Introduction

The Madras Institute of Development Studies was founded in January 1971 as a trust by Dr.Malcolm S.Adiseshiah and Mrs.Elizabeth Adiseshiah with the following objectives:

- * To undertake studies and research pertaining to development problems with special reference to the agrorural aspects of Tamil Nadu and the problems of the economically and socially backward sections of the population throughout the country.
- To conduct seminars and conferences on development problems and programmes of the State.
- * To foster inter-university cooperation among the social scientists of the Universities of the four southern states.
- * To promote inter-disciplinary research, and bring out publications relating to the above three functions.

Responding to the changing concepts of development the objectives have been extended to cover developmental issues of a much wider variety. During 1976 the Government of India through the Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi sent a mission to study the possibility of developing the Institute into a national institute of social science research. On the basis of the recommendations of the mission, the Institute was reconstituted as a National Institute in March 1977 under the joint sponsorship of the Indian Council of Social Science Research and the Government of Tamil Nadu, with a Governing Council comprising representatives of the ICSSR, State Government, Universities of the four southern states, trustees of the Institute and co-opted social scientists as given in Annexure I. The trust gifted to the reconstituted national institute its land and building, library, furniture, equipment, and a cash endowment.

As per the trust deed, the Institute also has an Academic Council, which meets twice a year. It consists of both external and internal members. While all the professors of the Institute serve on it as permanent members, other faculty members and the Ph.D.scholars serve on rotation. The Director of the Institute is its ex-officio Chairman. The composition of the current Academic Council is given in **Annexure II.**

Dr.Malcolm S.Adiseshiah served as the Director of the Institute from its inception till June 1978. Dr.C.T.Kurien took up charge of the reconstituted Institute in July 1978 and served the Institute as its Director for ten years. He was succeeded by Dr.A.Vaidyanathan and Dr.S.Neelakantan. After retirement of Dr.S.Neelakantan in December 1995, Dr.Nirmal Sengupta was appointed Director. During the course of the year 1996-97, Prof.Nirmal Sengupta resigned as Director and Prof.Paul P.Appasamy has been serving as Acting Director of the Institute.

Personnel

The faculty strength during 1996-97 was 17 following the resignation of Dr.U.Kalpagam. Prof.Nasir Tyabji is continuing his research at the Nehru Memorial Museum, New Delhi on "Technology Acquisition and Innovation in India". Dr.R.Hema, Fellow has extended her stay for one more year till December 31, 1997 at DePaul University, Chicago to continue her work on health insurance systems. The list of faculty members and their areas of research is shown in Annexure III. The composition of the administration and library staff is given in Annexure IV.

Silver Jubilee Celebrations

The year under review, 1996-97 was the Silver Jubilee of the founding of the Institute. The Silver Jubilee Celebration Committee had arranged an academic programme consisting of an inaugural lecture followed by 'a Special Seminar on "Tamil Nadu Economy, Society and Polity". A Silver Jubilee document summarising the Institute activities over the last twentyfive years was released at the Inaugural function. Three special workshops were held during the course of the year. The Valedictory function was held on November 23, 1996. The then Vice-President of India, Dr.K.R.Narayanan presided over the function and the Tamil Nadu Minister for Education, Prof.K.Anbazhagan offered felicitations. Workshop reports as well as selected papers from the special workshops will appear in the Institute Journal, "Review of Development and Change". There are also plans to bring out edited volumes of selected papers from some of the workshops. Special grants for the Silver Jubilee programmes were provided by the Indian Council of Social Science Research and the Government of Tamil Nadu.

Research Activities

Despite the fact that faculty strength has remained relatively small over the last few years, the research output has increased substantially in terms of MIDS publications, mimeographed publications, books and monographs, edited books, and contributions to books, journals and newspapers, seminar presentation and lectures and book reviews (Annexures V to XII). Several research projects have been carried out by Institute faculty. These projects have enabled a large number of young staff to get trained in applied research. During 1996-97, 5 research projects funded by national and international agencies were completed, while 10 others are ongoing (Annexure XIII). The Institute as a whole maintains a fine balance between different types of research and strives to remain relevant to the rapidly changing needs of society. The academic work of the Institute has become more diffused on account of the wide variety of disciplines and interests of the faculty as evident from the list of publications. The major research activities undertaken in the past year are discussed below.

