repeatedly in a state of intoxication, particularly on the evening of Tuesday the 3d February 1824, also on Parade on the evening of Monday 2d February 1824, and on the night of Thursday the 5th February 1824.

*Second Charge.*—For disobedience of Orders, and neglect of duty in having absented himself without leave from the Cantonment of Bangalore during the day of the 5th of February 1824, and in absenting himself from the Evening Drill on that day, for which he assigned no reason, and for absenting himself on the morning of the 6th February from the Drill of the Battalion.

*Third Charge.*—For disgraceful conduct, such as is unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, in associating with Mr. Heywood, who had been dismissed the Service by the sentence of a General Court Martial, and with whom he had no acquaintance previous to the said Mr. Heywood's dismissal from the Service.

*Fourth Charge.*—For disobedience of orders in not giving every information in his power respecting the said Mr. Heywood which he was ordered to do in a Letter written by the Officer Commanding Bangalore—and which Letter was communicated to him, Lieutenant Lihou.

*Fifth Charge.*—For unofficer-like conduct in appearing on several occasions on duty in a dirty and slovenly state, particularly on Wednesday evening the 4th February 1824 when he came to me in presence of the Commissioned and Non-commissioned Native Officers to inform me, his Commanding Officer, that Mr. Heywood just left his house—also on Friday evening the 29th January when he was on Parade in a very dirty pair of Pantaloon and Boots, and his Red Jacket marked with Chunam apparently off a Wall.

*Sixth Charge.*—For ungentleman-like conduct in having obtruded himself into the house of an Officer uninvited, and thereby subjecting himself to be ordered out by him, as also causing an Officer Commanding a Corps to request his Officers to have nothing to say to him, and never to ask him, Lieutenant Lihou, to their Mess.
