Introduction

The Madras Institute of Development Studies was founded in January 1971 as a trust by Dr. Malcolm S. Adiseshiah and Mrs. Elizabeth Adiseshiah with a four-fold objective:

- To undertake studies and research pertaining to development problems with special reference to the agro-rural aspects of Tamilnadu and the problems of the economically and socially backward sections of the population throughout the country:
- To conduct seminars and conferences on development problems and programmes of the State:
- To foster inter-university cooperation among the social scientists of the Universities of the four Southern States:
- To promote interdisciplinary research: and bring out publications relating to the above three functions.

During 1976 the Government of India through the Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi, sent a mission headed by Prof. D. T. Lakdawala to study the possibility of developing the Institute into a National Institute of Social Science Research. On the basis of the recommendations of the mission the Institute was reconstituted as a

National Institute in March 1977 under the joint sponsorship of the Government of India through the Indian Council of Social Science Research and the Government of Tamilnadu with a Governing Council comprising representatives of the ICSSR and the State Government and of the Universities of the four southern states, the original trustees of the Institute and coopted social scientists as given in *Annexure* I. The trustees gifted to the reconstituted National Institute its land and building, its library, furniture and equipment and a cash endowment.

Dr. Malcolm S. Adiseshiah served as the Director of the Institute from its inception till June 1978. Dr. C. T. Kurien took up charge as Director of the reconstituted Institute in July 1978. Dr. A. Vaidyanathan took over as Director with effect from July 1, 1988.

With the reconstitution, the scope of the Institute's activities has widened. Besides conducting research on various aspects of development, (both generally and with special reference to Tamilnadu), organising seminars and conferences, and fostering inter-university co-operation, the Institute's charter now provides for the conduct of teaching-cum-research programmes leading to Ph. D. degrees, expansion of the library and strengthening the social science documentation activities.

The Institute is on the threshold of entering the third decade of its functioning. This review highlights the various facets of the institute's functioning for the period July, 1989 to June 1990.

Eightieth Birthday Celebrations of Dr. Malcolm S. Adiseshiah

On 18th April, 1990 a public function was held in the Institute to celebrate the Eightieth Birthday of Dr. Malcolm S. Adiseshiah. Founder of the Institute and Chairman of its Governing Body, Dr. P. C. Alexander, then Governor of the State presided over the function. Thiru E. R. Prabhakar welcomed the gathering. Thiru M. S. Appa Rao, Dr. C. T. Kurien, Prof. S. Gopal and Dr. A. Gnanam paid tributes to the multidimensional personality of Dr. Adiseshiah and to his contributions as economist. educationist and philanthropist, Prof. S. Gopal handed over a volume of essays and reflections in honour of Dr. Adiseshiah entitled "Economy, Society and Development" to Dr. A. Gnanam, Vice Chancellor of the University of Madras. These were contributed by eminent Indian and foreign scholars. Dr. Gnanam presented the felicitation volume to Dr. Adiseshiah. Dr. Nirmal Sengupta, then Acting Director of the Institute proposed the vote of thanks.

M/s. Sage Publishers have agreed to publish this volume of felicitation on behalf of the Institute.

A Festscript in honour of Dr. Malcolm S. Adiseshiah edited by Thiru S. Subramanian containing articles from eminent Indian and foreign scholars had also been presented to Dr. Adiseshiah on his Eightieth Birthday.

Composition of Faculty

Since the last meeting of the Academic Council, there have been changes in the composition of the Faculty of the Institute. I am happy to report that Dr. A. Vaidyanathan was invited to join the Planning Commission and he took E.O.L. from 3rd January, 1990 to join there. On Dr. Nirmal Sengupta's shoulders fell the additional responsibility of being the Acting Director of the Institute from 3rd January, 1990 to 1st July, 1990 which he discharged creditably. Dr. Pulapre Balakrishnan joined the Institute as Fellow on 25th April, 1990. Mr. S. Guhan, Senior

Fellow rejoined the Institute on 4th June, 1990 after availing Extraordinary Leave to be the Adviser to the Chief Minister of Tamilnadu. He has accepted part-time appointment as member of the State Planning Commission with effect from 14th June, 1990. Dr. S. Neelakantan joined the Institute as Director on 2nd July, 1990. At present there are six Professors/Senior Fellows, seven Fellows, six Research Associates and one Research Assistant in the faculty (See Annexure II).

