The fifth volume is in a good state of preservation, but the sixth is exceedingly worn and crumbled, most of the pages being in fragments. The original has been collated with Mr. Pringle's extracts so as to give as complete a text as possible.

[From 11th January 1681 to 29th December 1681.]

—FORI ST. GEORGE, JANUARY 1681—

The Diary and Consultation Booke of the Agent Governour and Councill their Proceedings and Transactions for the Affairs of the Hon^{ble} English East India Company in the Agency of y^e Coast of Chormandell and the Bay of Bengale.

Letters were sent by a Braminy to Gopaldadagee Pundit the Soobidar of Porto Novo and them parts to treat about a Cowle for the settling a ffactory for the Company at Coonemerra, Cooraloor or at Porto Novo, and 5 : yards Broad Cloth delivered the Braminy for Presents, and 10 : Pag^{es} in Mony for Expences.

[Letters] sent about a Cowle [for a] ffactory in Ohengy [Country.]

M^r. Bridger and M^r. Wilkes being sick the Councill did not set.

The Flying Eagle arived.

The Flying Eagle M^r. William Meare Commander arrived from Syam whence she departed the 28th October last and met with a horrycane the 2^d November which put them in great danger having five foot water in hold and it lasted three days, and the day before the 1st Novemb^r she lost her Main Mast (by a thunder bolt) which she recruited at Malacca, her Oarg^o consists of 1000 : Ohests Oopper which was ordered to be landed forthwith, and the Commander of the Ship to keep the Key of the Warehouse untill it be weighed off.

Whereas the Hono^{ble}: Company in the 44th: Section of their letter dated the 3^d: December 1679: are pleased to write as follows: "We have now extended in Charter party upon consideration of what you write in that case, the time for the ships departure from your Coast to 20th: January presuming your care and dilligence will be such as to dispatch them not one day the later for that." Now notwithstanding the Orders w^{ch}. were given to the Bay and Metchlepatam as the Hono^{ble}: Comp^{as}: doe direct for a standing Rule in the 54th: Section of their letter of 12th: December 1677: if possible to prevent the great charge of Demorage (that they detain the Ships there noe longer then is absolutely necessary for the Companys service) yet none of the Ships are returned hither by this day, soe that 'tis altogether impossible to comply with the hono^{ble}: Comp^{as}: order in the dispatch of their Ships by the 20th: of January from this place, and in regard we doe at present judge it to be most for the hono^{ble}: Comp^{as}: Service for the ships to stay here untill they have landed what goods must be taken out of them and received in the goods w^{ch}: we have bought and gott ready at this place to send home upon these Ships, It is therefore after a serious Consultation of us the Agent and Councill (there being none of the quality of Senior March^t: at present here) considered to be fit and Resolved (by virtue of the Powers given to us in the 105th: Section of the hono^{ble}: Comp^{as}: letter Dated the 12th: December 1677) that the Ships Sampson, Eagle, Berkeley Castle and President shall remaine in this Road untill the goods provided here for the hono^{ble}: Companys Acco^{ts}: for England be laden aboard them, and then Dispatched according to the hono^{ble}: Companys orders.

[21TH.]

The Ship Sampson came to Anchor in the Road about midnight, and this Morning early came ashore Mr. Henry Oxinden, Mr. Richard Mohun and Mr. Nathaniell Cholmley. Alsoe Cap^t Chamblett who gave acco^{tt} he departed from the Bay the 28th December, arived at Metchlepatam the 10th and sailed thence the 14th Instant. Order was immediately taken for the landing of such goods as are to be put ashore here, w^{ch} is a considerable quantity on freight, besides 250 : Piggs Lead, about 3000 : baggs Saltpetre and 94 : bundles Gunny and Ropes from Metchlepatam.

— FORT ST. GEORGE, FEBRUARY 1682. —

[21st.]

The Berkeley Castle came to anchor in the Road between 7 : & 8 : a Clock in the night, Cap^t Talbot coming ashore with the Packetts Letters, and gave Acco^{tt} that he sailed from the Bay the 26th January, and that the Eagle and President sailed thence the 14th : Janu[ary with] orders to touch at Madapollam and Metchlepatam [to take] in the goods there, but this Ship was ordered directly [to the] ffort.

In the Morning early all the Boates were sent off to the Berkeley Castle to unlade Turmerick, Saltpet[re] and other goods to be landed here.

