Extract from the Proceedings of an European General Court Martial assembled at Fort William, on Thursday the 16th of April 1818, in obedience to General Orders by the Commander in Chief of the 31st March, and to Division Orders of the 14th Instant, and held by virtue of a warrant from His Excellency The Most Noble The Marquis of Hastings, K.G. Commander in Chief of all the Forces in India.

CRIME.—Lieutenant John Rawlins of the Regiment of Artillery, put under arrest for conduct *insubordinate, litigious, and disrespectful* to the Civil and Military Authorities of the Penang Government, during his residence in Prince of Wales's Island, as evinced in various letters and other documents between himself and the above named Authorities, from the month

month of May 1817 to the period of his quitting the Island in December 1817; and subsequent thereto in a letter addressed to the Adjutant General of the Army, dated February 11, 1818.

The following Extracts from the confirmed Proceedings of a Native General Court Martial held in Camp near Jaulnah, on Tuesday the 12th day of May 1818, in virtue of a warrant under the hand and seal of His Excellency Lieutenant General Sir Thomas Hislop, Bart. and continued by adjournment until Wednesday the 13th day of May of the same year, and of which Subadar Mahomed Abdullah of the 7th Light Cavalry, is President, are published to the Army.

Shaik Ismael, Jemadar of D. Troop 6th Regiment Light Cavalry, ordered into arrest by me, on the following Charges.

1st.—For unmilitary and un-officerlike conduct, in not reporting the disgraceful behaviour of two Troopers, who quitted their Regimental Lines, for the express purpose of plunder while under his immediate command, during the absence of the Corps on actual service between the 21st and 23d Ultimo.

2d.—For scandalous and infamous conduct such as is totally unbecoming the character of a Native Commissioned Officer, in participating in the emoluments arising from the sale of the plundered property.

It appears from the evidence adduced on the trial of Private Paria Curpah of the 1st Battalion 25th Regiment N. I., that the Prisoner, when posted as a Sentry, was permitted to unfix his Bayonet, and lay aside his Musket.

The Commander in Chief having reason to believe, that such a practice is frequent, His Excellency positively forbids it as most unmilitary, and directs, that whenever it may be found necessary to post a Sentry only with a Bayonet, from his being under cover or in situations where he may be unable to move about with his Arms supported, his Musket shall always be lodged with his Guard. Officers Commanding will be very particular in having this Order explained in their respective Corps.

G. O. BY GOVERNMENT.

Ordered, that the following Extract from the Honorable Company's

pany's General Letter in the Military Department, under date the 4th February 1818, be published in General Order.

Para. 276. "We are of opinion, after mature deliberation, that the best mode of combining the encouragement of a knowledge of those Languages (Hindoostanee and Persian,) with other objects of public importance, will be the adoption of the system which prevails in Bengal."

277. "We, therefore, authorize, and direct you, to appoint a Subaltern Officer, in each Battalion of Native Infantry, to be Interpreter of the Hindoostanee Language to that Battalion, who is also to perform the duties of Quarter Master of the Battalion, with the same Staff Salary as we in our Military Letter of the 5th May 1815, fixed for the Adjutants of Native Battalions, that is

Staff Pay per Month,	Arcot Rupees	62
Moonshee, and Stationary	40
A Horse	30

Total per Month, -- Arcot Rupees.. 132

278. "It will be the duty of the Interpreter and Quarter Master, to officiate as Interpreter of Hindoostanee, not only to all Courts Martial, which may be held in the Battalion to which he belongs, but to any other Court Martial, at which he may be directed to officiate, without any further charge, or expense, to the Company, for such service, and generally to render all the services which as an Interpreter he may at any time be called upon to perform."

279. -- "It will, also, be his duty to act as Quarter Master of his Battalion, and to perform all those duties, which are usually performed by the Quarter Masters of other Corps in your Army."

280. -- "We rely upon your care and vigilance that no Officer be selected for the important situation of Interpreter who is not fully qualified to perform all the duties of it, especially the serious and responsible duties to Courts Martial."

281. "We take this opportunity to recal to your recollection, our Orders to Bombay, as contained in our Military Letter to that Government, dated 17th January 1810, Copy of which was transmitted to you, as equally applicable to your Presidency, with our Military Letter of the 23d January 1811."

"We are decidedly of opinion, that no Officer should be appointed to any Staff situation whatever, unless he have previously acquired a knowledge of the Hindoostanee Language, which is the vernacular language of Hindoostan, and more or less spoken, and understood, throughout the Deccan."

