THE ADYAR LIBRARY

To the President, T.S.—I beg to submit herewith my report of the Adyar Library for 1920 which forms the thirty-fourth of its annual reports.

Change in the Staff.—The places of Librarian and Indexer which fell recant by the death of Mr. Siva Rao and the resignation of Mr. R. Nammiah were kept vacant for some months with a view to combining the two posts into one and appointing for it a person possessing the necessary iterary qualifications. Accordingly, Brother N. I. Venku Aiyer, B.A., a devoted Theosophist of long standing and a retired teacher of physical science was appointed as Librarian in May last. There are no other changes in the staff worth noticing.

Work of the Staff.—The four Pandits of the Oriental Section were engaged in the pieces of work allotted to them respectively in the Section, as detailed in the last year's report. While continuing their work urther on, they assisted me in the editorial work by way of collating MSS. and preparing press copies. The Librarian's sphere of work was confined to the Western Section. He had to spend some time in studying our methods and getting into touch with the current works. With the new accessions, classification and indexing in the Western Section.

Literary Publication.—This year saw the publication of the volume of Yoga Upaniṣaḍs containing 20 Minor Upaniṣaḍs out of the 108. This forms the second in the series, the first being the volume containing Saṃnyāsa Upaniṣaḍs, edited by my predecessor, Dr. Schrāder. The second volume contains 640 pages and is nicely printed and bound. The whole get-up redounds to the reputation of the Vasanta Press for good printing work under the superintendence of Mr. A. K. Sītārāma Sāṣṭri. The volume has been priced at Rs. 6, which is comparatively cheap, to place it within the buying capacity of the intended students.

Editorial Work.—Following up the volume of Yoga Upanisads, I have edited twenty-four more Minor Upanisads out of the collection of

108 Upaniṣaḍs, with the commentary of Sri Upaniṣaḍ-Brāhmenḍ Yogin. These treat of pure Vedānṭa and are classified under Sāmār Vedānṭa. A third of the volume has already been printed and the wh is expected to be ready about the middle of the next year. The nevolume taken in hand will comprise what are known as the Vaiṣṇa Upaniṣaḍs.

Search for MSS.—Unlike the last few years, no person outside t Library staff was available this year for the searching for rare Sansk MSS. abroad. This year's collection therefore does not contain ma old MSS. The collection is rather poor, and it comprises mostly no transcripts of old copies borrowed from the owners for the purpose.

Cataloguing.—The several catalogues in hand both in the Easte and Western Sections have been brought up-to-date. But the high co of printing has precluded the printing of any of these catalogues they are, as was intended.

Addition to the Library.—During the year, 66 printed books at 23 MSS, were added to the Eastern Section and 236 books and pamphlets were added to the Western Section. Of the additions to t Library in the Western Section so many as 217 volumes were present by the friends of the Library and the rest were acquired by purchase.

Binding.—This year 125 volumes were bound. The Vasanta Prebeing now short of men, a large number of volumes still await bindin
