With reference to the rules contained in Regulation III, of 1810.

1810, for facilitating the progress of Detachments of Troops through the Company's Territories, published for the information and guidance of the Army in General Orders, dated the 21st of December 1810; the Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct, that all Officers Commanding Detachments of Troops or single Corps, as also all Officers, not Commanding, nor proceeding with, a Corps or Detachment of Troops, who may be provided by any Servant of the Government with Bearers, Coolies, Boatmen, Carts or Ballocks, or any necessary supplies of Provisions or other Articles, shall in the first instance pay the prices demanded for the hire of such Bearers, Coolies, &c. or for the value of the Articles so furnished, notwithstanding any cause for complaint against the Public Servant, which, whether for overcharge or neglect of duty, or on whatever ground, they are to prefer immediately to the Zillah Magistrate, and if after his decision thereupon, further reference of the case should be necessary, their representation will be submitted for the information of Government, through the usual and regular channel.

Governor in Council:

We have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the Letters from the Secretary to Government in the Military Department, dated the 10th and the 17th ultimo; and in conformity with the instructions therein contained, to report the result of our examination of the proficiency made by Lieutenant Gorgon of the Madras European Regiment, in the Persian language; and by Lieutenant Alves of the 1st Battalion of Pioneers, and Lieutenant Mackintosh of the 2d Battalion of the 14th Regiment, in the Hindoostanee language.

The proficiency made by Lieutenant Gordon in the Persian language is highly satisfactory. His translations were executed with considerable accuracy; his pronunciation is correct, and he converses with sufficient fluency and ease.

We have therefore, much satisfaction in recommending, that your Excellency in Council may be pleased to confer upon Lieutenant Gordon the usual honorary reward.

The exercises performed by Lieutenant Alves are distinguished by peculiar correctness. His translation into Hindoostanee is particularly satisfactory, as it displays a more than ordinary acquaintance with the idiom of the language as spoken in the Peninsula; and the ease and fluency with which he converses, shew that his attention has been very successfully directed to this point.

Lieutenant Alves having therefore established, in so creditable a manner, his claim to the honorary reward, we are persuaded that your Excellency in Council will feel considerable satisfaction, in conferring this distinction upon him.

The translations executed by Lieut. Mackintosh are, with a few trifling exceptions, correct. His pronunciation however, is not very good; and he converses with considerable hesitation; but as we observe, that his conversation in English is not altogether free from embarrassment, we are led to believe that the hesitation above noticed is not to be attributed to a deficiency in the knowledge of the language.

With these remarks we beg leave to recommend, that your Excellency in Council may be pleased to bestow on Lieutenant Mackintosh the honorary reward.

The Commander in Chief commands it to be declared in General Orders, that His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in consideration of the meritorious services of the Non-Commissioned Officers of the Army, and with a view of extending encouragement and advantages to those of the Infantry, corresponding to the benefit which the appointments of Troop Serjeant Majors offer in the Cavalry, has been most graciously pleased in the name, and in behalf of His Majesty, to direct, that in all Regiments of Infantry, whose services are not subject to limitation, the Pay of the *Serjeant Major* shall henceforth be raised to *Three Shillings per day*, and that the Pay of *One Serjeant in each Company* of Battalions of the above description, viz. of those serving without limitation, shall be raised to *Two Shillings and Four Pence per day*, and that the said Serjeants shall be distinguished by an honorable badge, of which, however, and of the advantages attending it, they will, in case of misconduct, be liable to be deprived at the discretion of the Colonel, or Commanding Officer, of the Regiment, or by the Sentence of a Court Martial.

In consequence of the above most gracious intimation of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent's pleasure, the Commander in Chief directs, that the Serjeants selected for this distinction, shall be called the "*Colour Serjeants*," and that they shall bear above their chevron the honorable badge of Regimental Colour supported by two Cross Swords.

It is His Royal Highness's pleasure, that the duty of attending the Colours in the Field, shall, at all times, be performed by these Serjeants, but that these distinctions shall in no wise interfere with the regular performance of their Regimental and Company's duties.