Received Letters from Madapollam Dated the 12th [a word lost] with their Diary, Cousultations &c^a : for the Month of [a word lost] none of the Ships then arived there from the Bay.

The Towne of Treplicane which hath in forme[r yea]res been under the Company and when the Rent was no[t pa]id for this Towne for about Eleven yeares was taken fr[om] them and afterwards returned as apeares by Moos[tafa] Ckauns Rocca Anno 1672 : for 50 : Pag^{os} ₣ : annum, and [th]e Kings Phyrmaund procured anno 1676 : mentions it to be under us as this place is, which Towne having been left to Verona and since his death to his Successor, It was upon this occasion of Pedda Yenkatadrys miscarryages thought fit not to leave it longer under him, but to apoint the Comp^{ys} Peons to take care thereof, in order to which Pedda Yenkatadry was spoken to the 14th Instant to order his Servants to withdraw thence, whereupon he replied if Lingapa should cause trouble thereupon he desired he might not be blamed for it, to which he was answered, that if Lingapa did make any trouble he would be blamed for it, and this day there came a letter from Lingapa to the Governour about the said Towne, declaring he had given it to Pedda Yenkatadry paying 50 : Pag^{os} ₣ : annum for Gods sake for it, and rather then we should take it from him, he had now ordered it under Durmaray Moodalaree the Avaldar of S^t Thoma with many other arguments to affright us from taking it under us, as by his said letter.

The Governour sent a Message to the Avaldar of S^t. Thoma to know his reason for hindering and stoping Provisions from coming to this towne as usuall, to which he returned answer that he did not hinder nor stop any thing, but it was the Palygars or Watchmen who pretended to have orders from Lingapa soe to doe, but he knew nothing of it, & would be glad it were over, and immediately commanded about 20 Oooleys laden with Beetle and herbage to goe to markt with it to this Towne, w^{ch}. accordingly they did.

9TH.

In the Morning the Ship President sett saile for England. There being a great Omlplaint in Towne for want of fewell amongst the better sort and for Rice amongst the poor, the Governour ordered the Drum to be beaten about Towne, that such as were in want of food or fewell should goe and buy it at the neighbouring villages, and if they refused to sell or give it they might take it by force and should not be punished for it, excepting Treplicane our owne Village; Hereupon the Officers and Soldyers being in want gott a company of Men together, and Lieutenant Richardson desired the Governour to permit them to try their fortune in the Ountry which he granted, with orders that whatsoever place they went to they should first summon the people to carry fewell and Provisions to Towne as formerly, and at present to sell them something to satisfy their hunger or if they would not sell to give it them, and if they refused all, then to take by force what they could lay their hands upon that was food or fewell, and if the People made any resistance to fire or pull downe their houses or otherwise offend them as they should find necessary in the action, with these Orders Lieutenant Richardson marched out about 5: a Olock wth about 50 Soldyers and 50: Peons, and came to Oondore about sun sett summon'd the People of the Towne and declared to them his orders, to which they answered that Lingapa had forbid them to carry anything to Chinapatnam, and he could not perswade them to sell or give them any thing not soe much as water to drinke, whereupon the Lieutenant told them that if they would observe Lingapas order and be safe, he should have sent a force to defend them, for he was come with a force to compell them to breake them, and thereupon after he had forborne them untill after midnight, he sett his Men to take such things as they could find, which for the most part was Geese in Veronas house, and they pulled downe Jangum Naigue the Palygars house who being conscious of his guilt had fled and hid himselfe, for that fellow is the Watchman of S^t. Thoma, Treplicane and Condore and all that part of the Ountry, and was very busy in setting his watches and abusing the Poor People upon y^e: first orders from Lingapa; with this enterprize and small booty the Lientenant returned with his Men about 5 a Olock next Morning.

The Governour sent Peons to Trevitore, Egamor, S^t Thoma and the other Villages about us, declaring to the Inhabitants, that if they did not send in Provisions and fewell as heretofore they would suffer the same fate as Condore had done, but doeing that they might remaine safe in their houses without danger, to which they all returned answear, that they would come to y^e Governour in a day or two and send all sorts of things to towne as formerly, except Lingapa sent a force to hinder them, and in such case they must not suffer from us.

Lingapa should forbid them and endeavour to hinder them, upon which the Governour promised them that noe harme should be done them by our people, and if Lingapa abused them they might retire hither and should be protected here.

