The 3^d Judge contends that the Circular order of the Foujdary Adawlut, requiring the Circuit Judges to forward translations of all referrible trials, and dispensing with a copy of the original, is illegal and unsafe and throws an intolerable burthen on the Circuit Judges. The Foujdary Adawlut reply, that the copy of the original record was dispensed with because it was found to be useless; that the Judge conducting the trial is best qualified to attest the translations, that the translations are in general excellent, that they could not be prepared with greater, or even with equal dispatch at the Presidency; and that the Circuit Courts will now be relieved of much labour by the reduction in the number of referrible trials.