The Commander in Chief recommends to the Colonels of Regiments the utmost circumspection in the selection of the Colour Serjeants, and he hopes that this honorable appellation will invariably be bestowed on Men of approved valour, distinguished by their attention to the duties of their station, and to the discipline of their respective Companies.

The Commander in Chief avails himself of this opportunity of addressing himself to those who are the immediate objects of this Order.

His Royal Highness entertains a just sense of the meritorious services of the Non-Commissioned Officers of the Army, and he is persuaded, that, under the direction of their Officers, they have individually and collectively contributed largely to uphold the character of the British Army in its present pre-eminence, and His Royal Highness rejoices most cordially that these services have been thus graciously noticed.

It may reasonably be expected that the reward which is thus held out to merit, will prove an incitement to all; for it is within the reach of all, who have hands and hearts to serve their King and Country; it is offered equally to the young as to the old Soldier; it is the recompense of honesty, sobriety, fidelity and personal bravery; and His Royal Highness trusts it will prove the most powerful incentive to the Non-Commissioned Officers of the British Army to persevere in that line of conduct, which has obtained for them this munificent and distinguished favor from their Country and Sovereign.

Under this head will be included all references respecting Regimental Courts Martial, and Courts of Enquiry, which relate exclusively to circumstances of a Regimental nature.

In like manner, when a Commanding Officer may find it necessary to place an Officer of his Regiment under arrest, on account of alleged Regimental delinquency, he will in the first instance submit a report and statement of the circumstances through His Majesty's Deputy Adjutant General, in order that the Commander in Chief may decide on the propriety of bringing the offender before a General Court Martial; in which event, the Commanding Officer will be directed to forward the charges through the prescribed local authorities, to the Adjutant General of the Army. It will be understood however, that a report of the arrest on Regimental grounds will be immediately made to the Commanding Officer of the Division.

All General Orders received from Head Quarters in Bengal, which must necessarily have exclusive reference to the King's Service, will be circulated by the Deputy Adjutant General His Majesty's Forces, to His Majesty's Regiments, without the necessity of their republication to the Army at large.

13. His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty. Having been graciously pleased in the Gazette of the 10th of August 1813 (a Copy of which accompanied this despatch) to promote several Major Generals in our Service to the rank of Lieutenant Generals; the distinction thus conferred and which has so long justly been an object to which our Officers have attached its due importance, we trust will be received by them with a proper sense of gratitude and satisfaction; we think it proper at the same time to inform you, that the promotion of those Officers who are actually on the Staff of your Army as Major Generals to the rank of Lieutenant Generals, is not to vacate their appointments nor to make any alteration whatever in their respective situations or allowances.

17. We have permitted the undermentioned Officers on your Establishment, to remain in England, viz,
 Lieutenant Colonel James George Graham,

 Ensign John Stiggall, till first Ships of the ensuing season,

18. Major General P. A. Agnew of your Establishment, died in this Country on the 8th January 1813.

5. We have therefore reconsidered the subject and have come to the following resolution, which we desire may be carried into execution immediately on your receipt of this Letter.

6. Every European Soldier enlisted for unlimited service shall, if he have conducted himself to the satisfaction of his Commanding Officers, be entitled at the expiration of twelve years from the date of his enlistment to a bounty equal in amount to that usually given to Soldiers in our Service who re-enlist for 5 years, and at the expiration of seventeen years shall be entitled to be discharged or re-enlisted for a further period on the usual terms.

7. We have fixed twelve years as the period at which the first bounty is to be given, because it is the period for which Recruits are enlisted for general service under the Act of His present Majesty, Cap. 87th.

8. You will observe however, that under the Provisions of this Act, Sect. 4, the service of Recruits, enlisted under eighteen years of age, can be reckoned only from their attaining that age,

9. We

9. We trust that the indulgence now shewn to the European Soldiers in our Service will remove every ground of dissatisfaction and complaint, and will stimulate them to a correct and zealous discharge of their duties during their respective period of service.

The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the following Regulations for the guidance of the European Medical Department under this Presidency, shall in future be observed.