"The means of acquiring this Language, are now much facilitated,

facilitated, and it is so obviously both the duty and the interest of all our Ser-vants at all the Presidencies to obtain a knowledge of it, that we desire you will hereafter consider a competent acquaintance with it, to be an indispensable qualification, in every Candidate for a Staff appointment."

Extract from the confirmed Proceedings of a Native General Court Martial held at Bangalore, on Thursday, 25th June 1818, by virtue of a warrant from Major General Dyce, conducting the Details of the Army at the Presidency, under authority from His Excellency Sir Thomas Hislop, Bart. Commander in Chief, are, by His Excellency's orders, published to the Army.

Jemadar (now Subadar) Hoossain Cawn, in the Grenadier Company (now in the 6th Company) 2d Battalion 11th Regiment N. I. placed in arrest by me, on complaint of Jemadar Kistnamah, in the C. Company 2d Battalion 11th Regiment N. I. on the following Charges.

1st.—For having preferred a false complaint against Jemadar Kistnamah, stating that he (Kistnamah) was indebted to him (17) seventeen Rupees from Subscriptions collected by Jemadar Kistnamah from several Native Officers who had subscribed Money for the celebration of the Mohurum feast in the year 1815, the same tending to depreciate the character of Jemadar Kistnamah.

2d.—For unofficer-like conduct, in having about two Months and a half ago borrowed a Ring from Jemadar Kistnamah on the plea of using it as a model, with the intention of defrauding Jemadar Kistnamah of the Ring, and not giving it up until ordered to do so by me.

When Officers of His Majesty's Service are ordered home, under the operation of general or partial reductions, or from other causes equally beyond their controul, they are authorized to draw an advance on account of Passage Money, at the following rates, viz.

but it is to be distinctly understood that the foregoing allowances are confined to the case of Officers retiring from His Majesty's Regiments on this Establishment by incontrolable causes;—and will in no instance be extended to cases of Promotion in Regiments at Home, Exchange or Retiring upon Half-pay at the option of the Individual.

Supernumerary and Half-pay Officers of His Majesty's Regiments, provided they may not have become so voluntarily, are authorized to draw the full Pay and allowances of their Rank including Tent Allowance, up to the date on which they cease to perform Regimental duty, when they are to be considered as coming under the operation of the General Order 24th March 1817.

Officers of the Veteran Corps when temporarily detached on duty from their stations, are authorized to indent on the Public Stores for Camp Equipage, according to their Regimental Rank, and in cases when the required Equipments cannot be obtained from the Public Stores, they are permitted to draw the regulated Tent Allowance of their Rank in lieu thereof, under the provisions of the G. O. 20th August 1813. The allowance drawn by Officers of Veteran Corps on account of House Rent, is not to be affected by this Regulation.

The following modification of the 2d Para. of the General Order 20th July 1816, is authorized,---When the number of Pension and Family Certificates amount to 2,500, but is under 3,000, Commanding or Staff Officers are allowed to draw Pagodas 26 per month

month on that account ; and if the Certificates amount to or exceed 3,000, an allowance of Pagodas 30 per month is authorized.

It appearing that the 5th Para. 18th Section of the Code of Pay Regulations, regarding Staff Officers drawing House Rent, is considered applicable to the particular Officers only whose Appointments are therein specified, the Governor in Council is pleased to direct the principle of that Regulation to be applied to all Officers, who from holding fixed Staff situations, are not liable to be employed on Field Service.

Indents for Tatties, Gunnies and petty Articles, such as Thread, Needles, Wax, Gum, Pasteboard, Twine, &c. &c. for the use of Public Offices at the Presidency, are to be examined, checked and passed by the Military Board as heretofore, on whose authority they are to be supplied by the Commissariat and the charges admitted in the Public Accounts.

OPINION AND SENTENCE.—The Court having maturely weighed and considered all that has appeared before it in support of the prosecution, as well as what the Prisoner has urged in his defence, is of opinion, that he is "Guilty" to the full extent of the Charge set forth against him, viz. of "Gross misbehaviour, cowardice and disobedience of orders, while on duty at the Battery Guard on the 31st of March 1818, in not advancing to meet and repel a Sally of the Enemy from the Fort of Belgaum, altho' repeatedly ordered so to do by Lieutenant Walker of the 4th Regiment N. FINDING,---The Court having maturely weighed and considered the evidence adduced on the part of the prosecution and what the Prisoners have urged in their defence, do find the Prisoners

Prisoners William O'Brien, Charles Carr, and John Nelson (2d), guilty of the first Charge exhibited against them.

