### APPENDIX

#### NOTIFICATION.

It is proposed, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (h) of sub-section (2) of section 303 of the Madras District Municipalities Act, 1920 (Madras Act V of 1920) and in supersession of all previous rules on the subject, to make certain rules regarding the authorities competent to accord administrative and technical sanction to water-supply and drainage works in municipalities, the procedure to be followed for inviting tenders for these works and other connected matters. The following draft of the rules is accordingly published as required by section 304 of the said Act for general information.

The draft rules will be further considered after six weeks from the date of publication in the light of such objections or suggestions as may be received before the expiry of the period aforesaid. Objections or suggestions should be addressed to the Secretary to Government, Health, Education and Local Administration Department, Fort St. George, Madras.

#### DRAFT RULES.

Rule I.—Investigation, preparation of plans and estimates and administrative approval.

- 1. New water-supply and drainage schemes and schemes for improvements to already existing water-supply and drainage works requiring investigation by the Sanitary Engineering Branch shall first be investigated by the Executive Engineer (Public Health) under the general directions of the Sanitary Engineer, and under the orders of the Government. The Sanitary Engineer shall submit his investigation reports to the Chief Engineer who shall then forward the reports to the Government and obtain their orders for the preparation of plans and estimates. The Sanitary Engineer shall arrange to get detailed plans and estimates prepared and submit them to the Chief Engineer, who will scrutinize and forward them with his remarks to Government for administrative approval.
- 2. In the case of schemes for improvements to already existing water-supply and drainage works not requiring investigation by the Sanitary Engineer but eligible for grant from revenues of the State, previous approval of the Government shall be obtained.

#### Rule II-Technical sanction.

(a) (1) In the case of new water-supply and drainage schemes and also schemes for improvements to already existing water-supply and drainage works, the authorities mentioned below shall, on receipt of the administrative approval of the Government accord technical sanction to plans and estimates up to the limit of cost specified against each:—

#### Authorities. Maximum limit of cost. 1. Municipal Engineer, First Grade In the case of original works not exceeding Rs. 25,000. In the case of repair works no limit. 2. Municipal Engineer, Second Grade ... In the case of original works not exceeding Rs. 15,000. In the case of repair works no limit. 3. Municipal Engineer, Third Grade and engi-In the case of original works not exceeding neering subordinates possessing qualification Rs. 5.000. of a Municipal Engineer. In the case of repair works not exceeding Re. 8,000. 4. Municipalities in which there is no Municipal Engineer or subordinates possessing the qualification prescribed for Municipal Engineers-(1) Supervisor Not exceeding Rs. 2,000 for original works

as well as repair works.

Not exceeding Rs. 1,000 for original works as well as repair works.

Executive Engineer (Public Health)

6. Sanitary Engineer . . . . Original works not exceeding Rs. 25,000.

- (2) The powers of technical sanction conferred by this sub-rule on Municipal Engineers and municipal engineering subordinates shall be subject to the following conditions, namely:—
- (i) that the approval of the Sanitary Engineer, in the case of Municipal Engineers, I Grade and that of Executive Engineers (Public Health) concerned in the case of other Municipal Engineers and engineering subordinates shall be obtained before technical sanction is accorded to either new works or work of improvements involving structural additions or alterations or repairs to headworks, filters, service reservoirs, settlement tanks, sewage disposal plants or to any work, which materially affects the water-supply and drainage works of the Municipal Council; and
- (ii) that the previous approval of the Sanitary Lugineer shall be obtained before technical sanction is accorded to opening of new fountains or shifting the position of the existing fountains.
- (3) Typo-designs suitable for the work concerned issued by the Sanitary Board or Public Health Board, Sanitary Engineer or Consulting Architect, shall be used whenever these are available.

#### Rule III -- Execution.

(a) Municipal Engineers and engineering subordinates shall ordinarily be allowed to execute water-supply and drainage schemes subject to the limits laid down below:—

I Grade Municipal Engineer .. .. No limit.

II Grade Municipal Engineer .. Rs. 1,00,000.

III Grade Municipal Engineer and also municipal Rs. 50,000.

Municipal engineering subordinates not Rs. 20,000. qualified to become Municipal Engineers.