Previously to the march of a European Regiment from its Station, a Committee consisting of the Regimental Commanding Officer, the Superintending Surgeon of the Division, or in his absence, the Senior Medical Officer on the spot, and the

the Regimental Surgeon, shall minutely examine the state of the Men in Hospital and determine upon such as may be capable of accompanying the Corps on its march, without the aid of Carriage; for it is to be clearly understood that no Man shall be permitted to proceed in a Dooly from any Station, at which there may be a Garrison Hospital to receive him, those conveyances being attached to Regiments for the sole purpose of providing for contingencies during the march.

The charge of the Men who may be judged incapable of moving with the Corps will devolve on the Garrison Medical Officer, whose duty it will be to make a weekly report of their individual state to the Superintending Surgeon of the Division, and that Officer will from those statements frame a monthly report for the information of the Medical Board, in order that the necessary steps may be taken for the rejunction of the recovered Men with the Head Quarters of the Regiment.

As the situation of a Medical Officer on his first arrival in India with his Regiment must be embarrassing, from his unavoidable ignorance of local arrangements, the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that in such cases the Sick Men of the Regiment or Detachment shall in the first instance be sent into the Presidency General Hospital, until the Surgeon may have provided himself with the requisite Hospital Cloathing and Establishment, when the efficiency of his appointments in these particulars will be reported by the Officer Superintending the Medical duties of the Presidency to the Medical Board.

The most pointed attention will be given by the Surgeons of European Regiments to the Regulations framed for their guidance and published in General Orders by Government of date the 15th August 1806.

The Governor in Council having approved of new patterns submitted by the Medical Board, of Hospital Cotts, Bedding and Cloathing, is pleased to direct their general adoption; and expects that on or before the 1st of August next, the Military fixed, and Regimental Hospitals, will be completely equipped with the new furniture, of which models will be immediately forwarded to the Surgeons in charge, authenticated by the Seal of the Medical Board.

The strictest conformity within the period prescribed above is required to the Patterns of Cloathing models of Cotts which will thus be received from the Medical Board—and these articles will be deposited in a convenient place of custody at each Hospital, for the inspection of the Officer Commanding the Division, or of the visiting Medical Authorities, whose especial duty it will be to remark that the above Regulations are adhered

adhered to, and if not, to report the neglect of them for the information of the Government.

The Honorable the Governor in Council has been pleased to establish the following rules for the construction, and repair or alteration of Civil Buildings at the subordinate Stations.

The expediency of constructing Buildings for Civil purposes at the subordinate Stations will be submitted to the consideration of Government by the local Civil Officers through the Heads of Departments at the Presidency. And the Government having decided on the expediency of the work, plans and estimates will be prepared by Superintending Engineers under such instructions, as they may receive from the Military Board, to whom the applications of the Civil Authorities will be communicated for that purpose.

Materials for the construction of the works are to be supplied, and advances of money for the payment of workmen will be made, under the system laid down in the new Code of Regulations for the conduct of the department of Buildings and Repairs. But when the provision of materials by the Commissariat may be found to interfere with the Public Service in the Military department, the supplies will be furnished under such other arrangements, as may be determined on by

by the Government :—and in such cases the necessary orders will be issued to the local Officer, and the workmen will also be provided and paid by the Civil department.

Repairs or alterations to Civil Buildings at the subordinate Stations, for which the sanction of Government has been obtained through the prescribed channel of reference, will continue to be made under the superintendence of the Civil Officers, unless from their nature and extent it may be considered advisable to direct an Engineer to superintend the work, which will then be executed under the instructions of the Military Board, subject to the proviso contained in the preceding Paragraph.

The adjustment of the accounts of expenditure will proceed in the manner directed in the new Code for Civil Buildings at the Presidency, when the work shall have been performed under orders from the Military Board; but will be conducted as heretofore, when the materials and workmen are supplied under arrangements of the Civil Authorities.