The Court do also find the Prisoners Charles Carr and John Nelson (2d), guilty of the 2d Charge, but acquit the Prisoner William O'Brien of the 2d Charge.

SENTENCE.--- The Court having found the Prisoner O'Brien guilty of the 1st Charge as aforesaid, do adjudge him, the said William O'Brien, to receive on his bare back and in the usual manner, eight hundred lashes, with a cat of nine tails, to be inflicted at such time and place as His Excellency The Most Noble The Commander in Chief may be pleased to direct.

The Court having found the Prisoners Carr and Nelson, guilty of the both Charges preferred against them, do adjudge each of the said Prisoners, Charles Carr and John Nelson (2d), to receive on his bare back and in the usual manner, nine hundred and fifty lashes, at such time and place as The Commander in Chief may appoint--and the said Charles Carr and John Nelson (2d), are each of them further adjudged to be placed under weekly stoppages to the amount of one half of his Pay until the full expense of supplying him with a new Regimental Coat and Pantaloon shall be realized.

G. Commander in Chief of all the Forces in India, &c. &c. &c. &c. under date the 2d March 1818.

President,—Subadar Shaik Emom, 2d Battalion 1st Regiment Madras Native Infantry.

Officiating Deputy Judge Advocate General,—Captain William Stone, 1st Battalion 1st Madras N. I.

Interpreter,—Lieutenant Campbell, 1st Battalion 1st Regiment Madras N. I.

CHARGES.—Mahobut Khan, Jemadar of the Escort with the British Resident at Nagpoor, placed in arrest, on the following Charges.

1st.—For having not reported himself to Captain Lloyd, whom he was ordered to join in command of a small reinforcement, between the hours of 6 at night and 2 in the morning of the 26th and 27th of November last, in the action at Nagpoor, and not exerting himself as became an Officer, in encouraging the Men in their resistance to the Enemy.

2d.---For having not been present with the Escort some time after 1 in the morning of the 27th, when Captain Lloyd, his Commanding Officer, was forming a Party for the support of the left of the Division against the Enemy, and which Party marched off without him.

3d.---For having on the morning of the 27th, during the time that the Escort maintained its position on the Hill, quitted his position without orders and placed himself in the rear of a Powder Magazine, contiguous to the rear of the Post; and when the Hill was charged by the Enemy, and the Detachment compelled to retreat, having not advanced his Party to its support, but on the contrary, having been among the first to retreat to the Hill on the Right Flank, thereby defeating the purpose for which he had been posted.

4th.---That in the forenoon of the 27th, when the Troops stormed and retook the Hill from the Enemy, and during the whole of that arduous conflict, he, the Jemadar, was not present with his Corps, or with any other part of the Troops engaged---such conduct being cowardly and infamous, unworthy of a Soldier, and tending to the disgrace of the British Arms.

SENTENCE.—The Court having attentively considered the evidence in support of the prosecution, as well as what the Prisoner has urged in his defence, is of opinion, that the Prisoner, Jemadar Mahobut Khan of the Nagpoor Escort, is “Not Guilty” of the first Charge, viz. “Of not having reported himself to Captain Lloyd, whom he was ordered to join in command of a small reinforcement between the hours of 6 at night and 2 in the morning of the 26th November last, in the action at Nagpoor, and not exerting himself as became an Officer, in encouraging the Men in their resistance to the Enemy,” and do therefore acquit him of all and every part of the said Charge.

The Court is of opinion that the Prisoner is “Not Guilty” of the 2d Charge, viz. “For not having been present with the Escort some time after 1 in the morning of the 27th November last, when Captain Lloyd, his Commanding Officer, was forming a Party for the support of the left of the Division against the Enemy, and which marched off without him,” and accordingly acquits him of all and every part of the said Charge.

The

The Court is of opinion that the Prisoner is "Guilty" of that part of the 3d Charge which states "That when the Hill was charged by the Enemy on the morning of the 27th November last, not having advanced his Party to its support," but acquits him of every other part of the 3d Charge.

The Court is of opinion that the Prisoner is "Guilty" of the 4th Charge, viz. "That on the forenoon of the 27th, when the Troops stormed and retook the Hill from the Enemy, and during the whole of that arduous conflict, he, the Prisoner, was not present with his Corps or with any other part of the Troops engaged"---and the Court is further of opinion, that such conduct is cowardly and infamous, unworthy of a Soldier, and tending to bring disgrace on the British Arms.