Research and Writings

Dr. Malcolm S. Adiseshiah, Honorary Professor and Chairman, continues to edit the Bulletin and its "Editorial: Some Highlights" covers in every issue the general economic scene, national economy and national production front, international economy and the economy of Tamilnadu. He is a member of the Tamilnadu State Planning Commission and Vice-President of Tamilnadu State Council for Science and Technology, Chairman, Centre for Development Studies and Indian Association of Social Science Institutions. He is also a member of UGC Standing Committee on Adult Education Commission

and a member of Governing Board of Tata Institute of Social Sciences. He is very actively keeping his academic interest and his contributions continue to flow regularly through various organs. His academic publication are appended separately.

Members of the faculty have continued their individual research as well as their writings. Prof. C.T. Kurien with Prof. S. Gopal and Mr. Eric Prabhakar edited "Economy, Society and Development" (Essays and Reflections presented to Prof. Malcolm S. Adiseshiah on his 80th Birthday) and has written the introduction to the book, to be brought out by Sage Publications. He has also completed and has circulated Part I of his book, "The Economy: An Introductory Exposition".

Dr. A. Vaidyanathan, before he joined the Planning Commission as a member, in collaboration with Dr. S. Janakarajan, had completed and submitted to the Planning Commission a Monograph on "Palar-Parambikulam-Aliyar Project". For a Volume edited by Prof. Kaushik Basu to be brought out by Oxford University Press, he has contributed a paper on "Performance of Indian Agriculture since Independence".

Mr, S. Guhan presented a paper on "The Final Report of the Ninth Finance Commission: A Preliminary Examination" at the seminar organised by the National Institute for Public Finance and Policy, New Delhi on 12th May, 1990.

Prof. Nirmal Sengupta had published "La marcha de una idea" in Anuario de Ethnologia y Antripologia Social: "Mounting Antagonism towards Big Dam" in EPW. December 1989: Comments in B.D. Dhawan ed. Big Dams: Claims and Counter Claims, Commonwealth Publisher, New Delhi and "Significance of Andhra and Bihar" in Ghanshvam Shah ed. "The Capitalist Deve-Iopment: Critical Essays", Peoples Publishing, Bombay. His paper on "Local Adaptations and Basic Designs" had been accepted for International Workshop on Design issues in FMIS, organised by International Irrigation Management Institute and TRIMNET, Chiang Mai, December 1989. He presented a paper on "Destruction of Water Resources as a Consequence of Green Revolution" at a Workshop in Third World Network and Asia-Pacific Peoples' Environment Network. Penang, Malaysia in January 1990. At the regional seminar on "Panchayati Raj and Rural Development", he presented a paper

on, "For an Economic Rationale" at Vellore in March 1990.

Prof. Nasir Tyabji's paper on "The Genesis of Chemical-based Industrialisation: The Case of Oil-seeds in Madras upto the Depression" has been accepted for inclusion in the publication of the edited book "Technology and the Raj". It has come out as Working Paper No. 93 of our Institute. The paper had been discussed at the Indo-Soviet Symposium organised by ICHR in "India-Rationale, Role and Prospects" and the seminar organised by the Science and Technology Park of the University of Poona.

Dr. K. Nagaraj's study on "Rural Female Workers in Tamilnadu" has been published by the ILO-ARTEP in the Volume, "Limited Choices", edited by A. V. Jose.

Mr. S. Subramanian's "Poverty Minimisation in the light of Life Boat ethics" appeared in Volume 5 of Journal of Quantitative Economics. He has contributed a paper on "Some Notes on Poverty in India" to the "Perspectives for the Eighth Plan" book edited by Malcolm S. Adiseshiah.

