Universally Acclaimed Achievements in Adi Dravidar Welfare



- The scale of finance to individuals for taking up self employment ventures has been stepped up to Rs.7.50 lakh with 30 percent subsidy or Rs.2.25 lakh whichever is less. So far Rs.1,216.58 crore sanctioned as scale of finance and subsidy Rs.438.73 crore.
- 43 Middle Schools were upgraded as High Schools and 10 High Schools were upgraded as Higher Secondary Schools.
- A special grant of Rs.39 crore was sanctioned to provide toilet facilities in 779 Adi Dravidar Welfare schools.

- Free bi-cycles were provided to 8,63,159 SC/ST students at a cost of Rs.222.35 crore.
- Allocation of Rs.104.76 crore as special grant for the development of particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups of which Rs.44.76 crore has been released and 8,066 members benefited.
- Rs.33.15 crore to TAHDCO as Share Capital Assistance.
- Certificates were distributed to 43 students who completed training relating to film industry at the National Film Development Corporation (NFDC) through TAHDCO.
- Under Post-matric Scholarship Scheme Government to bear the maintenance allowance and compulsory non-refundable fees including Tuition fees fixed by the “Committee on fixation of fee” for SC/ST/ SCC students admitted in self financing colleges under free and paid seats. 28,21,770 students benefited at an expenditure of Rs.2,589.17 crore.
- The award amount of Rs.6,000/-, Rs.4,000/- and 2,000/- as 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize respectively, are given to one boy and one girl student who secure highest marks in 12th Standard Public examination at District level. Similarly, Rs.3,000/-, Rs.2,000/- and Rs.1,000/- for the first three positions respectively are provided to students who secure highest marks in 10th Standard Public Examination. Total award amount of Rs.32.57 lakh provided for the benefit of 1,598 students.
- Increase of award amount under Chief Minister’s Merit award as Rs.3,000/- per annum. So far, Rs.296.88 lakh provided for the benefit of 11,046 beneficiaries.
- Increase of award amount under Annal Gandhi memorial award as Rs.2,000/- per annum in the first year and Rs.1,500/- per annum for the succeeding 5 years are provided to SC students (one boy and one girl) who secure first rank in each district in +2 Public Examinations. Total award amount of Rs.10.26 lakh are provided for the benefit of 559 students.
- Under Higher Education Special Scholarship Scheme, the amount has been increased to Rs.7,500/- per annum to students who pursue degree course and stay in the institutional hostels and for post graduate / professional course as Rs.8,000/- per annum. So far, 1,14,682 students are benefited at an allocation of Rs.7,949.03 lakh.
- Rs.10,000/- as incentive to Head Masters who produce results above 95% in 10th and 12th Standards and Rs.5,000/- each for the subject Teachers who produce 100% results.
- 1,500 additional seats were created to the students in Adi Dravidar / Tribal Hostels.
- To reduce the dropouts and to continue the school education an amount of Rs.128.83 crore was spent in five years for the benefit of 16,32,174 girls under Girls Incentive Scheme.
- Under Special State Assistance, a sum of Rs.25 crore has been allotted for skill development and entrepreneurship development programme for 25,000 youth. 11,734 persons were imparted skill development training.

- An allocation of Rs.250 crore has been made under Comprehensive Tribal Development programme.
- Construction of own buildings for 93 Adidraavidar hostels which are running in rented buildings at an estimate of Rs.56.04 crore.
- Upgradation of essential infrastructure facilities in 1,080 hostels at an allocation of Rs.83.40 crore.
- Increase of incentive under Select Village Scheme to Rs.10 lakh, where untouchability is not practiced, for the development of infrastructure facilities.
- Government order to provide 6,245 Two Tier Steel cots for college hostel students at an allocation of Rs.5.28 crore.
- Increase of incentive for Special Coaching as Rs.50,000/- to candidates who pass the UPSC Preliminary Exam. 76 students are benefited.
- Cash Award to Writers has been increased to Rs.40,000/- to 10 SC/ST/SCC writers and 1 non SC writer for best Literary work. So far Rs.4,40,000/- provided to 22 writers.
- 54 new Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare hostels were opened.
- For the welfare of inmates of 582 hostels/ residential schools napkin burners were provided at a cost of Rs 146 lakh which benefited 43,258 students.
- Weighing machines to 1,616 hostels at an expenditure of Rs.80.80 lakh in order to check the correct weight of the food products.
- Renovation / special repair works in 200 Adi Dravidar Welfare primary schools at an expenditure of Rs.30 crore.
- Under Scheduled Castes Sub-plan Rs.39,434 crore allocated for Adi Dravidar Welfare Rs.2,178.09 crore allotted for Welfare of Scheduled Tribes under Tribal Sub-plan/
- Rs.1,675.51 crore allotted for Educational assistance during 2014-2015.
- Enhancement of Annual income ceiling limit of parents / guardians to Rs.2.50 lakh for all Educational related schemes.
- Stipend of Rs.50,000/- per year for 700 Adi Dravidar students pursuing Ph.D course. 1,372 Students are benefitted at an amount of Rs.6.86 crore.
- 76 College Girls Hostels are provided with Power Laundry System at a cost of Rs.2.88 crore.
- Creation of Smart Class Rooms in 100 Higher Secondary Schools at an expenditure of Rs.5.50 crore.
- Financial Assistance of Rs.50,000/- per Adi dravidar student who have passed the preliminary examination under Group – I examination conducted by the TNPSC. So far, 32 Students benefited at an expenditure of Rs.16 lakh.
- Financial Assistance of Rs.50,000/- to the Chartered Accountants / Indian Cost and Works Accountants to start profession.
- Loan assistance with Margin Money to 8,406 Adi Dravidar Women Members working in Women Industrial Co-operative Societies

with upgraded Sewing Machines. Totally Rs.447.44 lakh has been provided to 3,219 beneficiaries.

- Increase of award amount as Rs.1,600 for first year and Rs.2,000 for the consecutive 5 years to two boys and two girls who secure highest marks in 10th Standard public examinations.
- Managerial Skill Development training to the Headmasters of High and Higher Secondary Schools.
- 70 cooking steam boilers (Rs.5 lakh each) to 70 hostels at an expenditure of Rs.3.50 crore.
- Special Training to 50 Tribal students for getting admission in higher technical courses such as IIT and NIT at an expenditure of Rs.1 crore.
- Extension of land development scheme to all through TAHDCO at a cost of Rs.7.50 crore for benefiting 100 Adi Dravidar beneficiaries.
- State Level Cash Award are given to one boy and one girl belong to SC/ST/SCC who secure highest marks in 12th Std, 1st prize Rs.50,000, 2nd prize Rs.30,000 and 3rd prize Rs.20,000. Rs.61.07 lakh has been spent for 530 beneficiaries.
- Economic Assistance of Rs.264.46 crore to 78,639 members of Women Self Help Groups with subsidy of Rs.179.29 crore.
- Two Polytechnic Colleges in Cuddalore District and in Tiruvallur District were established at an expenditure of Rs.24.60. crore.
- One ITI in the campus of Adi Dravidar Higher Secondary School at Vadakarai in

Tiruvallur District was established at an expenditure of Rs.10 crore.

- Order were issued for supply of 1,367 steam idly cooker at a cost of Rs. 1.10 crore to Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Residential Schools.
- Government order to provide one pillow with cover to the inmates of Adi Dravidar / Tribal Hostels and Government Tribal Residential Schools at an expenditure of Rs.4.71 crore.
- Students staying in Tribal Hostels and Government Tribal Residential Schools in hilly areas are provided with one rain coat at an expenditure of Rs.2 crore. Similarly, to take care of students' health during winter season one sweater was provided to all students at an expenditure of Rs.1.08 crore.
- 10 new College Hostels were opened at an expenditure of Rs.2.13 crore during 2014-2015.
- A sum of Rs.15,000/- each are provided to 1,647 Hostel Wardens and Headmasters of Government Tribal Residential Schools every year at a cost of Rs.2.47 crore and Rs.10,000/- are provided to each Headmasters of 1,096 Adi Dravidar Welfare Schools to undertake immediate and urgent minor maintenance works at a cost of Rs.1.10 crore.
- Government order to provide Special training to 906 B.Ed., ST Graduates through SCERT for securing more marks in the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) at an expenditure of Rs.66 lakh. Similarly training for 500 SC/ ST Secondary Grade candidates those who passed in D.T.Ed and 500 SC Graduates those who passed in B.Ed., through private institutions for competing in Teachers

Eligibility Test at an expenditure of Rs.55 lakh.

- Rs.1.14 crore provided to encourage Scouts and Guides Movement in 207 High and Higher Secondary Schools.
- Government order to provide Solar Lamps in 216 Government Tribal Residential Schools in hilly areas from 6th std to 12th std. for the benefit of 13,154 students at a cost of Rs.73 lakh.
- Educational tours are provided to the students of 10th and 12th Standard in 207 Adi Dravidar Welfare / Government Tribal Residential High / Higher Secondary Schools at cost of Rs.25,000/- per School. The total expenditure involved in this scheme is Rs.52 lakh.
- Assistance of Rs 50,000 is provided for CAT training to 100 BE graduates belonging to Adi Dravidar/Tribal communities for getting admission in reputed institutions like IIM for MBA at a total cost of Rs 50 lakhs.
- Government order to provide First Aid Boxes to 1,346 Adi Dravidar hostels and 100 Government Tribal Residential Schools at a cost of Rs.49.16 lakh to treat minor injuries.
- Sports competitions at District / Zonal and State level are conducted among the 207 Adi Dravidar Welfare / Government Tribal Residential High and Higher Secondary Schools at a cost of Rs.26 lakh.
- In order to give yoga training to students, yoga training was provided to 414 teachers in 1,397 schools at a total cost of Rs.16.80 lakh.



- Amount for Manitha Neya Vara Vizha celebrations has been increased to Rs.50,000/- per district and Rs.1 lakh for the State level.
- The amount for Sama Bandhi Bojana programme has been enhanced from Rs.2,500/- to Rs.5,000/- in each District. Further this scheme is implemented in all Districts (except Chennai) at a cost of Rs.1.55 lakh.
- Financial assistance of Rs.50,000/- is provided to ST candidates who pass in the Preliminary Examination of UPSC and TNPSC (Group – I).
- During 2015-2016, allocation of Rs.663.53 crore for educational scholarship for 10th standard and above. Total allocation is Rs. 1,954.83 crore.

- Order has been issued for purchase of steam boilers for 460 Adi Dravidar Welfare hostels at a cost of Rs 21.02 crore.
- Government ordered to provide stainless steel plates and tumblers to the students studying in 1,314 Adi Dravidar Welfare Hostels at a cost of Rs. 1.46 crore.
- Government ordered for opening of working women's Hostels in Chennai, Kancheepuram, Tiruvallur, Coimbatore and Trichy at a cost of Rs.4.40 crore
- Announcement for upgradation of 5 Adi Dravidar Welfare / Government Tribal Residential High Schools into Higher Secondary Schools and 15 Adi Dravidar Welfare / Government Tribal Residential Middle Schools into High Schools at a cost of Rs.4.94 crore.
- Government ordered for opening of one Model Residential School in the premises of Tribal Research Centre, Mutharai Palada, Ooty, at a cost of Rs.8.59 crore.
- Government ordered for modernizing the existing class rooms into Integrated Smart Class Rooms in 26 Government Tribal Residential High Schools at a cost of Rs.1.31 crore.
- Government ordered for opening of 10 New College Hostels at a cost of Rs.1.65 crore.
- Government ordered to provide Embroidery Sewing Machines at a cost of Rs.96 lakh.
- Government ordered to provide Stainless Steel Plates and Tumblers to the students in 42 Tribal Welfare Hostels and 306 Government Tribal Residential Schools. Also ordered for providing Rain Coats to the students in Government Tribal Residential Schools in plain areas and for providing First Aid Boxes to 206 Government Tribal Residential schools at a cost of Rs.91 lakh.
- Announcement made to First Aid Boxes to all Adi Dravidar welfare Schools at a cost of Rs.38.25 lakh.
- Government ordered to provide Rs.5 lakh each to two best Higher Secondary Schools in Adi Dravidar Welfare and Government Tribal Residential School for development of infrastructure facilities at a cost of Rs.10 lakh.
- Increase in monthly feeding charges for SC/ ST hostel students to Rs.755/- for school students and to Rs.875/- for college students. The total beneficiaries are 97,239 with school students getting totally Rs.6.39 crore and college students Rs.1.11 crore.
- Increase in miscellaneous charges for soap, oil etc., to school students to Rs.50/- and to Rs.75/- for college students. So far, Rs.5.07 crore has been distributed to 84,592 school students and Rs.1.14 crore to 12,647 college students.
- Government ordered for development of two softwares for the Data base creation on the details of Prevention of Atrocities Act at a cost of Rs.5 lakh and for developing one software to link the details of Bonded labourers through online at a cost of Rs.3 lakh and for CUG connection to the officers and staff of Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department at a cost of Rs.1.66 lakh.



Astounding performance in the farm front



- The Mettur Dam was opened on 6th June 2011 for the first time bringing an additional Delta paddy area of 1,80,000 acres. Around 1,22,230 farmers benefited.
- To reduce the burden of the farmers, 4% VAT exemption on Agricultural inputs and Farm machinery. 63.40 lakh farmers benefited
- To ensure uninterrupted supply of fertilizers esp. DAP & other fertilizers interest free advance of Rs.580 crore was extended to TANFED.
- The Budget outlay for Agriculture for the past 5 years was Rs.23,655.5 crore.
- Under Micro Irrigation, Provision of 100% subsidy to Small Farmer and Marginal Farmer. Provision of 75% subsidy to other Farmers 1,65,802 Farmers benefited, Rs.799.3590 crore subsidy extended.
- Ceiling limit of one acre for Small and Marginal farmers for availing the subsidy for micro irrigation has been removed.
- Sugarcane farmers were given Rs.2,850/- per metric tonne as State Advised Price for sugarcane. So far, 781.50 Lakh metric tonnes of sugarcane was crushed and Rs. 16,994.49 crore was disbursed to the farmers.
- Pulses whole village concept implemented in 8,289 villages covering 12.446 lakh acres under pulses crop.
- 379 new vehicles worth Rs.23.68 crore distributed to block level Assistant Director of Agriculture. In 2014-2015, announcement is made to distribute 124 New vehicles.
- For record food grain production of 101.52 lakh metric tonnes in 2011-2012, and for record pulses yield of 6.14 lakh

metric tonnes in 2013-2014, Tamil Nadu received KRISHIKARMAN AWARD from Government of India. Record food grain production of 127.96 lakh metric tonnes in 2014-2015 (4th Estimate).

- During 2013-2014, Thiru. P.Solaimalai of Madurai District, Tvl.N.Parameswaran and Thiru K.P.Duraisami of Erode District were awarded with medal and Rs.5 lakh each for the record yield of 8,272 kg per acre, 6,110 kg per acre and 6,130 kg per acre in the years 2012, 2013 and 2014 respectively in SRI paddy cultivation.
- Under the ATMA programme, 1,322 extension officers and 8,180 farmer friends have been nominated.
- 3,04,727 acres of Redgram crop raised in transplantation method at an expenditure of Rs.68.417 crore in 26 districts.
- A multi disciplinary awareness campaign, Uzhavar Peruvizha conducted in all revenue villages. Around 80.86 lakh farmers participated in this programme. Rs.78.33 crore was incurred as expenditure. 18.35 lakh soil samples were collected. 11.21 lakh “Farmers Integrated Hand Books” (FIHB) were distributed.
- Inputs costing Rs.42.78 crore were distributed to farmers during Uzhavar Peruvizha.
- A sum of Rs.46.71 crore was incurred as expenditure for Special Samba package with new strategies for Delta districts to ensure samba cultivation and productivity for the year 2012-2013. Additional Samba package having new strategies to save the paddy crop due to paucity of water release from Mettur Dam in delta districts, at a cost of Rs.27.25 crore and Diesel subsidy were provided incurring an expenditure of Rs.12.43 crore.
- To protect farmers from the failure of monsoon in 2012-2013, the Government itself paid a sum of Rs.27.67 crore as premium covering 5.32 lakh farmers in Tamil Nadu. Thereby, the farmers received Rs.740.80 crore as compensation for Samba/ Thaladi crops.
- To ensure Kuruvai cultivation in one lakh acres in Delta districts, uninterrupted power supply and inputs subsidy worth Rs.4.83 crore were provided (Bio-pesticides, Bio-Fertilizers, Micro-Nutrients and Gypsum) during 2013-2014. 6,000 units of HDPE pipeline worth Rs.9.26 crore were provided for raising Kuruvai paddy crop.
- Input distribution (Znso4, MN Mixture, Bio-fertilizers, Gypsum) at an outlay of Rs.11.14 crore. Rs.18.25 crore subsidy was provided to farmers’ groups for Transplanter, Mechanical weeder and HDPE pipes for Kuruvai cultivation during 2014 in Delta Districts.
- During 2015, Kuruvai Special package was implemented in delta districts incurring an expenditure of Rs.29.80 crore towards mechanical transplantation of Paddy, usage of productivity enhancing inputs (MN Mixture & Bio-fertilizer), free distribution of Gypsum and providing ploughing subsidy and free distribution of Green Manure Seeds and pulses seeds in Vennar Region resulted

- in kuruvai paddy coverage of 3.05 lakh acres in delta districts.
- To fertilize after ascertaining soil health, 67.45 lakh FIHB distributed.
 - In 2012-2013, Rs.524.26 crore was given as drought relief to 3.53 lakh farmers in Delta Districts and Rs.800.79 crore was distributed to 19.27 lakh farmers in non-Delta districts.
 - To provide Integrated Agricultural Extension Services, Uzhavar Maiyams in 10 districts at a cost of Rs.14.97 crore were established.
 - Establishment of Integrated Agricultural Extension Centre in 100 blocks with budget outlay of Rs.150 crore.
 - Field functionaries in all Districts have been provided with 2,319 Personal Digital Assistants (PDAs) enabled with GPRS, GIS & GPS for speedy transmission of agricultural details to farmers.
 - To narrow down the potential yield gap and to facilitate the farmers with easy access to information like weather, input availability, farm based interventions, market intelligence and scheme benefits besides details of their own farm plan and input requirements, Touch Screen Kiosks have been established at block level in 125 places of Tiruchi (26), Erode(36), Tiruvarur(42) and Coimbatore(21) districts. By making use of “Crop doctor” software, farmers are adopting the plant protection measures.
 - Creation of awareness on traditional Agro products such as Tender Coconut, Cotton and Shikakai at an outlay of Rs.10 crore.
 - Establishment of TANSEDA with revolving fund of Rs.25 crore to ensure distribution of quality certified seeds as “Amma Seeds” at reasonable price to farmers through Amma Service Centre sales outlets in the blocks.
 - Establishment of Eco friendly IPM model Villages Scheme is implemented in 150 selected villages of 56 backward blocks in 16 districts with an estimate of Rs.165 lakh.
 - Under “Amma Farm Women Empowerment Programme” 550 farm women groups are formed for improving the income and standard of living of the farm women.
 - Ten Model Organic Villages are established one each in districts Vellore, Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Erode, Thiruvannamalai, Villupuram, Madurai, Salem, Cuddalore and Coimbatore with a budget outlay of Rs. 1 crore.
 - Integrated Horticulture Development Scheme was implemented in 2.29 lakh acres at an expenditure of Rs.21.66 crore.
 - 17,800 farmers were trained in Hi-tech horticulture cultivation at a cost of Rs.41.17 lakh through 4 Horticulture Training Centres at Madhavaram, Kudumiyanmalai-Pudukkottai, Ooty and Thally.
 - Urban Horticulture Development Programme in Chennai and Coimbatore Metros cultivating vegetables in roof top is implemented with the financial outlay of Rs.5 crore by distribution of Do-it-yourself kits. During the year 2015-2016 this scheme was extended to Madurai and Tiruchirappalli towns at a cost of Rs. 537 lakh.

- Hill Area Development Programme was implemented in Nilgiris district with the financial outlay of Rs.10.36 crore for the benefit of horticulture farmers.

- For Large area impact demonstration of fruit flies trapping technology to minimize yield losses to mango farmers in Dharmapuri and Krishnagiri Districts of Tamil Nadu, an amount of Rs.2.45 crore has been sanctioned during 2015.
- For Integrated Seed production Hub for Southern Districts of Tamil Nadu, an amount of Rs.5 crore has been sanctioned during 2015.
- Golden Jubilee of Green Revolution award was given to Tamil Nadu Agricultural University by the National Academy of Agricultural Sciences, Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Government of India on 27.11.2015.



Livestock growth uplifts rural economy



- Scheme for Free distribution of Milch Cows is being implemented in 21 Districts at a total cost of Rs. 208.42 crore. As on 17.01.2016, 59,950 beneficiaries have been provided with milch cows.
- Under NABARD RIDF XVII, Rs.122.24 crore has been allotted and construction of 360 Veterinary Institutions, and improvement and strengthening of 12 district livestock farm works were completed.
- Scheme for Free distribution of Goat / Sheep is being implemented in 31 Districts at a total cost of Rs.874.50 crore. As on 20.01.2016, 6,97,606 beneficiaries each have been provided with 27,90,424 Goat / Sheep.
- Under NABARD RIDF XIX scheme Rs.99 crore has been allotted for 450 Veterinary Dispensaries and construction of 377 Veterinary Dispensaries buildings were

completed and the balance work will also be completed at the earliest.

- Under NABARD RIDF XX, to construct 226 veterinary institutions, Government has sanctioned Rs.61.25 crore and construction of 96 veterinary dispensary buildings were completed.
- Under NABARD RIDF XXI Govt. Rs.62 crore have been sanctioned to construct 193 VDs and one quality control lab at IVPM Ranipet.
- Rs.78.30 crore have been allotted Under maintenance and repair work 1,191 buildings were renovated and furniture were provided to 2,322 Veterinary Institutions.
- Rs.25.516 crore have been sanctioned Under Establishment and strengthening of Veterinary Hospital and dispensaries (ESVHD) 252 new Veterinary Institutions were constructed.
- Under Establishment of 20 New Veterinary Dispensary scheme, 20 New buildings to Veterinary Dispensaries are constructed at a total cost of Rs.6.0 crore.
- Under National Agricultural Development Programme (NADP), Provision of facilities for improved delivery of Veterinary Services in Rural areas of Tamil nadu 10 CBFD buildings (LN2) were constructed at a total cost of Rs.3.4 crores and 85 Veterinary Dispensaries at a total cost of Rs.13.267 crores.
- Government have sanctioned Rs.29.70 crores to construct Integrated Office Complex with basic amenities for the Administrative

Offices of Animal Husbandry Department and Fisheries Department

- Under State Fodder Development Schemes, for the last 5 years a sum of Rs.90 crore was sanctioned 44,000 acres irrigated land 56,000 acres of rainfed land of farmers holding were brought under green fodder cultivation. Though this development, 86.4 LMT of green fodder has been produced. Besides this, to enhance green fodder production and to avoid wastage of green fodder fed to animals 7,397 Rainguns and 4,178 Numbers of power operated Chaff Cutters were distributed to farmers at 75% subsidy. To facilitate easy and uniform harvest of Fodder, 2,500 grass cutters were distributed to the farmers at 50% subsidy. To highlight the importance of feeding tree fodder to the Livestock, 30 lakh Agathi tree seeding were distributed to the farmers at free of cost. 10,000 Azolla units has been established.
- During 2015-2016 a sum of Rs.25 crore has been sanctioned and 62,000 acres have been brought under green fodder cultivation. 3,000 units of raingun are to be distributed to farmers at 75% subsidy. 10,000 Azolla units to be established. 40,000 numbers silage bags of 250 kg capacity are to be distributed to 10,000 farmers at the rate of 4 bags per farmer for ensiling fodder. Fodder seed production units are being established in 7 departmental farms. 2 lakhs fodder tree seedlings distributed to farmers at free of cost.
- Under NADP, 31 Mobile Veterinary Units were established at a cost of Rs. 2.05 crore.

Under out reach programme, 6,636 camps were conducted at a cost of Rs. 1.51 crore. A total number of 38,39,550 animals were treated and 8,91,356 farmers benefited.

- A total of 98 ultra sound scanning machines were purchased at a cost of Rs. 8.81 crore.
- Under Scheme for Poultry Development, so far 2,239 Broiler Farms and 7,823 Native Chicken Farms were established at a total cost of Rs.97.35 crore.
- 810 new Veterinary Sub Centres were upgraded as Veterinary Dispensaries at a

total cost of 52.02 crore. 20 new Veterinary Dispensaries were established at a cost of Rs.1.42 crore, 100 more new Veterinary sub centres will be established at a cost of Rs.271.50 lakh.

- Under Drought Mitigation Schemes Rs. 39.65 crores were utilized for cultivation of green fodder in 32,360 acres of land belonging to 38,202 beneficiaries, 1.525 lakh Metric Tons of green fodder was produced and of which 41,825 Metric Tons of fodder was procured and distributed to Aavin beneficiaries at 50% subsidy.

- 185 Fodder Depots were established at a total cost of Rs. 18.5 crore and 28,855 M.T. Dry fodder was distributed to 2,67,169 animal holders in a subsidized rate of Rs. 2/- Kg. There by 11,23,258 No. of Animals were benefited.
- 16 Fodder Depots established with an outlay of Rs.80 lakhs through which 2,480.75 MT dry fodder distributed benefitting 1,083 lakh animals in 8 draught districts.
- In Vellore at Keelvidhi village 83.5 acres of meikkal Lands have been brought under this pilot project. Procurement of agricultural machineries, land reclamation works & appointment of staffs are completed. - Under Foot and Mouth Disease Control Programme Scheme, Rs.30.04 crore was sanctioned and approximately 8.36 crore cattle population was vaccinated in 9 rounds at 6 months interval in all the district of the State.
- Under Assistance to States for Control of Animal Diseases (ASCAD) Scheme, Rs.14.16 crore was sanctioned. Approximately 2.14 crore animal population was vaccinated against Anthrax Disease, approximately 18.24 lakh cattle population was vaccinated against Black Quarter Disease (BQ), approximately 17.47 lakh cattle population was vaccinated against Haemorrhagic Septicemia (HS) disease and approximately 7.40 lakh sheep were vaccinated against Sheep Pox disease.

- A total of 3,948 on and off campus training programmes were offered to the livestock / fish farmers, unemployed and employed youths on scientific rearing of livestock and totally 2,29,065 persons benefited.
- For the beneficiaries of State Fodder Development scheme, a total of 77 training programmes on Fodder Production have been conducted benefiting 8,256 farmers.
- A seminar on the role of cattle in the social development of rural people was conducted on 08.06.2012 for the benefit of Veterinary doctors attached to the Animal Husbandry Department and Tamil Nadu Milk Producers Co-operative Society.
- Establishment of a solar powered Village Knowledge and Information Centre (VKIC) has been established by Krishi Vigyan Kednra, Kattupakkam of TANUVAS in collaboration with Virginia Tech University, USA at Thalambedu village of Kancheepuram district on 10.07.2012.

- Six Veterinary University Training and Research Centres one each at Villupuram, Thiruvannamalai, Krishnagiri, Ramanathapuram, Nagapattinam and Perambalur have been started at a cost of Rs.5.10 crore and are functioning.
- Establishment of permanent buildings at a cost of Rs.1.50 crore for the outreach centres of Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University at Theni, Rajapalayam and Tiruchirappalli.
- Dr. B.V. Rao Memorial Poultry Training Centre at Veterinary College and Research Institute, Namakkal with financial support at a cost of Rs.3.86 crore from National Egg Co-ordination Committee has been established.
- Established of fodder production units in Meikkal Poromboke lands in Villupuram and Vellore Districts at a cost of Rs.694.80 lakh.
- cyclone in Cuddalore district and vaccinated 2,500 poultry birds with oral pellet vaccine against Newcastle disease.
- A team of scientists have been deputed to assess the soil conditions in “Thane” affected Cuddalore district and suggest measures for raising appropriate fodder crops to sustain livestock farming activity in Cuddalore district, as a short term livelihood avenue.
- Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu declared open Veterinary College and Research Centre at Orathanadu in Thanjavur District and Ramianpatti in Tirunelveli District on 15.07.2015. The new colleges were functioning with adequate infrastructure.
- The Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 15.07.2015 declared open buildings for the Veterinary Research and Training Centre of the University at Tiruvannamalai, Villupuram, Rajapalayam, and Tiruchi and a farmers training centre at Theni.

RELIEF MEASURES

- During North-East Monsoon, Kanjeeपुरam, Chennai, Cuddalore, and Tiruvellore districts were the worst affected due to heavy rains. As a relief measure, 9171 Special Veterinary health camps were conducted in the worst affected districts. 6,93,389 livestock were vaccinated against various diseases. 6,16,142 animals were treated and 11,02,890 animals were dewormed in the camp.
- TANUVAS distributed 7 tonnes of Co-4 green fodder, 1 tonne of mineral mixture, 500 kgs milch animal feed and 100 kgs of straw block free of cost to the victims of, “Thane”
- Green Fodder development scheme in puramboke land is being implemented at a cost of Rs 694.80 crore in Vellore and Villupuram district.
- Veterinary Colleges functioning under the Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University in Chennai and Namakkal were given recognition from March 2015 to March 2020 by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research and the necessary order was received in April last week. These colleges were among the 22 colleges in the country to get the recognition.