Human Development

For many years the Institute faculty have been involved in research on education, poverty, health, employment, and social security. They have also undertaken studies of the "excluded groups" in society such as agricultural labour, the urban poor, backward classes, SC/ST, and women and children. These concerns have become increasingly relevant in the post-reform period.

Papers on exclusion of Dalits in Tamil Nadu and exclusion in education have been published. Two of the research scholars have formulated proposals relating to social exclusion: exclusion from institutional credit and exclusion of the urban poor, which may help to refine the methodology and conceptual basis of research in this area. An edited volume "Illfare in India: Essays on India's Social Sector in honour of S.Guhan" containing contributions from some of the faculty on poverty, discrimination and exclusion is in press.

Three of the faculty have been working on a UNDP sponsored study on "Strategies and Financing for Human Development" with special reference to primary education, health and social security. A study of "Elementary Education in Tamil Nadu and Rajasthan" was completed as part of this project. Manuscripts on "Education in Post-Independence India" and "Indigenous Indian Education" are underway. An inter-institutional study of "Maternal Anaemia in Tamil Nadu" funded by UNICEF has recently been taken up. The Institute will be hosting a conference on "Economic Reforms and Human Development" with the Institute of Social Studies, The Hague, The Netherlands in December 1997.

Research on backward classes and reservations has been a long standing interest of one of the faculty. A chapter on backward classes has been prepared for the encyclopaedia of sociology and anthropology. Manuscripts on backward classes and reservations in Tamil Nadu and India are underway. So also on Ambedkarism and Emancipatory Politics.

Agriculture and Rural Development

The following studies related to agro-economic research were completed: The Impact of Agricultural Reforms on the Rural Poor; Agrarian Structure and Patterns of Mobility; and Land Reforms and the Weaker Sections. A monograph on "Agricultural Transformation and Poverty" is nearing completion, while work continues on a study of the Public Distribution System in Tamil Nadu. Two edited volumes,

one on Agrarian Transformation' and another on 'Social Welfare' are under preparation. A monograph on Markets is also underway. The latter three volumes are the outcome of the resurvey conducted on 11 villages of Tiruvannamalai district.

Industrialisation and Urban Development

The Coimbatore-Tiruppur-Erode corridor in Western Tamil Nadu is experiencing rapid urban growth due to industrialisation. A study of the Tiruppur Industrial Cluster was completed for the Small Industries Development Bank of India. Another study of Industrial Decentralisation and Urban Development sponsored by UNESCO has been taken up.

Tamil Nadu is also experiencing dramatic changes with regard to fertility, birth rates and population growth rates. Some of the faculty have been examining the data from the 1991 Census and other sources to get a clearer picture of the transformation that is taking place.

The Workshop on "Urbanisation: Processes, Problems and Policies" provided a forum for a broad based discussion of urbanisation issues. Researchers from other parts of the country, particularly the Southern States discussed the comparative features of urbanisation in India. Studies of urban services, environment and urban poverty in Tamil Nadu underway since 1993 are nearing completion. A faculty member specialising in migration and urbanisation has published a paper on the "Rural-Urban Continuum in Karnataka".

Social Movements/Criticism

Another strand of social research has been the dialectics and dynamics of social transformation of Tamil Nadu and other parts of India. Non-Brahmin, Dravidian, Backward Class, Dalit and Tribal movements have engaged the interest of some of the faculty. A four-day workshop on "Social Criticism and Cultural Creativity" as part of the Silver Jubilee Celebrations provided a forum for discussion and debate. The Silver Jubilee Seminar on "Tamil Nadu: Economy, Polity and Society" also addressed the transformation that has occurred in the State of Tamil Nadu from various perspectives. Of particular interest is the use of the media, particularly cinema. A Workshop on "Indian Cinema: Culture, History of Dalit Politics, and Social History of Tamil Cinema continues.

The emerging agenda for social science research has itself been the subject of discourse. The Annual Meeting of Social Scientists held in January 1997 had as its theme "Recent Shifts in Social Science Research and the Usefulness of the Information Highway", while the forthcoming Interdisciplinary Research Methodology Workshop at Trivandrum will take up issues relating to "Creative Social Research: Rethinking Theories and Methods".