So far as the execution of the schemes is concerned, the Municipal Engineers and engineering subordinates shall be entirely subordinate to and under the orders of the officers concerned of the Sanitary Engineering Branch in respect of all matters. Municipal Engineers, I Grade, shall execute works under the supervision and general control of the Sanitary Engineer and Municipal Engineers, III Grade, under the supervision and general control of the Executive Engineers (Public Health) concerned. Municipal Engineers, III Grade, and engineering subordinates qualified to become Municipal Engineers, when they take up works costing more than Rs. 10,000 and engineering subordinates not qualified to become Municipal Engineers when they take up any work costing more than Rs. 2,500 shall be subject to the general control of the Assistant Engineers (Public Health) concerned.

Rule IV—Excess over estimates and deviations from sanctioned plans and estimates and other questions allied thereto.

- (a) In the case of schemes falling under rule III, a Municipal Engineer, I Grade shall be competent to pass finally all excess over the amount of original estimates sanctioned by himself or by higher authorities up to a limit of Rs. 500 irrespective of the total of the sanctioned estimate and in other cases, provided that the total amount of the excess is within 5 per cent of the sanctioned estimate and within the limit of his power to sanction estimates technically. A Municipal Engineer, I Gradehas no powers to sanction any excess over a revised estimate sanctioned by a higher authority.
  - (b) Contingencies in the estimate for a work.

A Municipal Engineer, I Grade shall be competent to divert the provision for contingencies to new works or repairs not provided for in the estimate up to a maximum of Rs. 5,000 for each item. He can divert the provisions in an estimate under contingencies to meet excesses due to increased rates or any cause whatever provided that total amounts of the estimate after revision does not exceed by more than 5 per cent of the sanctioned amount inclusive of contingencies and provided that the excess is within the I Grade Municipal Engineer's powers of sanction.

(c) Unforeseen works in an estimate for a work-

A Municipal Engineer, I Grade shall be competent to divert the provisions under this item for new works, which are required by the administrative authority and which are essential for the due fulfilment of the precise object for which the scheme was intended up to a limit of Rs. 5,000 for each item.

(d) Deviations from sanctioned plans and estimates-

A Municipal Engineer, I Grade shall be competent to sanction alteration in the constructive details of works during their execution in cases of necessity, reporting as a general rule his action to the Sanitary Engineer, provided that such alterations do not cause an increase of charge on the work, beyond the limits of his powers to deal finally with excesses over estimates. When, however, such alterations affect the administrative side of the works, they should be effected only after consulting the municipality concerned.

- (e) In the case of schemes executed by Municipal Engineers, II Grade and III Grade and other municipal engineering subordinates under rule III, the Officers of the Sanitary Engineering Branch of the Public Works Department concerned shall exercise the powers, which they would normally exercise under rules in the Public Works Department Code.
- (f) In the case of schemes falling under rule III, the officers of the Sanitary Engineering Branch of the Public Works Department concerned shall exercise the powers which they could normally exercise under the rules in the Public Works Department Code, as amended so far as water-supply and drainage schemes are concerned, by G.O. No. 2528, Health, dated 7th August 1952.
- (g) The Municipal Council shall be informed by the Officer concerned, as soon as he exercises the powers under this rule.

#### Rule V.—Tenders and contracts

- (a) In all cases the tender notices should be prepared and issued by the Municipal Engineer and if there is no Municipal Engineer, by the Executive Authority of the Municipal Council. Before the issue of tender notices, the approval of the authority which accords technical sanction to the estimates should be obtained for the tender notice. And in the case of tender notices relating to the purchase of pumping plant, the Mechanical Expert to the Sanitary Engineer shall be consulted through the Sanitary Engineer. The Contract Committee referred to in section 68 (1) of the Madras District Municipalities Act, 1920 (Madras Act V of 1920) shall be competent to accept tenders in the case of contracts not exceeding Rs. 1,000 in value. In the case of contracts exceeding Rs. 1,000 in value, the following procedure shall be adopted by Municipal Councils. Municipal Councils.
- (b) Municipalities having I Grade Municipal Engineers shall select suitable tenderers and enter into agreement with them in respect of works costing not more than Rs. 25,000 in consultation with and under instructions from its Municipal Engineer. In respect of works exceeding this limit, the municipality should seek the advice of the Sanitary Engineer, before accepting tenders.
- (c) Municipalities having II Grade Municipal Engineers shall select suitable tenderers and enter into agreement with them in respect of works costing not more than Rs. 10,000 in consultation with and under instructions from its Municipal Engineer. In respect of works costing more than Rs. 10,000, the municipality should consult the Executive Engineer (Public Health) concerned or the Sanitary Engineer according as the amount of contract is within the accepting powers of the Executive Engineer (Public Health) or the Sanitary Engineer under the Public Works Department Code. Department Code.
- (d) Municipalities having III Grade Municipal Engineers or other engineering subordinates, should in all cases exceeding Rs. 1,000 referred to in paragraph V (a) above, consult the Executive Engineer (Public Health) concerned or the Sanitary Engineer according as the amount of contract is within the accepting powers of the Executive Engineer or Sanitary Engineer.
- (e) In the case of schemes falling under sub-rule (b) of rule III, the Officers of the Sanitary Engineering Branch of the Public Works Department, shall exercise the powers which they would normally exercise under the rules in the Public Works Department Code.