- Biosafety Level-III (BSL-3) Laboratory at TANUVAS campus, Madhavaram, at a budget outlay of Rs.12.75 crores and released a sum of Rs.8 crore, It develops newer generation vaccine and diagnostic kits for the benefit of livestock farmers and poultry entrepreneurs. Hereafter diagnosis of high risk infectious disease like avian influenza and Foot and Mouth disease can be carried over at this laboratory. It overcomes the dependence of Northern states for diagnosis of these disease. By this laboratory livestock farmers and poultry entrepreneurs will be benefited.
- For giving emergency, critical medical care to livestock in remote rural areas of Tamil Nadu ten number of Animal Mobile Medical Ambulance at a cost of Rs.633.96 lakh. This pilot project which is first of its kind in the country, will be launched in 5 Districts (Tiruchirapalli, Thanjavur, Namakkal, Madurai and Kancheepuram). This Animal Mobile Medical Ambulance, when called by a farmer via phone, will provide emergency care to livestock at a farmer's door step. It will also shift the critically ill animals to the nearest Veterinary Hospital.
- To provide more services and support to the livestock and poultry farmers and also the public, the existing Veterinary University Training and Research Centre functioning at Madurai is upgraded as Tamil Nadu Veterinary University Training and Diagnostic Centre at a cost of Rs.1 crore.
- For Vice-Chancellor, Registrar, Officers and Non-teaching staff of TANUVAS Quarters would be constructed.
- For the newly constructed Veterinary College and Research Institute, Tirunelveli and Thanjavur compound wall would be constructed at a total cost of Rs.2 crore.

- Aavin made history with the highest milk procurement of 31.32 lakh litres on 15.10.2015.
- Milk procurement by Aavin has been increasing and Aavin has procured 23.68lakh in the year 2014-2015 and in the year 2015-2016 (average up to December 2015)

the procurement has been increased to 29.41 lakh litres per day.

- To make the payment of dues to milk producers, the Government, provided assistance to Aavin to the tune of Rs.192.14 crore as ways and means advance.

- For the beneficiaries of free Milch animals scheme, milk producers societies were formed in 4,177 villages.
- 175 Bulk Milk Coolers were installed by which milk chilling capacity has been increased by 7.44 lakh litres per day.
- Smart card was introduced for the benefit of Aavin milk consumers. Smart card can be used for renewal of monthly milk cards through website www.aavinmilk.com.
- “Aavin Chocolate” Mango Milk Shake, Milk Peda, Shree Khand, Milk bread, Milk cake and Milk shake in 7 different tastes were introduced.
- 182 new Aavin milk parlours have been started and also 3 mobile parlours have been opened.
- On 04.01.2013 the sale of “New Ooty Tea” in Aavin milk parlours was commenced.
- The average milk sales which was about 10.30 lakh litres per day, now it has been increased to 11.50 lakh litres.
- The annual turnover of Aavin has increased from Rs.2,369 crore to Rs.3,881 crore.

- The Government enhanced fishing ban period relief assistance from Rs. 1000/- to Rs. 2,000/- and disbursed an amount of Rs.155.56 crore to 7,77,921 families.
- The Government introduced a new scheme of Rs. 4,000/- per family as a special allowance to marine Fishermen families during the fishing lean period and disbursed an amount of Rs. 63.83 crore to 1,59,564 families during 2011-2012, Rs.64.40 crore to 1,61,012 families during 2012-2013, Rs.65.81 crore to 1,64,530 families during 2013-2014 and Rs. 66.09 crore to 1,65,243 marine fishermen families during 2014-2015. For the year 2015-2016 a sum of Rs.66 crore was sanctioned. An amount of Rs.42.50 crore was disbursed to 1,06,244, marine fishermen families of 10 coastal Districts viz., Tiruvallur to Ramanathapuram till 31.12.2015. Disbursement of relief amount will be completed by April 2016 in remaining three Districts.
- Government introduced a new scheme for conversion of mechanized fishing boats and upgradation / replacement of traditional motorized crafts into tuna long liner in order to promote deep sea fishing and reduce the fishing pressure in inshore waters for which a sum of Rs.5 crore was sanctioned and Rs. 3.51 crore subsidy was released to 151 boats. Further, the Government enhanced the subsidy from 25% to 50% with Rs. 30 lakh as maximum subsidy at a unit cost of Rs. 60 lakh to procure new tuna longliners. Government

has sanctioned an amount of Rs.6.48 crore for the year 2013-2014 and Rs.5 crore for the year 2014-2015 for implementation of this scheme. The applications received from fishermen applicants were scrutinized and 171 eligible beneficiaries were finalized by various committees. Work orders were issued by the Honourable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 15.07.2015 and boat construction is in progress.

- For establishment of Fish Processing Parks integration with SIPCOT land on long term lease basis to three prospective developers have been allotted in Thoothukudi and Thiruvallur Districts. In the Districts of Cuddalore, Nagapattinam, tender has been called for. Land allotment order was given to the developers for Kanniyakumari and Ramnad Districts.

FISHERIES UNIVERSITY AT NAGAPATTINAM

- Rs. 18.10 crore was sanctioned towards establishment of Tamil Nadu Fisheries University at Nagapattinam and Rs.8 crore was released during 2012-2013. The University has started functioning. During 2013-2014, an amount of Rs.54.64 lakh was released. A sum of Rs.13.65 crore was allotted for the year 2014-2015 and an amount of Rs. 3.41 crore was released as first installment.
- For establishment of Fisheries Institute of Technology in Thiruvallur District and Nagapattinam District, the Government sanctioned Rs.34.07 crore for each Institute and released Rs. 7 crore each during 2012-2013. Both the Institutes have started

functioning and are imparting training courses. During 2013-2014, an amount of Rs.5.5 crore sanctioned for each institution and thus a total of Rs. 11 crore has been released. A sum of Rs. 31 crore has been allotted for both the centres for the year 2014-2015 of which an amount of Rs.7.75 crore has been released as first installment.

- During the year 2014-2015, the Government sanctioned an amount of Rs. 24.77 crore for Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi and other Extension centres transferred from TANUVAS to Tamil Nadu Fisheries University. An amount of Rs. 6.19 crore has been released as First Installment.
- National Fishermen Savings cum Relief assistance of Rs. 71.26 crore for the year fill 2014 was disbursed to 5,96,647 fishermen. For the year 2014-2015, Government enhanced the fishermen contribution from Rs.600 to Rs.900 and its matching contribution amount from Rs.1,200 to Rs.1,800/- per fishermen beneficiary and an amount of Rs.34.99 crore has been disbursed to 1,94,436 marine Fishermen. For the year 2015-2016, a sum of Rs. 37.40 crore was sanctioned. An amount of Rs.22.62 crore was disbursed to 1,47,920 fishermen of 10 coastal Districts viz., Tiruvallur to Ramanathapuram till 31.12.2015. Disbursement of relief amount will be completed by April 2016 in remaining three Districts.
- Under State Savings Cum Relief Scheme for fisherwomen, Rs.60.55 crore had been disbursed to 5,05,537 marine fisher women. For the year 2014-2015, Government has enhanced the fisherwomen contribution



from Rs.600/- to Rs.900 and its matching contribution amount from Rs. 1,200/- to Rs.1,800/- per fisherwomen beneficiary and disbursed a sum Rs. 31.82 crore to 1,76,786 fisherwomen. For the year 2015 - 2016 a sum of Rs.34.98 crore was sanctioned. An amount of Rs. 24.96 crore was disbursed to 1,38,680 fisherwomen of 10 coastal Districts viz., Tiruvallur to Ramanathapuram till 31.12.2015. Disbursement of relief amount will be completed by April 2016 in remaining three Districts.

- In 2011-2012, Rs. 6.46 crore was released to 2,450 beneficiaries and Rs. 4 crore was

released to 1,398 beneficiaries for the year 2012 - 2013 under motorization of traditional crafts scheme. For 2014-2015, an amount of Rs. 1.90 crore has been released for 635 fishermen as subsidy for purchasing OBM / IBE.

- 5,500 traditional craft fishermen of Thoothukudi, Tirunelveli and Kanniyakumari Districts have been supplied sales tax exempted industrial kerosene at a subsidized price of Rs. 25/- per litre for the year of 2011-2012 to 2015-2016 an amount of Rs.230.30 crore has been released.

- The 5 innocent fishermen of Thangachimadam, Ramanathapuram District who were arrested by the Sri Lankan Navy on a fabricated case on 29.11.2011 were sentenced to death on 30.10.2014 by the High Court of Colombo. Due to immediate and untiring efforts of the Government of Tamil Nadu, all the five innocent fishermen were released on 19.11.2014 and returned to Tamil Nadu on 20.11.2014. The Government, in order to protect the lives of the five innocent fishermen released a total of Rs.26.25 lakh towards legal assistance. Government also released Rs.38.85 lakh towards interim relief, daily relief and also to help them start new life.
- In order to improve the productivity of marine eco system, installation of Artificial Reefs was completed in 17 places at a cost of Rs. 2.63 crore.
- On a pilot basis, subsidy assistance of Rs. 7.50 lakh was provided for the purchase of Self Contained Underwater Breathing Apparatus (SCUBA) to 10 fishermen of Thoothukudi District, who were engaged in Chank diving. Air compressor was also supplied at a cost of Rs. 5.67 lakh for the use of fishermen.
- Under Centrally Sponsored Shared Group Accident Insurance Scheme, a sum of Rs. 89,12,500/- has been paid as insurance relief to 109 families during the year 2011-2012. For the year 2012-2013 a sum Rs.1.17 crore to 126 families, for the year 2013-2014 a sum of Rs.1.43 crore to 158 families, for the year 2014-2015 Rs.1.13 crore to 119 families and for the year 2015-2016 a sum of Rs. 95.50 lakh to 111 families have been settled as insurance relief.
- Financial assistance of Rs. 50 lakh to 105 fisherfolk youth for undergoing Maritime Education was provided during 2012 - 2013. Further, an amount of Rs. 50 lakh has been sanctioned by the Government for 2013-2014, from which 139 fisherfolk youth were provided financial assistance. Further, an amount of Rs. 50 lakh was sanctioned for the year 2014 - 2015 and an amount of Rs. 20 lakh was released to 56 fisher youth.
- Modernization of Chennai Fishing Harbour has been taken up at a cost of Rs. 17.63 crore under NFDB and Tsunami Rehabilitation Programme and completed.
- Additional funds of Rs. 60.65 crore for Colachel Fishing Harbour, Rs. 57.40 crore for Thengapattinam Fishing Harbour and Rs. 73.52 crore for expansion of Chinnamuttom Fishing Harbour in Kanniyakumari District have been sanctioned and work is in progress.
- For construction of Fishing Harbour at Manakudi in Kanniyakumari District at a cost of Rs. 72.44 crore under PPP mode, feasibility report has been obtained. Tender received and scrutiny is under process.
- Under Centrally Shared Scheme, Revised Administrative sanction was obtained for Rs. 148 crore for the fishing harbour in Poompuhar in Nagapattinam District. The foundation stone was laid by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 11.09.2013 and work is in progress.

- Rs.10.34 crore has been sanctioned under NFDB assistance for improvement of Cuddalore Fishing Harbour and work has been completed.
- Construction of Fishing Harbour at Muttom and Rajakkamangalamthurai in Kanniyakumari District sanctioned under BOOT system. The works at Muttom Fishing Harbour have been completed and put into use.
- Fishing harbour at Mookaiyur in Ramanathapuram District is to be constructed under Centrally Shared Scheme at an approximate cost of Rs.113.90 crore. The draft Detailed Project Report has been approved by the Technical Advisory Committee. State Level CRZ clearance was obtained for this project and National Level CRZ clearance by Government of India is awaited. On receipt of the same, the project will be taken up.
- Renovation of Fish landing centre at Jegathapattinam in Pudukkottai District and Mudasalodai in Cuddalore District at a cost of Rs. 78.93 lakh has been completed with the financial assistance from NFDB and expansion of Fish landing centre at Mudasalodai in Cuddalore District at a cost of Rs.7.78 crore has been taken up. All the works were completed and put into use.
- Under NABARD – RIDF XVIII assistance construction of Fish Landing Centres at 11 places along the Tamil Nadu coast at a cost of Rs. 62.95 crore and construction of fish seed farms at 12 places at a cost of Rs.37.05 crore has been taken up. The construction of 11 fish landing centre works was completed and put into use. All works of 11 out of 12 Government fish seed rearing centre were completed. The works for remaining 1 fish seed farm is in progress.
- To help traditional fishermen, Solar Hybrid Guide lights have been installed at 10 places at a cost of Rs. 1.03 crore.
- Modernisation of Fishing Harbour at Nagapattinam and Pazhayar, Fish Landing Centres at Annankovil and Nagore along with stabilization of two bar mouths at Vellar in Cuddalore and Uppanar in Nagapattinam have been taken up at a revised cost of Rs.132.35 crore under ETRP scheme. All the works completed and put into use except Nagapattinam Fishing Harbour which is in progress.
- Under National Agriculture Development Programme (NADP) Rs. 50 lakh was disbursed for establishing 10 Fish Seed Production Centres under 50% subsidy and the seed production has been started.
- A sum of Rs. 107.11 lakh has been sanctioned for the purchase of 38 FRP boats for conservancy of Reservoirs and the boats have been purchased and put into use.
- Rs. 84.97 lakh has been released to FITT for purchase of FRP Boats to provide training on Tuna long line fishing under NADP 2011-2012. Construction of 3 FRP boats was completed. Two boats were handed over to the Assistant Directors of Fisheries, Thoothukudi & one boat to the Assistant Director of Fisheries Kanniyakumari and are put into use.
- Rs. 334 lakh has been released to FITT for cage culture of fish at Poondi.

- Under NADP, the project on Integrated Model for Coastal Aquaculture at Parangipettai at a cost of Rs. 135.26 lakh has been completed and fish culture and training are in progress.
- 1,300 marine fishermen undergone Capacity Building – Training through exposure visit to other States at a cost of Rs. 85.85 lakh.
- In the year 2012-2013, an amount of Rs. 20.81 crore was sanctioned under National Agriculture Development Programme (NADP) for schemes such as renovation of Government fish seed farms, Capacity building of staff, squid jigging and modernization of Fish Retail Outlets. The schemes have been completed.
- In the year 2013-2014, an amount of Rs.4.66 crore was sanctioned under NADP for schemes such as fish culture in Multipurpose Farm Ponds, Augmenting fish production and shrimp production with improved technology, Improving fishing efficiency and hygienic fish handling equipment. In the year 2013 - 2014, 3,687 multipurpose farm ponds were stocked with 20.33 lakh fish seeds, for which 50% subsidy was provided for inputs such as fish seed, feed, manure and harvesting expenses. So far, 441.066 tonnes of fish has been harvested.
- During the year 2014-2015, under NADP, Rs. 113.54 lakh was sanctioned for the implementation of Multipurpose Farm Ponds Project. Until December 2015, 936 multipurpose farm ponds covering an area of 54.26 hectare were stocked with 6.88 lakh fish seeds, for which 50% input subsidy was provided. So far, 240.80 ton fishes were harvested.
- During the year 2014-2015 under NFDB financial assistance, a sum of Rs.25.38 lakh was sanctioned for the “Introduction of Tilapia culture in farm ponds” for which Rs.13.38 lakh has been released as first installment. Until December 2015, 1.87 lakh fast growing short seasonal GIFT seeds were stocked in 500 farm ponds and harvested 66.71 tones. Rs. 12 lakh has been released as 2nd installment and stocking of another 500 farm ponds are in progress.
- The Tamil Nadu Fisheries Development Corporation has established a Fish Dressing Centre at Nagapattinam with a financial assistance of Rs. 1 crore from National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB). As per Government orders this facility has been transferred to Tamil Nadu Fisheries University for imparting training on value added fishery products to fisherwomen.
- Upgradation of infrastructural facilities at a cost of Rs.12.05 crore in Thoothukudi Fishing Harbour with financial assistance from National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB) is nearing completion.
- Under TN IAMWARM project, an amount of Rs. 15.63 crore was sanctioned for 40 sub basins covering 14 Districts towards implementation of various inland fisheries schemes for the year 2011 -2012 to 2014 -2015 and Rs. 10.60 crore was utilized for the four years and the works have been completed. 109 earthen fish seed banks were established in the farmers field 35 modern fish kiosk, 4 fish seed production center Nile Tilapia and Amur carp breeding centre were established under this project.

- In the year 2012-2013 Rs. 9.58 crore was sanctioned under NADP - NMPS for Cage culture and to establish integrated aquaculture unit. Fish culture is in progress. In the year 2013 - 2014, a sum of Rs. 5.05 crore was sanctioned for Integrated Aquaculture Unit at Thanjavur and Thiruvavur under which subsidy has been released to fish farmers for fish culture, fish seed rearing and other works in progress.
- A record production of 35.28 crore early fry was produced in Government seed production centres during 2014-2015. During 2015-2016, 39.64 crore early fry was produced till December 2015, which surpassed all previous records.
- In the year 2013-2014, under NABARD RIDF XIX, improvements and additional facilities to Chennai Fishing Harbour at a cost of Rs. 75 crore was sanctioned. The works have been completed.
- In the year 2013-2014, under NABARD RIDF XIX, Stabilization of Vettar barmouth in Nagapattinam District at a cost of Rs. 11 crore and Vellar Barmouth in Cuddalore District at a cost of Rs. 20.20 crore were sanctioned. Both works have been completed.
- The Government sanctioned a sum of Rs. 2 crore to conduct model studies and preparation of Detailed Project Report for the construction of Fishing Harbours at i)Tharangambadi ii)Arcottuthurai iii)Jegathapattinam iv) Rameswaram. Model study and preparation of DPR for Tharangambadi Fishing harbour has commenced and is in progress. Other three works are taken up under CDRRP assisted by World Bank at a cost of Rs. 10 crore, for which Expression of Interest (EOI) called for.
- Under NFDB, to enhance the fishery productivity of reservoirs, Rs.69.26 lakh advanced fingerlings were stocked at a cost of Rs.79.04 lakh during 2011-2012 and in the year 2012-2013 fingerlings were stocked at a cost of Rs.25.87 lakh. Fresh water fish seed production centre was established at Mettur and Thirukampuliur at an estimated cost of Rs.25.20 lakh. Trout Hatchery Centre at Avalanchi, Nilgiri District was renovated at the cost of Rs.30 lakh.
- The Government of Tamil Nadu has taken a decision to lease out all the 53 reservoirs under the control of Fisheries Department to increase the fish production. So far, 33 reservoirs have been leased out and a total amount of Rs. 17.56 crore has been collected as lease amount. Action has been taken to lease out the fishery rights of remaining reservoirs during the year 2015-2016.
- Under NFDB 2013-2014, a sum of Rs.7 lakh was sanctioned for giving training to the Multipurpose Farm. The training has been completed.
- Under Western Ghats Development programme, a sum of Rs.70.13 lakh was sanctioned for development of infrastructural facilities in the Government fish farms at Pechiparai and Chittar during the year 2012-2013. During the year 2013-2014. Under WGDP input subsidy of Rs.2 lakh was released to the farmers of Virudunagar District for fish culture in irrigational tanks.

- Rs.66.66 lakh has been sanctioned as subsidy under Freshwater Fish farmers Development Agency during the year 2012 -2013.
- During 2011-2012, Rs.3.33 crore was sanctioned as subsidy to the shrimp farmers under Brackish water Fish farmers Development Agency. Out of this subsidy, Rs.77.33 lakh has been released to 77 Brackish water Fish farmers covering 118 ha. in Nagapattinam, Thiruvarur, Thanjavur and Ramanathapuram Districts.
- Government has sanctioned 19 vehicles (Jeeps) at a cost of Rs. 1.14 crore to the Department to implement welfare schemes efficiently. The vehicles have been procured and given to various subordinate offices.
- TNFDC has been operating 21 mobile fish retail outlets at a cost of Rs. 1.83 crore under National Agriculture Development Programme and National Fisheries Development Board assistance. The modern fish stalls of TNFDC are equipped with additional hygienic fish handling equipment at a cost of Rs. 7.70 lakh under NADP Scheme.
- During the year 2014-2015, 5 more mobile fish retail outlets at an estimated cost of Rs.50 lakh were introduced.
- Four modern fish retail outlets at an estimated cost of Rs.40 lakh in various places of Tamil Nadu including Chennai and Madurai have been sanctioned and work is in progress.
- Rs.70 lakh has been sanctioned to establish Inland Fish landing centre at Bhavanisagar and work is in progress.
- An additional office building has been proposed at Santhome, Chennai at a cost of Rs.250 lakh for TNFDC Ltd. and construction works will be commenced shortly.
- The TNFDC Ltd., has proposed to modernize the existing wholesale fish market at Ukkadam, Coimbatore with modern facilities such as cold storage, ice plant, waste disposal system etc., at a total cost of Rs.3.24 crore by availing financial assistance of Rs.2.25 crore from National Fisheries Development Board, Hyderabad and a sum of Rs.0.99 crore as financial assistance from Coimbatore Municipal Corporation. The construction works have been carried out by the Municipal Corporation, Coimbatore. The market is being operated by the Tamil Nadu Fisheries Development Corporation Ltd., from 01.03.2015.
- In order to improve the fish sales, the Tamil Nadu Fisheries Development Corporation has established a modern fish handling centre at a cost of Rs.70 lakh at Kurichi in Coimbatore District and has got 4 Mahindra Bolero Pick Up trucks at a cost of Rs 26.8 lakh under 40% financial assistance of NFDB to transport the fish catch from reservoirs to fish stalls hygienically.
- This Government has provided appointment on compassionate grounds for 8 persons after 19 years in TNFDC. The TNFDC staff were provided promotion after a gap of 20 years. Rs.50 lakh has been given as contribution to the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund.
- Rs.44.55 lakh has been paid to the State Government by the TNFDC as maiden dividend for the year 2012 - 2013 and Rs.1.44 crore has been paid to Government as dividend for the year 2013-2014.

- A Modern Fish Retail Outlet and Fish Restaurant at Vanianchavadi in Kancheepuram District at a cost of Rs.89.08 lakh under the financial assistance of NADP.
- Under NADP scheme, a sum of Rs.30.75 lakh has been sanctioned to TAFCOFED for capacity building by imparting Extension Education and exposure visit to other States for 20 marine Fisherwomen and to strengthen marketing Infrastructure. Two Mobile Fish Retail Vehicles have also been given to the each beneficiary group. A Modern Fish Kiosk has been established at Vaiyavoor village in Kacheepuram District.
- The election for selecting the office bearers of TAFCOFED was held on 03.07.2013 and 17 members were elected.
- The diesel bunks were opened in Jeagathapattinam to provide sales tax exempted diesel to fishermen for benefitting 146 mechanised fishing boats and 80 country crafts.
- One modern fish retail outlet at Ariyalur has been started and it is running on successfully.
- Under NFDB 40% subsidy scheme basis, 3 Mahindra Bolero pickup vehicles to the tune of Rs.16.21 lakh has been purchased by TAFCOFED, in fulfillment of coastal fish marketing activities through Fishermen co-operative societies.
- TAFCOFED is conducting training programme on Training/ skill development to marine fisherwomen on “Solar Lantern Fabrication and servicing” to 260 fisherwomen beneficiaries in 13 costal Districts with a financial sanction of Rs.5.42 lakh from National Fisheries Development Board(NFDB).
- TAFCOFED is conducting Training programme on Basics of Seamanship and Navigation, Electronic equipments and Maintenance Marine of Engine” to deep sea going fishermen of Tamil Nadu with financial assistance from NFDB. 80 deep sea going fishermen from Kanniyakumari District have been trained. 1,000 fishermen in 40 batches will be trained under this programme and certificates will be issued.
- In the Fisheries Department, 444 posts have been filled up under various categories up to date since 2011-2012.
- To establish a world class Oceanarium in Mamallapuram on PPP basis, Government has sanctioned an amount of Rs.2.5 crore towards consultancy and advertisement charges. The TNIDB has provided approval for the Detailed Concept Report and Request for Qualification (RFQ). Tenders floated, two firms were qualified in RFQ tender. After obtaining approval of Draft Concession Agreement (DCA) from TNIDB Request for Proposal (RFP) will be issued to the qualified bidders in order to finalize the successful developer.
- Government has sanctioned an amount of Rs. 42 crore to redevelop the Chetpet lake into Sports Fishing cum Eco Park. Hon’ble Chief Minister laid Foundation stone on 27.06.2014. The Government released Rs.22 crore in 2013-2014 for the first phase and Rs.12.50 crore for the year 2015-2016. Works are nearing completion.

- In the year 2013-2014, the Government accorded administrative sanction for a sum of Rs. 40 lakh towards Consultancy fee for the preparation of TEFR and conduct of Model Studies for Permanent stability for Barmouth with groynes at Pulicat Lake in Thiruvallur District. Model studies have been completed by IIT, Madras. Preparation of EIA report is under process.
- In the year 2014-2015, with financial assistance from World Bank, the Government intends to modernize Mallipattinam Fishing harbour in Thanjavur District at a cost of Rs. 60 crore and to stabilize the Barmouth at Punnakayal in Thoothukudi District at a cost of Rs. 18 crore. Detailed project report is prepared. For Punnakayal barmouth work, CRZ clearance and SEIAA – TN Environment clearance obtained. Tendering works are in progress. EIA studies are in progress for mallipattinam fishing harbor.
- In the year 2014-2015, Government accorded Rs. 10 crore under CDRRP assisted by World Bank to conduct feasibility studies for the construction of fishing harbours at 1) Jegathapattinam 2) Arcotuthurai 3) Rameswaram 4) Eneyamputhanthurai, for which Expression of Interest (EOI) called for.
- In the year 2014-2015, the Government accorded administrative sanction for RS.79.40 crore under NABARD – RIDF XX, for the works of 9 Fish landing centre / Beach landing centre and 4 Fish seed farms. Agencies have been fixed and works are in progress.
- In the year 2014-2015, the Government accorded sanction to construct integrated Administrative office buildings for Fisheries Department at Ramanathapuram and Nagapattinam at a cost of Rs. 3.60 crore. Agencies have been fixed and works are in progress.
- In the year 2014-2015, the Government sanctioned an amount of Rs.67 lakh, to construct new office building at Royapuram in Chennai, Kodaikkanal in Dindigul District and Thoothukudi. Works completed at Chennai and Thoothukudi.
- In the year 2015 - 2016, Government accorded Administrative sanction for Rs. 68.30 crore under NABARD – RIDF XXI for the works of 5 fish landing centers, 10 fish farms and shore protecting along the coastal stretch of Kovalam in kancheepuram District. Tenders called for.
- The Government has accorded administrative approval and financial sanction to conduct model study and Techno Economic Feasibility Report at an estimate cost of Rs. 4 crore for the construction of Tuna Fishing Harbour at Ennore in Thiruvallur District, new Fishing harbor at Vellapallam in Nagapattinam District and Renovation of existing Fishing harbor at Cuddalore Mudunagar in Cuddalore District. Consultancy appointed and studies are in progress.
- To ensure the safety and security of the fishermen and to disseminate information about weather warnings, action is being taken to provide seamless communication network to all fishing crafts operating in the coastal District of Tamil Nadu at an estimated cost

of Rs.52 crore under World Bank financial assistance.

- For implementing the recommendations of the FTMSUL-I by co management in fisheries management, development of strategies for enhancing and diversifying fishermen livelihoods and enhancement of knowledge management, an amount of Rs. 49 crore has also been sanctioned by the World Bank project. Works are in progress.
- Under NFDB funding assistance, an amount of Rs.1.06 crore has been received as 1st installment in the sanctioned amount of Rs.2.13 crore towards creating employment opportunities to rural women. From this, an amount of Rs. 67.91 lakh has been released as 1st installment subsidy to 250 beneficiaries in various Districts of Tamil Nadu.

- Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi and other Extension Centre of this University, the Government have allotted a sum of Rs. 12.62 crore for the year 2015 – 2016 and a sum of Rs. 3.15 crore each has been released as third installment during this year. During the academic year 2015-2016 40 students for B.F.Sc programme 22 students for M.F.Sc programme and 11 students for Ph.D programme were admitted in this Institute.
- The Tamil Nadu Fisheries University is offering post-graduate course on fish quality assurance and management at the Fisheries Development and Research Institute, Thoothukudi. A high level delegation led by Vice-president Prof.Zhu Jianzhen from the Guangdong Ocean University, China visited the Tamil Nadu Fisheries University campus, Thoothuudi on October 15 and 16, 2014 and held discussions with the Vice-Chancellor and other officials of the TNFU to have academic and research cooperation between Guangdong Ocean University and the Tamil Nadu Fisheries University, Thoothukudi.
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University organized a Research cum Extension seminar on 13.09.2013 at Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi with the mandate to develop it' vision plan.
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University conducted farm radio school with AIR Chennai, Trichy and Tirunelveli on ornamental fish farming, BMP in Vannamei culture and Freshwater Fish Farming practices.

- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University organized Fish Farmers Meet for the benefit of low saline water farm pond farmers on profitable vannmei culture at Thanjavur on the 14.11.2014, Mannarkudi of Thiruvarur District on 20.11.2014, Thalaignayiru on 07.11.2014 and Sirkazhi at Nagapattinam District on 18.12.2014.
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister inaugurated on 28.05.2015 Tilapia Research Centre (10 acre) under National Agricultural Development Programme at the cost of Rs. 121.04 lakh at Barur, Krishnagiri District and the hatchery construction works are in progress.
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister inaugurated on 28.05.2015 Shrimp Brood Bank under National Agricultural Development Programme at the cost of Rs.198.91 lakh at Ganapathipuram, Kanniyakumari District. (7.5 acre).

- Offered three months programme on Freshwater Fish Farming technologies and ornamental fish culture for 10 fish farmers at Fisheries College and Research Institute, Ponneri, Thiruvallur District.
- Offered one month course on skill development programme on shrimp farming assistant and seaweed production for 9 fishermen at Department of Coastal Aquaculture, Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi.
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University received 31 externally funded research programmes to the tune of Rs. 22.86 crore during 2015-2016.
- The Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi functioning under the Tamil Nadu Fisheries University has started Fish Quality Control and Assurance Certificate Centre at the Fish Quality and Management Department with the financial assistance of Rs 20 lakhs from the Tamil Nadu Government.
- The Tamil Nadu Fisheries University, Thoothukudi has set up a genetically protected ornamental fish breeding bank at Fish Development Research and Extension Centre, Madhavaram, Chennai at a cost of Rs 25 lakh with the assistance of National Fisheries Development Board.

Department of Fish Quality Assurance and Management in the Fish Quality Assurance and Management Institute at Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi under the NADP funding at a cost of Rs. 101 lakh.

- With the funding of Rs.111 lakh from the National Fisheries Development Board the Tamil Nadu Fisheries University, Thoothukudi developed breeding strategies and innovative farming protocols for high value ornamental fishes.
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University established a Marine Engine and Sea Safety Training Centre for the fisherfolk at the Department of Fishing Technology and Fisheries Engineering, Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi under NADP funding at a cost of Rs.2 crore.
- The Hon'ble Minister for Animal Welfare released 4 new technologies at the Fisheries Week celebrations organized by the Tamil Nadu Veterinary Sciences and Research University Centre at Kattupakkam on 19.01.2013 . These technologies include value assessment after assessing the chlorofenical sediment fish macroni, value added fish fingers and hot and cold fish mixture.
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University has given on-campus and Off Campus Training on various fisheries technologies through Fisheries Colleges, Research centre and Extension centre to 9,749 fish farmers.
- 32 types of handbooks on training / pamphlets / files were prepared and distributed to fish farmers. eom
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University published 67 research papers and 23 popular articles in National and International journals for the benefits of students and researchers working in the field of fisheries.
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University organized Technical awareness programmes such as Culture of live bearers, hygienic production of dry fishes, hygienic maintenance of fishing harbours and Landing Centers and 405 Marine Fishermens have benefited from these programmes.
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University has conducted the On-Campus and OFF-Campus training programme on Tilapia culture and Composite fish culture to 102 freshwater Fish Farmers.
- Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi has conducted On-Campus Training Programme on Biodiversity and Conservation of Marine Organisms to 34 Fisheries Officials from Tamil Nadu Fisheries Department.
- Tamil Nadu Fisheries University has given advisory services to 4,105 fish farmers and fisherfolk on freshwater fish culture, ornamental fish culture, fish and shrimp farm, water quality management, value addition, waste utilization, and quality and safety of fish products.
- Establishment of Aquatic Rainbow Technology Park is under progress in Madhavaram at a cost of Rs.10.30 crore. The park will be beneficial to the ornamental fish farmers, entrepreneurs and exporters of Tamil Nadu.

- Pillows to 1,304 Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, Denotified Communities, Minority Hostels at a cost of Rs.162.13 lakh have been supplied.
- Construction of compound wall in 15 Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes,

Denotified Community girls hostels at a cost of Rs.141.41 lakh.

- Steel book shelves to 67 Most Backward Classes, Denotified Community college hostels at a cost of Rs.7.91 lakh have been supplied.
- Computers and Accessories to 15 Kallar Reclamation Higher Secondary Schools at a cost of Rs.24 lakh have been provided.
- Introduction of smart class rooms in 15 Kallar Reclamation Higher Secondary Schools at a cost of Rs.75.75 lakh.

COMMERCIAL TAXES & REGISTRATION DEPARTMENT

Transparent Tax Administration for well developed Tamil Nadu



Commercial Tax Revenue mobilization

- The Department mobilized its share of tax revenue of Rs.56,852 crore during 2013-2014. By ensuring Commercial Tax compliance, it registered a growth of 18.73% over the previous year in overall revenue collections despite a general slowdown in the Indian economy.

Revenue mobilization during 2014-2015

- The Department has mobilized its share of revenue of Rs.60,314.61 crore during 2014-2015. The Department has registered a growth of 6.09% over the previous year in respect of overall Commercial Tax revenue collections. This growth has been achieved despite a general slowdown in the Indian economy and reduction in prices of Petroleum products.
- The Department achieved revenue collection of Rs.60,314.61 crore in the period up to March 2015. In the current year, amidst lesser

growth in the major industries like cement and automobiles and continuous reduction in prices on petro fuels, overall growth rate of 6.09% has been recorded for the said period when compared to the corresponding period in 2013-2014.

- The Department has achieved revenue collection of Rs.39,533.50 crore during the year 2015-2016 (upto November 2015), amidst lesser growth in the major industries like cement and automobiles and continuous reduction in price on petro fuels consequent to price reduction on crude petroleum globally. Overall growth rate of 2.26% (upto November 2015) has been recorded, when compared to the corresponding period during the previous year 2014-2015, despite a steep fall in crude petroleum in the global market. The State has managed this without increasing tax rates on petroleum products, unlike most of other States.

Revenue Trend

- The Department has achieved revenue collection of Rs.44281.77 crore during the year 2015-2016 (upto December 2015), with a growth rate of 1.76% (upto December 2015).

Ratio of Gross Commercial Taxes Revenue to the GSDP

- The Net Commercial Taxes to GSDP ratio has steadily moved up from 5.21% in 2010-2011 to 6.52% in 2013-2014. This indicates steady improvement in efficiency in mopping up of taxes. The State Tax to GSDP ratio stood at 10.07% in 2013-2014.

Trend in Revenue Collection

- The department has been able to maintain a healthy growth in collection of revenue through better monitoring and strict enforcement to deter tax evasion, despite a general slowdown in the Indian economy. Revenue collection by the department under all the Acts over the past four years was Rs. 2,79,995 crore.

Cost of Tax Administration:

- The tax administration of the Department is highly cost effective as revealed from the details of revenue receipts and cost incurred for the Commercial Taxes Department.

Infrastructure Development:

- Modernization of Check-posts—Budgetary allocation of Rs.33.36 crore was made during 2011-2012, for Modernization of 28 Check-posts and 8 Checkpoints with the object of improving the infrastructure and operational facilities such as building with adequate space, adequate manpower, uninterrupted power supply and network connectivity, is

undertaken with necessary acquisition of land and construction of building.

Construction of New Building:

- During 2011-2012, construction of own buildings in 15 locations for housing 42 offices located in rented buildings were undertaken and completed at the cost of Rs.23.01 crore. During 2012-2013, the Government have sanctioned Rs.11.18 crore for construction of own buildings in 10 places for housing 16 offices, namely, Ranipet, Virudhachalam, Kallakurichi, Ginjee, Harur, Ariyalur, Tiruppur, Ambasamudhram, Nanguneri and Tiruchendur. During 2013-2014, sanction was accorded to a tune of Rs.10.93 crore for construction of new buildings with Solar Roof tops for housing Commercial Taxes Offices at 7 locations namely, Valvatsagostham, Devakottai, Chidambaram, Arcot and construction of Commercial Taxes Staff Training Institute at Coimbatore, Tirunelveli and Vellore. Out of which, construction work was completed in Arcot and Commercial Taxes Staff Training Institute at Tirunelveli. Rest of the buildings are under various stages of construction. During 2014-2015, action is being taken for the Construction of two Commercial Taxes Complex for housing 86 Offices in South and North Chennai at an estimated cost of Rs.78.22 crore respectively and setting up of Integrated Check Post comprising of Police, Transport, Revenue, Commercial Taxes, Civil Supplies and Excise Departments at Chennapalli, near Hosur at an estimated cost of Rs.120 crore and Modernisation of the Office of the Principal Secretary/ Commissioner of Commercial Taxes, Ezhilagam, Chepauk, Chennai at an estimated cost of Rs.1.38 crore.

- Rs.245.26 crore has been allotted for construction of own buildings for 151 Commercial Tax offices located in rented buildings, for integrated buildings, and setting up integrated check post in Hosur and providing additional facilities at the Commercial Tax Commissioner's office in Chennai.
- 16 vehicles at a cost of Rs. 86.91 lakh provided for efficient tax collection.

Total Computerization Project

- End to End Computerization Project of CT Department has been envisaged at a cost of Rs.230.96 crore, during 2011-2012. Necessary Software development, hardware supply and maintenance completed and rolled out from 29.01.2016.
- Redundant Network Connectivity in all Commercial Tax Offices was made during 2011-2012 at the expense of Rs.3.58 crore.

Re-organization

- Re-organization of Chennai Divisions has been made with effect from 01.08.2014 with an object of equal distribution of workload. Similarly, steps were taken to connect Department Actions through Internet from 01.09.2014.

Human Resources Development

- In 2011-2012, 1,325 vacant posts in various cadres were filled up by candidates selected through Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission.
- Out of 4,500 temporary posts existed for many years, more than 3,375 posts were made permanent.
- Appointment orders on compassionate grounds for 61 heirs of department employees who died while in service.

- Additional fund of Rs.10 lakh has been allocated for every year to impart Training to Commercial Taxes personnel.

VAT Exemption

- Tax on LPG for domestic use is totally exempted in the State benefiting 18.86 crore families.
- Agricultural implements and inputs exempted from VAT at a cost of Rs. 87 crore per annum.
- Wheat, oats, handmade locks, insulin, helmet and feeding bottles & nipples have been completely exempt from VAT from 01.04.2012.
- Battery operated Motorised Retrofitted Scooters for the use of differently abled persons is exempt from VAT.
- The threshold for payment of luxury tax for accommodation in hotels increased from Rs.119/- to Rs.499/- from.
- Fishing accessories like fishing ropes, fishing floats, fishnet twine, fishing lamps and fishing swivels were exempted from the present levy of VAT from 01.04.2015.
- Mosquito nets of all kinds exempted from levy of VAT from 01.04.2015.
- Works contract relating to sizing of yarn was exempted from the present levy of VAT.

Reduction in Rate of Tax

- VAT was reduced from 14.5% to 5% on Electrically Operated Two Wheelers (e-Bikes), Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFL) & Compact Fluorescent Tubes, Splints & Veneers and Sanitary Napkins and Diapers from 01.04.2012. VAT was reduced from 14.5% to 5% on Gensets on par with Generators from 07.12.2012.

- Registered dealers opting for compounding rate of payment were made liable to pay tax at the scheduled rates, only when the turnover of taxable goods exceeded the threshold of Rs.50 lakh.
- The small dealers who fall short of the general threshold of turnover were also enabled to avail the input tax credit, before giving up the tax collected by them to the Government.
- Deemed assessment procedure brought in to effect from 2011-2012 onwards and all such assessments shall be deemed to have been completed as on 31st October of that year, provided the returns filed are correct and complete.
- VAT on cardamom was reduced from levy of 5 % to 2% from 01.04.2015.
- VAT on LED lamps of all kinds was reduced from levy of 14.5 % to 5% with effect from 01.04.2015 to encourage the use of energy saving devices.
- VAT on air compressors, pump set up to 10 hp and their parts thereof was reduced from 14.5% to 5% from 01.04.2015 to encourage the MSME Sector and to benefit agriculturists in the State.
- VAT on cellular telephones (mobile phones) was reduced from 14.5% to 5% from 01.04.2015.
- The threshold limit for payment of Luxury tax increased from Rs.199/- to Rs.499/-.

Samadhan Scheme

- Samadhan scheme was introduced and was in force from 01.11.2011 to 30.04.2012, for settlement of arrears pertaining to assessment. 3,979 applications have been

received and an amount of Rs.100.32 crore was collected upto 30.04.2012.

Taxation Awareness Campaigns

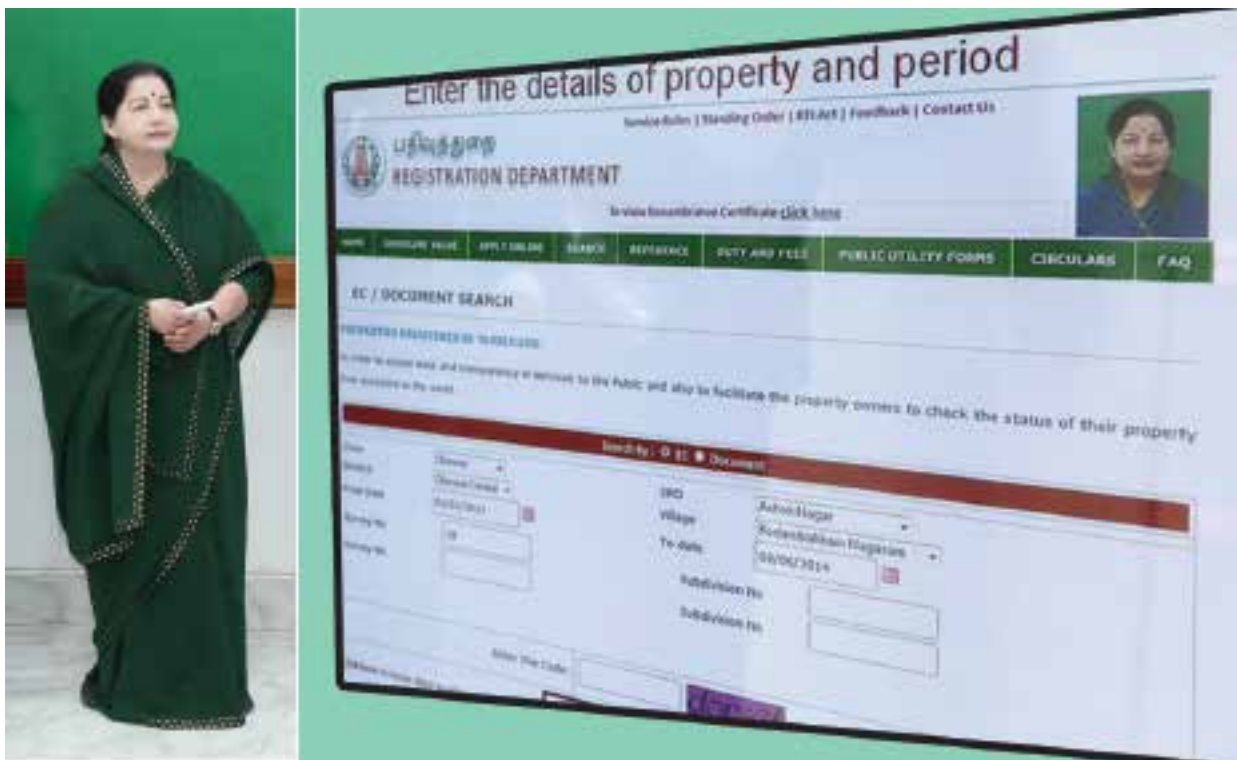
- During 2013-2014, an amount of Rs.20 lakh has been ordered to be allocated for every year, for conducting Taxation Awareness Campaigns at the Divisions level. Accordingly, awareness campaigns are organized twice in a year in every division.

Adherence of Grievance Day

- Grievance day is being adhered on every Monday by the Joint Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners of this Department, to receive and redress the grievances of the trading public.

Traders Welfare

- During 2011-2012, the life membership fee was reduced from Rs.500/- to Rs.100/- so as to enable the small dealers to enroll in the Traders' Welfare Board.
- The corpus fund of Rs.2 crore was enhanced to Rs.5 crore to Traders' Welfare Board.
- During every year, prior to preparation of budget, a pre-budget meeting is convened by this Department, with the Representatives of Trade and Industry Associations and Chambers of Commerce and Industry, to decide the policy matters regarding the taxation changes necessitated either to benefit the trade and industry either with exemption or reduction in rates of tax and to redress the procedural hardships to the traders.
- Commercial Taxes to interact with traders and industries associations for finding solutions to day to day issues concerning industries and trade.



REGISTRATION DEPARTMENT REVENUE

- In the financial year 2013-2014, 26,53,291 documents were registered and Rs.8,055.74 crore was collected; an 8.05% increase in revenue compared to the previous year.
- In the financial year 2014-2015, 25,73,931 documents were registered and Rs.8,279.64 crore was collected; an 2.78% increase in revenue compared to the previous year.
- Stamp duty on registration of sale deeds was reduced from 6% to 5% from 01.04.2012.
- Ceiling limit for availing stamp duty and Registration fee exemption was increased from Rs. 5,000/- to Rs. 25,000/-.

REVISION OF GUIDELINE VALUE

- To weed out anomalies and reflect true market value, Guideline value was rationalized in 2012.

- Stamp Act was amended making registration of Construction agreement compulsory from 01.10.2013. Stamp duty of 1% is levied.
- To facilitate easy approach by the public, the Power to Adjudicate Instruments of Power of Attorney was granted to Sub-Registrars.
- To ensure speedy disposal so as to benefit the public, power to refund was delegated to District Registrars also.
- To provide relief to registrants, an upper cap of Rs.4,000/- for registration fee on release on mortgage has been fixed.

REGISTRATION TRAINING INSTITUTE (RTI)

- In the financial year 2015-2016 upto December 18,82,354 documents have been registered and Rs.6,294.42 crore have been collected.
- Hon'ble Chief Minister had announced issue of certified copies free of cost for

documents of land transaction lost in the recent floods. Commercial Taxes and Registration Department issued, thereby providing exemption from payment of stamp duty and registration fee of the Registration Act respectively. Subsequent, to the special camps, which were conducted from 14.12.2015 to 28.12.2015 thousands of Certified copies of documents were prepared and given to the applicants.

- To improve the existing training facilities Rs.30 lakh as annual grant was sanctioned on 04.10.2013.
- Soft skills, leadership qualities, Public relations, life coping skills, better communication and the like have been incorporated in the revised training.
- Hostel facility for trainees has been provided at a cost of Rs.49 lakh. Appointment orders on compassionate grounds for 17 heirs of department employees who died while in service.

Infrastructure

- 23 Bolero Jeeps at a cost of Rs. 1.22 crore for high rank officers in the Department.
- To ensure Uninterrupted Registration through bio-metric systems and web-camera, Government has sanctioned Generators to all Sub-Registrar offices. As of now 150 generators have been put into operation. Sanction for procurement of 150 more generators was made in the financial year 2013-2014 and an amount of Rs.4.82 crore was sanctioned.
- 627 Digital Signature Certificates were issued to Officers at a cost of Rs. 3.50 lakh.

Buildings

- Government announced it will build own buildings for all Sub-Registrar offices in the ensuing 5 years.
- Rs.126.52 crore was sanctioned to construct 160 Sub Registrar offices, 25 Integrated complexes housing 50 Sub Registrar Offices and 116 Sub Registrar offices and 16 integrated registration offices including 29 sub-registrars offices were inaugurated.

Fire extinguishers

- As a fire safety measure, equipment like fire extinguishers, buckets, fire detectors and aluminum ladders were provided to all Sub-Registrar Offices at a cost of Rs.4.78 crore.

Computerization

- Viewing of Encumbrance Certificates online has been introduced by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 11.06.2014.
- Payment of Stamp duty and Registration fees through Banks is being introduced.
- Scheme has been approved by the Government to convert old files into micro fiche and to micro film documents that are registered daily. The scheme approximately cost Rs. 143 crore.

Web enabled and ERP based

Computerization:

- ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) based end-to-end computerization has been proposed.
- In order to provide speedy and transparent service to the Registrant public, the Government has sanctioned Rs. 176.44 crore for web based software.



- It is to be implemented through System Integrator and includes outsourcing of certain functions of the department. More secured and transparent property registration, Online generation of Deeds, Multiple modes of payment, Multiple modes of application submission, Timely and online service delivery, Provision to link revenue database for title verification, Easier tracking of grievances online as well as offline.

e-Visit

- Registrants can fix online appointment with Registrars of respective Sub-Registrar Offices for registration of Documents/ Marriages. This system was introduced by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 06.11.2013.
- This procedure will reduce overcrowding in the offices and the public can avoid long hours of waiting in the office.

Biometric system and Web camera

- To curb impersonation and fraudulent registrations, adoption of biometric system

and web cameras to take fingerprints and photographs of registrants has been implemented in all Sub-Registrar offices with effect from 01.11.2013.

IP Camera

- I.P. cameras installed in all Sub-Registrar offices and started functioning from 06.11.2013 to arrest fraudulent registrations.
- Remote monitoring of the activities of the registration offices in order to make registration process and functioning of the Sub-Registrars transparent.
- The recorded video of the registration process is given to the registrant as proof of the registration process.

Collection of payment through banks

- Online / Offline Payment of Stamp duty and Registration fees through Indian Bank, Indian Overseas Bank, Canara Bank, Punjab National Bank, Bank of Baroda, State Bank of India has been implemented.

CO-OPERATION

Services towards Agricultural Revolution

- To increase agricultural production, Rs.22,058.61 crore was given as crop loan to 48,89,855 farmers.
- Government grants 7% interest incentive to farmers who repay their crop loan dues promptly and reimburses the interest to the Co-operative institutions. Rs.589.58 crore has been issued after waiving interest.
- 25 solar copra dryers at a cost of Rs.1.47 crore have been established for the benefit of

coconut growing farmers to convert coconut into quality copra in a short time.

- To offset the shortage of manpower in farming operations, Agro Service Centres formed in 2,104 Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies at a cost of Rs.80.44 crore with a subsidy of Rs.25.59 crore. They are equipped with agricultural implements and farm equipment like paddy transplanters, harvesters, threshers, mini tractors, tractors, power tillers and agricultural appliances for custom hiring.
- To ensure hassle-free sale of DAP to farmers through the co-operative outlets in the State, interest-free loan to the Tamil Nadu Co-operative Marketing Federation has been enhanced from Rs.130.50 crore to Rs.150 crore.
- A seed processing machine at a cost of Rs.19.13 lakh to process 20 metric tonnes of seed per day has been installed in Thudiyalur co-operative Agriculture Service Society to sell quality seeds to the farmers.
- Investment credit for agriculture and allied activities, to the tune of Rs.1,328.70 crore has been disbursed to 2.88 lakh farmers.
- Agricultural produce worth Rs.3,786.41 crore has been marketed through Agriculture Producers Co-operative Marketing Societies in the State.

Crop Loan:

- Rs.3,079.58 crore has been disbursed to 7,98,874 SC / ST farmers as crop loan.

- Rs.3,822.44 crore has been disbursed to 8,88,239 new members as crop loan.

- To uplift the economic development of small and marginal farmers, Rs.13,380.32 crore has been given as crop loan to 30,91,279 farmers.

Welfare of Differently-abled persons

- Interest-free loan of Rs.107.31 crore has been given to 30,758 differently abled persons.
- To enhance the borrowing power of differently abled persons in Primary Agricultural Credit Co-operative Societies and Urban Co-operative Banks, Rs.10 lakh share capital assistance was distributed to viz. 2,000 members at Rs.500/- each as interest free loan. A sum of Rs.75 lakh at Rs. 2,500/- each has been released to 2,000 and 1,000 differently-abled persons of Primary Agricultural co-operative Societies and Urban Co-operative Banks as share capital subsidy during 2013-2014.

Welfare of Women

- To encourage women members to attain economic sustainability, Rs.205.21 crore was given as women entrepreneur loan to 55,589 women members.
- Co-operative Banks disbursed Rs.193.25 crore as salary loans to 45,330 working women.
- An amount of Rs.2,472.17 crore has been disbursed as loan to 2,58,236 Women Self Help groups.



- Interest free Share Capital loan of Rs.10 lakh for 2,000 women members of Urban Co-operative Banks at Rs.500/- per member has been provided to enhance their borrowing power. In 2013-2014, share capital subsidy of Rs.25 lakh was given to 1,000 women members in Urban Co-operative Banks at Rs.2,500/- each. In 2014-2015, share capital subsidy of Rs.25 lakh was given to 1,000 women members in Urban Co-operative Banks at Rs.2,500/- each.
- Share Capital subsidy of Rs.20 lakh has been provided to 4,000 women members of Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies at Rs.500/- per member to enhance their borrowing power. In 2013-2014, Share Capital subsidy of Rs.5.50 crore was distributed to 22,000 women members of Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies at Rs.2,500/- per member to help Rural Women avail credit to undertake income generating activities. In 2014-2015, a share capital assistance of Rs.25 lakh as subsidy was provided.
- During 2011-2012, 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 the Government has provided interest free Share Capital loan to total 1,500 women members for Rs.15/- lakh at

Rs.1,000/- each in Primary Co-operative Agricultural Rural Development Bank.

Welfare of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes

- In 2012-2013, Share Capital subsidy of Rs.10 crore was given to 40,000 SC/ST members of Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies at Rs.2,500/- per member.
- During the year 2011-2012 to 2014-2015, interest free Share Capital loan of Rs.60 lakh to 8,000 members was given to 24,000 SC/ST members of PACCS during 2011-2012, 2012-2013 and 2013-2014.
- Interest free Share Capital loan of Rs.20 lakh was given to 4,000 SC/ST members of Urban Co-operative Bank at Rs.500/- per member from 2011 to 2015.
- In 2013-2014, share capital subsidy of Rs.2.50 crore was distributed to 10,000 SC/ST members at Rs.2,500/- each of Urban Co-operative Banks. During 2014-2015, Rs.25 lakh was given to 1,000 SC/ST members at Rs.2,500/- each for this purpose.
- The Integrated Co-operative Development Project scheme was commenced in the Nilgiris District at a total outlay of Rs.30.88 crore to improve infrastructure in co-operatives.
- In 2012-2013, 10 vehicles were distributed at a cost of Rs.94.95 lakh to 10 Co-operative Societies to function as mobile fair price shops in the hilly areas.

- In In 2013-2014, Three more vehicles at a cost of Rs.38.36 lakh were provided to function as Mobile fair price shops in tribal areas and 2 vehicles at a cost of Rs.28.46 lakh were provided to function as Mobile fair price shops in Chennai city to avoid over crowding.
- Hitherto, minor millets like Samai and Varagu cultivated by Hill Tribal people and honey and tamarind collected by them were sold without processing at a very low cost. To ensure that the tribals get the right price for their produce, the scheme of packing and marketing these produce under a common brand name was commenced. For this purpose samai processing machine at a cost of Rs.1,50,000/- was installed.
- 7,248.50 kg honey worth Rs.22,36,084/-, 39,291 kg tamarind worth Rs.28,38,300/-, 25,176.50 kg samai worth Rs.12,67,932/-, 8,669 kg varagu worth Rs.5,73,101/- were sold.
- To uplift Tribals, the Pandalur Taluk Hill Tribes LAMP Society, Kothagiri Taluk Hill Tribes LAMP Society in Nilgiris district and Silting Hill Tribes LAMP Society in Dharmapuri district were newly formed.

General Welfare

- Co-operative institutions have given Rs.1,537.07 crore as Housing loan to 66,372 customers.
- Co-operative institutions have distributed Jewel loan of Rs.1,40,520.66 crore to 3.78 crore individual members.

- Small scale industries loan and Small Road Transport operators loan (SRTOL) under Non-Farm Sector were extended to 1,97,676 individuals to the tune of Rs. 1,238 crore.
- In order to relieve petty traders and road-side vendors from the clutches of money lenders, 6,72,830 petty traders were given a loan of Rs.663.83 crore by the Co-operatives.
- Special Cash Credit Facility of Rs.50 lakh each was given during 2013-2014 to 72 weak Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies to increase their business turnover above Rs.1 crore. By this facility, 35,621 members benefited to the tune of Rs.130.61 crore. Further, during 2014-2015, special cash credit of Rs.79.90 crore was sanctioned to 67 weak Co-operative Societies at Rs.50/-lakh each benefiting 21,573 members.
- 'CORE Banking Solutions' has been implemented in the Tamil Nadu State Apex Co-operative Bank, helping its affiliates and customers more efficiently.
- The Core Banking Solution is implemented in 794 branches of 23 District Central Co-operative Banks at a cost of Rs.8.80 crore.
- Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) and National Electronic Fund Transfer Technology (NEFT) are also implemented in the Tamil Nadu State Apex Co-operative Bank for transferring funds anywhere in India benefiting its customers immensely.
- In the past four years, 407 branches of District Central Co-operative Bank (226), Urban Co-operative Banks (66), Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies (100) and Urban Co-operative Credit Societies (15) have been fully air-conditioned at a cost of Rs.45.58 crore.