Dr. Padmini Swaminathan's "Legislation for the Improvement of the Socio-economic

conditions of Women: The Indian Case" has been published by Macmillan in the edited work "Women in Development in South Asia". She has co-authored with Dr. Nasir Tyabji for the paper on "Recent Trends in Industrialisation in Tamilnadu" published in MIDS Bulletin. She had presented papers on "Women's Studies and Industrial work" at New Delhi and at Trichirapalli; a paper on "Women Technology and Development" was presented in Montreal, Canada at a Conference organised by the McGill and Concordia Universities.

Dr. P. Radhakrishnan has published his paper on "Indigenous Education in British India: A Profile", in "Contributions to Indian Sociology". A paper on "Backward Classes in Tamilnadu" appeared in EPW and a related paper in MIDS Bulletin. He had published a paper on "Land Reforms in Tamilnadu" in MIDS Bulletin. In the Kerala University seminar he presented a paper on "Peasant Struggles in Malabar: An Overview".

Dr. M. S. S. Pandian has contributed to "Political Economy of Agrarian Change: Nanchilnadu, 1880-1939" published by Sage Publications. In EPW he has analysed the "Culture and Subaltern Consciousness: An Aspect of MGR Phenomenon".

Dr. Paul P. Appasamy has presented a paper on "Micro-Watershed Management: A Case Study of a Tamilnadu Village" at a seminar organised by the Centre for Science and Environment. At the workshop on "Coastal Vegetation and Dryland Forestry", he and Dr. Sivarajasingham presented a paper on "Sustainable Agriculture Development Through Watershed Management in Dry Areas of Tamilnadu".

Dr. Pulapre Balakrishnan's book "Pricing and Inflation in India" is to be released by Oxford University Press.

Dr. S. Janakarajan in collaboration with Prof. A. Vaidyanathan has submitted a report to the Planning Commission by studying the two surface irrigation systems in Tamilnadu. He has presented a paper on "Interlinked Transactions and the market for water in the agrarian economy of a Tamilnadu village" at the Centre for Economic Studies, Presidency College, Calcutta.

Dr. R. Hema has co-authored a paper at the PACER Conference in New Delhi on "Pricing Options for Peak load problem in Indian Electric utilities". A list of books / papers completed during the year under review merits mention. Apart from the research work mentioned earlier, the faculty spends considerable amount of time in writing papers for, and participating in, conferences and seminars as listed in *Annexure III*. A Comprehensive and updated list of the institute's publication from its inception to date is given in *Annexure XII*.

Related Activities

In addition to their academic work, the members of the faculty continued to make contributions to the public life. Dr. C.T. Kurien serves as a Member of the Tamil Nadu State Council for Science and Technology. He organised the Institute's Workshop on "Agricultural Development of Tamilnadu" in August 1989. He visited the People's Republic of China as a member of an ICSSR delegation in November. He is helping the Centre for Development Studies, Trivandrum in their faculty evaluation.

Dr. Nirmal Sengupta gave a lecture on a training course in irrigation at Institute

for Social and Economic Change, Bangalore in August and was a discussant to a workshop on "People's access to water resources" in New Delhi in December. He was also invited to the discussion on Draft Report prepared by the National Institute of Urban Affairs on "Women in the Urban Informal Sector" held at Lucknow in April and attended a workshop on "Land Reforms in India" at LBSN Academy of Administration Mussoorie in April.

Dr. Nasir Tyabii along with Dr. Padmini Swaminathan organised the workshop in the Institute on "Perspectives for Industrialisation in Tamilnadu during the Eighth Five Year Plan" in September. The report on the proceedings appeared in EPW in November and MIDS Bulletin in December. He attended the conference on "International Debt-Crisis: Implications for the LDCs and the Future of the World Economy" organised by the Centre for Research on New International Economic Order, Madras in December. He chaired a session on "Marx's Historical Method" organised by the Department of Sociology, University of Madras in February. He participated in the seminar on the Budget organised by the Mangement Division of Anna University and State Bank of India in March. He

assisted the Centre for Development Studies, Trivandrum as an external evaluator for Faculty Evaluation Scheme.

