GOVERNOR OF MADRAS

JOHN, Sri A. J., B.A., B.L., Governor: Born in July 1893 at Thalayolaparambu near Vaikom; Graduated from St. Joseph's College, Tiruchirappalli, in 1917; Law Degree at Madras two years later; Enrolled as an Advocate at the High Court. Trivandrum. in 1926; Set up practice first at Parur and then at Alleppey; Entered politics and returned unopposed in 1925 to the Travancore Legislative Council from the Vaikom Constituency ; Was a member of the Council for three years ; Was elected to the Travancore Legislative Assembly from the Vaikom-cum-Kottayam Constituency in 1937; President of the Travancore State Congress in 1938; Was arrested in the same year, convicted and sentenced to undergo 18 months' simple imprisonment and to pay a fine of Rs. 1,500; Was released after six weeks but was again arrested and put in jail for a week before the case against him was withdrawn ; Was again elected to the Travancore Assembly unopposed in 1948 from the Kaduthuruthy Constituency and was chosen the Speaker of the Assembly also unopposed ; Later in the same year joined the State Ministry as Finance Minister; Continued as Finance Minister of the integrated State of Travancore and Cochin till 1951; Elected to the T.C. State Assembly from the Poonjar Constituency in 1952; As leader of the Legislature Congress Party formed a Ministry which was in Office till 1954 when the Assembly was dissolved; Was returned to the Assembly from the same constituency, in the elections that followed ; Was first Minister for Home Affairs in the Congress Ministry and later Finance Minister as well; Governor of Madras, with effect from 10th December 1956.