Modernization of Co-operative Banks and safety measures

- All the 23 District Central Co-operative Banks in Tamil Nadu have obtained banking license from Reserve Bank of India. Tamil Nadu is the Second state in the country to achieve this feat.
- Due to the excellent performance of the co-operative banks, the deposits increased from Rs.26,247.43 crore to Rs.49,184.63 crore.
- Rs.154.62 crore has been released as Government subsidy to provide modern infrastructure facilities and better customer services. To revive 41 Co-operative Banks, a special cash credit of Rs.20.50 crore for the year 2012-2013 has been released.
- The number of Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies, having a credit turnover over Rs.1 crore has increased from 3,854 to 4,431.
- To provide additional banking services, 61 branches were opened by District Central Co-operative Banks.
- 3,972 Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies out of 4,571 are functioning with strong rooms.
- 4,571 Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies including branches were fully computerized.

- During 2012-2013, Computers were installed in 1,121 Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies at a cost of Rs.2.80 crore, Rs.25,000/- each.
- Internet facilities were made available to public through 4,364 Common Service Centres.
- Defender doors at a cost of Rs.2.13 crore in 75 Primary Agriculture Co-operative Credit Societies, strong rooms at a cost of Rs.0.48 crore in 20 Primary Agriculture Co-operative Credit Societies; and iron safe at a cost of Rs.1.83 crore have been installed in 112 Primary Agriculture Co-operative Credit Societies.
- Own buildings at a cost of Rs.24.34 crore have been constructed for 43 Branches of District Central Co-operative Banks, 16 Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies at a cost of Rs.1.65 crore.
- 38 Primary Agriculture co-operative Credit Societies have been upgraded as Urban co-operative Credit Societies.
- Initiatives are being made for installing Banana cooling and ripening plants in 6 Co-operative Societies, One plant was already opened and work started in 3 co-operative institutions. Proposals sent to Tamil Nadu Co-operative Union seeking Co-operative Research and Development Funds for the installation of units for the remaining 2 Co-operative institutions.
- In order to collect the long over due Non-Farm Sector loans issued by Primary Co-operative Agriculture and Rural Development Banks, Government have announced “One Time Settlement Scheme 2014” vide G.O.139 Co-operation Food and Consumer Protection Department (CC2) dated: 17.12.2014.
- On implementation of this scheme out of 5453 overdue members the total no. of overdue members is reduced from 5741 to 5453. Out of 5453 overdue members, 2693 have remitted 25% of the overdue amount to the tune of Rs.17.18 crore and entered into an agreement with the bank as on 26.10.2015. Further, 509 members have remitted overdue amount of Rs.8.63 crore in full and benefited to the extent of Rs.9.51 crore by way of Interest Waiver.
- Safety lockers for customers have been established in 30 Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies at a cost of Rs.0.75 crore.
- Drought relief at Rs.15,000/- per acre was given to the tune of Rs.517.98 crore to 3,48,681 farmers affected in delta areas (more than 50%) and Rs.766.60 crore to 15,96,887 farmers in non-delta areas.
- During Kharif-2012, out of Rs.633.56 crore received from Agricultural Insurance Corporation of India Ltd., as Crop Insurance Claim, Rs.609.84 crore was issued to 5,10,827 farmers under Crop Insurance Scheme. A sum of Rs.568.59 crore has been received from Agricultural Insurance Corporation of India and distributed to 3,47,631 farmers.

- 1,92,847 farmers who were affected by Thane cyclone in Cuddalore District were assisted to the tune of Rs.106.73 crore and 79,771 farmers affected in Villupuram District were given Rs.24.94 crore.
- To strengthen the security of the jewels pledged, 545 Primary Agriculture Co-operative Credit Societies and 20 Primary Agriculture Co-operative Rural Development Banks have been provided with strong rooms with defender door at a cost of Rs.29.05 crore.
- 37 Agricultural Producers Co-operative Marketing Society have been provided strong room with defender doors at a cost of Rs.2.27 crore.
- For grading, drying and to get a better price for the agricultural produce, drying yards at a cost of Rs.23.35 lakh have been installed in 4 Agricultural Producers Co-operative Marketing Society - Alangudi, Aranthangi, Thirumayam and Thirumangalam.
- To process and add value to the agricultural produce of farmers 5 processing units were established at a cost of Rs.91.35 lakh in Agricultural Producers Co-operative Marketing Society.
- To extend better services, new office buildings were constructed in Gingee, Tiruvannamalai, Polur and Karamadai Agricultural Producers Co-operative Marketing Society at a cost of Rs.146.66 lakh.
- CCTVs were installed in 2,152 branches of Tamil Nadu State Apex co-operative Bank,

Central Co-operative Banks and Urban Co-operative Banks.

- Fertilizer Mixture Plant has been established in Nilgiris Agricultural Producers Co-operative Marketing Society at a cost of Rs.15 lakh.

Controlling Price hike

- In order to control the rise in price of vegetables. 12,749 MT of vegetables worth Rs.37.58 crore were sold through 58 Farm Fresh Consumer Outlets. Vegetable cultivation loans to the tune of Rs.268.28 crore were disbursed to vegetable growers through co-operative banks.
- To control the rise in prices of tamarind in the open market, through market intervention 182.367 MT of tamarind was procured and sold to the public at Rs.60/- per kg.
- In order to control the price rise of essential commodities in the open market, the Price Stabilization Fund has been enhanced from Rs.50 crore to Rs.100 crore.

Farm Fresh Consumer Outlets

- A sum of Rs.8.34 crore was sanctioned as revolving fund from Price Stabilization Fund to 40 Farm Fresh Consumer Outlets, 2 mobile Farm Fresh Consumer Outlets in Chennai, 10 Farm Fresh Consumer Outlets functioning in Coimbatore, and 6 Farm Fresh Consumer Outlets functioning in Thoothukudi, Madurai and Tiruvannamalai.
- A sum of Rs.103.61 lakh as subsidy and Rs.10.90 lakh as Interest Free Loan for

working capital have been released for the development of infrastructure from CRDF.

- A sum of Rs.1,24,73,120/- and Rs.1,16,79,191/- was sanctioned as grant from Price Stabilization Fund by the Government towards the transportation cost, spillage, drainage wastage, and handling charges incurred by the vegetable selling 6 Co-operative stores.

Co-operative Medicals and Amma Marundhagams

- In the Budget of 2014-2015, it was announced that as an innovative initiative, 100 New Amma Marundhagams will be opened in addition to the existing 210 co-operative Medical Shops. Accordingly, 10 New Amma Marundhagams were inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 26.06.2014 and 100 new Amma Marundhagams are functioning till date.
- Government has sanctioned interest free working capital assistance of Rs.10 crore for these 100 Amma Marundhagams from the Price Stabilization Fund.
- To create a fine ambience in the newly opened Amma Marundhagam with adequate facilities including computer and air-conditioning, on par with private medical shops.
- Quality medicines are sold to the consumers at reasonable rates with discount up to 15% through Amma Marundhagams.

- In the period 2012-2015, medicines to the value of Rs.293.73 crore were sold through the co-operative medical shops.

Price Stabilization Fund

- In order to control the price of tamarind, Government have sanctioned Rs.67.83 lakh to Dharmapuri District Consumer co-operative Wholesale Stores and Rs.5 lakh to Krishnagiri co-operative Marketing Society for the procurement of tamarind.
- As a market intervention activity, to control the price of essential commodities, like Toor dhal, Urad dhal, Round chilly, Long chilly, Tamarind and Gingelly Oil, Government have sanctioned and released Rs.6 crore to Tamil Nadu co-operative Marketing Federation.
- To control the rise in price of Turdal and Urad dal the scheme of sale of Turdal and Urad dal at lower rate in ½ kg packets in 20 centres of Cooperatives and 5 centres of Tamil Nadu Civil Supplies Corporation in Chennai was launched by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 24.05.2015. Turdal of 47.097 MTs at Rs.53.50/- per ½ kg Uraddal (A) at Rs.56.00 and Urad dal (B) at Rs.49.50 per ½ kg to the quantum of 25.731 MTs has been sold to consumers till 30.11.2015, the period of the scheme.
- To control the rise in price of turdal in the market, imported turdal is being sold through the 71 outlets of cooperatives in Chennai, Coimbatore, Madurai and Tirucharapalli Districts at Rs.55/- per ½ kg and Rs.110/-



per kg from 01.11.2015 onwards. 216.476 MTs of Turdal has been sold to consumers till 31.12.2015.

Sale of Iodised Salt

- To prevent occurrence of diseases arising due to deficiency of iodine, 1,33,800 metric tonnes of iodised salt valued for of Rs.4,683 lakh have been sold upto 31.10.2015 in all the Fair Price Shops in Tamil Nadu with effect from 2011-2012.

Buildings for Fair Price Shops

- About 1,394 new buildings were constructed for Fair Price Shops.

Government Subsidy

- The Government have compensated the loss incurred to the co-operative institutions running the fair price shops by way of subsidy since PDS is not operated on profit motive. The Government have released subsidy of Rs.660 crore for the past four years.

Monitoring Stock position in Fair Price Shops

- To monitor the movement of essential commodities and the closing stock position in the Fair Price Shops, a special server at a cost of Rs.18.35 lakh and a web based

software at Rs.31.74 lakh has been installed through ELCOT since February 2013.

Filling up of vacant posts in Fair Price Shops

- During 2012-2013, 4,680 Salesmen and 1,441 Packers have been appointed by getting list from the Employment Exchange through District Recruitment Board. During 2013-2014, 600 Salesmen and 50 packers and during 2014-2015, 1,404 salesmen and 311 packers were recruited to fill up the vacant posts.

Margin Money

- The margin money allowed to the co-operative Institutions by the Government for running the Public Distribution System has been raised by 75% over and above the existing rate.

Integrated co-operative Development Project

- The Government have released Rs.219.58 crore for the Integrated co-operative Development Projects implemented in 11 districts. Vital infrastructures like godown, office building, commercial complex, compound wall, vehicles, strong room with defender doors, safety vaults, computers, generators, modern banking counters, jewel weighing machines etc., have been created in co-operative Societies at a cost of Rs.87.43 crore. Also margin money assistance of Rs.145.94 crore has been disbursed to the societies for business development.

Electronic Weigh Bridge

- 3 electronic weigh bridges at Perundurai,

Bhavani and Usilampatti Agricultural Producers Co-operative Marketing Societies have been installed at an estimated cost of Rs.56.67 lakh for weighment of agricultural produce of farmers.

- Further two electronic weigh bridge at a cost of 41.55 lakh have been installed one each in Thuraiyar and Nilgiris Agricultural Producers Co-operative Marketing Society.

Storage Godowns of Co-operative Societies

- To get a better price for the agricultural produce of the farmers, store them safely and also to enable them to produce pledge loans, the Government have proposed to construct 3,873 godowns with a capacity of 5,10,600 metric tonnes at a total cost of Rs.483.33 crore with Government grant of Rs.483.32 crore. Out of this, 3,317 godowns were constructed with capacity of 4,11,800 metric tonnes. The construction of remaining godowns is under progress.

Pledge Loan

- The co-operative societies have disbursed produce pledge loan to the extent of Rs.1,169.82 crore to the farmers.

Modernization of Co-operative Presses

- In Tamil Nadu, 7 Co-operative Presses at Chennai, Vellore, Salem, Madurai, Tirunelveli, Coimbatore and Tiruchi were modernized at Rs.3.68 crore.

New Health Insurance Scheme

- State Government Employees' New Health Insurance Scheme 2012 has also been

extended to the employees of Co-operative Societies also. As per this scheme, in two years, employees of Co-operative Societies and their dependents can avail medical treatment up to Rs.2 lakh without paying cash. Annual premium under the scheme is Rs.2,120/- which will be shared by the employees and Co-operative Societies in equal proportion. This Scheme was launched by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 27.07.2015.

- Under this scheme, 41,061 employees working in 6245 societies and 1,14,986 family members depending on the employees, totaling 1,56,047 persons will be benefitted. So far 342 employees have availed medical claims to the tune of Rs.1,56,10,552.

Co-operative Election

- According to the provisions in the Constitution (97th Amendment) Act, 2011, co-operative societies should be managed by duly elected boards. The TNCS Act has been amended and for the first time a separate Tamil Nadu State co-operative Societies Election Commission has been formed for conducting election to co-operative societies.
- The Constitution (97th Amendment) Act 2011 provides that in the elected board, there should be one member from the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and two women members. The Tamil Nadu Co-operative Societies Act has been amended suitably by providing that in the elected members of the board of every society, there shall be 18% reservation for Scheduled Castes and

Scheduled Tribes and 30% reservation for women members.

- The Tamil Nadu State Co-operative Societies Election Commission conducted elections to 24,046 co-operative societies of all types; 2,36,797 persons were elected as Board of Directors in the management of co-operative societies.

Food and Consumer Protection Department

- All the 1.87 crore Rice option cardholders, 65,606 Police card holders and 19,528 Sri Lankan Tamil Refugees living in camps were provided with Pongal gift hamper each comprising 1 kg of Raw rice, 1 kg of Sugar and a cash assistance of Rs.100/- for celebrating Pongal of 2014.
- Every month 1.90 crore rice option cardholders are supplied with rice free of cost from 01.06.2011, for 6.75 crore beneficiaries. The off take of rice between 16.05.2011 to 31.12.2015 was 1,75,82,316 Metric Tonnes. Rice, Sugar, Wheat, Kerosene, Toor dhal, Urad dhal and Palmolein are being supplied to Card holders every month at subsidized prices involving a subsidy of Rs.441 crore per month.
- 1,21,085 metric tonnes of rice is supplied free of cost to 18.90 lakh AAY cardholders.
- To control the rise in price of vegetables including onion and tomato, 58 Farm Fresh Consumer Outlets (FFCOs) including 2 mobile outlets were opened on 20.06.2013 in Chennai city and its urban areas, as well as in Coimbatore and Thoothukudi. Vegetables

are being procured directly from the farmers without the involvement of middlemen, according to the demand in market.

- To protect the people from the impact of increasing prices of essential commodities, the Government has enhanced the price stabilisation fund from Rs.50 crore to Rs.100 crore.
- 8,924 new part time fair price shops have been opened remote and far-flung areas so far.
- To control the prices of pulses and edible oils in the open Market, Government have introduced a scheme of supply of Toor dhal, Urad dhal and Palmolein oil at subsidised rates to the cardholders under special Public Distribution System. Toor dhal, Urad dhal are supplied at the rate of Rs.30/- per kg and palm oil at Rs.25/- per litre. Till now, 75,511 metric tonnes of Toor dhal, 34,675 metric

tonnes of Urad dhal and 87,749 kilo liters of Palmolein oil has been supplied.

- To control the rise in price of rice, one lakh metric tonnes of rice was offloaded in the open market for sales at Rs.20/- per kg through Amudham Departmental Stores run by the Tamil Nadu Civil Supplies Corporation, retail outlets run by the Co-operative wholesale stores and through the special outlets. It is being sold on need basis in the District Headquarters, Corporations and Town Panchayats.
- To curtail the smuggling of essential commodities, 12 New Civil Supplies-CID Units comprising 74 police constables have been formed at a cost of Rs.4.25 crore.
- For safe storage of food grains 95 godowns have been constructed and 18 godowns are under construction.



Making Tamil Nadu Shine as Power Surplus State



Tamil Nadu Generation & Distribution Corporation Limited

- 7,485.5 MW of power is obtained from new projects of TANGEDCO, share of Central Generating Stations and from Joint Venture Projects.
- TNEB-NTPC JV Project at Vallur (3x500MW)– Unit-1, Unit-2, Unit-3 commissioned on 29.11.2012, 25.08.2013 and 26.02.2015 respectively.
- Commercial operation declared on 12.10.2013 in Mettur Thermal Power Project Stage-II (600 MW).
- Commercial operation of North Chennai Thermal Power Project Stage-II (2 x 600 MW) Unit-I achieved on 20.03.2014 and Unit-II achieved on 08.05.2014.
- New wind mills with a capacity of 1,495.88 MW added from June 2011 to December 2015.
- 159 developers have registered their applications for the establishment of solar power plants for a combined capacity of 3,911.5 MW. Power Purchase Agreements (PPA) have been executed with 82 developers for a capacity of 1,458 MW. Installed capacity of solar power plants under various schemes as on 31.01.2016 is 414.3 MW.

- Agreement entered into to procure 3,330 MW power for 15 years from 2014 under long-term access to meet future demand.
- EPC contract for Ennore Expansion Power Project of capacity 660 MW awarded. Project works are under progress.
- EPC contract for Ennore SEZ (2 x 660 MW) project awarded. Project works are under progress.
- Government accorded approval for establishment of Uppur Thermal Power Project (2 x 800 MW).
- Government accorded approval in G.O.(4D) No.1 dated 03.02.2015 for establishment of 2 x 660 MW Udangudi Expansion Stage II and 2 x 660MW Stage III.
- Orders issued for replacing existing Ennore Thermal Power Plant by 660 MW Power Plant.
- 210 MW Unit III of Mettur Thermal Power Station 1 has achieved continuous operation of 337 days as on 14.11.2014. This feat has been achieved on its Silver Jubilee year.
- During 2012-2013, NCTPS Stage 1 (3x210 MW) achieved highest PLF of 91.68% above national average of 69.93%.
- Highest PLF of 92.77 % was achieved by MTPS in the 25th year in 2011-2012.
- Highest PLF of 90.04 % was achieved by TTPS in the 32nd year in 2012-2013
- Roof-top Solar Power Plant of 60 KW at a cost of Rs.55.80 lakh installed at TANGEDCO Head Quarters and inaugurated on 30.12.2013.
- 207 Substations commissioned and 6,029.66 ckt kms of EHT lines energised. Of these substations, Kayathar 400 kv SS and Tiruvalam 400 kV SS were commissioned on 04.07.2014 and 27.07.2014 respectively.
- The transmission infrastructure in the State especially in Chennai is being strengthened at a project cost of Rs.5,000 crore with a loan assistance of Rs.3,572 crore from JICA.
- 400 kv substations along with associated 400 kv lines at Thappagundu, Anaikadavu and Rasipalayam to evacuate wind power at a total cost of Rs.1,306.25 crore are under execution.
- TANTRANSCO has proposed schemes for evacuation of Renewable Energy for a value of Rs.1,593 crore. Ministry of Finance/ GoI has accorded approval for the grant of Rs.637.2 crore (40%) under National Clean Energy Fund (NCEF) and loan agreement for soft loan from German Government through KfW for another 40% was signed on 17.12.2014. Tendering activities for the schemes are under progress.
- To avail loan assistance from financial institutions and banks, Rs.50,614.09 crore of Government Guarantee sanctioned.
- Government has provided financial assistance of Rs.37,483.32 crore to TANGEDCO in the last four years.
- Under Financial Restructuring Plan, short-term loan amounting to Rs.6,353.49 crore agreed to be taken over by State Government. The interest commitment for the above loans to the extent of Rs.558 crore per annum is being met by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

- Distribution of Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFL) to all hut consumers availing free electricity to replace incandescent lights free of cost launched on 30.12.2013. The scheme has been completed.
- 37.68 lakh new electricity connections effected.
- The scheme of sending messages through SMS regarding current consumption charges and due date of payment for consumers, launched on 12.06.2014.

TEDA

Chief Minister's Solar Powered Green House Scheme (CMSPGHS)

- India's largest Solar Rooftop programme targeting 3 lakh Green Houses with Solar powered lights to be installed over a period of 5 years from 2011-2012 to 2015-2016 at 60,000 houses per year. Under this scheme, Rooftop solar panel totalling 20-30 MW will be installed in 5 years at an estimated cost of Rs.900 crore.
- Work order was given for the installation of 3,00,000 Solar Home lighting Systems. Out of this 1,53,611 Solar Home lighting Systems have been installed.

Energising street lights with solar power

- 1 lakh street lights to be energized through solar power over a period of 5 years in Village Panchayats from 2011-2012 to 2015-2016. This is the first of its kind project in the country, as the existing street lights so far energized from TANGEDCO grid power are energized by replacing existing tube lights with 20W LED lamps and powered

through solar energy in clusters of 10/15 with provision of grid backup.

- Work order was given for Energization of 40,000 Street lights with Solar power. Out of this 35,560 Street lights with Solar power have been completed.

Chief Minister's Solar Rooftop Capital Incentive Scheme

- Under this scheme, the State Government provides Capital Incentive of Rs.20,000/- per KWp, in addition to 30% MNRE subsidy, for the installation of 1 KWp each grid tie solar rooftops by 10,000 domestic consumers orders issued.
- The domestic consumers can also avail the power credits for the excess power feed into the grid after consumption as per net metering provision. Applications are received online at www.teda.in and sanctioned on first-come first-served basis. 5,783 applications are received as on date (01.02.2016). Out of this, 5,246 applications were sanctioned.

50 Nos. of 500 LPD Solar Water Heating Systems

- 50 Solar Water Heating systems of 500 litres per day capacity each at Aavin bulk milk coolers have been completed at various locations in the State.

RENERGY 2014

- India's largest Renewable Energy event RENERGY has been successfully conducted from June 12th to 14th, 2014 by TEDA every year since 2012. Last Year this event was held at Chennai at Chennai Trade Centre with 2014, 2,000 delegates, 15,000 visitors and

200 exhibitors RENERGY was conducted successfully in Coimbatore in 2013 & 2015.

The Chief Electrical Inspector of Government

- The Electrical Inspectorate functioning under the Energy department is responsible for ensuring compliance of the safety provisions in all electrical installations as per Electricity Act, 2003. The department was created in 1961 and has also been entrusted with licensing of Lifts, testing of electrical instruments, levying Electricity Tax and promoting energy conservation.

Improvement in service delivery of Electrical Inspectorate

- In order to improve the accessibility and convenience of the consumer in availing services and to improve operational efficiency of the electrical inspectorate, Government issued orders reorganizing the department considering the work load and by shifting the offices to the respective work centres. Further, the Government issued notification under Section 162 of the Electricity Act, 2003, wherein the powers of conducting statutory inspections and issue of permission to the electrical installations have been delegated to the field level officers from the higher levels for rendering speedy services to the consumers at the field level itself.

Government Electrical Standards Laboratory

- Electrical Inspectorate is equipped with a laboratory called Government Electrical

Standards Laboratory (GESL) at the Head Quarters office of the Chief Electrical Inspector, Chennai. It caters to the needs of various State Electricity Boards in our country of calibrating their accurate energy meters using Reference Standards and Sources. This laboratory is in existence for more than 50 years.

- The “National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories” (NABL) is established by the Government of India and functions under the Ministry of Science and Technology. NABL is the authority to issue accreditation for Laboratories in our country so that the test/calibration certificates issued by such accredited Laboratories are accepted in the International Level. GESL was issued such an accreditation by NABL in July, 2012.
- In order to improve the electrical energy parameter testing facility at GESL, enhanced version of High precision Power/Energy calibrator and Meter Test System of 100 ppm accuracy was procured from Germany in October 2013. Subsequently, the scope of accreditation by NABL has been enhanced for electrical energy parameter of 150 ppm accuracy from July, 2014 onwards. There are only few laboratories in India at this level with such a facility on energy parameter next to National Physical Laboratory, New Delhi. With this facility, calibration of power/Energy standards from various laboratories of our country, energy meters from any power plants and Distribution Company can be undertaken now with International standards at high accuracy level.



Procurement of Hand-held Electrical Instruments to Ensure Electrical Safety

- In order to monitor & ensure electrical safety of electrical installations during statutory inspection by departmental Electrical Inspectors, hand-held electrical instruments, namely, Earth Leakage Detectors, Tong Testers and Insulation Resistance Testers were procured. Using these devices, the Electrical Inspectors are now conducting field tests to ascertain important electrical parameters like leakage current, load current and insulation resistance of the installation. Hazards are brought to the knowledge of the consumer to ensure electrical safety.

Energy Conservation Building Code

- In order to reduce energy consumption in commercial buildings and certain categories of major building complexes with a connected load of 100kW and above, the

Government has initiated amendment to the Energy Conservation Building Code for adoption by the building planning authorities while issuing approval for the building plan.

Implementation of Energy Efficiency Measures

- In order to showcase the Energy Efficiency movement in office buildings, implementation of Energy Efficiency Measures at Namakkal Kavignar Maaligai, Secretariat and Ezhilagam Main Building, Chepauk, was done. The project involves replacement of Air conditioners and ceiling fans by star labelled ones and conventional tube lamps by energy efficient T5 fittings so that an energy saving of about 20% is achieved by these simple, proven and cost effective measures.



Controlling Pollution, Ensuring a Radiant World for Future Generations



- A sum of Rs.22 crore was released in the year 2013-2014 and a sum of Rs.12.50 crore during 2014-2015 and thus a total of Rs.34.50 crore to establish a Sport, Fishing cum Eco-Park at Chetpet in Chennai and the works are in progress.
- The Department of Environment is conducting a separate online quiz programme in schools as a part of awareness activities at a periodical intervals, as announced during 2014-2015 under announcement.
- For installation of a 1.5 MW Wind turbine clubbed with 500 KW Solar Photo Voltaic System at Kayathar, Rs. 12 crore has been released.
- Bio-remediation works are being carried out at Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Vandalur, Guindy National Park, Vedanthangal

Birds Sanctuary, Karikilli Birds Sanctuary, Pulicat Birds Sanctuary and Amirthi Mini Zoological Park, at a cost of Rs.10.01 crore.

- For regeneration of Shola forest Rs. 2.07 crore was sanctioned for 2013-2014 and Rs.0.942 crore for 2014-2015. Work is in progress.

Reducing usage of plastics

- Roads are being relayed using plastic waste. Out of the sanctioned amount of Rs.219.37 crore, Rs.210.60 crore has been spent so far, and plastic roads have been relayed to a total length of 1,551 km. Further, relaying of plastic roads is in progress.
- Rs.4.40 crore has been allocated for establishing 95 Plastic Waste Collection Centres. Processing units have been established.

- It is proposed to distribute biodegradable bags throughout the State, at a cost of Rs.75 lakh during the current year.
- Plastic awareness activities were carried out throughout the State through “Message on Wheels” by selected NGOs, at a cost of Rs.64 lakh in 2013-2014 and Rs.64 lakh in 2014-2015.
- 15 Plastic Waste collection centres have been established in 10 districts at a cost of Rs. 2.20 crore; Five shredding machines at a cost of Rs. 0.20 crore.
- Awards are given to the best three villages, three self help groups and the best three schools in the State that play a vital role in reducing the usage of plastic every year. Rs.30 lakh was sanctioned for 2013-2014 and again for 2014-2015.

Formation of new Eco clubs and strengthening of the existing Eco clubs

- 3,200 new Eco Clubs were formed in the year 2012-2013 in addition to the existing 1,869 eco clubs. In 2013-2014, Rs.1.27 crore was released as continuous financial support to 5,069 eco clubs to carry out eco club activities.
- 3,200 new Eco clubs were formed in 2013-2014 at Rs.80 lakh.
- At present 8,269 Eco Clubs are functioning in the State. In 2014-2015, financial assistance was enhanced from Rs. 2,500/- to Rs. 5,000/- per school for which a sum of Rs.4.13 crore was allocated and released.
- Rs.1.60 crore was released for the formation of new 3,200 Eco clubs. Totally, 11,469 Eco clubs are functioning.
- In order to make the children understand the environment and environmental issues and to provide opportunities, financial assistance of Rs.100 lakh was disbursed to best performing 500 Eco Clubs/NGC Eco Clubs at Rs.20,000/- per school for 2014-2015.

Details of schemes to be implemented in 2014-2015

- Environment Management Plans will be prepared for two eco sensitive areas of the State, Srirangam in Tiruchi district and Rameswaram in Ramanathapuram District. These places require immediate attention by adopting integrated management approaches to carry out restoration programmes at a cost of Rs.10 lakh each, released during 2014-2015.
- Rs.50 lakh allocated for 2014-2015 and released for strengthening of the existing 7 seven Environment Information Dissemination Centres (EIDC).
- Seminar & Workshops have been conducted. 96 Hoardings erected in 32 Districts in Tamil Nadu.
- Rs.10 lakh has been allocated for establishing Climate Change Cell.
- For carrying out eco restoration work in Ayyarkulam, Kuyavankuttai and Sithampatti tank in Perundurai at Erode district, a sum of Rs.4.50 crore has been released to Directorate of Town Panchayat and for Kuttaithairpalayam in Perode Panchayat and Kambatteeswaran tank Punaikalamangalam in Erode district, a sum of Rs.3 crore has been released to District Collector, Erode and thus, a total sum



of Rs.7.50 crore for eco restoration activities in Erode District during 2014-2015 and the works are in progress.