#### Rule VI.—Bills—Payment of.

(a) In respect of schemes in direct charge of Municipal Engineers and engineering subordinates, payments to contractors for the work shall be made by the Executive Authority on bills passed by the Municipal Engineer or engeneering subordinates and the work test-checked by the Executive Engineers (Public Health). In the case of works executed by a I Grade Municipal Engineer, no test-check by an Executive Engineer (Public Health) is necessary before payment of bills. The accounts shall be maintained by the Executive Authority on details furnished by the Municipal Engineer or the engineering subordinate and the bills on which payments are made.

(b) In respect of schemes in direct charge of the Sanitary Engineering Branch of the Public Works Department, payments shall be made in accordance with the usual procedure adopted in the Public Works Department and the accounts shall be maintained by the Sanitary Engineering Branch of the Public Works Department.

#### Rule VII.

Works financed entirely from municipal funds shall be executed by the Municipal engineering staff without the supervising control of the Sanitary Engineering Branch of the Public Works Department if the amounts of such works are within the limits of powers of technical sanction of the Municipal Engineer or engineering subordinate of the Municipal Council under rule II, unless the Municipal Council specifically requests that supervisory control of the Sanitary Engineering Branch be exercised under rules III (a) and VI (a) in such cases. The exercise of powers of technical sanction by Municipal Engineers or engineering subordinates under rule II, referred to above, is subject to the conditions in rule II (a) (2) of the same rules, in respect of these works also.

#### Rule VIII.

These rules shall also apply to other works, such as draw wells, tube wells, with pumping units, distribution cistern with supply taps, street drains, etc., pertaining to water-supply and drainage though not connected with any scheme new or existing, and also to repairs (ordinary or special) to existing works such as renewal of filter media, relaying of a water-supply main, reconstructing public fountains, flood drainage repairs, etc., as distinct from improvements, which are financed entirely from municipal funds. Technical sanction to all these works shall be governed by rule II, subject also to the conditions in rule II (a) (2).

In the case of pure repair works, the Municipal Engineers, I and II Grades shall have enhanced powers of according technical sanction to all estimates without limit of cost, subject, of course, to the conditions in rule II (a) (2). The supervisory control of the Sanitary Engineering Branch of the Public Works Department stipulated in rules III and VI shall not apply in the case of pure repair works, executed by Municipal Engineers, I and II Grades. The powers of III Grade Municipal Engineers, engineering subordinates possessing the qualifications of a Municipal Engineer and engineering subordinates not possessing the qualifications of a Municipal Engineer, for purposes of technical sanction and executions in respect of "Repair Works" shall be the same as those laid down under rules II and III, subject to the provisos therein.

Note.—In this rule, the term Chief Engineer, wherever it occurs, refers to the Chief Engineer, who is in charge of the Sanitary Engineering Branch for the time being.

## Order-No. 1174, Health, dated 3rd May 1954.

Under the orders in G.O. No. 1155, P.H., dated 8th April 1947, the construction of septic tank latrines in panchayat and non-panchayat areas should be carried out by the Public Health Department under the supervision of the District Health Officers concerned with the aid of the Local Fund Engineering staff or the Health staff in the district. With reference to the orders in the Government Order second cited, in municipalities, the work in question is to be carried out by the Public Health Department under the supervision of the Municipal Health Officers concerned with the aid of the Municipal Engineering staff or the Health staff of the municipality and in municipalities where an Engineering Supervisor is available, the Health Officer and the Engineering Supervisor may carry out the work without outside sanction.