When Military Chaplains are appointed to officiate at more Stations than one, and it may not be necessary to appoint a Clerk at each Station, it will be left to the discretion of the Chaplains to require the Clerks of the principal Stations to act also at the other Stations, or otherwise to procure Persons for the occasional performance of the duties required,—

in the former case the different Stations, at which the Clerks are required to act, will be named in General Orders, which will entitle the Persons appointed to more Stations than one to draw a fixed monthly allowance on account of travelling, equal to the dry Batta of a Non-Commissioned Officer (1 67½ per day,) in addition to the salary abovementioned. In the latter case the Chaplains are authorized to make such allowance not exceeding five Pagodas per month to the Persons occasionally employed, as they may consider necessary in reference to the duration or frequency of the Service performed.

The charges for the above allowance (whether fixed or occasional) are to be included in the Chaplain's abstracts, and supported by the receipt of the Persons employed.

Extract from the Proceedings of an European General Court Martial, assembled at Cawnpore, on Friday the eleventh day of March 1814, by order and in virtue of a warrant, under the hand and seal of His Excellency The Earl of Moira, K. G. Commander in Chief of all the Forces in India, for the trial of Privates Thomas Ryan and James Finn of His Majesty's Sixty-seventh Regiment of Foot, and all such Prisoners as shall be brought before it, and continued by adjournment until the 14th day of March 1814.

CHARGE.—Thomas Ryan, Private His Majesty's 67th Regiment of Foot, ordered into confinement by Lieutenant Colonel Huskisson Commanding the Corps, on the following Charges.

1st—Disobedience of orders in absenting himself from his Barracks after late on the night of the 3d February 1814 and going into the Civil Bazar: such conduct being subversive of discipline and in breach of the Articles of War.

2d—Disorderly and un-soldier-like conduct between the hours of 8 and 12 o'clock on the night of the 3d February 1814, in having with a drawn Bayonet knocked down Private Patrick Padden and made several attempts to stab him with the Bayonet aforesaid: such conduct being subversive of discipline and in breach of the Articles of War.

3d—Mutiny on the morning of the 4th February 1814 when on his way from the ground, where the Regiment was at Field Exercise, to the Guard House, he being under the charge of Serjeant Manus, in having offered violence to the said Serjeant when in the execution of his duty, by attempting to strike him with his Firelock: such

conduct

conduct being subversive of discipline, in defiance of all subordination, and in breach of the Articles of War.

4th.—For saying to Serjeant Munn, on the morning of the 4th February 1814, that, if the Officer, Commanding the Company, Lieutenant Johnston, brought him, the said Thomas Ryan, to a Court Martial, he would take the first opportunity to shoot him; or words to that effect; such expression being mutinous, subversive of discipline and in breach of the Articles of War.

SENTENCE.—The Court, having maturely weighed the evidence on the part of the prosecution, together with what the Prisoner has urged in his defence, finds him guilty of the first Charge exhibited against him, and of the second part of the second Charge; it acquits him of the first part of the second Charge "for forcing the Sentry who was in charge of him."

The Charges of which the Court has found the Prisoner guilty, being in breach of the Articles of War, it sentences him to receive eight hundred lashes in the usual manner and to solitary confinement for two months.

The Commander in Chief has confirmed the above Sentence yet an observation respecting them is necessary. There is absolute inconsistency in sentencing a Prisoner to suffer confinement as well as corporal punishment. It should be recollected, however, that the view of the Legislature in empowering General Courts Martial to order solitary confinement, was to make the penalty a correction as well as an infliction.

infliction; an object which might be counteracted by the Soldiers being previously degraded by corporal punishment; the keeping the penalties separate will therefore always deserve the consideration of a General Court Martial. In the present instance the Commander in Chief has on enquiry learned with much surprize, that there is not any cell appertaining to the Gaol of Calcutta, where a Prisoner can be held in solitary confinement according to the meaning of the term and the purpose of the Legislature.

This defect will be immediately remedied, but in the mean time (as it is to be apprehended that the same want of a fit place of confinement exists up the Country) it is inexpedient to enforce a part of the Sentence not likely under such circumstances to have the desired effect. His Lordship, thence, remits the imprisonment adjudged against Thomas Ryan and John Foley: and he directs the corporal punishment to which they are respectively sentenced, to be carried into execution at such time and in such proportion as may seem meet to the discretion of the Commanding Officer of the Division to which the Prisoners severally belong.

