No. 364. Read the following letter from the Acting Superintending Engineer, 1st Division, to the Secretary to Government, Public Works Department, dated Dowlaishweram, 22nd December 1870, No. 3,313 :—

ADVERTING to the correspondence noted in the margin, I have the honour to forward herewith, for orders and instructions of Government, copy of a letter\* received from the Executive Engineer in charge No. 1 Range, Godavery, reporting that one of the sea punts at Cocanada is not worth repairing, and requesting permission to break up the same. I beg to add its value had better be written off to Profit and Loss.

Paragraph 2 of Executive Engineer's letter, No. 298, dated 10th September 1870, printed in G. O., No. 2,373, dated 1st October 1870.

From the Officer in charge of No. 1 or Eastern Delta Range, Godavery District, to the Superintending Engineer, 1st Division, dated Dowlaishweram, 14th December 1870, No. 445.

I HAVE the honour to report that one of the sea punts brought up from Cocanada for repair is so worn out that I do not consider it worth repairing. There are several holes in its bottom, and the iron plates are worn so thin that they can be fractured by a blow from a hammer. I estimate that it would require Rupees 1,700 to patch up the punt, and then it would probably not last for two years.

2. Under these circumstances, and as the punt has been in the District about ten years, I have the honour to request permission to break her up to enable me to clear the dry dock for other work.

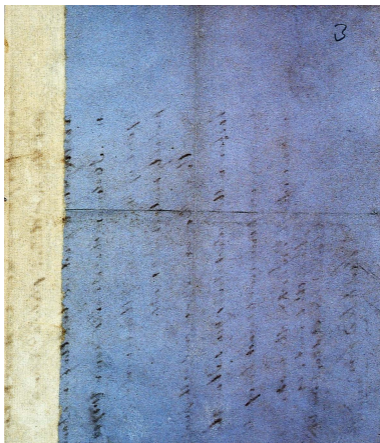

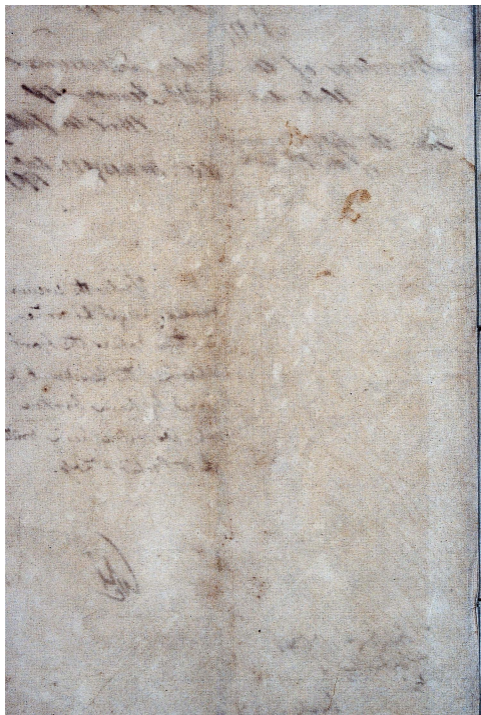

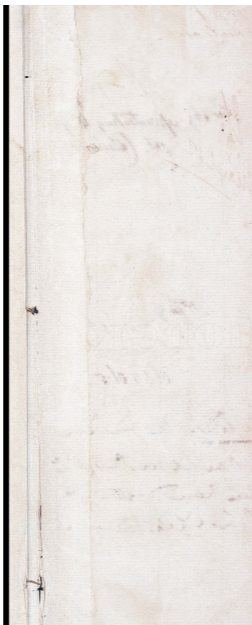
