Encloses Copies of letters from the Residents in Mysoor and at Hydrabad, regarding the forms which it may be proper to observe on the investiture of a Nabob of Kurnool considers those described by the Resident at Hydrabad to be most appropriate for that occasion, but that there will not be any necessity for observing the same forms on declaring the presumptive heir, Desires that he will be prepared to submit his opinion on this point at the proper season.

Information respecting the reported treatment of Munnoo Meean the strength of the Fort of Kurnool—the number of the Nabob's Troops—the steps taking for levying forces—the mode in which the Nabob's revenue are managed—the impoverished condition of his territory and the ruined state of his finances.

Requests that Mr. Chaplins' mission has been without effect—Explains the Nabobs error regarding the form and tenor of the letters addressed to him and to his son by Lord Minto and by the Government of Fort Saint George—States the inviolable determination of the Government, with respect to the succession to his estates—Combats the arguments in defence of his conduct contained in the paper delivered to Mr. Chaplin—Intercedes for Munnoo Meean—Desires him to receive Mr. Chaplin as the accredited agent of the Government.
