Resolution and Order thereon.

To the Chief Secretary . Transmitting copies of letters from Sir Gore Owsely and from Military Secretary to the Commander-in-Chief and requesting instructions whether the Ambassadors application for a quantity of Muskets should be complied with whether the Arms are to be sent to Buschar or to Bombay, as in a former instance.

Acknowledging receipt of a Letter under date the 1360. June with papers relating to the plan of movements connected with the settlement of the difference with the Southern Jageerdars which he approves of.

With copy of a dispatch to the Right Honor-Fromable the Governor-General on the subject of the arrangements for the eventual prosecution of hostilities against the Southern Jagheerdars, take a view of the force at his command and the plan of operations intended to be pursued and discusses the question of the practicability of carrying them on, during the rainy season, request instructions as to the season in which operations should be commenced but if in the mean time he can bring his negotiations to a close will proceed to action.

The negotiation with the Peishwah has assumed a favorable appearance but he has not yet opened the subject to the Jageerdars, a part of the Poonah Subsidiary Force to proceed with the Peishwah The whole are placed in readiness to field service, but the Resident does not anticipate any immediate necessity for the march of the Troops south of the Toombuddra.

From the Resident—. His negotiation have assumed Cons. 14th August D° such an aspect that he has judged it necessary to require the advance of the Seroor force under Colonel Montresor and the reinforcements from Bombay and Jaulnah - will observe the effect of those movements before he require the advance of the Troops at Bellary but has written to Colonel Dowse to hold the Troops in readiness to move.