Dr. K. Nagaraj was a member of the working group on "Urbanisation" set up by the Tamilnadu Planning Commission for the preparation of the Eighth Plan. He is a member of the Study Group on "Indebted Rural Labour". He is also a member of the working group on "Official Statistics of the Planning Commission, Government of Tamil nadu.

Mr. S. Subramanian was a visitor to the Indian Statistical Institute, Delhi during January-February, 1990. He was a discussant at the conference on "Economic Theory and related Mathematical Methods" organised by the ISI, Delhi and "On Aspects of Development of the Indian Economy" organised by the Presidency College, Calcutta.

Dr. Padmini Swaminathan participated in a National workshop on Visibility of Women in Statistics and Indicators: Changing Perspectives at Bombay in July, sponsored by UN-INSTRAW-GOI-DWCD-SNDT. At a workshop organised by the History Department, University of Bombay in July 1989,

she spoke on "State Policy with reference to Industrialisation in Madras Presidency, 1895-1914". In August 1989 at the Madras School of Social work, she participated in a "Consultation on Building in Women Development in the Eighth Plan — State and Region" held under the auspices of the Planning Commission.

Dr. Radhakrishnan organised the one-day workshop on 'Backward Classes and Reservations" at the Institute in March 1990. He participated in the workshop on Ph.D. Scholars and Guides in the Institute in April 1990. He also participated in a three-day workshop on "Oral History" organised by the USEFI and the Sociology Department of Madras University.

Dr. Paul P. Appasamy participated in the seminar on "Urban Poverty" organised by the National Institute for Urban Affairs at the Madras School of Social work in July 1989. In September 1989 he participated in the Indo-French seminar on "Protection of Water Resources" and in December he chaired a session of the National Conference on "The Debt Crsis" organised by the Centre for Research on New International Economic Order. He assisted the Institute in organi-

sing the Twentieth Interdisciplinary Research Methodology workshop at Trivandrum in June 1990.

Some of the faculty members serve on Committees established by government and by non-governmental entities. A list of these is provided in *Annexure IV*. They also contribute to the work of other academic institutions by serving on their respective Coun-

cils/Board of studies, by evaluating M. Phil and Ph.D. theses and refereeing research proposals and Papers, see *Annexure V*.

Ph.D. Training

1. Ph.D. Programme

Mr. K. Bharathan has been awarded the Ph.D. Degree of the Madras University.

Mrs. Asha Krishnakumar has submitted her synopsis of her dissertation to the Madras University.

The course structure for the Ph.D. scholars has been a matter of debate for quite some time. The existing scholars continue with the structure of giving three seminar papers on their topics. They also evince keen interest by attending workshops and seminars on related topics. The list of Ph.D. Scholars and their topics of research are given in Annexure VI.

2. Meeting of Ph.D. Scholars and Guides

The annual Ph.D. Scholars and Guides meeting was held from 18th to 21st April, 1990 at the Institute. It was attended by 39 Ph.D. scholars from different parts of the State. In addition, 7 recognised Ph.D. Guides from various Universities and Colleges of Tamilnadu also participated.

Several well known scholars and public figures visited the Institute during the year. The list of such scholars are furnished in Annexure IX.

Interuniversity Co-operation

1. Meeting of Social Scientists

The Nineteenth Annual Meeting of Social Scientists was held on 6th January at the Institute. It was attended by 21 participants drawn from different disciplines in social sciences of South Indian Universities. For the first time, School of Management Studies, Cochin University and Agricultural College, Madurai were represented. Apart from the usual theme of the Teaching and Research in Ph. D. Programme, Evaluation Procedures in Post-Graduate Courses were reviewed in this year's workshop.