- A sum of Rs.20 crore has been released, as first phase for rehabilitation and restoration of Madhavaram, Ambattur, and Korattur wetland complex in Thiruvallur District and the works are under progress.
- A sum of Rs.4 crore has been released to Public Works Department, as first phase, during 2014-2015 for restoration of Sarkarperiyapalayam Tank in Avinashi Taluk in Tiruppur District and the works are in progress.
- Rs.20 crore has been allocated, as first phase, for rehabilitation and Restoration of Madhavaram, Ambattur, and Korattur wet land complex in Thiruvallur District.
- Rs. 3.59 crore has been allocated for eco-restoration and rejuvenation of 19 number of water bodies in Wildlife/Bird Sanctuaries in National Parks. Works are under progress.
- Rs.1.130 crore has been released for formation of 20 more Environment Information Dissemination Centres and for training to teachers' co-ordinators.
- Rs.36 lakh has been released for various awareness activities in Amirthi Mini Zoo.
- Rs.24.618 crore for Forest Department and Rs.0.20 crore for Amirthi Mini Zoo has been allocated for relaying of roads using plastic wastes.
- Rs.4 crore has been released as first phase, for restoration of Sarkarperiyapalayam Tank in Avinashi Taluk in Tiruppur district.
- To create awareness activities among school children and the general public through "Message on Wheels", Rs.32 lakh allocated as incentive to the 10 best Eco-club / NGC Schools in each district.

Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board

- TNPC Board has obtained NABL Accreditation to its five Advanced Environmental

Laboratories (AEL) located at Chennai, Salem, Madurai, Cuddalore and Coimbatore.

- Seven District office buildings were constructed in Sivagangai, Dindigul, Namakkal, Virudhunagar, Thanjavur, Villupuram and Pudukottai at a cost of Rs. 10.64 crores and they were inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 13.11.2015.
- The Government has issued orders for granting Rs. 179.34 crore for 18 CETPs in Tiruppur to achieve ZLD.
- Awareness Programme to avoid the use of use-and-throw plastic products conducted at a cost of Rs.32 lakh in 32 Districts.
- Training programme for ETP operators to prevent loss of life during cleaning of effluent tank, conducted at a cost of Rs.25 lakh for 3,000 workers.
- A new District Laboratory at Maraimalai Nagar was established at a cost of Rs.58 lakh and was inaugurated on 11.09.2012 by the Hon'ble Chief Minister through video conferencing facility.
- For the first time, Tablet computers at a cost of in Tamil 3.96 lakh were distributed to all the 34 District Environmental Engineers by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 11.09.2012.
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu distributed the Green Awards on 11.09.2012 to 12 industries who have excelled for the improvement of the environment.
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu distributed 86 Nos. of PM10 (Particulate Matter) instruments procured at a cost of Rs.1.28 crore and 5 Nos. of PM 2.5 instruments procured at a cost of Rs.11.33 lakh for Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board Laboratories on 11.09.2012.
- Enhancement of Risk allowance from Rs.60/- to Rs.500/- to all the Engineers and Scientists of TNPCB.
- House building loan for the employees of TNPCB was granted from the financial year 2013-2014 as per the announcement made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister under Rule 110 of TNLA Rules.
- As per the Orders of Hon'ble Chief Minister, TNPCB is at present functioning with three tier (District, Zone and Head Office) set up as opposed to its earlier two tier set up.
- New district office was established in Ariyalur, covering Ariyalur and Perambalur District for the benefit of Industries and Public.
- New District office, having headquarters at Palladam was established and is functioning for better monitoring of Industries in Tiruppur District.
- New District office in industrialized Coimbatore District having headquarters at Coimbatore North was established and is functioning to monitor industries.
- Green Award distributed by Hon'ble Chief Minister to District Collectors who have carried out improvement works in their Districts.
- New building for District Office & Advanced Environmental laboratory building in Cuddalore was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 25.06.2014.

- TNPCB established a Continuous Ambient Air Quality Monitoring Station at a cost of Rs.87 lakh in SIPCOT Industrial complex, Thoothukudi to monitor the ambient air quality on continuous basis.
- In order to monitor the quality of Ambient Air, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has installed 6 Continuous Ambient Air Quality Monitoring (CAAQM) Stations in Tamil Nadu in which 4 CAAQM Stations are in Chennai and one CAAQM Station is in SIPCOT Industrial Complex, Tuticorin and one CAAQM Station is in SIPCOT Industrial Complex, Gummidipoondi. All stations are in operation.
- In order to monitor ambient noise level of Chennai city on a continuous basis, TNPCB has installed five noise monitoring stations at a cost of Rs. 76 lakh. These stations are located at Old Washermenpet, Sowcarpet, Anna Nagar, Velachery, Pallikaranai. The funding was done on 50:50 co-sharing basis by TNPCB and CPCB.
- In order to monitor the water quality of Noyyal river and Kalingarayan canal, TNPCB has provided online continuous river monitoring stations at three locations in each water body at a cost of Rs. 40 lakh. These stations monitor pH, total dissolved solids, and dissolved oxygen.
- TNPCB launched Online Consent Management and Monitoring System (OCMMS) on 19.01.2015. This also allows TNPCB to carry out the consent management processes such as application scrutiny, raise inspection, raise clarification, submit inspection report, prepare consent order and forward consent order online. In order to facilitate the industries to apply through OCMMS, TNPCB established a CARE CENTRE in all of the 34 District offices.
- 219 Laptops were issued to all senior officers and Engineers of the Board at a cost of Rs. 1.40 crores in order to process the applications received online and to deliver the consent order to the concerned industries expeditely.
- A short video film/advertisement on the importance of Ecology and Conservation has been prepared during 2014-2015 at an allocation of Rs.1 crore and TV channels are telecasting the film.

FOREST DEPARTMENT

- A “Massive Tree Planting Programme” to increase green cover was sanctioned for implementation in the State for planting 3.29 crore seedlings at an outlay of Rs.229.61 crore from 2011-2012 to 2015-2016. Totally 2.61 crore seedlings have been planted so far in the 32 districts throughout the State at a cost of Rs.84.79 crore.
- During the year 2015-2016, Government had issued orders for establishment of early warning alarm system about the movement of elephants to create awareness among the public in Tamil Nadu Government Buses in Valparai areas.
- Sanction has been accorded by the Government for implementation of Massive Tree Planting programme, 67 lakhs seedlings planting at an outlay of Rs. 53.72 crore over

- a period of three years from 2015-2016 to 2017-2018. Upto 31.12.2015, 66,86,796 seedlings has been planted in 32 Districts at a cost of Rs.15.46 crore throughout the State. Implementation of the scheme is under progress.
- With financial assistance from Japan International Co-operation Agency (JICA), the Government has accorded sanction for implementation of the Scheme “Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Conservation and Greening Project” at an outlay of Rs.686 crore from 2011-2012 to 2018-2019.
 - During 2015-2016 1.02 crore seedlings will be planted in private farmlands at free of cost to farmers in 1021 villages for which 1.07crore seedlings are being raised in advance. About 1 crore seedlings have been raised so far. An amount of Rs.32 croe has been released to the Project Management Unit for implementation of the scheme. Implementation of the scheme is under progress.
 - Maintenance works were carried out at a cost of Rs.111.77 crore under Tamil Nadu Afforestation Project Phase II. In the past four years, Rs.52.79 lakh loan assistance has been given to 1,377 number of forest dwellers in Tamil Nadu.
 - In order to control monkey menace in various cities, Rs.3.63 crore was sanctioned in 2011-2012 and 2012-2013. A sum of Rs.3.06 crore has been incurred so far towards implementation of the scheme. A sum of Rs.0.67 crore has been released for the year 2014-2015.
 - Rs. 89.05 crore has been sanctioned from the 13th Finance Commission to improve the forest wealth from the year 2011-2012 to 2013-2014. So far Rs. 81.48 crore had been spent. During 2014-2015 it has been proposed to spend another Rs. 45.13 crore with unspent funds of previous year.
 - Rs.15.84 crore was sanctioned for raising teak plantations over an area 12,775 hectares and maintenance of plantations during 2012-2013 and 2013-2014. A sum of Rs.12.79 crore has been incurred so far for raising and maintenance of plantations over an area of 11,075 hectares. This scheme was implemented in 2014-2015 at an outlay of Rs.13.97 crore.
 - An amount of Rs.53.33 crore was sanctioned under Asian Elephant Depredation and its mitigation measures against depredation of farm lands by wildlife during 2011-2012 and 2012-2013. Out of this, Rs.49.18 crore was spent on carrying out various mitigation measures. In 2014-2015, this scheme was implemented at an outlay of Rs.32 lakh.
 - In 2012-2013, a bird sanctuary was established at Sakkarakottai tank in Ramanathapuram District. In continuation, Sathyamangalam Wildlife Sanctuary in Erode District was declared as Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve and the fourth Tiger Reserve in the State. In 2013-2014, the Government issued orders for notifying Cauvery North Wildlife Sanctuary in Dharmapuri district, Kodaikkanal Wildlife Sanctuary in Dindigul district, Gangaikodan Spotted Deer



Sanctuary in Tirunelveli District and Point Calimere Wildlife Sanctuary Block A at Thanjavur and Thiruvavur Districts & Block B in Nagappattinam district.

- Government had issued orders for creation of Wildlife Management Training Centre at Attakatty in Anamalai Tiger Reserve and in Theppakadu, Mudumalai Tiger Reserve by upgrading the existing Training Centre at an outlay of Rs.2 crore at the rate of Rs. 1 crore for each centre.
- During the current year to continue the Forest Research activities a sum of Rs. 3.85 crore has been sanctioned by the Government.
- During the current year, a sum of Rs. 9.36 crores has been sanctioned towards implementation of the scheme Project Tiger with the assistance from the Centre in three Tiger Reserves viz., Kalakad Mundanthurai Tiger Reserve, Anamalai Tiger Reserve and Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve.

- In 2014-2015, Nellai Wildlife Sanctuary in Tirunelveli District was notified as 15th Wildlife Sanctuary in the State.
- In 2014-2015 Suchindram-Theroor-Manakudy lake area in Kanniyakumari District was declared as 2nd Conservation Reserve in Tamil Nadu.
- Rs.1 crore was sanctioned to create Wildlife Conservation Revolving Fund and through this, funds received from Government of India will be utilized in full.
- In 2011-2012, sanction was given to create wild life protection revolving fund for
- Rs.1 crore. The fund helps utilization of Central funds fully.
- Orders were issued to allocate 30% of the total vacancies for direct recruitment to the post of Forest Watchers in Hill Districts, equally to Scheduled Tribe youths and the Scheduled Tribes already engaged as Anti-poaching Watchers.

- Rs.12.73 crore was spent for planting 1.19 crore seedlings under Tree cultivation in private lands during 2011-2012.
- Rs.20.87 crore was sanctioned from 2011-2012 to 2015-2016 for implementation of the scheme of creation of fodder resources and improvement of Wildlife habitat inside the forest areas to mitigate human-animal conflict and a sum of Rs.13.69 crore was incurred. During the year 2014-2015, this scheme was implemented at an outlay of Rs.4.17 crore.
- Replanting of Thane Cyclone affected areas in Villupuram and Cuddalore Districts was sanctioned at an outlay of Rs.14.96 crore during 2012-2013 to 2015-2016. Totally a sum of Rs.11.11 crore was incurred.
- In 2011-2012, Rs.7.35 crore was sanctioned to establish Butterfly Park and Nakshatra Vanam in Srirangam constituency, near Upper Anaicut Reserved Forest of Tiruchi Forest Division to attract pilgrims and tourists and to conserve butterfly species. A sum of Rs.4.72 crore has been spent so far towards implementation of the scheme. This scheme is to be implemented at a cost of Rs. 2.62 crore in 2014-2015.
- Rs.27.13 crore was sanctioned for Establishment of Advanced Institute for Wildlife Conservation (Research, Training and Education) at Arignar Anna Zoological Park in 2012-2013 and Rs.1.30 crore has been spent towards infrastructure development works. In 2014-2015, construction works were carried out at a cost of Rs.5.83 crore by Public Works Department.
- Sanction was accorded for implementation of Water Conservation and Canopy Improvement in degraded forest lands over an area of 50,000 hectares at an outlay of Rs.50 crore in 10 districts with NABARD assistance during 2012-2013 and a sum of Rs.49.70 crore has been spent so far towards implementation of the scheme over an area of 50,000 hectares. This scheme was implemented at a cost of Rs.50 crore over an area of 35,000 hectares.
- Rs.50 lakh was sanctioned for the scheme of Restoration and Reclamation of Shola forests in Nilgiris District for a period of five years from 2013-2014 to 2017-2018. A sum of Rs.16 lakh has been spent so far. Implementation of the scheme is continued during 2014-2015 at an outlay of Rs. 19 lakh.
- Government issued orders for the establishment of Central Nurseries in 32 Districts of the states of Tamil Nadu at an outlay of Rs. 4.80 crore.
- In 2014-2015, for restoration of the indigenous sandal vegetation areas a scheme “Assisting Sandal regeneration in Traditional Sandal areas” was sanctioned at an outlay of Rs.5 crore.
- Government issued orders for strengthening Legal wing of Forest Department by creating three posts of Advocates (1 criminal and 2 civil) in 2013-2014.
- Establishment of Forest Museum at Arignar Anna Zoological Park was sanctioned at a cost of Rs.20 lakh in 2013-2014 and a Rs.16 lakh was spent on implementation of the scheme. In 2014-2015, Rs. 4 lakh was spent to carry out spill over works of previous year.

- Rs.5 crore was sanctioned for improvement of Amrithi Zoo at Vellore and Tiruchi Zoo at Tiruchi in 2013-2014. A sum of Rs.2.60 crore has been spent so far towards implementation of the scheme.
- The Government has issued orders enhancing monthly wages to Anti-poaching watcher from Rs.4,000/- to Rs.6,750/- per month and at present wages are being disbursed at the enhanced rate.
- The Government has sanctioned Rs.6.94 crore to carryout developmental activities in the zoos under the control of Zoo Authority of Tamil Nadu headed by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu. Rs.6.88 crore has been spent so far.
- Rs.2.81 crore was sanctioned towards providing of drinking water facilities to wild animals in Forest areas through energized solar power in 2013-2014. A sum of Rs.2.81 crore has been spent so far towards implementation of the scheme.
- The amount of Compensation for death caused by wild animals has been increased from Rs.1.5 lakh to 3 lakh and for damages of crops, the compensation amount has been increased from Rs.15,000/- to Rs.25,000/- per acre. A sum of Rs.8.56 crore during the years 2011-2014 for 6,852 instances was paid as compensation under various schemes. In 2014-2015, Rs.4.97 crore was sanctioned under various schemes for payment of compensation and Rs.4.79 crore has been paid so far as compensation for 3,122 various instances.
- A revolving fund of Rs.2.50 crore has been created for early settlement of compensation for wildlife damage.
- Upto 31.12.2012, Gulf of Mannar Biosphere Reserve Trust was funded by UNDP. From 01.01.2013, the Government has agreed in principle for funding the trust activities with an outlay of Rs.10 crore at the rate of Rs.2.50 crore every year for a period of four years from 2013-2014 to 2016-2017. The Government has sanctioned and released
- Rs.2.50 crore towards development and management of Gulf of Mannar Biosphere Trust in 2013-2014 and Rs.1.32 crore had been spent. Implementation of the scheme was continued during 2014-2015 at an outlay of Rs.2.50 crore.
- In 2012-2013, the Government ordered to utilize the facilities of Police canteen by Uniformed Forest personnel, Retired Uniformed Forest personnel and the family of deceased Uniformed Forest Personnel and sanctioned Rs.10 lakh as one time additional grant for Police canteens.
- In 2012-2013, the Government sanctioned Rs.4 crore towards enhancement in grant of cash allowances in lieu of supply of Uniform, Washing allowance and Risk allowance to the Forest Personnel on par with Police Personnel.
- In 2014-2015, the grant of risk allowance has been extended to 137 Anti poaching watchers at Rs.400/- each at an outlay of Rs.6.58 lakh.
- In 2012-2013, the Government sanctioned Rs.1.44 crore for purchase of 13 Jeeps and 26 Motor cycles and on articles required for strengthening the Protection and Vigilance Wing.

- In 2011-2012, construction of buildings was carried out at a cost of Rs.4.42 crore under various schemes. In 2012-2013 and 2013-2014, buildings were constructed at a cost of Rs.8.89 crore and Rs.9.43 crore respectively under various schemes. In 2014-2015, construction and improvement of buildings was carried out at an outlay of Rs.7.58 crore.
- In the tribal schools run by Forest Department, orders were issued for awarding the first three rankers in 10th standard and 12th standard examinations every year for the first time with amounts ranging from Rs.15,000/- to Rs.50,000/- to individual rank holders in boys and girls categories. So far, Rs.7.40 lakh has been awarded to 27 students.
- Rs.31.64 crore was spent in 2011-2014 towards improvement of roads to a length of 256.46 kms. In 2014-2015, improvement of roads for a length of 70.068 kms has been carried out at an outlay of Rs.18.67 crore.
- Further, with the funds received from the Director of Environment from the years
- 2011-2012 to 2013-2014, Rs.29.48 crore was spent on relaying of Forest roads by using plastic waste to a length of 394.223 kms. In 2014-2015, it is proposed to relay forest roads by using plastic waste at a cost of Rs.24.62 crore to a length of 137.284 kms.
- In 2011-2012 and 2012-2013, Rs. 39.40 crore was realised as revenue to Government by sale of 87.25 metric tonnes of sandalwood through tender cum auction sale. During 2013-2014, Rs.137.41 crore was realised as revenue to Government by sale of 298.983 metric tonnes of sandalwood through tender cum auction sale. In 2014-2015, Rs.38.39 crore was realised as revenue to Government by sale of 67.585 metric tonnes of sandalwood through tender cum auction sale and retail sale.
- Rs.85 lakh has been realised as revenue to Government by sale of 458 cubic metre of teakwood through open auction.
- In 2013-2014 and 2014-2015, Rs.15.80 crore was realised as revenue to Government by the sale of 4,954.734 cubic metres of teakwood through open auction.
- Rs.57.19 crore was realised by sale of Social Forestry Plantations in 2011-2014 and in 2014-2015 Rs. 21.79 crore was realised as revenue by sale of Social Forestry Plantations.
- In the last four years, Rs.76 crore has been earned as revenue through sale of Social Forestry Schemes.
- In 2011-2012, Rs.7.81 crore and in 2012-2013 Rs.6.77 crore was given to panchayats as share of sale of Social Forestry Plantations in panchayat tanks.
- In 2011-2015, 11,545.145 hectares of land were notified as Reserved Forest and 8,695.315 hectares was notified as Reserve Land.

- Tamil Nadu Forest Plantation Corporation Limited has supplied pulp wood to the tune of 911899 M.Tonnes to M/s. Tamil Nadu

Newsprint and Papers Limited and M/s. Seshasayee Paper and Boards Limited from the year 2011-2012 to 31.12.2015.

- 19723 Ha. of Eucalyptus pulp wood plantations have been raised by selecting high yielding clones and Australian provenance seeds.
- Rs 34.78 lakh has been earned from April to July 2015 as revenue by leasing out cashew plantations under the control of Tamil Nadu Plantation Corporation through auction and tender.
- 3,921 Ha. of senile, unproductive cashes areas have been converted into high yielding cashew grafted plantations.
- TAF CORN made profit of Rs.98.88 crore from the year 2011-2015 and for the year 2015-2016, the budgeted profit is Rs.11.50 crore.
- TAF CORN has paid Rs. 1,503.40 lakh as dividend its share holders (i.e. Government) from the year 2011-2012 to 2014-2015. For the year 2015-2016, it is proposed to pay dividend of Rs. 345.01 lakh to the Government.

ARASU RUBBER CORPORATION LIMITED

- Arasu Rubber Corporation Limited has ISO 9001-2008 quality Certificate.

- The total manpower utilized in the Corporation in the past four years is 14,00,772 mandays.

- Rs.572.84 lakh was paid as bonus to the workers and staff during the last 4 years.
- High yielding clone rubber seedlings have been planted in 710.97 ha during last four years.
- Rs.5.69 crore was sanctioned and paid to M/s TANTEA as inter-corporate loan. Of this Rs.3 crore alone was recovered without return.
- Rs.2 lakh per year was sanctioned to the Forest Department in connection with Wild Life Week celebrations during the last Four years.
- Rs. 2 lakh per year was sanctioned to the Forest Department in connection with the All India Forest Sports Meet.

- Revision of wages to Field Supervisors from 15.06.2013 has been ordered.
- The Government have allotted Rs.40 lakh to provide labour amenities to the workers of this Corporation through HADP.
- To improve the retail sale of tea, TANTEA has started production and sale of White tea, Green Tea and hand-rolled green tea to keep pace with the developments in tea market.
- TANTEA has started selling flavoured tea varieties and black pepper through the dealers and through online marketing websites
- In the year ended 31.03.2013, 333.09 lakh kg green leaf tea was harvested through which 79 lakh kgs of tea was produced. In the current year, a target of 390 lakh kg of green leaf tea has been set.
- In the financial year 2012-2013, Rs. 4.77 crore has been given as loans and grant to C and D workers of the Corporation.
- Government has increased the paid-up Share capital in this corporation and released

The wholesale traders are appointed in Coimbatore, Thanjavur, Tiruvarur, Tiruppur and Kanniyakumari, Puducherry (Union Territory), Tirunelveli, Pudukottai, South Chennai, Central Chennai and Cuddalore.
- Tantea's Tigerhill Factory has won the Golden Tea India Prize in the competition jointly organized by the Tea Corporation and UPASI. This has raised the prestige of the Tantea which is likely to improve the procurement among the traders.
- In retail 34,564,190 kgs. of tea was sold for an amount of Rs.64,30,843.
- To modernize the tea factories, two new CTC machines for Nelliyalam tea factory, and one CTC and dryer for Ryon Tea Factory have been supplied. It has been planned to purchase two new cylinders for Queen Garden factory. Steps are being taken to purchase eatter for Ryon Factory and sorters for Ryon Cherangkadu and Cherampadi tea factories.



Incomparable Budgets for Enriching Tamil Nadu



- For the first time in the history of Tamil Nadu, budget estimate exceeded Rs.1 lakh crore in the past five years.
- The total estimated Revenue receipts have crossed Rs.1 lakh crore in the past three years.
- The percentage of Fiscal Deficit to GSDP has been maintained at below 3% in the last four years.
- The debt to GSDP ratio has been maintained within the norms of Central Finance Commission.
- As per the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Fiscal Responsibility Act 2003, the outcomes of the review have been placed before the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly.
- Lifetime Family Pension has been extended to the Unmarried/divorced/widowed daughters of pensioners.

- Medical assistance to the Government employees has been enhanced from Rs.2 lakh to Rs.4 lakh under the New Health Insurance Scheme. Under this scheme, Rs.650.05 crore has been availed as medical assistance by 1,64,810 beneficiaries from 01.07.2012 to 31.12.2015.
- Financial assistance to family members of deceased pensioners has been enhanced from Rs.35,000/- to Rs.50,000/-.
- Orders were issued extending the Tamil Nadu Government Pensioners Family Security Fund Scheme to the State Government Employees permanently absorbed in State Public Sector Undertakings/ Central Public Sector Undertakings/ Autonomous Bodies etc.
- Festival Advance has been enhanced to Rs.2,000/- to all the Tamil Nadu Government Pensioners.
- The “Tamil Nadu Vision 2023” document envisaging an investment of Rs.15 lakh crore for infrastructure development of State was released by the Hon’ble Chief Minister.
- A sum of Rs.2,000 crore has been provided in the Budget Estimates 2014-2015 under Tamil Nadu Infrastructure Development Fund. It is envisaged that about 20% of the project cost will be funded for bridging any viability gap in implementation of the infrastructure projects under Public Private Partnership.
- New banking Sub-treasuries have been established in 14 Taluk headquarters.
- Thoothukudi District Treasury building and new buildings for 14 Sub-treasuries have been constructed at a total cost of Rs.9.07 crore.
- Opening of 9 new Sub-Treasuries in 9 Revenue Taluks.
- Construction of building at an estimated cost of Rs.19.82 crore for the 33 Sub-Treasuries now functioning in Rental Buildings.
- Administrative sanction accorded for construction of own building at an estimated cost of Rs.11.31 crore for 17 Sub-Treasuries now functioning in the Rental Building.
- 3 more New Regional Joint Director Offices created at Coimbatore, Vellore and Tirunelveli in Treasuries and Accounts Department.
- Construction of Office complex at an estimated cost of Rs.21.60 crore for the departments under the administrative control of Finance Department which are at present functioning in Rental Buildings in Chennai.
- The New Health Insurance Scheme, for Pensioners / Family Pensioners has been sanctioned on cashless basis with the quantum of Assistance fixed at Rs.2 lakh for a block period of four years.
- Release of the “Tamil Nadu Vision 2023 Volume II” by Hon’ble Chief Minister on 21.02.2014.
- Monthly Hill Allowance for Government Servants serving in Hilly areas has been enhanced from Rs.900/- to Rs.1,500/- with effect from 20.02.2014.
- Monthly winter allowance for Government Servants serving in Hilly areas between 1,000 metres and 1,499 metres above average sea level have been enhanced from Rs.250/- to Rs. 400/- with effect from 20.02.2014.
- Monthly winter allowance for Government Servants serving in hilly areas above 1,500 metres above average sea level has been

enhanced from Rs.350/- to Rs.500/- with effect from 20.02.2014.

- New Internal Audit Offices were formed in Theni, Ariyalur, Perambalur, Thiruvavarur, Krishnagiri and Thiruvallur in line with the concept that there should be one Internal Audit Office for every District.
- For Internal Audit and Statutory Boards Audit Department, 40 Inspectors and 400 Assistant Inspectors sanctioned temporarily for Noon Meal Scheme audit were made permanent.
- In the last four years, Rs.278.02 crore was sanctioned to 1,02,361 pensioners under the Pensioners Health Fund Scheme.
- Based on the suggestion of C&AG and also taking into account the principles advocated for Central Public Sector Undertakings by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India, Government of Tamil Nadu has formulated a common dividend policy. As per this, the State Public Sector Undertakings shall declare dividend at 30% of Net Profit (after tax) (or) 30% of paid up share capital, whichever is higher, subject to availability of disposable profits.
- For incurring Capital Expenditure the State Public Sector Undertakings have been classified as 'A' Category Undertakings and 'B' Category Undertakings based on their investments, size, volume of activities and turnover.
- The ceiling limit in respect of "A' Category Undertakings has been enhanced from Rs.2 crore to Rs.10 crore and in respect of 'B' Category Undertakings from Rs.1 crore to Rs.5 crore so as to enable the Board of Directors of the respective PSUs to accelerate approvals of the projects quickly.
- Based on the recommendations of the Pay Grievance Redressal Cell, Government has sanctioned notional increment to a Government Servant whose increment falls on the day following superannuation on completion of one full year of service for the purpose of pensionary benefits.
- As per the recommendation of 2nd State Finance Commission, the Tamil Nadu Local Fund Audit Act' 2014 (TN Act No. 24 of 2014) was enacted by the Legislative Assembly with effect from 14.12.2014.
- New Regional Joint Director Office has been established at Salem in the department of Local Fund Audit.
- An additional fund of Rs.1,012.31 crore has been allocated in the Supplementary estimates for implementation of various new schemes including 37 new schemes under Tamil Nadu Innovation Initiatives schemes as recommended by State Planning Commission in the second round for the year 2015-2016.
- In New Health Insurance Scheme, 2014 for Pensioners (including Spouse)/ Family pensioners, a sum of Rs.65.94 crore has been availed as medical assistance by 25,009 beneficiaries.
- Under the Tamil Nadu Government Pensioners Family Security Fund Scheme, in the past five years a sum of 195.54 crore have been disbursed to the 52,520 family members of the deceased pensioners.