The Court having found the Prisoner in part guilty of the 3d Charge and of the whole of the 4th Charge, and which being in breach of the Articles of War, do sentence him to be dismissed the service and declared unworthy of serving the Honorable Company in any military capacity whatsoever.

Several instances having recently occurred of the transmission to Head Quarters of Recommendation Certificates for the promotion of Native Officers, in which the reasons for departing from the Regulations prescribing attention to seniority in the selections for promotion have either been altogether omitted to be mentioned, or when stated have proved very unsatisfactory---The Commander in Chief finds it necessary to call the particular attention of Officers forwarding such documents to this point. In cases where it may be deemed proper to set aside the claim of seniority, a full and explicit statement of the cause, together with the grounds on which a junior may be selected for promotion, is to be made at the foot of the Certificate, to enable His Excellency to form his own judgment on the subject.

The Commander in Chief is further pleased to declare, that he does not consider the spirit of the Regulation which appears to impede the priority of claim to promotion in their respective Ranks to the Havildar Major, Drill Havildar and Drill Naigue, as in the least degree affecting the superior claims which in many cases the other Non-commissioned Officers of the Corps may have justly established for themselves by long and faithful services; and His Excellency therefore directs, that seniority shall only be set aside when the general character and conduct of the Individual shall be such as to render it necessary and expedient for the good of the Service.

OPINION AND SENTENCE.—The Court having maturely weighed and considered all that has appeared before it in support of the prosecution, as well as what the Prisoner has urged in his defence, is of opinion that he is not guilty to the full extent of the 1st Charge set forth against him, and does therefore acquit him of the same---But the Court finds the Prisoner guilty of being in a state of intoxication and of thus appearing before the Sepoys of his Company, thereby shewing them a bad example.

The Commander in Chief publishes to the Army the annexed General Order by His Excellency The Most Noble The Governor General.

General Order, by His Excellency the Governor General.

GORRUCKPORE, 18th June 1818.

The Service within the Nagpore Territory having been closed by the reduction of the Fortresses of Mundelah and Chandah, the Governor General has infinite pleasure in professing his acknowledgments to Major General Marshall and to Lieutenant Colonel Adams, under whose able management the captures were respectively effected.

The difficulties which Major General Marshall had to encounter in getting forward his Battering Train, through a Country singularly rough and wholly devoid of roads, were such as, notwithstanding the indefatigable efforts of Captain Case, and of the Ordnance Department under Acting Deputy Commissary Donald, could not have been surmounted by ordinary means. Nothing could have overcome the obstacles but the admirable zeal which appears to have pervaded every branch of the Division. The Sepoys deserve the highest encomiums for their patient and protracted labor in dragging the Artillery and Waggon up the rocky steep; and the Governor General desires that his warm praise may be communicated to them: but it is obvious that their cheerful perseverance in such severe toil could only flow from the cordial confidence subsisting between their Officers and them—

To

To the Officers, therefore, His Lordship directs it to be explained, that from an effect so beneficial to the public service, he knows how to appreciate justly the habitual tenor of their behaviour towards their Men; for which he offers them his applause and thanks.

The conduct of the siege by the principal Engineer Captain Tickell was marked with the same science and judgment observable at Dhamonnie, and does great credit to the professional skill of that Officer. The high terms in which Major General Marshall represents the exertions of Captain Tickell, as well as those of Lieutenants Pecket and Cheape, Ensigns Colvin and Irvine, and Cadet Warlow of the same Corps, are amply justified by the circumstances attending the fall of the Fort.

The gallant manner in which Brigadier General Watson led the assault, and dislodged the rallying Enemy from various parts of the Town, reflects great honor upon him, and must have materially influenced the success of the attack.

Major O'Brien, in procuring information on which to ground the plan for investing the place, manifested a judicious activity extremely useful.

The zeal and intrepidity of Lieutenant Pickersgill, Deputy Assistant Quarter-Master General, in reconnoitring the breach, will remain duly impressed on the Governor General's memory. His Lordship has further to be mindful of the unwearied assistance which Major General Marshall states himself to have received from Captain Watson, Assistant Adjutant General, and from Captain James, Deputy Assistant Adjutant General to the Division.