Faculty members have been concerned about the degeneration of values, and widespread corruption in India. One of the Emeritus Faculty has co-authored a book on "Corruption in India", while another faculty member has been writing extensively on ethics and moral consciousness. The latter has also been conducting field studies of the work done by two voluntary organisations in the rural areas of Gujarat and Orissa.

Gender Studies

Some of the faculty have also been concerned about the gender bias in employment, education, science and technology and more recently on reproductive rights. One of the Silver Jubilee Workshops had as its theme "The Political Economy of Indian Sekuality". Selected papers are to be published in a volume to be brought out by Kali for Women. The plight of women workers has been a topic of recurring interest. A paper on "Work and Reproductive Health" was presented at a recent conference. One of the research scholars has nearly completed an extensive study of women workers in the tanning industry in Tamil Nadu.

Labour Studies

A faculty member who has been writing on the Labour Movement in Karnataka has received an award to produce a documentary on the "Labour History of the Kolar Gold Fields". Two other faculty have recently completed a paper on "Child Labour in Tamil Nadu". Work on rural nonagricultural employment continues. A project on the status of women workers in the garment industry at Ambattur has been sponsored by the Department of Women and Child Welfare.

Village Studies

There has been a resurgence of interest in the academic community in Village Studies. It may be recalled that the Institute did a series of monographs on village studies in the 1980s. A paper on Village Resurveys was published as part of an edited volume, while a bibliography on Village and Town Surveys in Tamil Nadu is under preparation.

Environmental Studies

The Institute is gradually building up competence in the area of environment and natural resource management. Studies of common property resources such as irrigation tanks and forests have been taken up by both faculty and research

scholars. Doctoral research on joint forest management use and on the valuation of water resources are underway. A project on Natural Resource Accounting for a river basin in Tamil Nadu is nearing completion.

Water Management

A major study of "Groundwater Irrigation in the Vaigai Basin sponsored by the Planning Commission was completed by two faculty members as part of a larger project on Costs and Productivity of Irrigation in Tamil Nadu. Another major project on the "Financing of the Irrigation Sector" funded by the Ford Foundation is nearing completion. Monographs on tanks/small water bodies and on well irrigation in two river basins in Tamil Nadu are nearly complete. Papers on "Management of Conflict" in groundwater use, and in the Bhavani Basin have been prepared for a forthcoming conference. A project on "Local Options for Water Supply and Conservation Management" has recently been funded by the International Development Research Centre (IDRC), Canada.

Theoretical Research

A book on "Rethinking Economics - Reflections based on a study of the Indian Economy" was authored by an Emeritus Faculty member, while a volume on the "Measurement of Inequality & Poverty" edited by another faculty member will, soon be published. A manuscript on "Institutional Theory" is under preparation.

Policy Research

The Emeritus Faculty served as members of the Tamil Nadu State Planning Commission and on a Steering Committee of the Kerala Planning Board. Several faculty members have also served on the Working Groups set up by the Tamil Nadu State Planning Commission in connection with the preparation of the Ninth Plan. The services of the faculty are increasingly sought by government agencies at the State and National level. Of particular importance are studies of the impact of reform at the State and local levels.

The Institute participated in a study of backward blocks for the Chief Minister's Hunger Free Area Programme. An assessment of the socio-economic status and the development programmes of a block in South Arcot District was carried out by a faculty member of the Institute. The Public Works Department has expressed interest in utilising the Decision Support System developed in the project on "Financing of the Irrigation Sector". An "Environmental Profile of Chennai" was prepared for the Sustainable Chennai Project implemented by the Chennai Metropolitan Development Authority. CMDA has requested assistance in the development of an Environmental Management Information System.

Public Activities

Several faculty members serve on the Boards of Studies in Economics, Sociology, History, and Political Science in different universities in South India. Some of the faculty also serve on the Governing Councils and Boards of various institutions. The public activities of the faculty members are given in Annexure XIV.