Weaving Schemes for a Bright Future in the Textile front



DEPARTMENT OF HANDLOOMS AND TEXTILES

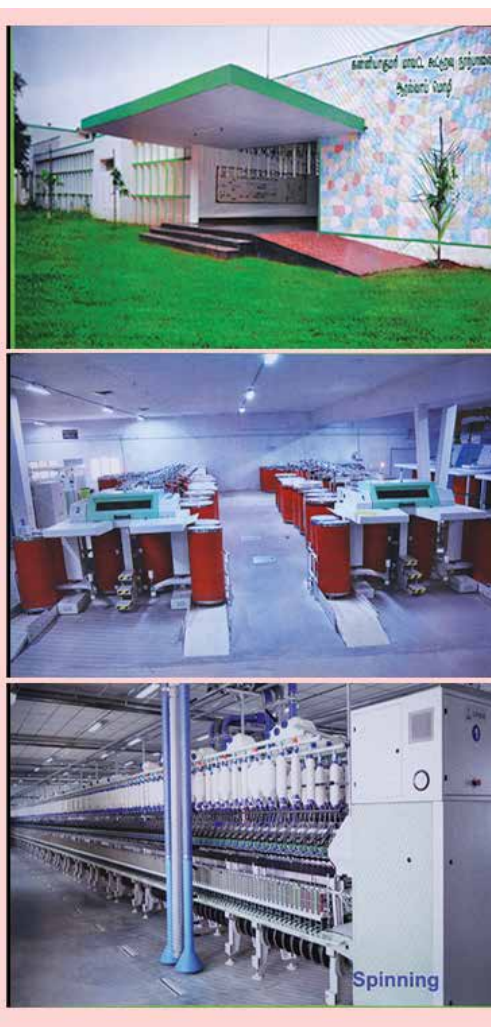
- The Old Age Pension payable to the Weavers under Tamil Nadu Co-operative Handloom Weavers Old Age Pension Scheme has been enhanced from Rs.400/- to Rs.1,000/- per month from 01.01.2012. 20,456 Handloom Weavers benefited.
- The Family Pension payable under Tamil Nadu Cooperative Handloom Weavers Family Pension Scheme has been enhanced from Rs.550/- to Rs.1,000/- per month with effect from 01.01.2012. 1,486 families benefited.
- Due to stoppage of Central share of 4 per cent under Savings and Security Scheme by Government of India, the State Government has ordered to enhance the State share of 4 paise to 8 paise. 71,842 weavers are getting benefits.
- The payment of Interest Subsidy on Quarterly basis to the Handloom Weavers Co-operative Societies has been modified and paid on monthly basis from November 2012. For the past 4 years, Interest Subsidy to the extent of Rs.57.43 crore (upto 30.11.2015) has been paid.
- In order to improve the quality of the Sarees under cost free Sarees and Dhothies Scheme,

60 Nos Polycot Sarees has been introduced and the scheme implemented at a cost of Rs.486.36 crore during Pongal 2014. The same design is followed and a provisions of 486.36 crore have been released in Budget Estimate 2015-2016.

- The Weavers who are engaged in cost free Sarees and Dhothies Schemes have been given additional wages of Rs.20.50 per Saree and Rs.10.30 per Dhoty for Pre-loom activities from the year 2012-2013. Due to this, 11,000 Handloom Weavers and their family members are benefited.
- The supply of uniform has been increased to 2 sets instead of one set of Uniform, from 2011 and 4 sets of uniforms with new colours were supplied from the Academic year 2012-2013 to the students studying in 1st std to 8th std who are beneficiaries under Puratchi Thalaivar MGR Nutritious Meal Programme at a cost of Rs.350 crore. By way of this, 45.86 lakh students are getting benefits.
- The closed Ramanathapuram District Co-operative Spinning Mills has been modernized at a cost of Rs.28.02 crore and reopened on 04.03.2015 and commenced its production.
- The closed Tamil Nadu Co-operative Textile Processing Mills at Erode was re-opened on 10.06.2011 by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu and the mill once again commenced its production. The Mill earned a net profit of Rs.8.43 crore during 2011-2015.

A sum of Rs.5.82 crore has been sanctioned towards modernisation of the mill.

- Sanctioned Rs.179.34 crore as interest free loan to Common Effluent Treatment Plants to achieve Zero Discharge of effluents at Tiruppur.
- Sanctioned Rs.300 crore towards subsidy for settling the principal amount due to the Bank towards the loan obtained by 18 Common Effluent Treatment Plants to establish Zero Liquid Discharge at Tiruppur.
- The Government have allotted a sum of Rs.260 crore towards construction of 10,000 Green Houses for weavers under Chief Minister's Green House Scheme at a cost of Rs.2.60 lakh per House (Rs.2.30 lakh for construction and Rs.30,000 for Solar Power Light). Accordingly, all the 10,000 Green Houses have been constructed. Installation of Solar Power is being done.
- The Government have implemented the Scheme of Free Electricity upto 100 units bimonthly to 1,33,764 handloom weavers and upto 500 bimonthly to 1,01,410 powerloom weavers at a cost of Rs.757 crore.
- Under the scheme of "Revival, Reform and Restructuring Package for Handloom Sector" financial assistance of Rs.147.71 crore have been sanctioned for the benefit of 718 Handloom Weavers Co-operative Societies, 520 individual weavers and Co-optex during the year 2012-2013 and 2013-2014. Apart from this, during the year 2014-2015 a grant of Rs.285.60 lakh has



been released towards computerization and common accounting system for 718 Primary Weavers Co-operative Societies.

- The salary of 424 staff working in the Weavers Co-operative Societies on consolidated pay for more than 10 years have been regularised by providing the special time scale of pay. In order to redress the grievances of employees of the Weavers Cooperative Societies, a Committee has been constituted to examine the revision of pay structure of employees.
- With a view to encourage the handloom weavers who have been supporting for the development of Handloom Weavers

Co-operative Societies in terms of production and sales, a scheme of giving cash award of Rs.1,00,000/-for “best weaver” has been introduced and the best weaver award is given to a weaver of Thirubuvanam Silk Weavers Co-operative Society, for the year 2013-2014. Similarly, best weaver award for the year 2014-2015 was also given to a weaver of Thirubuvanam Chozhan Silk Handloom Weavers Co-operative Society.

- In order to improve the wage earning capacity of handloom weavers the Government have decided to provide Pedal looms to Handloom Weavers and ordered to supply 6,000 Pedal

Looms over a period of 3 years at 2,000 Pedal Looms per year at a cost of Rs.24 crore (Rs.40,000/-per Pedal Loom). In the first phase, Rs.8 crore has been released for the year 2013-2014 and also a sum of Rs.8 crore has been released for the year 2014-2015. So far 5,450 Pedalooms have been supplied.

- A Mega Handloom Cluster is proposed to be setup at Trichy, comprising the District of Trichy, Ariyalur, Perambalur and Thanjavur District. Tamil Nadu Handloom Development Corporation has been appointed as the Cluster Management and Technical Agency of the above Mega Cluster. Towards implementation of the Scheme, so far a sum of Rs.2.26 crore has been released.
- Rs.3.75 crore was sanctioned towards supply of 25,000 motorised pirn winding machines at Rs.1,500/- each to the weavers of handloom Weavers Co-operative Societies. Accordingly, motorized pirn winding machines have been supplied to 25,000 handloom weavers.
- In order to install 10 shuttleless Auto-loom in the powerloom complexes at Coimbatore and Aruppukottai through Tamil Nadu Textile Corporation, a sum of Rs.4.78 crore has been sanctioned. Accordingly, 10 Air Jet looms have been installed and production has commenced from March 2015.
- In order to provide timely supply of Warp yarn required for weavers so as to provide continuous employment, a sum of Rs.80 lakh has been sanctioned to provide Motorised Warping Machines to Handloom Weavers

Co-operative Societies at a cost of Rs.80 lakh at Rs.80,000/- each. Accordingly, Motorized Warping Machines were supplied to 100 Handloom Weavers Co-operative Societies.

- In order to modernise the ordinary powerlooms by providing a subsidy of Rs.10,000/- per loom, a sum of Rs.80 lakh has been sanctioned to modernise 800 powerlooms. Accordingly, 800 powerlooms of Salem, Erode, Tiruppur, Namakkal, Coimbatore and Madurai Districts are being modernized.
- Under Integrated Handloom Development Scheme, as many as 41 Common Facility Centres (CFCs) have been sanctioned during the period from 2011-2012 to 2014-2015 and construction work for all the Common Facility Centres have been completed.
- The 5 functional Co-operative Spinning Mills viz. Kanniyakumari, Bharathi, Anna, Pudukottai and Krishnagiri Co-operative Spinning Mills were modernized at a project cost of Rs.147.21 crore and the same has been inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 13.11.2015 through Video Conferencing.
- In order to introduce new technology in Designing, the Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs.120 lakh towards purchase of 100 Electronic Jacquard Machines for Handlooms under State Innovation Fund for the year 2015-2016.
- To reduce the strain in weaving and also to improve their productivity, thereby getting higher earnings, the Government have

sanctioned a sum of Rs.45 lakh towards supply of 100 Pneumatics Handloom for Handloom Weavers under State Innovation Fund for the year 2015-2016.

- In order to improve the Dyeing process, the Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs.30 lakh towards installation of 25 Tub Dyeing Units with 6 Arms Dyeing Machines in Silk Handloom Weavers Co-operative Societies under State Innovation Fund for the year 2015-2016.
- The Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs.3 lakh towards purchase of 25 Washing-cum-Rinsing Machines for the Silk Dyeing Units under State Innovation Fund for the year 2015-2016.
- The Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs.120 lakh towards Repositioning Co-optex as a premium brand through the launch of niche boutique under State Innovation Fund for the year 2015-2016.
- In order to update the designs according to the changing trends in the market, the Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs.225 lakh towards purchase of 2,000 Motorized Jacquard Machines for Handlooms under State Innovation Fund for the year 2015-2016.

DEPARTMENT OF SERICULTURE

- Tamil Nadu is the leading state in Bivoltine silk production at National level.
- 52% in total silkworm layings consumption is distributed as chawkie worms, which is the highest performance at National level.

- Productivity of cocoons per 100 Silkworm layings is 73.9 kgs, which is the highest performance at National Level.
- Keeping in mind the non-availability of own building for Directorate of Sericulture at Salem, a new building was constructed at a cost of Rs.1.65 crore.
- Additional building for training classes and Hostel at a cost of Rs.2 crore was constructed for TamilNadu Sericulture Training Institute, Hosur, which is functioning for imparting training in Sericulture technologies.
- In order to improve the production and quality of silk, improved new Multi-end Silk reeling machineries were installed at all the eight Government Silk reeling units, at a cost of Rs. 80 lakh.
- During the year 2013-2014 the scheme “One farmer in each Panchayat” was implemented in 300 panchayats; by this, 323 new farmers took up Sericulture.
- Under “Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme”, 50 Farm Ponds during 2013-2014 and 30 Farm Ponds during 2014-2015 were established in Government Silk Farms.
- Subsidy assistance for installation of Drip irrigation system in Mulberry gardens has been increased from 75% to 100%. The unit Cost was increased as Rs. 30,000/- per acre and maximum eligibility of subsidy per farmer also increased as 5 acres. Rs.1,677.99 lakh had been released as subsidy to the beneficiaries for drip irrigation systems installed in 6,791 acres by this Government.

- Subsidy assistance for planting mulberry was increased as Rs. 10,500/- per acre and maximum eligibility per farmer also increased as 5 acres and Rs.52,500/- was sanctioned to farmers. Since the assumption of this Government Rs. 1,462.27 lakh had been released as subsidy to 12,802 beneficiaries for mulberry planted in 18,460 acres.
- Subsidy assistance for procurement of improved Silkworm rearing appliances and farm equipment was increased as Rs.52,500/- per farmer; Rs. 2,325 lakh had been released to 5,200 beneficiaries since 2011-2012.
- Financial assistance for construction of silkworm rearing houses.
- Tamil magazine “Pattu Malar” at the rate of Rs.2/- per magazine is being sold to 14,000 Silk farmers.
- Providing “Crop Insurance Scheme” to the farmers for Silkworm rearing houses and rearing appliances, who are involved in sericulture.
- In order to support the small / marginal farmers, in the first time, 100 Nos. of Micro Level Chawkie Rearing Centres were established during 2012 -2013.
- In view of increasing the Mulberry leaf yield, Micro Nutrients worth of Rs. 40 lakh were supplied at free of cost to the sericulture farmers.
- During 2012-2013, 5,100 Sericulture farmers were imparted one day training cum one day exposure visit, at a cost of Rs.25.50 lakh.
- The scheme “Health Insurance” was implemented with Government financial assistance for benefiting women farmer and their family members, who are working in Government units.
- In view of filling up the vacant posts in field level functionaries of Sericulture Department, 93 Junior Inspectors and 16 Assistant Inspectors were recruited during 2013-2014.
- During 2014-2015, training to 2,000 farmers and 500 Silk-reeling workers was given under “Integrated Skill Development Scheme”, for which Rs. 49.25 lakh has been provided as state Government’s share. Similarly steps were taken to recruit 157 Junior Inspectors 14 Assistant Inspectors during 2014-2015.

MARKETING

- Co-optex has effected a Retail sale of Rs.217.91 crore during 2011-2012, Rs.244.61 crore during 2012-2013, Rs.301.44 crore during 2013-2014 and Rs.306.57 crore During 2014-2015. Current year upto 31.12.2015, Rs.223.68 crore (Last year for the same period sales effected was Rs.216.30 crore). Total sale of handloom and powerloom varieties is Rs.1,293.53 crore (upto 31.12.2015)
- The Scheme “Buy 2 Get 1 Free” introduced by Co-optex from 2011-2012 is being continued during the year 2014-2015. A sales of Rs.34.84 crore

during 2011-2012, Rs.27.32 crore during 2012-2013 and Rs.36.54 crore during 2013-2014 and Rs.29.40 crore during 2014-2015 was effected by this scheme. Total Rs.128.10 crore sales has been effected.

- Deepavali Festival sales was Rs.67.70 crore during 2011, Rs.101.28 crore during 2012, Rs.121.29 crore during 2013, Rs.127.25 crore during 2014 and Rs.135.18 crore during 2015. Total Deepavalli sales was Rs.552.70 crore.
- Pongal Festival sales was Rs.43.85 crore during 2012: Rs.52.50 crore during 2013, Rs.64.62 crore during 2014 and Rs.70.46 crore during 2015, Total Rs.231.43 crore sales was effected.

Modernization

- From 2011-2012 upto December 2015 (4 Years and 9 Months) Co-optex has Modernized 32 showrooms at the Expenditure of Rs. 487.85 lakh.

Textile Library

- Textile Library has been established at Co-optex Head Office exhibition ground at a total Cost of Rs.25 lakh which is equipped with 511 Textile related books, weekly, fortnightly and monthly magazines, other textile journals and video collections on handloom weaving for the benefits of weavers, students and public.

Design Studio

- The Design Studio has been established at Co-optex Head Office at a cost of

Rs.15 lakh. With the design input provided through this Design Studio so far around 1,110 new designs have been developed and introduced through Co-optex outlets which were highly appreciated by the customers.

Textile Testing Laboratory

- Co-optex has setup Textile Laboratory at Head Office with the concept of providing quality textiles to its consumers.
- In continuation of the establishment of testing lab at Co-optex Head Office, with the financial support of Government, it has also launched laboratories at Salem, Erode, Coimbatore, Madurai and Kancheepuram production centres at an overall cost of Rs.10 lakh.
- Co-optex is engaged in the process of Research of Natural dyeing and fabric at the cost of Rs.8 lakh to promote green environment by producing eco-friendly textile.
- Co-optex is implementing the revival and value addition of traditional designs in handloom products Tamil Nadu under Part-II scheme at the cost Rs.14 lakh.

- The Government Of India sanctioned the Scheme of Virudhunagar Mega Handloom Cluster under Comprehensive Handloom Development Scheme (CHCDS) during the year 2009-2010, at a total financial out lay of Rs.87.68 crore of which Central Assistance is Rs.70 crore as grant —in — aid by Government of India and the balance amount has to be shared by the State Government and the beneficiaries. Till date, a total sum of Rs.31.07 crore has been released to Co-optex.
- Utilizing this funds, the Technology up-gradation scheme has been implemented and various hard interventions have been distributed to the Weavers which has been instrumental in increasing the productivity and three fold rise in the wage earning capacity of the Weavers.

Boutiques under Innovation Fund

- The Government have sanctioned an amount of Rs.1.20 crore under Tamil Nadu Innovation Initiatives Scheme for the year 2015-2016 for the modernization of 4 Co-optex Niche Boutique namely Chennai (Adyar), Cochin, Coimbatore and New Delhi (Khan Market) the work have been completed at the Chennai Showroom in Adayar and for the showrooms at Cochin and Coimbatore, the work is in progress and for New Delhi the tender process has been completed.

TAMILNADU HANDICRAFTS DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION LTD.

- The Tamil Nadu Handicrafts Development Corporation Limited is achieving a record sale of handicrafts worth of Rs.33 crore every year. The Corporation is aimed to achieve Rs.40 crore this year.
- The Corporation has increased the wages with effect from 01.06.2011 by 100 percent to its artisans working in the Poompuhar Production units in addition to this 50 percent of increase of wages sanctioned with effect from 2013, which resulted to earn a sum of Rs.15,000/- to Rs.20,000/- monthly by the Poompuhar Artisans.
- With the financial assistance of Rs.50 lakh from Government of Tamil Nadu, 'Poompuhar State Awards' have been given to 54 artisans. Poompuhar State Awards were given for the year 2014-2015 on 30.03.2015. This award shall be given every year to 10 artisans.

- The Tamil Nadu Government has introduced a new award namely “Poompuhar District Craft Award” in 2011-2012. This award consists of a cash prize of Rs.5,000/-, silver medal and a merit certificate. This award is being given every year to 85 craftspersons. Totally 255 artisans have been conferred this award upto 2014-2015.
- A three year training scheme in Bronze Icons at Swamimalai to 8 young trainees was commenced from 15.09.2012 and completed by 14.09.2015.
- A two year training scheme in Brass lamps at Nachiarkoil to 8 young trainees was commenced from 15.09.2012 and completed on 14.09.2014.
- A one year training scheme in Thanjavur Art Plates at Thanjavur for 8 women was organized from 15.09.2012 to 14.09.2013.
- During the year 2013-2014 as announced by the Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu under rule 110, “One year training in making of Thanjavur Painting for 100 Women” at Srirangam, Trichy District, at a cost of Rs.83 lakh commenced from 06.11.2013 is successfully completed on 05.11.2014.
- The Government have introduced a new prestigious award on yearly basis. During 2013-2014 namely “Living Craft Treasure” was introduced to be conferred on ten Awardees aged above 65 years. This award consists of a cash prize of Rs. 1 lakh, a thamirapathiram, an eight gram Gold Medal and a Certificate. Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu have distributed this award for the year 2013-2014.
- The Government of Tamil Nadu is the only State in the country which has conferred highest number of awards (245 nos). namely “Poompuhar State Award”, “Poompuhar District Craft Award”, “Living Craft Treasure Award”, “Gen next Award”, “Team Production Award”, “Utility Based Handicrafts Award” & “Handicrafts Export Award”.
- “The training in making of traditional wood carvings of Tamil Nadu” is being given to 10 young artisans at Chinna Salem, Villupuram District at a cost of Rs.6 lakh which has commenced on 04.10.2013, completed on 03.10.2014.
- To provide additional marketing opportunities to handicrafts artisans of Tamil Nadu in various important cities all over India,. The Corporation has organised 1,049 exhibitions. The Corporation has planned to conduct 250 exhibitions during 2015-2016.
- During March 2012 and January 2013 “Thematic Exhibitions” were organized in Singapore.
- With a view to increase the sale of handicrafts of Tamilnadu in other States and in abroad, the Government of Tamil Nadu has introduced a scheme in 2013-2014 with a grant of Rs.50 lakh to provide financial assistance of Rs.25,000/- to the artisans who have participate in other State exhibitions and Rs.50,000/- to the participants of exhibitions at abroad.

- The Corporation has introduced a competition styled as “Gen Next Artisans” from the year 2013-2014 and conducted competition in 13 centres, and conferred first prize to 66 artisans, second prize to 66 artisans totally 132 artisans were honoured with a Silver Medal and a certificate at a cost of Rs. 6.50 lakh. This award is given every year. 48 young artisans were selected and honoured with a Silver Medal and a certificate on 30.03.2015.
- From the year 2015-2016 the artisans selected for Gen Next competition will get a cash price of Rs.2000/- in addition to the silver medal and a certificate.
- As per the announcement of the Government, the Corporation has commenced a 6 month training scheme in making of Papier Mache dolls for 50 women in Srirangam on 31.03.2015 at a cost of Rs. 80 lakh with financial assistance of Government of Tamilnadu. During the course of training, the ingredients for making the products and a stipend of Rs. 3,000/-per month are being given to the trainees.
- At present, the Corporation has introduced a three-year training scheme by reviving the traditional method of “Gurukulam” in Bronze Icon making, at Swamimalai. Similarly, another three-year training scheme at a cost of Rs. 30 lakh is commenced at Erode with financial assistance of Tamil Nadu Government.

- Since certain handicrafts products cannot be manufactured by a single artisan and a team work is needed. With a view to appreciate the team of artisans, “Team Production Award” has been introduced during 2014-2015 which was conferred on 3 teams on 30.03.2015 at a cost of Rs. 3.75 lakh. For 2015-2016 3 teams were selected for this award and awards will be distributed shortly.
- “Utility Handicraft Production Award” was conferred on 3 artisans from 2014-2015 on 30.03.2015 at a cost of Rs. 3.75 lakh. This award is to be given to those artisans who create utility based new designs. For 2015-2016, 3 artisans were selected for this award and awards will be distributed shortly.
- The Corporation, with a view to increase direct marketing of handicrafts goods and thereby improve the standard of living of the artisans, has organized 277 exhibitions during the financial year 2014-2015 as against 255 exhibitions organized during 2013-2014 at a cost of Rs. 225 lakh. Government has ordered to sanction financial assistance of Rs.45 lakh being 20% of the total expenditure, considering the welfare of the artisans.
- Under the Part-II scheme for the year 2014-2015 the Corporation proposes of implementing the following three schemes :-

- Considering the speedy development of industries in and around Oragadam and sriperumbudur in Kancheepuram district, it was decided to improve the road infrastructure facilities under Oragadam Industrial Corridor Project. The works are being under implementation in three phases.

Phase –I works

- Singaperumal koil – Sriperumbudur road (SH-57) km 0/6 to 24/6 (24 km) – widening the road to four lane with centre median. Vandalur – Wallajabad road (SH-48) Km 30/4 to 63/8 (33.40 km) – widening the road to four lane with center median. Construction of a Grade Separator at Oragadam junction in Vandalur – Wallajabad road.
- Out of 57.40 km, 52.90 km have been completed. Out of balance 4.50 km, 0.40 km work is in progress. The work of construction of a Grade Separator at Oragadam junction

has been completed. Value of work done so far Rs.476.82 crore.

Phase-II works

- In the second phase, the work of ‘improvements to the existing four laning to six laning at km 12/6 to 24/6 in Singaperumalkoil – Sriperumbudur road (12 Km)’ has been taken up.
- Out of 12 km, 11.20 km have been completed. The balance 0.80 km is held up due to LA and is in advanced stage. Value of work done so far Rs.90.90 crore.

Phase-III work

- ‘Improvements from four laning to six laning of Singaperumalkoil – Sriperumpudur road km 0/6-12/6’ was takenup.
- Out of 12 km road formation, cross drainage and construction of retaining wall works are in progress for a length of 5 km. Value of work done so far Rs.32.59 crore.

Bypasses

- Formation of bypass to Ilayankudi, Ettukudy, Thuraiyur, Perambalur (Phase I& II), Dharapuram (Phase I and Phase II), Pattukkottai (Phase I), Hosur (phase II), Vandavasi, Nagapattinam, Ramanathapuram and Kumbakonam at a cost of Rs. 163.94 crore has been completed.

The study was conducted through M/s. Indian Institute Technology Madras (IITM), Chennai and part of this roads to as length of 2867 Km were studied and prioritized based on economic return consideration.
- The Tamil Nadu Infrastructure Development Board (TNIDB) under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister has allotted Rs. 65 crore for carrying out DPR Preparation for a length of 575 km.
- Project was appraised by the World Bank and initially a loan amount to an extent of US\$ 300 Million Covering Road Upgradation



to a length of 572 Kms, Maintenance, Road Safety and Institutional Enhancement Components were approved by World Bank. The loan and the project agreement were signed on 28.05.2015 and loan became effective on 10.07.2015.

- Agreement was executed for Construction of civil works for widening and upgrading of approximately 427 km of roads through Engineering, Procurement, Construction (EPC) contracts including maintenance for a 5 year period after the construction in 10 packages for Rs. 1,705 crore.
- Maintenance for a length of 597 km from Arcot – Thiruvavur and Nagapattinam-Tutocorin corridors adopting Output and Performance based Road Contracts (OPRC) concept, were award recently. For widening to 4 lane and improvement of 145 km of roads under Public Private Partnership (PPP) concept, tender will be invited shortly.

- Government has given revised administrative sanction for Rs. 5,171 Crore for the initial phase of the project covering civil, Institutional Capacity Enhancement (ICE) components, Road safety and Land Acquisition (LA), Rehabilitation and Resettlement(R&R) cost.

Infrastructure Development

- New division offices have been formed at Edapady, Perambalur and Cheyyar.
- E-PATHAI (Electronic, Project, Administration, Traffic, Highway Assets and Information Management System) software was launched to maintain the road in a high tech manner including GIS, P&FMS and RMS. In addition, two Advanced Data Collection Equipment (ADCE) equipments purchased at a cost of Rs 3 crore.

Police

- Cultivation of poppy plant was detected in Paalamalai village under the jurisdiction of Kolathur Police Station (Salem). The banned narcotics (120 kg worth Rs. 1.20 lakh) was seized and the accused arrested.
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister presented rewards totalling Rs. 2.65 crore to 251 police personnel who were engaged in the arrest of fundamentalists in the last one year.

- The work of construction of 33,234 tenements in Chennai, Madurai and Coimbatore at a cost of Rs.1,741.26 crore have been completed under JNNURM and construction of 9,084 tenements at a cost of Rs.650 crore is in progress.
- 12,009 sale deeds (Tenements-5,354; Plots-6,655) have been issued.
- Reconstruction of 3,500 dilapidated tenements at a cost of Rs.280 crore in Chennai and other towns is in progress. Reconstruction of another 1,172 dilapidated tenements at a cost of Rs.93.46 crore by mobilizing funds from various sources is in progress.
- Socio-Economic Survey of 5.20 lakh slum families in 2,596 slum areas in 10 Cities has been completed under Rajiv Awas Yojana. For providing housing facilities to these slum dwellers and to make cities slum free, Slum Free Cities Plan of Action at a cost of Rs.62,810.18 crore has been approved by the Government of India.
- The Government of India has sanctioned construction of 6,055 concrete houses along with other development works in 21 slum areas at a cost of Rs.414.25 crore and work for construction of 4,918 houses is under progress.
- Tamil Nadu Slum Clearance Board has undertaken special repair works to the tenements in Chennai and other cities at a cost of Rs.26 crore.
- In order to provide better livable space for slum families, Tamil Nadu Slum Clearance

Board has decided to increase the plinth area of slum tenements constructed by it from 325 sq.ft to 400 sq.ft.

- In order to improve the facilities in slum areas, development works such as roads and street lights, have been undertaken in 456 urban slums of Tamil Nadu at a cost of Rs.34.05 crore. This has benefited 1.04 lakh slum families.



DIRECTORATE OF TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING

- Directorate of Town and Country Planning has sanctioned various infrastructure projects costing more than Rs.1,600 crore to various departments.

SCHEMES IMPLEMENTED UNDER GRANT FUNDING FROM TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING DEVELOPMENT FUND

Heritage town development programme

- The Directorate of Town and Country Planning enhanced the grant from Rs.50 lakh to Rs.1 crore for improving the infrastructure of heritage towns. Grant of Rs.22.23 crore has been sanctioned for 26 heritage towns during the last five years.

Traffic improvement Programme

- The department enhanced grant under Traffic improvement programme from a maximum of Rs.50 lakh for the Corporations and Rs.25

lakh to the Municipalities to Rs.1 crore and Rs.50 lakh respectively from Financial Year 2011-2012 onwards. In the last 4 years, Rs.12.31 crore has been sanctioned to the Municipal Corporations and Municipalities.

- An amount of Rs.14.51 crore was sanctioned between 2011 - 2015 to 3 Municipal Corporations and 32 Municipalities under Traffic Improvement Programme.

Park improvement programme

- An amount of Rs.14.93 crore has been sanctioned for improvement of 140 parks under Park Improvement Programme.
- The Grant amount under Park Improvement Programme has been enhanced to Rs.10 lakh from earlier limit of Rs.2.25 lakh and Rs.10.93 crore has been sanctioned for improvement of 131 Parks.

Projects taken up under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund

- Under infrastructure and amenities charges, funds for carrying out major

projects have been provided to the tune of Rs.1,639.61 crore.

Master Plan

- The Government has issued orders, to prepare the complete scheme and regional scheme, in three phases at a total cost of Rs.41crore for the entire Town and Country Planning area. In the first phase consisting of 8,447 Sq.km, the work is nearing completion.

Detailed Development Plan

- In the last four years, 150 detailed development plans / Micro level plans have been taken up and completed.

2012-2013

- The Department has undertaken implementation of web based automated plan scrutiny system at an estimated cost of Rs.2.20 crore.