- 2. The Director of Public Health now points out that difficulties have arisen in the matter of construction of septic tank latrines, as the Health Officers do not have training for estimates and measurements. He further states that even if a supervisor is allotted for the work, the check that a Health Officer can exercise will only be nominal. The Director has therefore suggested that the work in question might be taken away from the Health Officers.
- 3. After a careful examination of the matter, the Government pass the following orders:—
- (i) Health Officers will be responsible for initiating proposals for the construction of latrines, for deciding the site and the nature of latrines and for obtaining the necessary sanction and allotment of expenditure; and
- (ii) the Engineering department will be responsible for the entire execution of the work (construction of septic tank latrines,) from the preparation of estimates to the final completion of work and for any repairs, the expenditure thereon being met from the allotment under the Public Health budget.
- 4. The Government also direct that in municipal areas the work should be carried out by the Municipal Engineers and that in municipalities which do not have a Municipal Engineer, the work should be handled by the Subordinate Engineering staff with reference to the rules relating to the other works.

- 5. In panchayat areas, the work in question should be carried out by the District Engineering Supervisor and his staff with reference to the rules relating to other works.
- 6. In non-panchayat areas, the works relating to the construction of septic tank latrines should be treated as non-road works of the district board and executed by the Highways Department.

Act-Madras Public Health Act, 1939-Authority for the performance of the functions to be performed by the Panchayats under section 53 of the Act and delegation of certain powers to Inspector of Municipal Councils and Local Boards-Previous orders -Modified.

In G.O. No. 4269, Health, dated 14th December 1951, the Government directed that in respect of the functions to be performed by Panchayats under section 53 of the Madras Public Health Act, 1939, the District Boards of the districts in which the respective panchayats are situated, should be the local authority. The Inspector of Municipal Councils and Local Boards was also authorized to exercise the powers vested in the Government under section 6-A (2) of the said Act, in so far as they relate to the functions under section 53 of the said Act. The notifications issued in that connexion were omitted to be published in the Fort St. George Gazette. The Government direct that the said notifications be published with retrospective effect. The notifications in Appendices I and II will accordingly be published in the Fort St. Gorge Gazette.

2. It is now observed that in actual practice the orders referred to in paragraph 1 above, have resulted in great strain on the administrative staff and the financial resources of many of the District Boards. The Government consider that in the interest of efficient and prompt institution of measures provided for in section 53 of the Act, it is desirable to exclude from the purview of the above orders such of the panchayats as can finance the measures directly from their own funds and to make the orders applicable only to such panchayats as may not be able to meet the expenditure on the measures from their own funds in the first instance. In modification of the orders in G.O. No. 4269, Health, dated 14th December 1951 the Government accordingly delegate to the Inspector of Municipal Councils and Local Boards, the power vested in them under section 6-A (1) of the Act to notify the Panchayats in respect of which the District Boards shall be the local authority for the purposes of section 53 of the Act. The notification in appendices III and IV to this order will be published in the Fort St. George Gazette.

#### APPENDIX.

#### PART I.

Rules defining the Constitution and Functions of Advisory Committees for Government Hospitals in the Madras City.

The Advisory Committee is constituted in order to keep the Director of Medical Services and the Government informed as to the needs of the hospital as viewed by the public. The entire supervision and management of the institution and its establishment will be in the hands of the Dean or the Superintendent subject to the control of the Director of Medical Services and the Government. The Committee shall be an advisory body with no executive authority.

2. The Committee shall ordinarily consist of four ex-officio members including the Dean or the Superintendent and the Nursing Superintendent of the hospital and twelve nominated non-official members, of whom five may preferably be ladies, two of these ladies being public-spirited persons representing the Medical Association or members of the independent medical profession nominated by the Government. These members may be varied by the Government at their discretion in individual cases. In the case of Women and Children's hospitals, lady members may be appointed as far as possible.

Note.—The Deputy Superintendent, Government Hospital for Women and Children, Madras, shall be an ex-officio member of the Advisory Committee of the hospital.

