

ABSTRACT.—Directing that the draft notification regarding the cession by the Travancore Darbar of the abkári jurisdiction over the Periyár camps be forwarded to the Government of India and that steps be taken for the working of the Abkári Act in the camps under the control of the Collector of Madura, and requesting the Accountant-General to report as to the procedure to be adopted as regards the adjustment of the accounts.

ABSTRACT.—Recording, with reference to G.O., dated 6th December 1894, No. 866, Proceedings, Revenue Department, requesting the Board of Revenue to issue the necessary instructions in the matter of the working of the Abkári Act in the Periyár camps under the control of the Collector of Madura.

Notification of the Government of India, Foreign Department, dated Fort William, the 21st February 1895, No. 650-I.

Whereas His Highness the Maharaja of Travancore has granted to the British Government abkári jurisdiction within the lands in his territory which are occupied by

the Periyar Project camps;

In exercise of this jurisdiction and of the powers conferred by sections 4 and 5 of the Foreign Jurisdiction and Extradition Act (XXI of 1879) and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor-General in Council is pleased to issue the following orders:—

- (1) The Madras Abkári Act (I of 1886) is hereby applied to the said lands.
- (2) The Governor of Fort St. George in Council and all officers of the Government subordinate to him exercising executive authority in the Madura district shall have within the said lands the same executive powers as they may respectively exercise under the provisions of the said Abkári Act within the British territories subject to their administration.
- (3) Subject to any directions from time to time given by the Governor of Fort St. George in Council by notification in the Fort St. George Gazette, all courts having for the time being criminal jurisdiction within the Madura district shall, for the purposes of the said Abkári Act, exercise the like jurisdiction within the said lands.