Two papers were specially prepared. One by Prof. S. Neelakantan of the Department of Economics, Bharathidasan University and the other by Prof. Dharenendriah of the Psychology Department of Karnatak University. The papers were meant to set out the main features of the current evaluation procedures for PG courses, the directions in which they need to be improved, and also indicating measures for making the teaching community more responsive to the problems in this area. These two papers were intended to set the agenda for discussion at the Meeting. Thereafter the participants reviewed their experience with reference to those theme papers.

2. Census of Social Science Research in Southern States

The Twentieth Census of Social Science Research has increased to 277 from last year's 238. From Andhra Pradesh only 4 institutes have responded, an equal number from Karnataka, Kerala 2 and Tamilnadu 8. Of the 277 entries, Economics leads with 141, which is a sharp increase from last year's 80 entries. Surprisingly for the first time Agriculture takes the second place with 37 entries followed by sociology with 22 & Education with 20 entries.

3. Interdisciplinary Research Methodology Workshop

The twentieth annual Interdisciplinary Research Methodology Workshop was held

at the Centre for Development Studies, Trivandrum from 6th to 9th June and was attended by participants representing the disciplines of Economics, Sociology, Forestry, Ecology, Management, Geomorphology, Soil Science, Geography and Urban Planning. This workshop was the second in the series on "Management of Renewable Resources" and had as its theme, management of land resources. The list of papers presented at this Workshop are given in *Annexure X*.

Projects Completed

Management of Irrigation and its effect on productivity under different environmental and technical conditions.

Prof. A. Vaidyanathan, Dr. S. Janakarajan and their team of researchers have completed the project and have submitted the report to the Planning Commission of India.

Ongoing Projects

Agriculture and Rural Economy

Project on Study of Costs and Productivity of Irrigation under the sponsorship of Union Planning Commission, Delhi (Dr. S. Janakarajan)

This is a long term project covering a wide range of issues including differences in productivity between irrigated and unirrigated areas across different states in India; the study of groundwater potential and the study of irrigation disputes. Analysis of data is now in progress about the first issue, and macro picture of ground water irrigation in Vaigai basin would be completed in three months time.

Project on Indebtedness of Rural Labour sponsored by the National Commission on Rural Labour, Delhi.

(Dr. K. Nagaraj)

This is a small study undertaken for the National Commission on Rural Labour where the data from secondary sources, as also information available on the issue in some village studies done in the Institute are utilised. The work may be over by the end of August 1990.

Evaluation of Phase I & preparation of Phase II-Indo-Swiss mulberry cooperation in Sericulture sponsored by Department of Sericulture, Salem.

The project is a teamwork by Drs. Nirmal Sengupta (Co-ordinator), Nasir Tyabji,

R. Hema, D. Jayaraj and M. Thangaraj. This project commenced in June 1990 and concentrated on a field survey of the farmer beneficiaries of the SDC's schemes and analysis of secondary data on the progress of these schemes. The draft report was submitted on August 14.

Environment and Natural Resources

Management of Renewable Resources sponsored by Tamilnadu State Council for Science and Technology.

(Dr. Paul P. Appasamy and Dr. Sivarajasingham)

The technical work associated with the project is nearly completed. The major findings will be presented at the October 1990 MIDS Monthly Seminar. The final report will be submitted in March 1991.

Fducation

Evaluation of National Adult Education Programme sponsored by Ministry of Human Resources Development.

(K. Gopalan)

The Adult Education Evaluation Unit started functioning from 12-2-90. It has

taken up a study of evaluation of mass programme of functional literacy carried out by the higher secondary students of Coimbatore district in March 1990. In June-July 1990 it took up the evaluation of MTFL programmes conducted by the Gandhigram Rural Institute and Alagappa University. Currently it is evaluating the MTFL programmes in Madurai-Kamaraj University.

Industry

Business Groups in South India: A Study of their Structure, Growth and Functioning sponsored by ICSSR.