3. A nominated member shall hold appointment for three years, but shall be eligible for re-nomination as provided for in the note below. If a nominated member is absent from the station for a period of more than three months reckoned from the date of the commencement of his or her term of office or of the last meeting which he or she attended, or if within the said period of three months, less than three meetings have been held, absents himself or herself from three consecutive meetings held after the said date, the member shall be considered to have vacated his or her seat on the committee, unless his or her absence from the station or from the meetings, as the case may be, is condoned by the Government. If a member of the Union Parliament is nominated as a non-official member of a Hospital Committee and his absence at the Committee meetings for more than three months is inevitable, it should not be a sufficient reason for removing him from the Committee on account of such absence.

Note.—One-third to one half of the number of non-official members may be newly nominated once in three years, and in the matter of re-nomination of non-official members at the end of this period for the remaining vacancies on the committee, preference shall be given to those who attended the meetings regularly and evinced interest in their work. The persons nominated or re-nominated should be good and capable persons. To facilitate work, vacancies occurring in the middle of the term should be limited to the period up to which the members nominated in the batch continue to serve on the Committee.

- 4. The Committee shall choose one of its members as the President, who shall hold office for the period of his or her membership. The Resident Medical Officer of the hospital shall be the Secretary of the Committee and shall attend all meetings of the Committee. In the absence of the President, the members present shall elect one of the members to preside at the meeting. Seven members shall form a quorum.
- 5. (1) The Committee shall meet as often as may be necessary for the discussion of topics of interest and importance connected with the hospital. The meeting shall be convened by the Secretary under the orders of the President It will be open to any member of the Committee to forward to the President any remarks or suggestions which he or she may have to make or which he or she may desire to have discussed at the meeting of the Committee.
- (2) The lady members of the Advisory Committee shall, with the approval of the Committee, form themselves into a sub-committee for doing social work among nurses. The sub-committee should confine its activities purely to social work among the nurses and should not deal with questions relating to their service.
- 6. All suggestions and recommendations for the improvement of the hospital and for the welfare of the patients shall be brought before the Committee for consideration and decision by a majority. In any case of equality of votes, the President shall have a second or casting vote.
- 7. The minutes of the proceedings of the Committee shall be recorded in a book and shall be signed by the President or the member who presides at the meeting.
- 8. All recommendations of the Committee shall be forwarded to the Dean or the Superintendent of the hospital for necessary action. A copy of the minutes of each meeting shall also be communicated to the Director of Medical Services for information through the Superintendent of the hospital.
- 9. The Dean or the Superintendent of the Hospital shall carry out the recommendations of the Committee as far as practicable. If he or she cannot accept their recommendations, the matter shall be referred to the Director of Medical Services for orders.
- 10. Individual members of the Committee may arrange with the medical officer in charge to visit the hospital at any time during working hours and may record in the visitors' book any remarks and suggestions they may wish to make.
- 11. The non-official members shall pay surprise visits once a week by turns by maintaining a rotation roster as in the case of inspection of jails by non-official visitors. An inspection book with the points to be observed on the lines indicated below shall be opened at each hospital for the members to write their remarks:—
- (1) Are patients treated strictly in the order of their arrival? If there are large crowds at particular hours, is the system of forming queues adopted for out-patients?
  - (2) Are medicines dispensed promptly and according to turn?
- (3) How many, if any, of the patients were privately consulted or were treated by the Medical Officer before admission?
  - (4) Is the hospital clean and sanitary?
  - (5) Where diet is supplied, is it satisfactory?
  - (6) Have the patients any complaints in respect of their treatment by the hospital staff?
  - (7) Do the statistics of patients indicate that the hospital is popular?
- (8) How much time does the Medical Officer spend in the hospital? Is he easily accessible for emergent cases?
  - (9) Other suggestions for improving the conditions and procedure of the hospital.
- 12. A suggestion book for recording complaints by patients shall also be kept at each hospital. These two books shall be placed before the advisory committee for consideration at its meetings.
  - 13. Identification cards shall be supplied to all non-official members.
- 14. The Dean or Superintendent of the hospital shall submit periodical reports on the attendance of non-official members at the meetings of the Committee and on the work done by the Advisory Committee to the Director of Medical Services once in six months, the report for the first six months being submitted in July of every year and the report for the next six months being submitted in January of the succeeding year. The Director of Medical Services shall review the reports and submit a copy of his review to Government for information:

#### PART II.

Rules defining the Constitution and Functions of Advisory Committees for Mufassal Government Hospitals in the Madras State.