The General Court Martial of which Colonel Need is President, to be dissolved should there be no further duty for it to perform. That of which Lieutenant Colonel Hicks is President, is dissolved.

3d—In continuing his connexion with the said Joseph D'Silva after its impropriety and inconvenience had been pointed out to him, and after he himself had acknowledged the same, and given a spontaneous assurance that he would no longer permit him to remain in his compound.

4th—In having neglected to take any steps in vindication of his character when made acquainted with circumstances which highly reflected upon it, until after an interval of seven days, and then attempting to refute the implication partly by sending in to me a misrepresentation of the conduct of others.

In compliance with the instructions communicated to us in the Letter from the Secretary to Government in the Military Department, dated the 25th Ultimo, we have examined Lieutenant Alves of the 1st Battalion of Pioneers, in the Persian language, and we have the honor to report the result for the information of your Excellency in Council.

In his translations from Persian into English, Lieutenant Alves has committed two or three trifling mistakes, but they are not such as at all to injure the sense. In his translation into Persian we have not been able to detect a single error of any description and the sense of the original is rendered in a style of peculiar elegance. The hand writing of this exercise is remarkably good.

In the colloquial part of his examination both as regards pronunciation and fluency, Lieutenant Alves acquitted himself equally to our satisfaction, and we have no hesitation in stating that we consider him to excel, without exception, all who have yet come before us.

Under these circumstances we doubt not that your Excellency in Council will feel particular satisfaction, in conferring upon Lieutenant Alves the honorary reward.

Extract from the Proceedings of a General Court Martial which assembled in the Cantonment of Bangalore on Friday the 14th day of January 1814, by virtue of a warrant from His Excellency Lieutenant General The Honorable John Abercromby, Commander in Chief of the Forces serving under the Presidency of Fort St. George, and continued by adjournments until the 17th March 1814.

CHARGE.—Lieutenant Warlock, His Majesty's 69th Regiment, placed under arrest by me, for behaving in a scandalous, infamous manner, such as is unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, in the following instances.

1st. In using reproachful and provoking speeches or gestures towards Lieutenant Ruxton of the same Corps, on or about the hours of 9 and 10 o'clock on the night of the 13th January 1814, when a guest at that Officer's house.

2d. For decoying Lieutenant Ruxton out of his house about the hours of 11 and 12 o'clock that night and then assaulting that Officer in a most outrageous manner, by severe chastisement with a horsewhip, and using at the same time the opprobrious appellation of "Coward" towards Lieutenant Ruxton.

3d. In giving and sending a challenge to Lieutenant Ruxton to fight a Duel the next day, whereby the latter received a wound in the foot by a Pistol ball discharged

discharged at him by the Prisoner on the afternoon of the 14th January 1814.

The whole of which conduct on the part of Lieutenant Warlock tending to the subversion of good order and Military discipline, and in direct violation of the Articles of War.

SENTENCE.—The Court having considered the evidence laid before them in support of the Prosecution, as also what was offered by the Prisoner in his defence, are of opinion that Lieutenant Warlock is not guilty of the first Charge preferred against him, and do therefore acquit him of the same.

Upon the 2d Charge the Court is of opinion that Lieutenant Warlock is guilty “ of decoying Lieutenant Ruxton out of his house about the hours of 11 and 12 o'clock on the night of the 13th of January, and then assaulting that Officer in a most outrageous manner by severe chastisement with a “ horsewhip ” which conduct the Court considers to be unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman; but the Court do acquit the Prisoner “ of behaving “ in a scandalous, infamous manner, and also of making use of the opprobrious appellation of Coward; “ towards Lieutenant Ruxton,” there not having been in the opinion of the Court sufficient evidence adduced to convict the Prisoner of the same.