No exposition of the meritorious service of the Storming Column, nor any proof of the energy of Brigadier Dewar who commanded it, with Majors Midwinter and Thomas under him, can be requisite beyond the fact of its complete success. Lieutenants Lewis and Aitchison with a small Party of Pioneers and a few Men of the 1st Battalion 14th Native Infantry, had the pride of accompanying Brigadier General Watson through the breach, and were eagerly supported by Captain D'Aguilar with a Detachment of the 13th Native Infantry.

In reflecting on this triumph, the speedy prostration of the Enemy's defences, whence the Storm became practicable, exhibits conspicuously the merits of Major Hetzler, Captain Lindsay, and the other Officers and Men of the Artillery. The service rendered by Major Hetzler is highly estimated by the Governor General.

Where every Man whose station gave him the opportunity of taking a special part is stated to have distinguished himself, the Governor General could not without going into a too minute detail

detail express his opinion of every Officer particularized by Major General Marshall; therefore, he must content himself with saying, that he confirms and echoes the praise bestowed on the several Individuals or Corps in the Division Order of Major General Marshall on the occasion.

In adding the reduction of Dhamonnie and Mundelah to that of Hattrass, all achieved with little loss, Major General Marshall has evinced how judiciously he applies the principles of art in sieges; a branch perhaps the most scientific in the Military profession.

The skill with which Lieutenant Colonel Adams made a scanty supply of heavy Ordnance suffice for the capture of a strong Fortress, powerfully garrisoned, fitly crowns the conduct that had distinguished him during antecedent operations. The vigorous decision with which he had previously given a blow to the Army of Bajee Row, productive of irremediable distress and despondency in that Force, is not more to be admired than the judgment visible in the attack of Chandah. The gallantry of the Officers and Men serving under him has well seconded the ability of their Leader.

Lieutenant Colonel Scott, of the Madras Establishment, who guided the assault, displayed a courage no less calmly capable of perceiving and securing every advantage, than it was brilliant. His success demonstrates how judiciously his valor was applied. He appears to have been worthily supported by the intrepidity of Lieutenant Colonel Popham and Captain Brook, who led the right and left columns of attack. In noticing this part of the day's achievement, the Governor General should not forget the animated exertions of Lieutenants Bevan and Fell, (Commanding the Pioneers), or the zeal of Lieutenant Hull, who volunteered to lead the Bengal Grenadiers; nor can he omit noticing the strenuous bravery with which Captain Charlesworth, Lieutenant Casement and Lieutenant Watson (all wounded on the occasion,) contributed to the fortune of the day.

The rapid demolition of the Enemy's defences and the speed with which a breach was effected, would sufficiently testify the science of Lieutenant Anderson, Field Engineer, and of Lieutenant Crawford of the Bengal Artillery, acting as Engineer, in indicating the positions for the Batteries, even had not Lieutenant Colonel Adams professed his obligations to those Officers so warmly.

It is distressing that Major Goreham has not survived to enjoy the just reputation which his eminent merit in the command of the Artillery challenged for him: Yet, if he sank under his too earnest exertions, he bore with him to the tomb the universal admiration of the Army, and his name will long be quoted to excite similar energy.

energy in others. Captain Rodber, Captain Macdowell, Captain Mackintosh, and Lieutenant Walcott, seem to have highly deserved the praise which their Commander bestows upon them. Indeed, the efforts of all the Officers and Men of the Artillery appear to have been proudly laudable; and in particular the successful attempt of Lieutenants Poggenpohl and Hunter, to get one of the guns of the Horse Artillery over the breach, exhibits a spirit and resource of superior tone.

The number of those who would be justified by their behaviour on this occasion to prefer a claim for separate acknowledgments, lays the Governor General under the same impossibility of particularizing every body, which existed with regard to Mundelah: But His Lordship must notice that Major Clarke stands with his usual prominence of distinction; and that special praise is due to Captain Scott, officiating Assistant Adjutant General, and to Captain Sandys, Deputy Assistant Quarter Master General, the latter of whom attached himself to the head of the Storming Column.

In fine, the reduction of the two Fortresses splendidly terminated a Campaign of no ordinary exertion; leaving the Commanders and their Troops with augmented title to that approbation from Government which it is the purpose of this Order to proclaim.

viously to any such person being enrolled on the strength of a Corps, that he be examined by the Medical Officer in charge of it, and if found qualified in every respect, the Medical Officer will report the same to the Officer Commanding the Corps, who, on such written Certificate (to be countersigned if possible by the Superintending or Staff Surgeon) will entertain the candidate and place him on the strength of the Corps.