(Dr. Padmini Swaminathan)

This project consists of two parts. (1) a study of the growth of the corporate sector beginning 1900. (2) a study of the growth of the Naidu groups in Coimbatore. The project is expected to be completed in April 1991.

Study to evolve a policy on giving new Industrial connections by TNEB, Madras, (Dr. R. Hema)

The Inception Report to the project has already been submitted and the Mid-term report would be submitted shortly. The final

report is to be submitted in February 1991.

Urban Studies

Migration in Karnataka — MIDS-French Institute Joint Project.

(Dr. K. Nagaraj)

The project essentially tries to comprehend (a) the factors underlying various type of migratory movements of rural population, and (b) The socio-economic constraints on such migratory movements. This is sought to be done on the basis of a survey in two villages in the coastal district of Dakshina Kannada in Karnataka. The census has been completed in both the villages and the sample survey is being conducted at present in Navunda. The survey work is expected to be over by October 1990.

Metropolitan Economy of Madras, sponsored by the Times Research Foundation and the Madras Metropolitan Development Authority.

(Dr. Paul P. Appasamy and Dr. K. Nagaraj)

A preliminary report on the industrial and service sector has been completed. Further, analysis of the secondary data on small scale industries and on service sector is underway. There will also be analysis of the demographic and urban poverty aspects of metropolitan growth. The final report is expected to be submitted by the middle of November.

RBI Chair

For undertaking Applied Research in Regional Economics sponsored by Reserve Bank of India, Bombay, RBI Chair has been instituted.

Prof. Nasir Tyabji was appointed to the RBI Chair in May 1990. In the period since then some papers on "Industrial Development" have been prepared. Dr. S. Janakarajan continues to hold the position of Research Associate and is continuing his work on irrigation.

Library

From July 1989 to June 1990 the library added 3185 volumes. The Library received 219 journals. From the old publications available in the library about 22 of them were identified (which were published in/before 1940) and were photocopied.

The Library continues to bring out the monthly list of additions. The staff provides assistance to all the scholars. The number of outside scholars who referred the library materials during last year was more than 500.

Finances

The ICSSR had originally sanctioned a sum of Rs. 11.70 lakhs (Rs. 8.90 lakhs under Non-plan and Rs. 2.80 lakh under plan) for 89-90 which was matched by the Tamil Nadu Government, But when the actual release was made, the ICSSR reduced 5% in the total sanctioned grant of Rs. 11.70 lakhs which amounted to Rs. 58.000/-. (Rs. 44,500 non-plan and Rs. 14,000/- plan). Later, an additional grant amounting to 5% of the cut i.e. Rs. 58,000/- (Rs. 44,500 nonplan and Rs. 14,000/- plan) was sanctioned. Rs. 44,500/- was released in March 1990 and Rs. 14.000/- in April 1990. The Tamil Nadu Government also issued a similar sanction for Rs. 58,500/- to match the grant of the ICSSR.

The total uncovered deficit for the year 1989-90 works out to a marginal sum of Rs. 1,151.66. The ICSSR is being addressed

to issue a sanction for its share i. e. Rs. 575.83 (50% of Rs. 1,151.66). After getting ICSSR's sanction, the Tamil Nadu Government will be addressed for its matching grant.

On the non-recurring side, the ICSSR had sanctioned a sum of Rs. 2.33 lakhs towards arrears of salary out of which Rs. 2.13 lakhs was received in March 90 and Rs. 20,000 in April 90.

The Tamil Nadu Government had released

a sum of Rs. 1.50 lakhs against the sanction of Rs. 12.50 lakhs for the building programme.

The Tamil Nadu Government issued the G. O. No. 666 dated 27.6.89 for the implementation of the revised pay scales to its employees with effect from 1-6-89 as per the recommendations of the Fifth Pay Commission. The same provisions were recommended to be made applicable for the non-academic staff of this Institute also. Financial statements for 1990-91 are in Annexure XI.
