TIRUCHIRAPALLI.

THE Tiruchirapalli Hindu Girls Education Society (a-body registered under the Societies Registration Act) was managing an Elementary School for girls known as Savitri Vidyasala. In 1938 it was resolved to start a girls High School with a view to provide modern education in the background of Hindu tradition and culture. On 19-6-'38 Savitri Vidyasala Hindu Girls High School was inaugurated by Sri C. Rajagopalachariar who was then and is happily now the Chief Minister of the Madras State. The Institution soon became very popular and her strength grew from 40 to 1000 in 10 years.

On 22-10-'50 the Managing Society passed the following resolution :

“Savitri Vidyasala owes its origin and later its establishment on solid foundation to the indefatigable energy and fostering care of its Secretary and Correspondent Diwan Bahadur N. Ramaswami Ayyar. The Institution has acquired a respectable stature and has earned popular support. The demand for raising the High School to a College has been insistent” (and the Society therefore) appeals to “the Secretary and Correspondent” to spare no pains in this behalf and to rededicate himself to the achievement of this object.” It was further resolved that in due recognition of the Secretary's invaluable services “The College will be known as Seethalakshmi-Ramaswami College.”

In a special message Sri P. S. Kumarasami Rajah the then Chief Minister, Madras State and the present Governor of Orissa, spoke highly of the Savitri Vidyasala, blessed the venture to raise it to the status of a College and appealed “to one and all to whom

there could be no dearer cause than the promotion of education and culture among women, to extend their sympathy, help and patronage to this Institution."

The Chairman of the Trichy Municipality, the President of the District Board and other respectable leaders of all castes and communities also endorsed the appeal.

Accordingly, the Seethalakshmi-Ramaswami College was started in June 1951. The College is now affiliated to the Madras University in all the three Groups :

Group I (Mathematics, Physics & Chemistry)

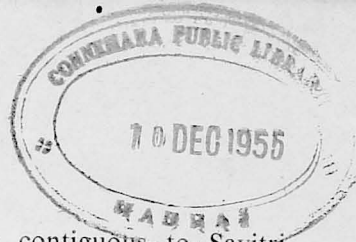
Group II (Natural Science, Physics & Chemistry)

Group III (History Logic & History and Music.)

Strength: In 1951-52 there was only the Junior Inter-Class and that but with a strength of 11. In 1952-53 the Senior Inter-Class was also opened and the strength increased to 57. In the current year (1953-54) there are 91 girls on the Rolls.

Intermediate Examination Results: The first batch consisting of 11 students appeared for the Intermediate Examination in March 1953 and it gives great pleasure to state that Ten of them passed in full, while the eleventh passed in English and History & Logic but failed in Sanskrit. Of the ten who passed, 6 got placed in the first Class. This is a very commendable result, particularly since all the 11 belonged to Group III (History, Logic & Music).

Students of Group I (Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry) and of Group II (Natural Science, Physics & Chemistry) will be appearing for the first time for the Inter Examination to be held in March 1954 and taking due note of the enthusiasm and high qualifications of the Lecturers in these subjects, it is expected that the results would be as commendable as had been in Group III.



Play-ground: An area of 15 acres contiguous to Savitri Vidyasala's play-ground has been ordered by the Central Government to be alienated to this College. And the matter is now pending with the Government of Madras. It is hoped that the latter would soon put us in possession of the entire area and thus enable us to satisfy the requirements of the University.

Building: The University has permitted the holding of the College Classes in the New High School Buildings till a separate Building for the College is built. This arrangement is satisfactory. Yet unceasing efforts to get plans and estimates for the College Building approved by the Government for grant purposes has resulted in the Government, by its recent order, permitting starting the building-work without waiting for the regular order placing it in the approved list of works. It is hoped that the work might be started before March 1954 with the help of the munificent donation already assured by M/s Dalmia Cement (Bharat) Ltd., for building the Dalmia Science Block for which foundation stone was laid on 31—5—51 by the late Dr. T. S. S. Rajan the then Minister of our State.

Endowment: A sum of Rs. 75,000/- has been invested in the National Savings Certificates and the said certificates have been deposited with the University.

The Management's offer to endow its buildings whereat a hostel is being run for the High School and the Elementary School girls—has been very kindly accepted by the University and the request to have the same equated for a capital endowment of Rs. 1,50,000/- is awaiting the University's decision.

Hostel: In 1951-52 and 52-53 we found accommodation for a few members of the College staff and some College Students in the hostel maintained for the High School girls. In the current year, it was expected that more accommodation might be needed. A separate hostel for the College has been therefore built and the

same was made ready for occupation by the opening of the College in June last.