It is to be understood, that a Second Dresser being returned and mustered on the strength of a Corps, his register is to be kept in like manner as that of the Men, and that he cannot be removed, or discharged, without the sanction and orders of the Commander in Chief.

The importance of fixing Second Dressers permanently with Corps, who know the Families of the Native Officers and Men, and in whom they have confidence, renders it essential that no removal shall ever be recommended unless on most urgent and peculiar reasons.

The Commander in Chief further directs, that Commanding Officers of Corps will see that the Second Dressers of Corps apply themselves to the duties for which they are chiefly provided, and that they are not employed in any but professional duties and pursuits.

It having been brought to the notice of the Commander in Chief, that Soldiers are in the habit of passing through the French Territories, and that in some instances, from ignorance of the local Police Regulations, have been guilty of irregularities, His Excellency deems it expedient to prohibit all Soldiers, European and Native, from entering Pondicherry or its dependencies, unless furnished with a Passport from the British Commissioner, to be applied for by Commanding Officers only on the most urgent occasions; and this Order is to be particularly explained to all Guards, Recruiting Parties, Escorts, and Men proceeding on leave, previous to quitting their respective Corps or Stations.

Remarks by His Excellency The Commander in Chief.

It appears to His Lordship that no attempt was made to disprove the fact asserted by the Prisoner, of his having been taken by the Enemy while he was seeking water to quench his thirst in the deserted Escort Lines; and of his having been detained until the approach of Brigadier General Doveton's Force caused the Enemy to neglect further care of him.—There is no apparent improbability in the fact, nor is it inconsistent with any thing testified by the Witnesses for the prosecution, were it substantiated, it would absolve the Prisoner; therefore, The Commander in Chief is of opinion that, standing un rebutted, the defence should be admitted as freeing the Prisoner from the Charge.

The

The Commander in Chief is perfectly attentive to that collateral knowledge of circumstances which each Member of the Court, sitting in judgment where the transaction took place, was likely to possess, and thence he should be inclined to think the condemnation of the Prisoner essentially just; but to act upon such presumptions would be to deprive a Prisoner of the ulterior security supposed to exist in The Commander in Chief's weighing the Sentence with the quality and amount of testimony adduced on the trial.

The evidence on the Proceedings not being decidedly satisfactory in the present case, His Lordship has not confirmed the Sentence.—Were he to direct the Court to revise it, the transmission of the result of that sitting at such a distance would entail a painfully long addition of confinement to Peer Mahomed, tho' destined to be freed. The Commander in Chief therefore directs that the Court be dissolved, and that Peer Mahomed be ordered to return to his duty.

cution, and what the Prisoner has brought forward on his defence, are of opinion that the Prisoner, Assistant Surgeon John Llewellyn, is not guilty of the first Charge, and they do therefore acquit him of all and every part of the same.

The Court are further of opinion that the Prisoner, Assistant Surgeon John Llewellyn, is guilty of the first part of the second Charge, but they do acquit him of all the latter part of the said Charge.

The Court having found the Prisoner guilty as above specified, do therefore sentence him to be admonished in such manner as His Excellency the Commander in Chief may think proper.

The Court are further of opinion, that Assistant Surgeon Llewellyn's conduct in this instance has proceeded entirely from his having been deprived of his usual accommodations on board the Vestal Cruizer, and of others having been assigned to him perfectly inadequate and unsuitable to an Officer and a Gentleman of his rank and situation, the Cabin now allotted to the Lieutenant of the Vessel and Mr. Llewellyn being, in the opinion of the Court, barely sufficient for the accommodation of one person.

The Court cannot forbear expressing their disapprobation of the evasive replies of Mr. Moriton, and further express their surprize that there should appear on his part so little preparation to answer questions which occurred on the Prisoner's defence.

Remarks by the Commander in Chief.

The Commander in Chief has approved and confirmed the above Sentence because it does not clearly appear with respect to the first Charge that any official order was given to the Prisoner not to quit the Vestal, by the Officer who was directed to make that communication to him; but it is nevertheless clearly proved by his own confession, that he did absent himself without leave from the 2d of June to the period of his being placed under arrest, a line of conduct highly reprehensible and deserving the severest censure, it can be owing solely to the wording of the 1st Charge that the Prisoner has been acquitted.

Of the first part of the 2d Charge the Prisoner has been found sentenced to be admonished, but there is no part of Assistant Surgeon Llewellyn's conduct so deserving of censure,

as the highly indecorous and improper letter which that Gentleman ventured to address to Government on the 28th May, which he has also thought proper to place on the Proceedings of the Court as part of his defence, and the Commander in Chief has only to express his regret that such an offensive document did not form part of the Charges exhibited against the Prisoner.