CHENNAI METROPOLITAN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

- Financial grant of Rs.389.42 crore has been sanctioned to Chennai Metro Rail Limited for developing area in front of Chennai Central Railway Station as a hub of integrated multi modal transport system.
- Chennai Metropolitan Development Authority completed construction of Wholesale Food Grain Market at Koyambedu consisting of 492 shops at an estimated cost of Rs.128.41 crore over an extent of 14.41 acres.
- To relieve traffic congestion and to reduce accidents due to haphazard parking of idle trucks along Inner Ring Road (IRR), CMDA has developed Truck Parking Yard

at Manjambakkam village abutting IRR on 11.64 acres at an estimate of Rs.22 crore, to accommodate about 400 commercial vehicles and provide amenities for the drivers.

- Chennai Metropolitan Development Authority has developed an Industrial layout Sithamanur area, Maraimalai Nagar, consisting of 30 Industrial plots on 32.26 acres of lands at an estimated cost of Rs.14 crore.
- Construction of Additional Double Level Basement Parking facility at CMBT, Koyambedu at an estimated cost of Rs.20 crore.
- Lands obtained from developers for forming 320 street alignment / Link Roads / Road widening. In 256 cases, lands have been handed over to agencies.
- 98 Local Bodies were provided assistance under Local Body Assistance Programme amounting to Rs.1,577.08 lakh.
- 24 community based environment and development schemes (CBED) costing to Rs.387.19 lakh were sanctioned to the Local Bodies.

CO-OPERATIVE HOUSING

- Under Interest waiver scheme, the Low Income Group, MIG and HIG beneficiaries were respectively given 75%, 50% and 25% interest along with 100% penal interest waiver. Due to this, an amount of Rs.513.41 crore was collected from 56,438 members.



Innovative ways for Industrial Growth, Great Success in Fostering Initiatives



- The State Government has signed 83 MoUs so far with an aggregate investment of Rs.1,35,992 crore.
- Guidance Bureau under Industries Department has attracted additional investments of Rs.4,466.93 crore in 47 projects through Single window facilitation.
- According to ASSOCHAM report titled, "States Emergence: A Comparative Analysis of Growth and Development" published



in February 2015, Tamil Nadu has been adjudged as the Best Performing State in terms of eight out of nine development parameters like economy, industrial development, combined infrastructure, power, roads, health, income & inequality and overall development.



- The Global Investors Meet 2015 conducted successfully on the 9th & 10th of September 2015 to show case the potential of the State and establish Tamil Nadu's position as an "Investors' Paradise" was a resounding success and attracted an investment of Rs.2,42,160 crore to the State generating employment for 4,70,065 persons by way of signing of 98 MoUs.
- Tamil Nadu Industrial Development Corporation (TIDCO) and Larsen and Toubro Limited have set up a Port Complex Shipbuilding Yard and Port through a Joint Venture with an investment of Rs. 3,375 crore in Kattupalli, Ponneri Taluk of Tiruvallur District. This project will provide direct employment for about 4,000 persons.
- TICEL Biotechnology Park-III at Anna University Campus, Coimbatore at a cost of Rs.55 crore.
- "Industrial Infrastructure Consolidated Fund" of Rs.100 crore has been created for

Infrastructure Development in SIPCOT Industrial Parks.

- SIPCOT has spent about Rs.486.98 crore for Infrastructure facilities in its Industrial Complexes/ Parks /New Industrial Park in the last five years.
- SIPCOT has created 20 Industrial Complexes/ Parks in 12 Districts. SIPCOT has allotted 3,374 acres of land for 432 Industrial Institutions with an investment of Rs. 15,218.52 crore. These companies have created employment for 72,648 persons.
- SIPCOT has formed a new company in the name of Madurai-Thoothukudi Industrial Corridor Development Corporation Limited to implement the Madurai-Thoothukudi Industrial Corridor project. Lands along the corridor are in various stages of acquisition.
- SIPCOT has acquired total extent of about 31,645 acres of land for setting up of Industrial Parks / Complexes / Growth Centres. 6,869 acres have been acquired during the last five years.

- Special Package of Incentives are offered from October 2013 to the existing and prospective entrepreneurs who invest in the existing as well as in the new Industrial Complexes / Industrial Parks of SIPCOT to be developed in the Southern Districts. The features of this special package are;

- ★ Allotment of land at 50% subsidized rate.
- ★ 100% exemption from stamp duty on Lease Deed registration.
- ★ Capital Subsidy increase from 1.5 to 2 times to the prospective entrepreneurs.
- ★ Creation of all infrastructure facilities required for industries.
- ★ Reduction in the minimum investment required for obtaining VAT based incentives from the present level of Rs.50 crore to Rs.10 crore.

- Under this scheme, an extent of 61.26 acres of land has been allotted in SIPCOT Industrial Complexes at Nilakkottai, Pudukkottai, Manamadurai, Thoothukudi and Gangaikondan to the Industries at 50% subsidised rate.

- Tamil Nadu Newsprint and

Papers Limited (TNPL) set up a Cement Plant with a capacity of 600 tonnes per day at a cost of Rs.148 crore producing cement from the sludge and fly ash in the Paper making Plant. This is the first time in India that Cement is produced, utilizing the sludge waste of a Paper plant within a paper mill. The capacity of this plant has been enhanced to 900 MTs per day at a cost of Rs.50 crore and the plant.

- TNPL has installed a state-of-the-art 300 tpd De-inking pulp plant at a cost of Rs.167 crore to augment the pulp production.
- TNPL has installed a new boiler by replacing three old boilers and a new 41 MW capacity turbo generator (TG) by replacing two less efficient old TGs of 18.5 MW capacity, at a cost of Rs.158 crore.
- TNPL is setting up a state-of-the-art Multi-layer Double Coated Board Plant of





a capacity of 2 lakh tonnes per annum at a cost of Rs.1,500 crore over an area of about 874 acres at Mondipatti village, Manapparai Taluk in Tiruchi District.

- TNPL has set up a 100 tonnes per day Wet Ground Calcium Carbonate (WGCC) plant in its Factory premises on Build Own and Operate basis through M/S OMYA, Switzerland.
- TNPL has set up a 200 tpd Precipitated Calcium Carbonate (PCC) Plant in its Factory premises on Build, Own and Operate basis through M/S OMYA, Switzerland.
- TNPL has set up “Center for Conversion of Paper and Packaging Board Unit” at Mayanur in Karur District, at an investment of Rs.30 crore.
- Government of Tamil Nadu has launched “AMMA Cement Supply Scheme” to provide cement at a concessional rate of Rs.190/- per bag to lower and middle income group of people in order to mitigate the hardships faced by them due to the rise of cement prices in the open market. About 11,44,133 MTS cement have been sold under this scheme till 29.01.2016.
- Tamil Nadu Salt Corporation Limited (TANSALT) has totally produced 9.70 lakh tonnes of Salt in the last five years.
- Tamil Nadu Salt Corporation Limited (TNSC) has installed a Salt Washery of 100 MT per hour capacity to improve the quality of salt at Mariyur Valinokkam in Ramanathapuram District at a cost of Rs.15 crore..

- In 2013-2014, the Government of Tamil Nadu launched three kinds of “AMMA” Salt to provide salt at cheaper prices in the Open Market. 13,373 Tonnes of Salt have been sold in this scheme till 29.01.2016.
- TANSALT had a turnover of Rs.137.53 crore through sales in the last five years.
- Loans to a total amount of Rs.1,859.06 crore were sanctioned by Tamil Nadu Industrial Investment Corporation Limited (TIIC) at an interest rate of 3% less than normal market rates to benefit 4,237 entrepreneurs under the interest subvention scheme.
- Generator loans totalling Rs.16.71 crore were sanctioned to 221 units by Tamil Nadu Industrial Investment Corporation Limited. The units have benefited through the scheme of 10% reduction in promoters contribution.
- The Department of Geology and Mining has earned Rs.4,413.68 crore as revenue from minerals from the years 2011-2012 to 2015-2016. (Upto December 2015)
- TAMIN established a Granite cutting and polishing Unit [100% Export Oriented Unit (EOU)] at Melur at a cost of Rs.42 crore.
- During the financial year 2013-2014, TAMIN achieved a sales turnover of Rs.188.87 crore which is the highest ever since its inception. Moreover in the same year TAMIN earned the highest net profit before tax Rs.24.69 crore.
- Rs. 45.71 crore worth of granite blocks and granite finished products were exported during 2013-2014.
- TAMIN has achieved Limestone sale of Rs.33.04 crore, Graphite Flakes Rs.30.33 crore, Indian Standard Sand Rs.7.10 crore and Exfoliated Vermiculite Rs.1.93 crore during the year 2014-2015.
- For the first time in the history of TANMAG, sales turnover achieved was Rs.110 crore during 2014-2015.
- TANMAG earned net profit (before Tax) of Rs.24.22 crore during 2014-2015, which is the highest since inception. The company earned a total of Rs.78.98 crore profit in the last five years.
- During last five years, the Public Sector Undertakings under the administrative control of Industries Department have earned a profit of Rs.1,976.18 crore and paid dividend of Rs.187.42 crore to Government.
- The State Government announced State Advisory Price of Rs. 2,100/- per tonnes to Sugarcane farmers in 2011-2012. This was enhanced to Rs.2,850/- for the year 2015-2016.
- Tamil Nadu Industrial Explosives Limited (TIEL) achieved a total export turnover of Rs.47.32 crore from may 2011 to December 2015.

- Tamil Nadu State Data Centre commissioned with effect from 01-08-2011 for supporting e-Governance initiatives under the National

e-Governance Programme

- At the National level, Tamil Nadu is the first State to get ISO/IEC 20000-1:2005 and 27001:2005 certificates for Data Centre Operations and Management of Information Security, which is an important milestone in the operation of Tamil Nadu State Data Centre.
- Tamil Nadu State Data Centre has now obtained upgraded ISO Certification in ISO/IEC 20000-1:2011 and ISO/IEC 27001:2013.
- About 39 Government applications of more than 20 Government Departments such as Tamil Nadu Health Systems Project,

Metro Rail Project, Electoral Rolls for the State Election Department, Distribution of Fan-Mixie-Grinder at no Cost Project, Distribution of Laptops to Students, e-Governance and e-District applications are being hosted at the Tamil Nadu State Data Centre (TNSDC).

- State Crime Records Bureau, Chennai Corporation, Information Technology Department (EFPS), Agriculture Department, Commissionerate of Municipal Administration(e-Office), ELCOT, Co-operation, Food and Consumer Protection and other Government Departments are also making use of the TNSDC.
- TNSDC is being upgraded with construction of a new building of 5,000 sq.ft. area to house 40 racks at a cost of Rs.40 Crore.

- A “Server Farm” has been created at Tamil Nadu State Data Centre with necessary hardware, software and testing tools. This will allow the departments to comply with Vulnerability Assessment and Penetration Tests before hosting applications.

CLOUD COMPUTING

- A Cloud was established in co-ordination with C-DAC at Tamil Nadu State Data Centre as a Pilot Scheme. The Saree-Dhoti application and ELCOT Enterprise Resource Planning – Facility Management Service (ERP-FMS) module is deployed in this Cloud. A full-fledged Cloud environment at Tamil Nadu State Data Centre is being planned and works are under way.

DISASTER RECOVERY CENTRE AND NEARLINE DISASTER RECOVERY CENTRE

- A Detailed Project Report for establishment of Disaster Recovery Centre for Tamil Nadu State Data Centre at Trichy is being finalised and selection of Operator is in process.
- In order to establish a Nearline Disaster Recovery Centre for the synchronous replication requirements of Tamil Nadu State Data Centre, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Central Government owned Data Centre is in process.

TAMIL NADU STATE WIDE AREA NETWORK AND NATIONAL KNOWLEDGE NETWORK (NKN)

- Fully State-funded Tamil Nadu State Wide Area Network (TNSWAN) Phase-II operations commenced from 09.09.2013 and horizontal connectivity has been provided to more than 2,000 offices of State Government Departments.

- A 1 Gbps link from National Knowledge Network (NKN) has been terminated in Tamil Nadu State Data Centre with 100 Mbps Internet Connectivity on 22.02.2012.
- The bandwidth at District Headquarters level is being upgraded to 34 Mbps/100 Mbps/1 Gbps depending on the usage through integration of NKN at District Headquarters level.

e-MAIL SOLUTION

- To provide seamless desktop connectivity and to adhere to the regulations with respect of storage and archival of email as official record, a Short Term e-mail solution has been launched through NIC-Secretariat with the available infrastructure. Provision of full fledged e-Mail Solution is developed.

E-DISTRICT PROJECT AND E-DISTRICT PORTAL

- e-District is one of the State Mission Mode Project under National e-Governance Plan (NeGP), which aims at electronic delivery of services to citizens through Arasu e-Sevai Centres. e-District services of Revenue, Social Welfare and other Government Services like Scholarships Schemes for BC&MBC and AD&TW are offered through these Centres.
- To implement and expand the e-District Project throughout the State, District e-Governance Societies (DeGS) have been set-up in all Districts and a sum of Rs.10 lakh has been sanctioned for each District. Now the DeGS are operational in all Districts.
- The e-District Services were expanded from 5 Districts to all the remaining 27 Districts on 24.02.2014 by the Hon’ble Chief Minister.
- A total of 1.17 crore of transactions have been made as on 31.12.2015.

- On-line registration facility with the Employment Exchange has been provided to the 10th and 12th standard passed students in their school itself and they can get their registration card from the Employment and Training Department without losing their seniority.
- 300 additional services of Government Departments will be offered by Arasu e-Sevai Centres along with the services already offered through e-District Portal.

ARASU e-SEVAI CENTRES

- To provide multiple Government services to the common man in his locality, Government has set-up Arasu e-Sevai Centres through ELCOT and Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation, Primary Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies (PACCS), Village Poverty Reduction Committees (VPRC) and Village Level Entrepreneurs (VLEs).
- Overall, a total of 11,120 Arasu e-Savai Centres have been established and are operational. Also, action is taken for establishment of Arasu eSevai Centres in all Village Panchayats.

URBAN ARASU e-SEVAI CENTRES

- The Hon'ble Chief Minister inaugurated 14 Urban Arasu e-Sevai Centres in Chennai and e-District Portal through video conferencing on 24.02.2014.
- These Centres have now been expanded to 520 with 200 being operated by ELCOT and 320 by Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation.

CREATION OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY CADRE

- As a step towards taking ahead the eGovernance initiatives in the Government Departments through-out the State, a

separate Information Technology Cadre has been created under the control of the Directorate of e-Governance with an initial strength of 98 posts. Action is being taken to fill-up these posts.

STATE RESIDENT DATA HUB (SRDH)

- Government have issued orders approving the creation of State Resident Data Hub (SRDH) to create biometry based citizens database from National Population Register (NPR) data with the identity being validated through the AADHAAR Number issued by Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI). The project is being implemented at a cost of Rs.25.93 crore.

TAMIL NADU GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (TNGIS)

- Government has accorded administrative approval for creation of Geographical Information System, a repository of digital maps that can be shared across all Government Departments for their use.

SMS BASED SERVICE TRACKING FACILITY

- In order to utilise the mobile phone penetration in the State, the Government of Tamil Nadu has accorded administrative approval for "SMS Based Service Tracking System" to enable the citizens to track the application submitted through e-District Portal using SMS facility.

DISTRIBUTION OF LAPTOPS TO STUDENTS

- As on 29.12.2015, 32,22,105 laptop computers have been supplied to students in Government and Government aided Schools and Colleges.

"WEB RATNA" AWARD

- For the years 2012 and 2014, the Tamil Nadu Government has won the "Web Ratna Award"

for “exemplary e-Governance initiatives and comprehensive web presence” given by Department of Electronics & Information Technology, Government of India.

TAMIL NADU ARASU CABLE TV CORPORATION LTD.

- The Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu revived the Arasu Cable TV Corporation which had become defunct due to various reasons and sanctioned a sum of Rs.3 Crore for the revival and expansion of the activities of the Corporation. The Corporation was renamed as Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation Limited (TACTV).
- The Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation launched its Cable TV Services throughout the State except Chennai on 02.09.2011 and in Chennai on 20.10.2012.
- The Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation is providing quality Cable TV Services at an affordable cost of Rs.70/- per month and the response from the Cable operators and the public were overwhelming. As on date, the Subscriber Base stood at 70.52 lakh and the Operator Base is 26,246.
- At present TACTV is providing the Cable TV services with 90-100 Channels, including Free-to-Air Channels, Pay Channels and Private Local Channels. The corporation has procured 137 pay Channels and almost all the Pay channels are in the bouquet of the Corporation.
- Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Government of India, has issued MSO License to the Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation in the Conditional Access System (CAS) areas of Chennai Metro. The TACTV Corporation will provide cable TV services in Digital mode in Chennai Metro Area, as soon as the Digital Addressable

System (DAS) License is issued to TACTV.

- Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation had entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with RailTel Corporation of India in order to provide Broadband and Internet Services through the Local Cable Operators throughout Tamil Nadu. Steps are being taken to enter into agreement with other Companies having Internet Services Provider Licence (ISP).
- Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation has launched the Arasu e-Sevai Centres in 12 places in Tiruvallur and Kancheepuram Districts in December 2014 and there is overwhelming response from the public for these Centres. Further, during February 2015, Arasu e-Sevai Centres were successfully started in another 224 Taluks all over Tamil Nadu.
- Hon’ble Chief Minister inaugurated 126 Arasu e-Sevai Centres on 11.01.2016 in the Chennai Corporation areas.

INTERNET AT EVERY HOUSEHOLD

- In order to implement the “BharatNet” project of Government of India in Tamil Nadu which is aimed at providing Government Services to citizens through Internet, action is taken to form “Tamil Nadu FibreNet Corporation” to execute the project at an estimated cost of Rs.3,000 crore along with Central share.
- By using the Internet Service Provider(ISP) License already obtained, Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation is taking action for providing high quality, low cost internet services, and also provide to Internet Protocol Television (IPTV) service along with high speed broadband and other internet services.

RURAL BUSINESS PROCESS OUTSOURCING CENTRES

- To train and employ rural youth from very

poor socio-economic backgrounds, to prevent migration of youth to the cities and to wean away the youth from Naxal influence, an Enhanced Rural BPO Policy was released by the Government on 01.06.2012.

- In order to promote Rural Business Process Outsourcing Units (Rural BPOs) and as per the Policy, to shift the focus of the BPO industry in rural areas, Government has sanctioned Rs.8.96 crore.
- A Rural Business Process Outsourcing Centre was established at Srirangam and inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 03.06.2013. Action is being taken to start these centres in other places.

TAMIL COMPUTING LAB, TAMIL SOFTWARE INCUBATION CENTRE, VISUAL THESAURUS AND COMPREHENSIVE COLLABORATIVE REPOSITORY AT TAMIL VIRTUAL ACADEMY, THAGAVALATRUPADAI, KANITHAMIZH PERAVAI AND TAMIL APPLETS

- At Tamil Virtual Academy, the interior works of Auditorium was completed.
- For creation of "Annotated Corpus for Tamil Literature", as a first phase, 56 books have been selected which includes Sangam literature, Post-Sangam period literature and epics to put an annotation for each word and the work is in progress.
- A Tamil Computing Lab was created to develop Tamil software like machine translation, OCR for Tamil language and to do research on Tamil computing.
- Tamil Unicode and TACE (Tamil All-Character Encoding) have been announced as a standard by Government of Tamil Nadu. For this purpose, fonts and keyboard drivers have been developed and given to users at free of cost.

- A Tamil Software Incubation Centre was created for those who interested to develop and to do research on Tamil Software were inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 22.09.2014.

- Tamil Virtual Academy is having a very rich digital library, linguistically annotated corpus and Tamil lessons for on-line education. With the help of these materials, TVA has implemented "A Visual Thesaurus for Tamil". This Visual Thesaurus means lists of words grouped together according to similarity of meaning with definitions and pronunciations in one package.

- 2,217 nationalized books have been uploaded in PDF format in digital library. Digitization of these books is under way.

- A Comprehensive and Collaborative Repository of Tamil Language, Literature, Art, etc. containing details of all the achievements of the Tamils and Tamil language and Literature has been created by Tamil Virtual Academy which will be shared by Tamil scholars, experts, students, research scholars and enthusiasts.

- In order to share the Tamil's history, literature and culture, a Monthly Lecture Series is being conducted under "Thagavalatrappadai Scheme" at Tamil Virtual Academy.

- To encourage tamil computing, action is being taken to establish a "Kanithamizh Peravai" at every College. Hon'ble Minister for Information Technology has inaugurated a "Kanithamizh Peravai" at Anna University on 30.10.2015.

- To develop applets for teaching Tamil lessons, Grammar and Dictionaries in computer, cellphones and smart phones, Tamil Applets are being developed at a cost of Rs.2.5 crore. ❖

Unimpeded Achievements in promoting Welfare of Labourers



Labour Welfare Board

- Total number of beneficiaries in Tamil Nadu Labour Welfare Board from 16.05.2011 to 31.12.15 is 97,067 and Rs. 4,82,35,835/- has been spent for welfare assistance scheme.

Unorganised Workers Welfare Board

- In the 17 unorganised workers welfare boards, from 16.05.2011 to till 31.12.2015,

13,95,923 workers have been newly registered and Rs.535 crore has been disbursed to 20,68,229 beneficiaries as welfare assistance.

- To achieve greater transparency in delivery of service through Unorganised Labour Welfare Board, financial assistance is directly sent through ECS to the bank accounts of the beneficiaries.

- The monthly pension for registered workers who have completed 60 years of age has been enhanced from Rs 500/- to Rs 1,000/-. 47,422 persons have taken this benefit.
- Skill training in driving heavy motor vehicles and industrial vehicles for 60 workers at a cost of Rs.12.75 lakh through Tamil Nadu Unorganised Drivers Welfare Board.
- The Government changed the name of “Tamil Nadu Auto Rickshaw and Taxi Drivers welfare Board” to Tamil Nadu Unorganised Drivers Welfare Board to register more drivers in the Board. So far, 19,167 drivers have been newly registered through 161 Special camps.
- District-wise Special awareness camps have been conducted by 17 welfare boards to create awareness about the various welfare schemes of the boards and 1.39 lakh new labourers have been registered in these special camps.
- The educational assistance for higher education for the wards of workers registered in the Welfare Boards has been enhanced by Rs.2,000/-. So far 2,78,151 beneficiaries have benefited.
- Rs. 38.48 crore has been sanctioned to construct the integrated office complex at 19 districts through Tamil Nadu Construction Workers Welfare Board’s fund and the work is in progress.
- The cess at the rate of 0.3% of the total estimated cost of the construction work received from the persons undertaking building and other construction work has been enhanced to 1% from 17.12.2013.
- Tamil Nadu Construction Workers Welfare Board conducting a study on mapping of inter-state migrant workers in the state at a cost of Rs.33,50,000/-. The mapping is in progress.
- The unorganised workers welfare boards enhanced the existing membership renewal period from 2 years to 5 years.
- Additional 15 categories of construction works included to the Schedule under the Tamil Nadu Manual Workers (Construction Workers) Welfare Scheme.
- As per the announcement made by the Hon’ble Chief Minister under Rule-110 in the Legislative Assembly, the Government enhanced the personal accident relief assistance in case of a death of a registered construction worker due to accident during the course of employment at the worksite from Rs.1 lakh to 5 lakh.
- As per the announcement made by the Hon’ble Chief Minister under Rule-110 in the Legislative Assembly, the Government ordered registration of inter-State migrant workers in the Tamil Nadu construction Workers Welfare Board and extension of welfare assistance to them are implemented. Registration of migrant workers has been commenced in all Districts.
- As per the announcement made by the Hon’ble Chief Minister under Rule-110 in the Legislative Assembly, the Government ordered setting up of 50 Mobile Health Clinic to cater to the health needs of construction workers at an expenditure of Rs.16.39 crore. In the first Phase 3 Tempo Traveller Vehicles have been purchased, allotted to LO (SSS) Chennai, Kancheepuram and Thiruvallur and fabricated for hospital are ready to launch.

- As per the announcement made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister under Rule-110 in the Legislative Assembly, the Government ordered provision of cost of transportation facility to gather children from nearby construction work sites to impart education at SSAs out of the welfare fund maintained by Tamil Nadu Construction Workers Welfare Board is implemented with School Education Department.
- As per the announcement made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister under Rule-110 in the Legislative Assembly, the Government ordered setting up of 50 mobile anganwadi facilities at various places, where construction work is predominant, at a cost of Rs.2.31 crore to meet the nutritional and developmental needs of the children of construction workers is implemented with ICDS.
- As per the announcement made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister under Rule-110 in the Legislative Assembly, the Government issued orders to construct 5 dormitories each housing 1,000 construction workers to be set up in Chennai and its suburban areas. Four dormitories for housing 500 workers each will be set up in Tiruchi, Salem, Madurai and Coimbatore districts. Thus, these 9 places will provide temporary accommodation to 7,000 construction workers at a cost of Rs.105 crore, through Tamil Nadu Construction Workers Welfare Board. The dormitory will contain Amma Canteen, RO water plant, Laundromat, Day Care Centre for children and elders, ATM/ Banking correspondence service, health clinic, reading room, recreation centre, facilitation centre for registration in Board, facility for adult literacy, etc.
- Hon'ble Chief Minister unveiled the laying of foundation stones through video conferencing for the construction of Dormitory at Thaiyur "B" village in Kancheepuram District at a cost of Rs.16.76 crore and at Ezhichur Village in Kancheepuram District at cost of Rs.14.90 crore. Third site at Kancheepuram District is to be identified in mampakkam village by the District Collector Kancheepuram.
- A suitable land has been identified and transferred to the Labour Department in Kottapattu village, Trichy East Taluk, Trichy District. In the first phase (2015-2016), order has been issued on 07.01.2016 to sanction Rs. 5,29,37,500/- from the Tamil Nadu Construction Workers Welfare Board fund for the construction of dormitories for 250 workers.
- Introduction of online facility to enable the unorganised workers to register and get the welfare benefits easily and remittance of cess amount payable to the Construction Board directly at a cost of Rs.1.25 crore is under process.
- Introduction of a toll free number cum multi-lingual assistance centre for the convenience of Tamil Nadu unorganised workers and inter-state migrant workers at a cost of 16 lakh for providing information to the unorganised workers, including interstate migrant workers on the different schemes operated by various welfare board schemes and also to facilitate redressing their grievances is under process.
- Establishment of an additional office of Labour Officer (SSS) at Vilavankodu in Kanyakumari district, Ambur in Vellore district and Ponnery in Thiruvallur

district have been identified by District Monitoring Committee and all steps are taken to implement the announcement of establishment of an additional office of Labour Officer (SSS) in Kanyakumari, Vellore and Thiruvallur districts where large number of unorganised workers are registered as members at an annual expenditure of Rs.1.26 crore to facilitate speedy registration and timely disbursement of welfare benefits.

- 33,50,000 Inter-State migrant workers, who were migrated from other states and working in Tamil Nadu were registered in the Tamil Nadu Construction Workers Welfare Board.

Tamil Nadu Academy of Construction (TAC)

- Tamil Nadu Academy of Construction (TAC) provides skill training under Modular Employable Skill Tainting to the workers registered under the TN Construction / Manual Workers Welfare Boards and their wards through Government ITI's and Private Training institutes approved by the Directorate of Employment and Training department. 668 persons have completed Modular Employable Skill training. 117 persons are undergoing training.
- House-building assistance for Beedi Workers has been enhanced from Rs.5,000 to Rs. 60,000 and Rs.1.20 crore has been allotted for 200 houses.

Legal Metrology

- During the period 16.05.2011 to 31.12.2015, 16,52,310 Inspections have been made, Rs. 10.25 crore has been collected as stamping fees and Rs. 5.14 crore collected as compounding fees under the Legal Metrology Act.
- During the period 16.05.2011 to 31.12.2015, 7,58,669 Inspections have been made, Rs.11.82 lakh has been collected as Registration fees and Rs.3.70 crore collected as compounding fees under the Legal metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules.

Administration

- All Inspectors of plantation were provided with new vehicles so as to strengthen the enforcement in protecting the welfare of plantation workers.
- To render effective service to the labour community, 35 vehicles (Jeeps) at a cost of Rs.2,06,64,420/- was provided to conciliation and enforcement officers on 03.08.2015.
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister declared open on 25.06.2015 through video-conferencing a laboratory along with integrated Labour Department office building constructed in 0.1218.5 sq.Metre (30 cent) at a cost of Rs.185 lakh in Madurai and a second level laboratory in Coimbatore at a cost of Rs 50 lakh with Rs 1 crore allotted from the Central Government under Legal Metrology Act.
- In the last four years 21,517 industrial disputes have been settled and 8262 cases were settled amicably and 3,475 cases were pending.