This Hostel is already overful and so another hostel building is being constructed. This new Building is a double storeyed one with 20 rooms on the whole-capable of providing decent accommodation for 60 members. With the completion of this building, the Hostel-problem would get solved for some time. It is gratifying to note that the Hostel is very popular.

Staff: The Principal and the other members of the staff are all well qualified enthusiastic young ladies coming from respectable families and inspired by the zeal to make the College a First Grade one in the very near future.

Conclusion: The College has started doing very well and has an undoubted future. All this is due to the Public patronage secured by unceasing endeavour to deserve same. But two more Lakhs of Rupees are yet necessary immediately for placing the Institution on a satisfactory basis. May we appeal to the Public for further help.

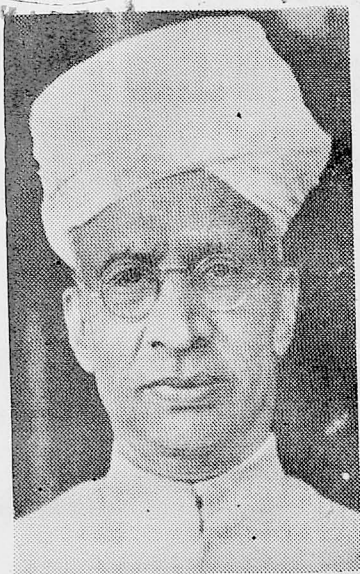

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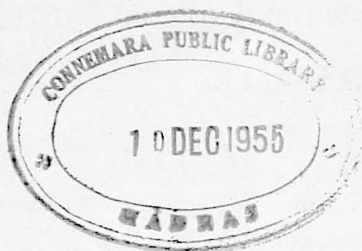
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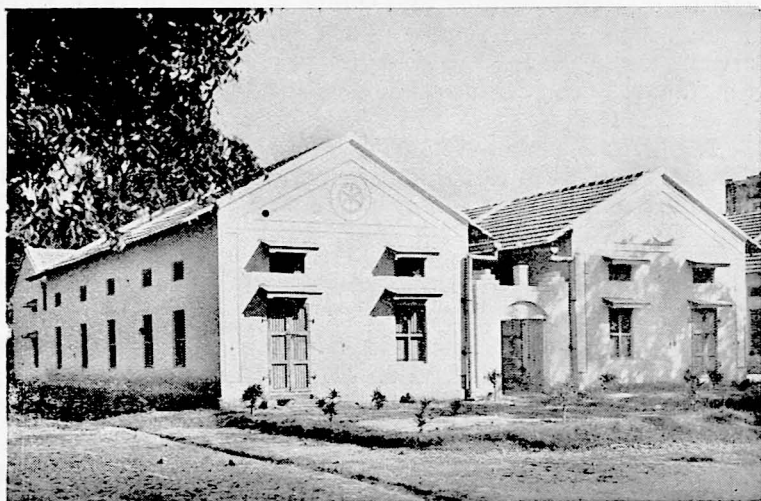

RULES AND HOSTEL CHARGES :

1. The Principal shall be the ex-officio Warden.
2. She will be assisted in the day to day running of the Hostel by a Deputy Warden who will be in charge of store room-maintain accounts regarding extras and guests-grant permission for interviews and absence, attend to the sick, enforce discipline and in general act under the instructions of the Warden.
3. Members seeking admission into the Hostel shall apply in the prescribed form to the warden. The warden has a right to refuse admission without disclosing reasons.

4. The following is the time-table for tiffin and meals :

7 A.M.	to	8 A.M.	Coffee
9 A.M.	to	10 A.M.	Tiffin
1 P.M.	to	2 P.M.	Meals
4-30 P.M.	to	5-30 P.M.	Tiffin and Coffee
7 P.M.	to	8 P.M.	Meals.

No item in the above will be served after time.

5. An admission fee of Rs. 2 and an advance of Rs. 75 as deposit will be collected from every new student-entrant. An all-inclusive charge of Rs. 42 per member per month will be collected for boarding-lodging-electricity and establishment charges. This charge is payable within the first week of every month. Fines at the rate of 2 annas a day will be levied for late payment for a week thereafter and membership will cease if the dues have not been paid before the end of the fortnight. Milk and hot water will be provided at extra cost-if available. Deductions will be made on the monthly charge of Rs. 42 for continued absence of 7 days and more and that at the rate of 0-12-0 per day. Guests will be charged at the rate of 0-10-0 per meal and Rs. 2 per day.

