*Amendment of rule 3 of Ferry rules.*—Communicating to all Local Boards and Municipal Councils G.O., Revenue Department, approving the recommendation of the Board of Revenue to empower Presidents of District Boards to supplement the ferry accommodation in the event of the contractor's failure to carry all the traffic that offers, and ordering the publication in the *Fort St. George Gazette* of a notification amending rule 3 of the general rules framed under section 16 of the Canals and Public Ferries Act, 1890.

*Amendment of rule No. 461 of the Local Fund Code.*—Amending rule 461 of the Local Fund Code so as to facilitate the lending of tools by local bodies to contractors under certain restrictions and conditions, and requesting the Accountant-General to issue the required correction slips as soon as possible.

*Annual establishment returns.*—Sanctioning the proposals of the Accountant-General that the salary and establishment bills relating to Local Fund servants should, for the future, be retained for only 10 instead of 35 years as required by G.O., No. 2084 L., dated 6th December 1901, and that the correction slip to article 236 of the Local Fund Code should be withdrawn so as to require the inclusion in the — of particulars regarding every officer in Local Fund service, and requesting the Accountant-General to make the necessary alterations in the Local Fund Code and to circulate correction slips accordingly without delay.

*Conveyance of camp equipment and bicycles.*—Communicating to the Sanitary Commissioner and the Sanitary Engineer G.O., Financial Department, directing that the maximum weight of camp equipment prescribed for claims under article 1000 of the Civil Service Regulations be applied when actual expenses are claimed under article 1062 and ruling that when claims are preferred under articles 1000 and 1062 of the Civil Service Regulations on account of the cost of conveyance of a bicycle, the bicycle shall, in the case of those officers who are permitted to recover charges for more than two horses, be taken as equivalent to one horse and that in no case shall the charge for the conveyance of more than one bicycle be admitted.

*Expenditure in excess of budget provision.*—Cancelling, with remarks, so much of article 290 of the Local Fund Code as limits to Rs. 500, the authority of District Boards to sanction excesses over budget allotments increasing from Rs. 250 to Rs. 500 the power of Taluk Boards to sanction similar expenditure, and requesting the Accountant-General to circulate at once correction slips to this effect to all Local Boards.

*Gratuity to Local Fund servants.*—Informing the Accountant-General that the intention of Government in articles of the Local Fund Code is to limit the amount of gratuity ordinarily to nine months' emoluments and that each case presented to Government is decided on its merits, and recasting the said article so as to make this intention clear.

*Holidays in Public offices.*—Communicating to the Sanitary Commissioner, the President, Municipal Commission, Madras, and other Government and local authorities concerned G.O., Public Department, laying down the conditions under which a Government servant who is called on to attend office on a public authorized holiday may be granted leave for another day in its place.

*Inferior service.*—Communicating to the President, Municipal Commission, Madras, the Sanitary Commissioner and other Government and local authorities interested G.O., Financial Department, on the ruling of the Government of India that the term — as used in paragraph 2 of article 50 of the Civil Service Regulations should be understood in a comprehensive sense; exempting all members of menial establishments from the production of a medical certificate on their appointment to a pensionable appointment in superior service whether their inferior service was qualifying or not.

*Madras Hill Allowance Code.*—Recording G.O., Financial Department, recording letter from the Government of India authorizing this Government to sanction, subject to certain limitations, the travelling expenses in the case of a clerk who accompanies the headquarters of Government to Ootacamund, but, in consequence of illness, is granted leave and permitted to rejoin the office at Madras on the expiry of such leave, and directing the necessary additions to be made to the —.

*Malabar.*—Informing the President, District Board, —, that it has already been decided that no right of appeal to the District Board should be allowed in the case of medical subordinates lent by Local Boards to Municipalities, and declining to amend article 69 of the Local Fund Code in the manner suggested by the President of the Taluk Board of Palghat.