With respect to the observation of the Court on the accommodation which has been recently allotted to the Assistant Surgeon on board the *Vestal* Cruiser, the Lieutenant General cannot but concur, and he will not fail to bring this subject officially to the notice of Government.

In conclusion, the Commander in Chief deems it an act of justice towards that highly respectable Public Officer, the Superintendent of Marine, to observe that the evidence required from Mr. Meriton not immediately applying to the Charges under investigation, it could not be supposed that he should be prepared to answer questions on points on which he did not expect to be examined; particularly as they related to subjects on which no satisfactory reply could be given except by a reference to papers which Mr. Meriton states he had not brought with him into Court,—the other parts of Mr. Meriton's evidence not applying to matters of fact but merely of opinion, there appears to be no grounds whatever for the remark of the Court, as a Witness is at all times at liberty to answer such questions in the manner in which he may think proper—nor can any Court (without being fully informed of every circumstance) venture with propriety to pass an opinion on the (correctness or incorrectness of such evidence.

The Military Board are directed to adopt the necessary measures for having the Arms in use with the Troops, as also those in the several Depôts, browned in the manner enjoined by the Honorable the Court of Directors.

The Military Board will issue instructions to Officers Commanding Divisions relative to the progressive introduction of this system, to the Arms now in use; and the several Commissioners of Divisions or Subsidiary Forces will prepare and transmit to the Military Board Indents for the quantity of materials required in their Divisions, or Forces, respectively, calculated upon the proportions laid down in the following instructions, and with reference to the number of Arms in store and the established strength of each Division of the Army.

The Right Honorable the Governor in Council is further pleased to direct, that an allowance be made to Battalions at the rate of 21 Rupees per quarter, for the purpose of meeting the expense of preserving the colour of the Arms, as required by the present Regulation.

The periodical allowance above alluded to, will not commence until after the expiration of twelve months from the time of the Arms of the respective Battalions being first generally browned, which circumstance must be duly reported by Officers Commanding Corps to the Military Board.

This allowance to be drawn by Quarter Masters and countersigned by Officers Commanding Corps.

Instructions for browning 200 Gun Barrels.

The following Ingredients, viz.

Nitric Acid.....	One Ounce.
Sweet Spirits of Nitre	One do.
Spirits of Wine.....	Two do.
Blue Vitriol.....	Four do.
Tincture of Steel	Two do.

are

are to be mixed together, the Vitriol having been previously dissolved in a sufficient quantity of warm water, to make with the other Ingredients two quarts of mixture. Wine measure.

Previous to commencing the operation of browning the Barrels, it is necessary that they be well smoothed and cleaned from all greasiness and other impurities; and that a plug of wood be put into the muzzle, and the vent well stopped, the mixture is then to be applied with a clean sponge or rag, taking care that every part of the Barrel is covered with the mixture, which must then be exposed to the air for 26 hours, after which exposure the Barrel must be rubbed with a hard brush and rag, or tow, to remove the oxid from the surface.—This operation must be performed a second and a third time (if necessary), by which the Barrel will be made of a perfectly brown colour, it must then be well brushed and wiped and immersed in boiling water, in which a small quantity of alkaline matter has been put, in order that the action of the acid upon the Barrel may be destroyed and the impregnation of the water by the acid neutralized.

The Barrel when taken from the water must, after being perfectly dry, be rubbed smooth with a burnisher of hard wood and then heated to about the temperature of boiling water, it will then be ready to receive a varnish made of the following materials (for 200 Barrels).

Spirits of Wine.....	36½ Ounces.
Dragons Blood Powder..	3 Drams.
Shellac bruised.....	1 Ounce.

and after the varnish is perfectly dry upon the Barrel, it must be rubbed with the burnisher to give it a smooth and glossy appearance.

To repair and retain the brown upon the Barrels.

When the Barrel is much rubbed from use, a little Vitriolic Acid may be applied to it, and then it must receive the treatment that Barrels undergo in browning, care being taken to deaden the action of the acid by means of boiling water.

When Brown Barrels are in constant use, the brown might be continually kept perfect by means of the application of Vinegar, which should remain upon the surface for a day and then be washed well with boiling water.

If this operation be repeated monthly, a Barrel which has been properly browned in the first instance will continue in a perfect state for many years.