RBI Chair

The Reserve Bank of India established a Chair in applied research in Regional Economics in the Institute in 1985 for a five year period. In 1991, the RBI decided to extend support to the Unit on a continuing basis subject to periodic review. The RBI Unit comprises a Professor, a Research Associate and a Steno-Typist. Since 1993, the RBI has been granting fellowships to Ph.D.Scholars with the stipulation that there should not be more than four RBI doctoral fellows at any given point of time. Two of the scholars have completed the fellowship period.

Doctoral Scholars

Currently, there are ten doctoral candidates of the Institute registered with the Madras University. The new regulations

Academic Programmes

The Institute has been carrying out several inter-university programmes for more than two decades. Since 1996, a new journal "Review of Development and Change" edited by Prof.C.T. Kurien has been brought out by the Institute. Dr.V. Jacob John who has been serving as Programme Coordinator, and Production and Circulation Manager of the journal was invited to participate in a Leadership Programme sponsored by the U.N. University in Jordan, Israel, Palestine and Egypt. The academic activities of Programme and Project Personnel are listed in **Annexure XXII**. The Institute proposes to considerably strengthen the academic programmes and outreach activities in the next few years.

a) Meeting of Heads of Social Science Departments in Southern Universities

The 26th Annual Meeting of the Social Scientists of Southern Universities was held at the Institute on Friday, 31st January 1997 and Saturday 1, 1997. The theme of the meeting was on "Recent Shifts in Social Science Research and the Usefulness of the Information Highway". The theme paper by Prof.D.Narasimha Reddy, University of Hyderabad was

of the University require doctoral committees for scholars who joined after July 1995. The Committees will monitor the progress of the scholars every six months until the submission of the thesis. No new scholars were admitted during 1996-97. Mr.K.Sivasubramaniyan was awarded the Ph.D. degree for his thesis on "Historical Development of Tank Irrigation in Tamil Nadu". His thesis work was supervised by Emeritus Professor A.Vaidyanathan. The list of doctoral candidates and their area of research is given in **Annexure XV.**

Affiliates and Post-Doctoral Scholars

The Institute grants affiliation to students and faculty members of academic institutions in India and abroad. While the number of requests for affiliation has increased, the research done by the affiliates needs to be integrated with the ongoing academic work of the Institute. The list of affiliates is given in **Annexure XVI**.

Seminars and Special Workshops

Special seminars are arranged in the Institute for members of the Institute and outside scholars to present their research. The list of seminars by faculty and visitors are given in **Annexure XVII.** The list of visitors is given in **Annexure XVIII.** Three special workshops were held as part of the Silver Juilee Celebrations. The authors and their papers are listed in **Annexures XIX** to **XXI.**

on 'Restructuring Social Science Research' based on the Gulbenkian report followed by a panel discussion in the afternoon. Mr.A.Mohan, Additional Director, National Informatics Centre, Chennai gave a lecture the next day on 'The Access to the Information Highway', which was followed by a live demonstration of the electronic networking facilities that are currently available to researchers in the social sciences. The meeting was sponsored by the Tamil Nadu State Council of Science and Technology.

b) Ph.D.Scholars and Guides Workshop

One of the major activities of this Institute every year is the Annual Meeting of Ph.D.Scholars and Guides Workshop drawn from different parts of Tamil Nadu. The workshop sponsored by the ICSSR has been held for the past 16 years and all the participants find it an extremely worthwhile experience. It is of special significance to Ph.D. scholars in remote parts of the state who frequently work in total isolation and for whom this is perhaps the only opportunity to interact with other scholars. For the first time, the Workshop was held at a college - S.T.Hindu College, Nagercoil from May 8-11, 1997. Due to disturbances in the Southern Districts, the attendance was affected to some extent. However, 24 scholars and 10 resource persons participated in the workshop.

c) Inter-disciplinary Research Methodology Workshop

The 26th Inter-disciplinary Research Methodology Workshop was combined with the first Special Workshop of the Silver Jubilee Celebrations held at the Institute on August 1-3, 1996. The theme of the workshop was on 'Rethinking Modernity: Political Economy of Indian Sexuality'. A set of fifteen papers were discussed and circulated in advance among participants with focus on range of disciplines and methodologies were discussed. Around 50 participants attended the workshop (see Annexure XIX).

d) 26th Census of Social Science Research in Southern Universities

The 26th Census of social science research in south India was conducted during May-June this year. There is a marginal decrease in the listing of disciplines: 9 as against 11 recorded last year. Surprisingly however, the entries recorded this year is 183 higher than last year's 151. As usual, economics leads the tally with 111 entries; followed by political science with just 27; agriculture with 23 entries. Education alone had 11 entries and the rest have less than 5 entries each.