6. Night lights will ordinarily be off at 10 P.M. subject to modifications during Examination times by the warden. Main-gate will be closed at 8-30 P.M. The inmates will meet and say prayers both in the mornings and in the evenings. 6-30 A.M. to 9 A.M. and 8 P.M. to 10 P.M. are study-hours when silence would be strictly enforced.

7. The Hostel authorities will not hold themselves responsible for any loss of money or valuables. The Deputy warden may be entrusted with extra money in the hands of the students for safe keeping. The students are advised not to bring costly jewels with them but to wear minimum and cheap jewels during the stay in the Hostel.

8. Members will be responsible for taking care of the furniture and for keeping the walls and premises clean.

9. No member shall introduce a guest without giving previous notice to the Deputy warden. No guest shall be allowed to stay during the night without the permission of the Deputy warden.

10. No meeting shall be held in the Hostel without the previous permission of the Deputy warden.

11. The menu will be prepared for everyweek by the Deputy warden.

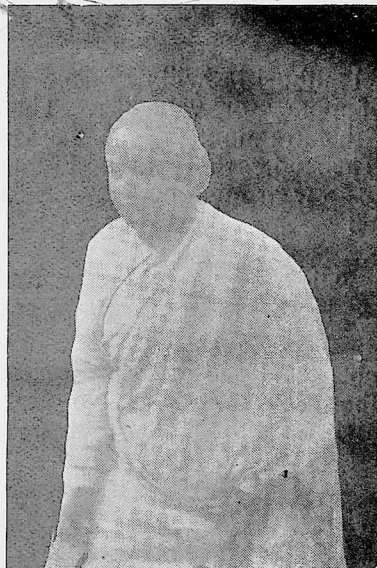
12. Any complaint relating to the Hostel shall be brought to the notice of the Deputy warden.

13. Members may remember their hostel-life is a training ground for Proper social behaviour and good conduct and that therefore, by word and deed, inside the dining-hall and outside, they should consciously evolve a code of etiquette which would stand them in good stead in their after life.

14. Membership will be liable for termination for any conduct considered prejudicial to the general good of the hostel.

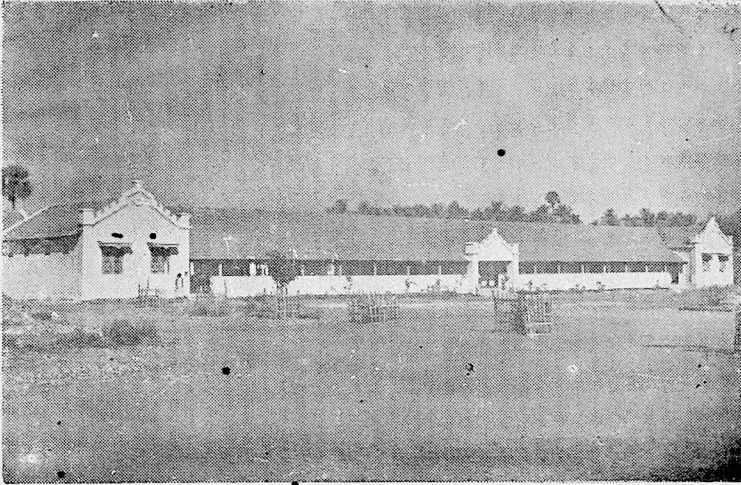
The campus is not sufficient for these institutions.

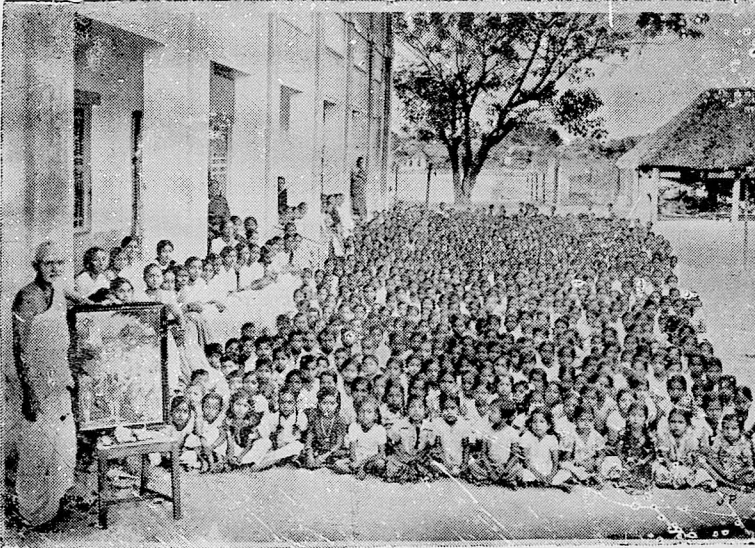