13TH.

Fewell and Provisions have been brought into Towne ever since the 10th little or much, but this day the Country People brought in as much plenty as formerly, all the Watchmen having forsaken their Stations for fear of being beaten or taken Prisoners.

THURSDAY
Y^E 14TH.

The Councell met but noe business presented.

15TH.

There came a Didwan by name Kishnama on horseback with 10: Peons from Lingapa at Congee Voram, at first he pretended to come from Accana, but being admitted to the Governour and sat downe, he tooke out a letter and deliver'd it saying 'twas from Lingapa, then he pul'd out a Paper and Read it aloud being a pretended Order from Accana to Lingapa to besiege Chinapatnam and Palicat because the Governours of the said two places will not doe as they are ordered by the Divan; and the Didwan being high thinking to put a terrour with his Order, he was taken up and bid to be civill and respectfull, whereupon he was calme, and heard soe full answer to what he had to say that he had nothing to Reply, further, then that he was a Stranger to these affairs, and importun'd by Lingapa to come and make up this business; the letter from Lingapa was sent in an affronting manner being written in Ordinary white Paper, not usuall and threatning war and Devastation of the place because we did not send to meet Braminy Accana at Trepity, and for refusing to receive the Kings Phyrmaund, and for not doeing what we were commanded by the Divan.

16TH

Received letters from Madapollam and alsoe from Metchlepatam with their Diary, Consultations &c^s: for the Month of March; from Madapollam they advise of the arrivall of Ship Eagle there the 4th: Instant.

The Didwan Kishnama came to the Governour again and then was shewed him the Kings Phyrmaund and Lingapas two last letters to the Governour, by which he was given to understand how far different one was from the other, and fully convinced of the villanous proceedings of Lingapa in falsifying a Phyrmaund from y^e King which was it he pretended we refused to receive, & many other discourses in our vindication.

By advices from Congee Voram and alsoe from Palicat the seige is taken off there, upon a letter which the Govern^r of Palicat sent to Lingapa.

18TH.

This Morning when the Didwan was to come to receive his Dispatch from the Governour all the Portugez Inhabitants upon notice given them yesterday appeared at the ffort gate to receive armes who being Mustered Officers amongst them were appointed to command the others at the severall Posts assigned them as follows:—

Whereas Mr. Ralph Ord and Mr. Clement King the Farmers of the Petty Land Customes did now bring in their Acco^{ts} by which it appears that they did receive less then is specified in the Articles made with them, It is therefore Resolved to allow them 44: P^{o} towards the loss they sustained by reason of the Stopage of trade by Lingapa.

Whereas Lingapa Still continues an Imbargoe upon all goods and Provisions coming to this place, & the Marchants who by the Orders made and published the 29th Aprill last finding themselves defeated of their designe of tradeing at S^t Thoma, doe now begin to think of bribing Lingapa and his Officers to be permitted to bring their Cloth to this Towne, the consequence of which will be as bad as carrying to S^t Thoma to prevent w^{ch} and alsoe the better to compell Lingapa to desist from these evill practices, and to lay downe his pretences of borrowing Mony gratis as he pretends Verona lent him, It is Resolved to make and publish the following Orders.

Forasmuch as Podala Lingapa contrary to the King of Gulcondah's Phyrmaunds and Cowles hath Imbarqu'd all Trade by land to this Towne, It is ordered that noe Person whatsoever Inhabiting or tradeing in this place by themselves or by others shall make any applications to the said Lingapa or to any Officers or others imployed by him as to the bringing in of any goods hither without perticular licence from the Gov^r this affair wholly concerning the government of the place, and if any shall offend herein they shall suffer such paines and penaltys as the Governour & Councell shall think fit to award; And if any Person of this place or concerned in the Companys trade shall assist the said Lingapa by lending of him mony upon any consideration whatsoever or give him any advice or Intelligence to the prejudice of this place, every such Person shall be accounted as an Enemy to this place and shall be punished accordingly.

And to the intent that none may pretend ignorance of these Orders they are Proclaimed by beat of Drum and affixed up in the usuall manner that all Persons may take Cognisance thereof and not act contrary thereunto.

The reward is great if you be foun[d] true to this concern & very severe if you transgresse or negleget what ought to be done in it w^{ch} you have already been acquainted with.