The Advisory Committee is constituted in order to keep the Director of Medical Services and the Government informed as to the needs of the hospital as viewed by the public. The entire supervision and management of the institution and its establishment will be in the hands of the medical officer in charge, subject to the control of the Director of Medical Services and the Government. The Committee shall be an advisory body with no executive authority.

- 2. The composition of the Committee shall ordinarily be as follows:-
  - (a) District Headquarters Hospitals:—(1) The Collector.
    - (2) The President, District Board (when a non-official).
    - (3) The District Medical Officer.
    - (4) The Executive Engineer.
- (5) The Chairman, Municipal Council, in the case of Municipal towns, when a non-official.
  - (6) A second-representative of the Municipal Council.
  - (7) A second-representative of the District Board.
- (8) A non-official who is a member of the Madras Legislative Assembly or the Madras Legislative Council representing the area in question or a public spirited person preferably a lady representing a congress committee or Public Welfare Committee, organisation or body nominated by the Government.
- (9) A non-official, preferably a lady, being a public spirited person representing a Medical Association or a member of the independent medical profession, nominated by the Government.
  - (10) | (11) | Four other non-official members nominated by the Government.
- Note.—(1) Individual members of the Legislature may be appointed as Members of the Advisory Committees on the recommendation of the Collector and the Director of Medical Services; any member so appointed will take the place of the second representative of Municipal or the District Board as may be specified in each case. Members of the Legislature may also be appointed as members of the Committee when the Chairman of the Municipal Council or the Special Officer in the case of superseded municipalities
- (2) One or at the most, two legislators may be appointed as co-opted members of Hospital Advisory Committees in their respective residential areas if there are not legislators already serving on the
- (3) In cases where a district comprises more than one local fund district, the Presidents of all district boards in the district may serve as members of the Advisory Committee of the Government District Headquarters Hospital as representatives of district boards. Similarly, each of the district boards in the district may send up a second representative to serve on the Committee.
- (b) Hospitals at Divisional Centres.—(1) The Revenue, Divisional Officer or if the station is not the Headquarters of the Revenue Divisional Officer, the Tahsildar, Deputy Tahsildar or an official of the Judicial Department not lower in rank than a District Munsif (if one is available at the station).
- (2) The Chairman, Municipal Council, or the President, Panchayat Board, as the case may be. In the case of Government Medical institutions at divisional centres which are outside the municipal or panchayat areas, a non-official member of the District Board elected for the circles in which the institution is situated.
- (3) Local Public Works Department Officer, if one is employed in the station (vide note below).
  - (4) The Medical Officer in charge.
- (5) and (6) Two non-officials who are members of the Madras Legislative Assembly or the Madras Legislative Council or public spirited persons, representing a congress committee or a Public Welfare Committee, organization or body nominated by the Government.
- (7) A non-official, preferably a lady who is a public spirited person representing a medical association or a member of the independent medical profession nominated by the Government.
  - (8), (9) and (10) Three other non-official members nominated by the Government.

Note.—(i) If no Public Works Department Officer is employed in the station, his place will be taken by another non-official gentleman, nominated by the Government.

- (ii) The Lay Secretary and Treasurer of the Government Headquarters Hospital, Kozhikode, shall be an ex-officio member of the Advisory Committee of that hospital and the Government Women and Children Hospital, Kozhikode.
- 3. The representatives elected by the Municipal Councils and the District Board need not necessarily be members of the respective bodies. An elected member shall hold his appointment for three years and shall be eligible for re-election as provided for in the note below. Women shall be eligible as members of the advisory committee. The Assistant to the District Medical Officer in the case of District Headquarters Hospitals other than hospitals under Civil

Surgeons (wherever there is a Resident Medical Officer in addition to the Medical Officer in charge) and the Medical Officer in charge in the case of other hospitals, shall discharge the duties of the Secretary to the Committee and shall attend all meetings of the Committee.

