**Proceedings of the Madras Government, Public Works Department,
5th October 1871.**

No. 75. Read the following letter from the Superintending Engineer, 8th Division, to the Secretary to Government, Public Works Department, dated Madura, 11th September 1871, No. 2,156:—

IN reference to G. O., of the 11th August 1871, No. 2,064, calling for certain particulars connected with the fatal accident which lately occurred at Tiroomalay Naick's Palace at Madura, I have the honour to enclose the Proceedings of the Assistant Engineer in charge of the Madura Range, in the investigation of the claim to gratuity on the part of the mother of the deceased.

2. The deceased was a painter by name Theroovengadam, a native of Ramnad, Madura District, and he had been employed on the palace works for about six weeks prior to his death on wages of 7 Annas per diem.

3. Whilst Theroovengadam was engaged, on the 25th July last, in painting the ornamental portion of the waggon vault, he slipped and fell off the scaffolding while shifting his position from one portion of the vault to another; and by the fall he fractured his neck, in addition to being otherwise seriously wounded. He was at once taken to the Madura American Mission Hospital, which is situated at a distance of about 150 yards from the palace, and within a few minutes after he reached the hospital in question Theroovengadam died. No inquest was held on the body of the deceased.

4. There can be no doubt but that the fall of the painter was purely accidental. The scaffolding was constructed, in the usual manner, of stout bamboos, and in order to prevent accidents the Overseer had furnished the upper platform with a line of bamboos at back to act as a hand railings.

5. The claimant, the mother of the deceased, appears most respectable, and bears a good character. Her husband, who was a painter, died about four years ago, and since his death she and her two younger sons, aged seven and six years, respectively, entirely depended upon Theroovengadam for support.

6. As the family have no longer any means of livelihood, and considering the sad and shocking manner in which the painter met with his death, I would strongly recommend, for the sanction of Government, that the deceased's mother, Vencataletchumy, be granted a gratuity of Rupees 78-12-0, calculated in conformity with Extract Minutes of Consultation, 18th September 1856, No. 1,687, Public Works Department, (namely, six months' wages of her late son,) and the amount charged to the estimate for the palace works.

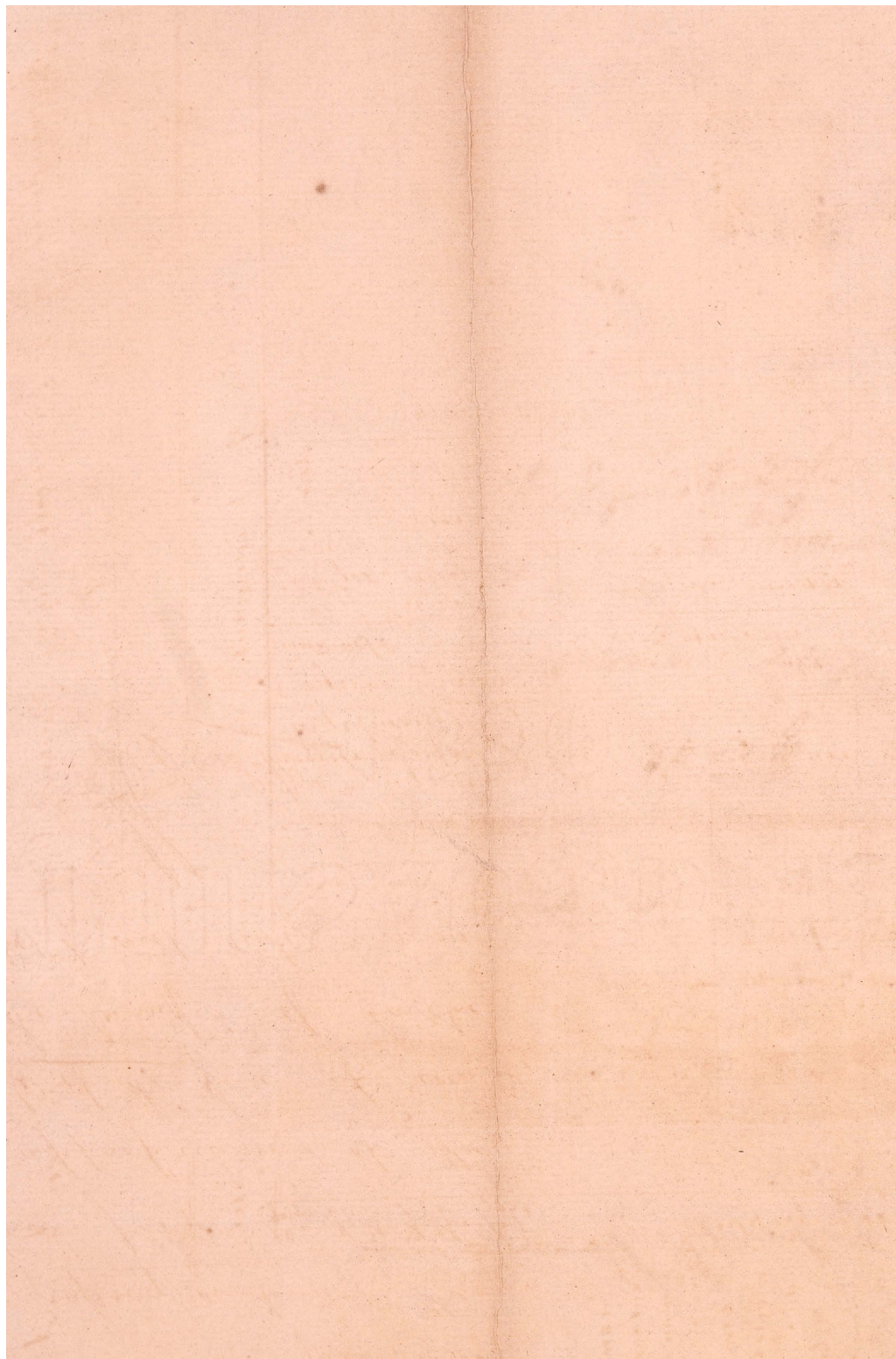