The stoppages which are made from Cavalry Officers on the above account are to be recorded in the Regimental Books, specifying by what Paymasters, and from what month's abstracts, the stoppages were made.

When an Officer is permitted to return a Charger to the Ranks, his bill is to be made out for the regulated amount, and to be sent by the party direct to the Accountant General in the Military Pay Department, accompanied by a copy of His Excellency the Commander in Chief's permission to return the Charger;—by a certificate that the Horse has actually been received into the Ranks;—and by a statement showing to what Paymasters, and in what months, the instalments corresponding in amount with the bill, were paid for the Horse.

On receipt of the above documents, certified by the Officer Commanding the Regiment, the Accountant General is to refer to the accounts of Paymasters, or, if those do not shew the payments, to the abstracts of the Officers, which are lodged in his Office;—and if it shall appear that the stoppages were made from the party, the Accountant General is to transmit the bill and accompanying documents to the Military Auditor General, informing him that the price of the Horse has been fully paid, on which communication the latter is to pass the bill for payment—but if, on the contrary, it shall appear that the whole of the stoppages were not made, the bill is to be returned by the Accountant General to the party, with a letter particularizing the instalments which appear not to have been paid.

Remarks by The Commander in Chief.

The Commander in Chief has confirmed, though he cannot approve, a Sentence so entirely inadequate to the Crime. The Prisoner

Prisoner has been found guilty of disgraceful conduct, highly unbecoming an Officer and a Gentleman, and his conduct has on various occasions been so disgraceful and ungentlemanlike, from his inveterate habits of intoxication, as to render it quite improbable that any reprimand however severe, will prove of the smallest use towards reclaiming a Man so lost to every sense of honorable and gentlemanlike feeling. His Excellency therefore directs, that previous to the Prisoner's release from arrest, he be ordered to pay over the amount of the balance due to the Men of his Company, to the Adjutant of the Corps of Invalids, for the purpose of it's being transmitted to the Fort Adjutant at Tannah, who is to be placed in charge of the Company at that Station so long as Lieutenant White may remain attached to it, who by his unworthy and disgraceful habits has rendered himself totally incapable of such a charge.

Lieutenant R. White, after having paid the amount due to his Company, to the Adjutant of the Native Invalids, to be released from his arrest, and will return to his duty.

Remarks by The Commander in Chief.

The Commander in Chief cannot help expressing his regret that Jemadar Shamajee Aaronjee of the 2d Battalion 6th Regiment N. I. should have been brought before a General Court Martial, especially as it appears from the evidence on the part of the prosecution, that there was not the slightest ground for preferring the Charge which was exhibited against him. It is likewise proved, that no previous investigation took place, and that the Jemadar was brought to trial on the mere report of the Native Adjutant, by whom the Jemadar was treated with a degree of harshness not only unnecessary, but highly reprehensible,—had the Commanding Officer of the Battalion paid that strict attention to his duty, which ought always to be observed on similar occasions, the Jemadar would not only not have been brought to public trial, but the respectability of the Corps would have been more becomingly upheld.

" As connected with this subject, we deem it necessary to call your particular attention to the necessity of discontinuing the practice which appears to obtain at your Presidency, of granting allowances in advance to Officers proceeding to the Isle of France, the Cape, or St. Helena, and eventually to Europe for the recovery of their health.—In many instances those Officers avail themselves of the full extent of this permission, and return to Europe, whereby they are put on a better footing than those who obtain leave to return home, and whose allowances cease from the date of the dispatch of the Ships on which they may embark."

6. " We therefore direct that in future no allowances of any kind be advanced to Officers obtaining leave of absence to proceed to the Isle of France, the Cape, or St. Helena, but in the event of their returning from either of those places to India, you will order payment of the arrears of Batta and Gratuity due to them on their return to their duty."

2. Agreeably to the above instructions of the Honorable Court of

of Directors, all authorized advances to Officers proceeding to Sea, the Cape of Good Hope, China, or other Settlements, are to be regulated in conformity with the 3d Paragraph, General Order 31st August 1816, which directs the issue of six months Subsistence in place of three months Pay and Allowances; and the Accountant General in the Military Department will himself observe, and issue the necessary instructions to Paymasters to ensure their attention to, the form of last Pay Certificates prescribed by the Honorable Court in the above Extract.

3. In order to save unnecessary trouble and delay to Officers when on the eve of embarkation, they are permitted to apply direct for all authorized advances to the Paymasters, who are to discharge their demands in conformity to the Regulations, without previous communication with the Military Auditor General.