If a nominated member is absent from the station for a period of more than three months reckoned from the date of the commencement of his or her term of office or of the last meeting. which he or she attended or if within the said period of three months, less than three meetings have been held, absents him elf or herself from three consecutive meetings held after the said date, the member shall be considered to have vacated his or her seat on the committee, unless his or her absence from the station or from the meetings, as the case may be, is condoned by the Government. If a member of the Union Parliament is nominated as a non-official member of a Hospital Committee, his absence at the Committee meetings for more than three months is inevitable and it should not be a sufficient reason for removing him from the Committee on account of such absence.

Note.—One-third to one-half of the number of non-official members may be newly nominated once in three NOTE.—One-third to one-half of the humber of non-official members may be newly nominated once in three years, and in the "matter of re-nomination of non-official members at the end of this period for the remaining vacancies on the committee, preference shall be given to those who attended the meetings regularly and evinced interest in their work. The persons nominated or re-nominated should be good and capable persons. To facilitate work, vacancies occurring in the middle of the term should be limited to the period up to which the members nominated in the batch continue to serve on the committee.

- 4. The Committee shall meet as often as may be necessary for the discussion of topics of interest and importance connected with the hospital. The meetings shall be convened by the Secretary under the orders of the Collector, Divisional Officer, Tahsildar, Deputy Tahsildar or an officer of the Judicial department not lower in rank than a District Munsif, as the case may be. It will be open to any member of the Committee to forward to the Collector, Divisional Officer, Tahsildar, Deputy Tahsildar or an officer of the Judicial Department not lower in rank than a District Munsif any remarks or suggestions which he may have to make or which he may desire to have discussed at a meeting of the Committee.
- 5. The Collector, Divisional Officer, Tahsildar, Deputy Tahsildar, or an Officer of the Judicial Department not lower in rank than a District Munsif shall preside at the meetings, but in his absence, the members present shall elect a chairman for the meeting. Six members shall form a quorum.
- 6. If at a meeting convened under Rule 4, there is no quorum as fixed in rule 5 the meeting can be adjourned to a specific date and for such an adjourned meeting, four members shall form
- 7. All suggestions and recommendations for the improvement of the hospital and for the welfare of the patients shall be brought before the Committee for consideration and decision by a majority. In any case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or easting
- 8. The minutes of the proceedings of the Committees shall be recorded in a book and shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting.
- 9. All recommendations of the Committee shall be forwarded to the District Medical Officer for necessary action. A copy of the minutes of each meeting shall also be communicated to the Director of Medical Services for information.
- The District Medical Officer shall carry out the recommendations of the Committee as far as practicable. If he cannot accept the recommendations, he should refer the matter to the Director of Medical Services for orders.
- Individual members of the Committee may arrange with the medical officer in charge to visit the hospital at any time during working hours and may record in the Visitors' book any remarks and suggestions they may wish to make.
- 12. The non-official members shall pay surprise visits once a week by turns by maintaining a rotation ros er as in the case of inspection of jails by non-official visitors. An inspection book with the points to be observed on the lines indicated below shall be opened at each hospital for the members to write their remarks :-
- (1) Are patients treated strictly in the order of their arrival? If there are large crowds at particular hours, is the system of forming queues adopted for out-patients?
  - (2) Are medicines dispensed promptly and according to turn?
- (3) How many, if any, of the patients were privately consulted or were treated by the Medical Officer before admission?
  - (4) Is the hospital clean and sanitary?
  - (5) Where diet is supplied, is it satisfactory?
  - (6) Have the patients any complaints in respect of their treatment by the hospital staff? (7) Do the statistics of patients indicate that the hospital is popular?
- (8) How much time does the Medical Officer spend in the hospital? Is he easily accessible for emergent cases?
  - (9) Other suggestions for improving the conditions and the procedure of the hospital.

- 13. A suggestion book for recording complaints by patients shall also be kept at each hospital. These two books shall be placed before the Advisory Committee for consideration at its meetings.
  - 14. Identification cards shall be supplied to all non-official members.
- 15. The District Medical Officer shall submit periodical reports on the attendance of non-official members at the meetings of the Committees and on the work done by the Advisory Committees to the Director of Medical Services once in six months, the report for the first six months being submitted in July of every year and the report for the next six months being submitted in January of the succeeding year. The Director of Medical Services shall review the reports and submit a copy of his review to Government for information.