An interesting feature of this year's census is that Ph Ds alone accounts for 122 entries out of a total of 183 followed by projects for the first time with 34 entries and M.Phil has 27 entries. The census results clearly indicates that projects have come to play a major role even in some of the major university departments.

Although the census is the only available documentation source on social science research in southern universities the response has been far from satisfactory. The census has been an ongoing feature of inter-university cooperation since 1971. The publication unit have been annually mailing copies of the report to those who have responsed to the census especially to universities and research institutions in South India.

Journal

Three issues of the new Institute Journal "Review of Development and Change" have been published. Approval has been obtained from the Registrar of Newspapers. Workshop reports as well as selected papers from the Silver Jubilee Seminar and Special Workshops have been published in the last two issues. The forthcoming issue will be on the Golden Jubilee of Indian independence.

Library

The Institute library now has a collection of about 40,500 books in stock. Around 200 Indian journals and foreign

journals are received either through subscription or on complimentary basis. 1300-1400 visitors (other than MIDS staff) use the library every year. Due to lack of space, permission to use the library is restricted to research scholars, college/university teachers from India or abroad, while undergraduates and other outsiders can use the library only with special permission. During the period July 1996-June 1997, 1275 volumes were added to the library collection.

A significant initiative taken in respect of the library is computerisation. A file server with two nodes has been installed using the funds from the Special Silver Jubilee grant. The arduous task of entering the information from the card catalogues and accession registers is expected to be completed by the end of December, 1997.

Computer Facilities

The Silver Jubilee grants provided by the funding agencies enabled the Institute to significantly upgrade the computer facilities. Purchase and installation of the following capital equipment have been completed.

1. Desk Top Publishing System (DTP)

The Institute is involved in formatting project reports, working papers and the journal for off-set printing. The DTP system consisting of a Pentium computer, DTP software and laser printer was purchased. The new equipment will significantly reduce the cost of printing. Training in the use of the software has been provided.

2. Library Computerisation

A network system with 3 AT 486 nodes and a printer have been installed. The Institute plans to purchase the MICRO-LIBSYS package since it would meet the needs of both the library staff and users. Training of library staff in the use of the package will also be needed.

3. Data Bank

A small LAN System (Pentium 150 File Server) links the Data Bank, the library computers, e.mail and Internet Services. There are plans to gradually incorporate various social science databases, which will be made accessible to researchers. Training courses in the use of social science data are also under consideration. Currently, the Institute has a shell account for e.mail services through the National Informatics Centre. Individual e.mail addresses will be provided in the future.

Infrastructure

The purchase of a new staff car was approved by the Governing Council. It was decided that a "Tata Sumo" would

meet the needs of the Institute in terms of seating capacity, fuel consumption, and maintenance cost. Although the Council also approved the construction of two additional floors in the new building, work had to be deferred until adequate finances are made available by the funding agencies. Renovation work in the old building, as well as painting of the new building was undertaken during the summer.

Finance

The audit report for the year under review as per annexure XXIII presents the financial position of the Institute. As per

the statement, a sum of Rs.59,28,012.79 has been spent on recurring expenditure for the year 1996-97. Against the recurring expenditure the ICSSR had sanctioned and released by March 31, 1997 a sum of Rs.21,90,000/- (Rs.15.80 lakhs under Non-Plan and Rs.6.10 lakhs under Plan). The Tamil Nadu Government had released the matching share of Rs.15,48,000/- for the year 1996-97 before 31.3.97, and the balance of Rs.6,42,000/- was released in 1997-98. The Tamil Nadu Government had released the library grant of Rs.5,12,435/- for the year 1996-97 and arrears from previous years amounting to Rs.18,62,000/-. The internal receipt was Rs.99,513.05. Taking into account the receipts and expenditures, the deficit works out to Rs.9,36,064.70.