Upon the 3d Charge the Court finds the Prisoner guilty “ of giving a challenge to Lieutenant Ruxton “ to fight a duel the next day,” but acquit him of behaving in a scandalous, infamous manner, such as is unbecoming the character of an Officer and a Gentleman, and of all and every other part of the said Charges.

The Court having found the Prisoner Lieutenant Warlock, guilty of parts of the 2d and part of the 3d Charges exhibited against him, do by virtue of the Articles of War adjudge and sentence him to be Cashiered.

"Remarks.—The above Sentence is approved. It gives The Commander in Chief much concern that he cannot comply with the intercession of the Court in favor of Lieutenant Ellis. The youth and inexperience of Lieutenant Ellis can be no admissible plea in this instance. Irritation from indignity previously suffered might afford some shadow, tho' a very slight one, of extenuation for Lieutenant Warlock's forgetfulness of what was incumbent on him as an Officer. But the transgression of Lieutenant Ellis was cool and deliberate. When he, under peculiar circumstances, abetted Lieutenant Warlock in going home and fetching thence a Horsewhip, and lent himself to Lieutenant Ruxton out of his house that he might be assaulted, his conduct cannot be regarded as an error in judgment but as a passionate departure from those principles which must be inflexibly insisted upon in every man who has the honor to bear His Majesty's commission.—The Commander in Chief is desirous that the Army should thoroughly understand the discrimination which, while he has extended lenity to Lieutenants Warlock and Ruxton, constrains him to let the Sentence on Lieutenant Ellis take effect."

John Murray Private in Captain Barrington's Company of His Majesty's 56th Regiment, confined by my order on the following Charges.

1st. For making use of threatening language against Lieutenant Brough the Officer then in charge of Captain Barrington's Company on the morning of the 15th of January, and for going to his Lieutenant Brough's Tent in the afternoon of the same day, with a loaded Musket in his hand.

2d. For refusing to go to Drill when ordered by Serjeant Major Robertson, and for levelling and snapping a Musket at him, with an intent to shoot him when in the execution of his duty; and subsequently when a Prisoner in the Quarter Guard declaring to Serjeant Major Robertson, that although he had then missed him, he would settle him when he came out, or words to that effect.

3d. For designedly wasting when on Field Service a part of the ammunition entrusted to his charge.

SENTENCE.—The Court having maturely deliberated on the evidence before it, as well as what the Prisoner John Murray, Private in His Majesty's 56th Regiment has urged in his defence, acquits him of the 1st and 3d Charges for want of evidence; but the Court finds the Prisoner guilty of the 2d Charge, which being in breach of the Articles of War and subversive of Military discipline, it doth by virtue of the authority in it vested sentence the Prisoner John Murray to receive 1000 lashes (one thousand) and to suffer six months solitary confinement, (and during such confinement to forfeit the whole of his pay with the exception of nine Pence per day for his subsistence), at such time and in such manner as His Excellency the Commander in Chief may be pleased to direct.

The Commander in Chief having approved and confirmed the Proceedings of the General Court Martial held for the trial of John Murray Private in H. M. 56th Regiment of Foot, the more painful part of his duty would exact from him the order for the full execution of the sentence it has so justly awarded; and however earnest is his desire to extend mercy, the enormity of the offence of which the Prisoner has been found guilty, is of that nature, that His Excellency, in giving indulgence to his private feelings, by the remission of any portion of the punishment, can with difficulty consider himself justified in the adoption of that resolution. He has notwithstanding, decided to that effect in the confident belief, that during the period of confinement, which has been allotted by the Sentence, the Prisoner may make every possible atone-
 ment

ment which can proceed from a just sense of his offence, as well as from the sincerest feelings of contrition & repentance.

It is solely with this hope, that the Commander in Chief remits the whole of the corporal punishment awarded the Prisoner; at the same time he directs, that the remainder of the Sentence be forthwith carried into effect.

Company of the 2d Bat. 16th Regiment but transferred to the Invalid establishment on the 30th December 1813, by which he caused the said Sepoy's (Vyapoory's) death on the morning of the 16th January 1814.

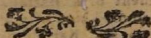