Conciliation

- In the last five years up to 31.12.2015, 26,011 industrial disputes have been settled. 9,441 disputes were disposed amicably. 1,060 disputes are pending.
- A settlement under section 12 (3) of Industrial Dispute Act, 1947 benefitting 3,000 drivers of 108 Ambulance service regarding bonus and other conditions of service.

- Strike by the Tamil Nadu Transport workers from 28.12.2014 regarding the 12th wage demand came to an end by conciliation talks on 31.12.2014, to benefit 1.25 lakh transport workers.
- Workers of 18 Co-operative sugar mills went on strike from 11.12.2014 regarding the wage issue. All the workers resumed work on 31.12.2014 after intervention of conciliation authorities.
- A wage revision settlement was arrived at in Beedi manufacturing industry on 10.08.2015 to benefit nearly 4 lakh beedi rollers.
- Strikes were called off in 45 Engineering Industries, 1 Textile Industry, 18 Sugar Industries, 8 Transport Industries, 1 Chemical Industry, 20 Readymade Garments Industries, 9 Plantations, 9 Tanneries and 35 other industries and employment status of 2,24,908 workers were protected.
- Lock-outs were lifted in 13 Textile Industries, 8 Engineering Industries, 3 Tanneries and 8 other industries and employment status of 5,476 workers were protected.

Eradication of Child Labour

- After formation of the present Government, 6,19,595 establishments have been inspected by the enforcement officials and Special District Task Force in all the districts. 206 contraventions were noticed and 122 prosecutions were filed. In 92 cases, Rs. 9.23 lakh has been imposed as fine.
- 231 child labourers were rescued, out of them 97 children were enrolled in special training centres of NCLP, SSA and re-admitted in regular Schools. 67 children were handed over to Child Welfare Committee / Shelter homes. The remaining 67 migrated child labour were handed over to their parents with necessary advice for admitting them in the schools nearby their residence.
- During the month of January 2015 enforcement officials in the districts have carried out special raids/ inspections with a view to vigorously enforce the laws prohibiting employment of children. 7,339 inspections were carried out and 40 children were rescued from employment and rehabilitated.
- As on 31.12.2015, 9,203 rescued child labourers are studying in 235 Special Training Centres of the National Child Labour Project (NCLP).
- As on 31.12.2015, 14,795 children have been mainstreamed into the regular schools during the last four years.
- As on 31.12.2015, 1026 former child labourers are studying in Medical Colleges / Engineering Colleges / Arts College and Technical Institutions.
- To create awareness against Child labour among the public, SMS were sent, slides were shown in cinema theatres, signature campaigns were conducted, local TV networks and AIR were utilized, rallies were conducted and pamphlets were distributed and boards were set up in railway stations and bus stands. About one lakh letters were dispatched to students during 2015.
- The monthly cash assistance of Rs.250/- has been enhanced to Rs.500/- from the academic year 2011-2012 to all the children who pursue their higher education, for the full term of their course. During last four academic years 2,743 children have been benefited to the tune of Rs. 1.65 crore.

- A state level anti-child labour awareness meeting was held on 12.06.2015 in Kancheepuram. The Secretary to Government Labour and Employment Department, The Commissioner of Labour, District Collector of Kancheepuram, The Director of Industrial Safety and Health, Member of Parliament, Members of Legislative Assembly, Local Body Members, officials from various departments and school children have participated in the meeting. Awards were distributed to the mainstreamed students of the Special Training Centres of National Child Labour Projects who secured high marks in the 10th and 12th standard public examinations. Awards were also given to one Best Educational Instructor from each NCLP district, one Inspector of Labour, one Deputy Director of Industrial Safety and Health, one NCLP Project Director and two field officers for their good performance in their area of work. Some of the erstwhile NCLP STC children presently Mrs. Deepa, working as a Teacher(Postgraduate- Maths) in Government Girls Higher Secondary school at Nanganallur, Mr. Sankar, Assistant Branch Manager in a International Investment Bank at Chennai and the State Rank holder among the Children mainstreamed from NCLP Mr. Karthik who shared their experience were felicitated.
- In order to create mass awareness among the public in connection with Anti Child Labour Day, awareness programmes were also conducted from 08.06.2015 to 12.06.2015 in all the districts.
- Anti-Child Labour Day awareness programme were conducted on 08.06.2015 and 09.06.2015 in Schools, Colleges, Factories and Workplaces and signature campaign were also conducted.
- In the 41st All India Industrial and Tourism Trade Fair 2015 held at Island Grounds in Chennai, a Signature Campaign on awareness on elimination of child labour was organised and 64,563 general public have signed the pledge against the employment of child labour.
- Students of the Special Training Centres are being given a monthly assistance of Rs. 150/- and also free educational gadgets and free medical tests.
- Under National Child Labour Project, students of the Special Training Centres are given free uniforms, and free bus pass to those who need such pass by the Tamil Nadu Government.
- Students of the Special Training Centres are given 5 eggs/ plaintain fruits additionally in their mid-day meal by the State Government.
- Students, studied in Special Training Centres under National Child Labour Project who have secured the first three ranks in the 10th and 12th annual examinations are given a cash prize of Rs.5,000/-, Rs.3,000/- and Rs. 2,000/- each.
- More than 100 students who were rescued from child labour and joined Special Training Centres are now studying in various engineering colleges in the State.
- In the March 2015 Plus two examinations, V.Karthick of Dharmapuri, who was rescued from construction work secured 1156 marks, V.Mahalakshmi of Tiruchirappali district, rescued from domestic work, secured 1142 marks and C.Muthuselvi of Virduhunagar district, rescued from a firework unit secured 1135 marks.
- In the 10th standard common examination, 2015, Selvi V.Indumathi of Namakkal,

rescued from powerloom industry secured 490 marks, B.Kirthika of Salem, rescued from brick industry secured 483 marks, and K.Sakthivel of Krishnagiri, rescued from construction industry secured 484 marks.

DIRECTORATE OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND HEALTH

REGISTRATION OF FACTORIES

- During the above period 11,411 new factories have been covered under the purview of Factories Act, 1948 benefitting 3,51,442 workers .

TAMIL NADU INDUSTRIAL ESTABLISHMENTS (CONFERMENT OF PERMANENT STATUS TO WORKMEN) ACT 1981

- During the above period 1,95,107 workers were made permanent in 16,989 factories.

BUILDING AND OTHER CONSTRUCTION WORKERS ACT AND RULES

- During the above period 6,693 establishments were registered under The Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of Employment and condition of Service) Act 1996. To create safety awareness among the workers, builders, promoters and contractors 136 batches of safety training classes were conducted in which 12,429 workers were benefitted.

SAFETY AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

- Safety Propaganda committee periodically visit Chemical Factories, Fireworks, Tanneries and Bleaching & Dyeing units to explain hazards in these industrial units by educating the managements and workers about the safety precautions to be followed to avoid accidents. During the above period

495 Safety Awareness Campaigns have been conducted in which 24,829 workers were benefitted.

SAFETY TRAINING

- To educate the workers and managements on the importance of safety, 2,260 training classes were conducted in factory premises during the above period in which 1,03,309 workers were benefitted.

STATE SAFETY AWARDS

- In order to motivate the managements for better safety performance, State Safety Awards are presented to the managements every year based on their performance in reducing accidents in their Factories. From 2011 onwards, value of First Prize State Safety Award silver Shield has been enhanced from Rs.2500/- to Rs.5000/- for 90 Shields, and value of Second Prize silver Shield has been enhanced from Rs.1500/- to Rs.4000/-. For the years 2010 to 2012, 197 managements were selected and awarded State Safety Awards by the Honourable Minister for Rural Industries and Labour Department.

UYARNTHA UZHAIPALAR VIRUDHU

- To encourage the workers, who suggest outstanding and useful method for the improvement in productivity, better working environments and improvement in Safety Standards “Tamilaga Arasin Uyarnta Uzhaipalar Virudhu” is awarded every year. From 2012 onwards, the number of award has been enhanced from 24 to 43. For the years 2010 to 2012, 169 workers from 91 factories have been selected for Uyarnta uzhaipalar Virudhugal and awarded by the Honourable Minister for Rural Industries and Labour Department.

SIVAKASI TRAINING CENTRE

- As per the announcement made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Training Centre at Sivakasi was started to create safety awareness to the workers working in Fireworks factories. 714 workers were given training in 23 batches in the Training Centre. The construction of Permanent Training Centre at Sivakasi was opened by the Honourable Chief Minister of Tamilnadu on 25.06.2015 through video conference. Due to the effective training imparted to the workers, accidents in Sivakasi have been reduced drastically.

MOBILE TEAM

- A Mobile Team has been formed under the head of Additional Director of Industrial Safety and Health at Virudhunagar District, to inspect the fire works factories surprisingly and to monitor the safety and health measures of the workers in these factories. This mobile team has conducted 967 inspections in firework factories. The team is also creating safety awareness through small skits, folk dances etc.
- The Government issued orders sanctioning Rs 0.75 crore for purchase of furniture for classes and Rs.7.06 crore for procuring machineries in 15 Government ITI s in the State during 2013-2014. During 2014-2015 Rs 37.62 crore sanctioned for purchase of machineries and gadgets for 37 industrial training institutes. Total sanction was Rs 45.43 crore.
- The Government issued orders for starting 15 industrial training institutes in the State at a total estimate of Rs 77. 7 crore. For the benefit of tribal students, five new industrial institutes were started at an estimate of

Rs 32.83 crore in Anaikatti (Coimbatore district), Cuddalore (Nilgiris), Karmandurai (Salem), Kolli Hills (Namakkal) and in Jamunapudur (Tiruvannamalai). For the benefit of all communities 5 ITI s were started at an estimate of Rs. 26.39 crore in Veppalodai (Thoothukudi district), Radhapuram (Tirunelveli), Aruppukottai (Virudhunagar), Tiruvaiyaru (Thanjavur), and Bodi (Theni) and at a cost of Rs 18.55 crore in five places in Manikandam (Tiruchirappali District), in Chinna Salem (Villupuram), Kattumannarkoil (Cuddalore), Kadayanallur (Tirunelveli), and Udumalpet (Tiruppur).

CREATION OF ONLINE PORTAL EXCLUSIVE FOR THIS DIRECTORATE

Creation of this online portal is under progress. Through this portal Online renewal of factory license and issue of fresh license could be implemented. Online portal could strengthen further the activities of this Directorate.

Growth in Small Industries fosters Enthusiasm among Youth



- In an effort to build on the attractive growth prospects in Tamil Nadu, and the Government's commitments in maintaining the States position as India's most preferred investment destinations, GLOBAL INVESTORS MEET has been organized on 9th and 10th September, 2015 at Chennai Trade Centre, Chennai, Tamil Nadu.
- In order to facilitate, the opportunities arising out of Global Investor Meet, Road Shows with focus on Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises were conducted in 32 districts from 6th August to 11th August 2015. 10,073 entrepreneurs have signed "Memorandum of Understandings" for an investment of Rs.16,532.67 crore.
- To assist educated youth, Government launched 'New Entrepreneur cum Enterprises Development Scheme' in 2012-2013 with capital subsidy at the rate of 25% with a maximum of Rs.1 crore and with 3% interest subvention. Till date, 1,261 trained beneficiaries have started their units. For their project cost of Rs.606.54 crore, an amount of Rs.77.17 crore was released as subsidy.
- Under NEEDS scheme, a total No. of 415 applications involving subsidy component of Rs.41.43 crore were selected

- and recommended to the Banks/TIIC for obtaining provisional sanctions. Out of which, sanctions have been obtained from the financing Institutions to the tune of Rs.28 crore for the 260 applications.
- To encourage Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, 3,044.11 acres of land have been identified at 47 places in 12 Districts for setting up Industrial Estates.
 - The quantum of capital subsidy rate on the plant and machinery of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises has been enhanced from 15% to 25%. A sum of Rs.250 crore was disbursed to 5,930 entrepreneurs.
 - A sum of Rs.50 crore sanctioned for revamping of District Industries Centre's in all 32 Districts, 5 new buildings (Thiruvavarur, Tiruppur, Nagapattinam, Namakkal and Theni) and 7 additional building (Cuddalore, Vellore, Salem, Thanjavur, Krishnagiri, Madurai and Dindigul) have been completed construction and inaugurated through video conferencing by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 25.06.2014 in the 1st phase. Further, 3 more new buildings (Thiruvannamalai, Karur & Villupuram) and 8 New/Additional buildings at (Dharmapuri, Erode, Sivaganga, Tirunelveli, Trichy, Kanniyakumari, Virudhunagar & The Nilgiris) were also completed construction and inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 25.06.2015 in the 2nd phase. For the remaining 9 DIC buildings building works are completed and ready for inauguration.
 - Establishment of Common facilitation centres at 5 places at a cost of Rs.47.76 crore under Micro, Small Enterprises Cluster Development Programme.
 - Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises have been disbursed with LTPT subsidy for 4 years to the tune of Rs.24 crore at rate of 20% and Generator subsidy to the tune of Rs.47.48 crore at the rate of 25%.
 - In the financial year 2015-2016, 4 Micro and Small Enterprises Facilitation Councils sittings were conducted and an amount of Rs. 28.26 lakh has been realised to 5 Micro and Small Enterprises.
 - Rs.13 crore have been disbursed under 100% subsidy equivalent to the Value Added Tax (VAT).
 - Under Unemployed Youth Employment Generation Programme (UYEGP) loan has been granted to 18,305 beneficiaries and subsidy of Rs.52.60 crore has been disbursed for projects with 16,362 employees.
 - There are 314 Industrial Cooperative Societies, out of which 261 societies are working on profit. They have made sales turnover of Rs.178.20 crore as against the proportionate sales target of Rs.247.02 crore and earned total net profit of Rs.6.57 crore.
 - During 2015-2016, Sagoserve has achieved the sales turnover of Rs.67.95 crore as against the proportionate target of Rs.133.68 crore and earned total net profit of Rs.61.07 lakh.
 - During 2015-2016, Taico Bank has mobilized deposit of Rs.969.76 crore and disbursed the loans and advances to the tune of Rs.509.96 crore. It has earned total net profit of Rs.3.40 crore.
 - To upgrade the infrastructure facilities of Entrepreneurship Development Institute by constructing a new complex at Guindy, Chennai, Rs.4.88 crore was allotted,

construction completed and the new complex inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister through video conferencing on 25.06.2014.

Improving Urban Infrastructure shows Excellent Administration

- Other than the 214 Amma Unavagams in Chennai Corporation and Government Hospitals, With the opening of 90 Amma Unavagams, 10 each in Madurai, Coimbatore, Tiruchirappalli, Salem, Tirunelveli, Tiruppur, Erode, Vellore and Thoothukudi Corporations, and one in Government Rajaji Hospital, Madurai, economically weaker sections, labourers, school going children are benefited by getting hygienic food at inexpensive prices. Subsequently 7 Amma Unavagam, each

one in Government General Hospitals in Coimbatore, Thanjavur, Dindigul, Trichy, Salem, Tiruppur and Erode Corporations and 4 Amma Unavagam in Public Places one each in Coimbatore, Madurai, Thanjavur and Dindigul totaling 11 were operationlized. In total, 102 Amma Unavagams are functioning in 11 Corporations. On an average in each Amma Unavagam breakfast and lunch are being prepared and sold for 300 persons. Upto 31.12.2015, 10,14,03,920 Idlies, 2,40,87,933 Sambar rice and 2,00,49,717 Curd rice have been supplied to the public at a price of Re.1/- per idly, Rs.5/- per sambar rice and Rs.3/- per curd rice.

- Subsequently, as announced by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 01.06.2014, 32 Amma Unavagam have been opened in 16 District Head Quarters one each in Government Hospitals and one in Public place. In Avadi, Pallavapuram, Tambaram, Maraimalai Nagar and Hosur Municipalities 10 Amma Unavagams, each two in Public Places have been opened. Remaining 103 Municipalities have been provided with one Amma Unavagam functioning in a Public Place from 24.05.2015. 145 Amma Unavagams have been opened on 24.05.2015 in 124 Municipalities and all are functioning successfully. Upto 31.12.2015, 15,99,47,478 Idlies, 95,81,652 Sambar rice and 79,25,363 Curd rice has been supplied to the public at inexpensive rates.
- During the last five years, a sum of Rs.2,234.91 crore sanctioned under IUDM. Scheme for 6,466 works to provide Infrastructure facilities such as Water supply, UGSS, Roads, Storm Water drains, Street lights, Eradication of open defecation, Solid Waste Management, Parks and Bus stand. So far, 5,615 works have been completed and the remaining works are in various stages of implementation.
- During the last 5 years, 184 works have been taken up under Part-II scheme at Rs.37.58 crore and 179 works like construction of differentlyabled friendly toilets, purchase of Jet rodding machine, Generator and desilting machine, construction of office buildings, Storm Water drains have been completed.
- During the last 5 years, Under Infra Gap Filling Fund, 4,527 works have been taken up for Rs.609.71 crore. Out of this, 3,819 works such as construction of Gasifier Crematoriums, Slaughter Houses, toilets, Improvement of water supply facilities, UGSS, Storm water drain, Bus Stand, office building etc have been completed.
- 267 works have been taken up under Operation and Maintenance Gap Filling Fund for Rs 234.16 crore. Out of this, 141 works like improvement of markets in Ariyalur Municipality and weekly sandai in Chinnamanur Municipality, water supply, storm water drain, slaughter house, office building have been completed.
- To eradicate open defecation, Rs.210.60 crore was sanctioned for construction of 1,205 new toilets and rehabilitation of 2,059 existing toilets. Of these, 654 new toilets and 1,589 old toilets rehabilitation have been completed.
- Under Solid Waste Management fund a sum of Rs.392.70 crore was sanctioned for implementation Solid Waste Management projects, 826 works have been taken and 69 works were completed balance works are in various stage of implementation.
- During the last 5 years, Rs.197.22 crore has been sanctioned to Urban Local Bodies to tackle the drought in which ssRs.103.59 crore as grant for immediate relief works by providing bore wells with hand pumps, Mini power pumps, purchase of hand pump spares, water supply through lorries, providing sintex tanks, hiring/purchase of Gensets, etc.,

- In 2014-2015, to tackle the summer water scarcity Government has sanctioned Rs.10 crore as drought relief and relief works were taken up in 8 rainfall deficit districts and 23 other districts covering 9 Corporations and 75 Municipalities. For Vellore Corporation Rs.5 Crore was sanctioned. All the works taken up are under various stages of progress.
- In 2015-2016, to restore the damages due to North-East monsoon 2015, the Government have sanctioned Rs.75 crore under State Disaster Response Fund for temporary restoration of roads and the other infrastructures. The road and culvert restoration works were taken up in 8 Corporations and 58 Municipalities and all the works are under various stages of progress.
- With the financial assistance of Rs.52.93 crore from Environment Protection and Renewable Energy Development Fund, 324.165 Km length of roads were relayed using plastic waste. To promote the collection of plastic waste and shredding,

- Asum of Rs.1,421 crore have been sanctioned under Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns, for 68 works to provide Water Supply, UGSS, Roads and Solid Waste Management So far, 42 works have been completed.
- The Government of India sanctioned 51 projects for the 7 year mission period at a project cost of Rs.2,316.02 crore under JnNURM for Basic Services to the Urban Poor (BSUP), for construction of 89,720 dwelling units. Out of this, 72,302 housing units have been completed.
- Under Integrated Housing and Slum Development Programme (IHSDP), facilities are provided to the slum dwellers. Under this component, 94 projects were sanctioned at a cost of Rs.566.11 crore for the construction of 37,720 Housing units, out of which 34,480 dwelling units have been completed.

CORPORATION OF CHENNAI

- In order to provide nutritious food in hygienic environment to the poor and vulnerable people at subsidised price, the Corporation of Chennai has set up 276 Amma Unavagams in all wards of the Corporation and in 7 Government Hospitals. Provision of one Idly at Rs.1/-, Pongal and variety rice at Rs.5/- each and 2 Chappathis and Dhal at Rs.3/- for dinner at these Amma Unavagams has been welcomed by everyone, especially the poor people due to its affordability in times of ever rising inflation. Till 31.12.2015, 11,82,25,928 Chappathis, 27,21,30,918 Idlies and 10,95,73,537 variety rice have been provided through these centres. About 3

Lakh people are getting benefitted everyday under this scheme. Many experts world over have showered their praise on this scheme as an outstanding scheme due to the boost it has given to the overall socio economic development.

- In Family Welfare Bureau of the Chennai Corporation, in Erstwhile Chennai had 10 Twenty four hours (24x7) Emergency obstetric units in 10 Zones and 93 Health posts were functioning. Now, in expanded Chennai, 15 Zones and 17 Emergency Operation Centres & 140 Municipal Primary Health Posts are modernized on par with private centres and are functioning with Hi-tech equipments.
- In Chennai Corporation Hospitals, Foetal monitoring by CTG machine, Deliveries conducted by disposable delivery kits and under Janani Suraksha Yojana Schemes, provision of Rs.600/- for all delivered mothers. In the financial year 2015-2016 upto December 2015, totally Rs.3.78 crore has been given to 62,594 beneficiaries.
- In operation theatres - Deliveries, Cancer, heart diseases and Infection Control method are prevented by using the modern technology equipments like Nanotechnology, Defibrillator, Disposable LSCS Delivery kits, Shifting Trolley, Video Laparoscopy & Sono Mammogram, on par with private centres.
- As per World Health Organisation schedule, all vaccines are given free of cost at welfare centres and during field operations. Earlier, DPT and TT vaccines were given. Now, like

in Private Hospitals, Hepatitis-B, Pentavalent vaccines are administered at all welfare centres. In Immunization activities section, upto December-2015, B.C.G.-10,693 Pentavalent vaccine-1,01,427, oral polio drops-1,01,427, Measles-1,14,039 children were fully immunized.

- Cervical cancer early detection screening not available even in Private Hospitals was done for women in 14 places. Upto December 2015, 2,64,923 women were screened.
- Yoga for Antenatal mothers was done in 5 Emergency Operation Centres (Saidapet, Vadapalani, Pulianthope, Sanjeevarayanpet & Shenoyanagar).
- Under Marriage Fund scheme for the poor women, Rs.25,000/- & Rs.50,000/- along with 4 gram Gold coin was given to the tenth standard and degree holders respectively. Until Jan-2016 Rs.18.11 crore and 16,928 grams Gold have been given to 4,232 beneficiaries.
- Under Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy Maternity Benefit scheme, Pregnent women who are delivering in Government Hospitals, during the year 2015-2016 upto December 2015 Rs.22.67 crore have been given to the 22,655 beneficiaries.
- With a vision of developing Chennai as a world class city with infrastructure of international standard, the Hon'ble Chief Minister has announced a path breaking scheme called Chennai Mega city Development Mission (CMCDM). Under this special scheme, the Government has sanctioned an unprecedented amount of

Rs.1,164.56 crore to the Corporation of Chennai for taking up works for roads of about 976.02 Km length, storm water drain network for a length of 196.99 Km, footpath to a length of 321.43 Km and 12,952 streetlights and various modern vehicles and equipments for solid waste management. Till now, works for roads to a length of 933.68 km, storm water drain network for a length of 156 km and footpaths for a length of 156 km besides installation of 11,939 streetlights have been completed at the cost of Rs.1,073.83 crore. All the balance work will be completed and put into use for the citizens within a period of next 2 months. Due to effective and speedy implementation of this scheme, the long awaited aspirations of the people living in the extended areas of Chennai Corporation of having infrastructure at par with the core city areas are being fulfilled adequately.

- The Corporation of Chennai maintains 471 Bus Route Roads for a length of 387 Km. During the last 5 years, the Corporation of Chennai has completed the restoration of 235 Bus Route Roads for a length of 149.70 Km at a cost of Rs.98.41 crore under Tamil Nadu Urban Road Infrastructure project (TURIP) and 93 Bus Route Roads for a length of 40.14 Km at a cost of Rs.30.12 crore under Capital Funds of Corporation.
- Under TURIF 2014-2015, it was proposed to relay 45 bus route roads to a length of 40.47 Km at an estimated cost of Rs.91.17 crore. So far, 41 roads to a length of 32.82 Km has been completed and remaining 7.65 KM length balance 4 roads are in progress.

- Under TURIF 2014-2015 savings it was proposed to relay 9 roads at a length of 6.09 Km at an estimated cost of Rs.8.71 crore. So far, 4 roads are completed and the balance 5 roads are in progress.
- Under CMCDM 2015-2016 it was proposed to relay 149 bus route roads in government grants of Rs. 242.57 crore. So far, 141 roads to a length of 115.32 Km has been completed and the balance 8 roads to a length of 12.09 km are in progress.
- Under CMCDM 2015-2016 savings, it was proposed to relay 49 bus route roads to a length of 25.25 km at an estimated cost of Rs.39.34 crore. So far, 23 roads has been completed and the balance roads are in progress.
- Under TURIF 2015-2016, relaying of 92 roads to a length of 72.65 Km at an estimated cost of Rs. 161.70 crore is in progress.
- For the past 5 years, Railway Over Bridge at Rangarajapuram Level Crossing, Railway Under Bridge at Villivakkam Level Crossing (LC2), Bridge across Cooum River connecting Metha Nagar Officers Colony 1st Street and Venkatachalapathy Street, Bridge across Buckingham canal at Indira Nagar 2nd Avenue connecting Rajiv Gandhi Road, Bridge at pari street across Virugambakkam Canal connecting CMDA colony and Arumbakkam, Additional Box culvert adjacent to existing bridge at kalamman koil street, Chinmaya Nagar across Virugambakkam canal, Pedestrian cum two wheeler subway at Rangarajapuram level crossing, Railway Under Bridge at

Maniyakara Chathira Street and Grade Separator at Vallalar Nagar in Mint Junction, RUB at MC.Road, Construction of 5 new Box culvert connecting Solaiamman Koil Street Ezhil Nagar, Krishnamurthy Nagar and M.K.B.Nagar , R.K link road Baba Nagar, Dr.Ambedkar street in Suzhpunalkarai and across Narayanapuram lake Improvement work, at 9 flyovers, 3 old canal bridges, Providing stainless steel cladding work over the existing Crash barrier for Flyovers at Junction of Dr. Radhakrishnan Road - TTK Road, Construction of ROB at Kathivakkam High road- Cochrane Basin Road, Construction of Box culvert in lieu of causeway at Padikuppam canal in Padikuppam Road at J.J. Nagar were completed at a total cost of Rs.111.23 crore.

- Most part of Chennai city is situated just 2.5m above the mean sea level, due to this there are chances of flood occurrence in many places during the monsoon period. In order to reduce the loss due to flood in Chennai City, Corporation of Chennai has constructed 329.05 km network of storm water drains at a cost of Rs.521.64 crore in the last 4 years. As a result of this, the number of flood prone areas in the Chennai Corporation has reduced to 169 from about 300 earlier.
- The generation of Municipal Solid Waste in Chennai city has increased to 5,000 metric tonne per day. At present the corporation is managing the solid waste by deploying 460 compactors, 277 tipper lorries, 20 mechanical sweepers, 57 skid steer loaders and 57 front end loaders and 26 Hydraulic

Excavator (Poclain) and 4 numbers of Buldozar, Bobcat 27 During 2011-2015, vehicles and equipments worth Rs.62.88 crore have been purchased.

- Construction of Shopping Complex Rs.1.28 crore, Construction of Lorry Depot Rs.4.46 crore, Construction of Amma Maligai for Basement + 5 floors Estimated Cost Rs.39.11 crore, Construction of 8 Health Buildings and 2 Electrical Crematorium estimated cost of Rs.11.72 crore, in Education Department construction of 24 school buildings estimated cost Rs.15.40 crore, Construction of 24 Division offices at a cost of Rs.26.62 crore, Construction of Multi Level Car Parking in Wallace Garden at an estimated cost Rs.43 crore with public and private partnership, Restoration work done in Elliots Beach Smith Memorial Building at cost Rs.1.65 crore, construction of CD Hospital in Tondaiarpur at cost Rs.17.38 crore, construction of Air conditional Auditorium with 900 seat capacity for Estimated cost Rs.18.05 crore, Construction of Dhobikana Rs.42.43 lakh.
- With the objective of providing uniform quality street lighting throughout the city for safety of citizens, especially the women and old age people, the Corporation of Chennai is maintaining 2,28,876 streetlights. In addition to that, for providing street lighting in the newly added areas of the city on par with the erstwhile city area, a project for setting up 1,10,000 energy efficient L.E.D. streetlights has been taken up at an estimated cost of Rs.322 crore. Out of this, work for erecting 72,861 street lights has already

been completed at a cost of Rs.145.85 crore. This is the Highest achievement by any Municipal Corporation in the Country for erecting energy efficient LED Street lights. Installation of remaining 37,139 LED Street lights will be completed before March 2016. To encourage the renewable energy method, 745 LED Street lights with Solar power of 13 Watts has been installed at a cost of Rs.213.25 lakh.

- Having regard to the fact that parks play a very important role in improving the quality of life of the citizens by providing fresh air, facilities for daily exercise and play equipments for children, the Corporation of Chennai has taken up work on 300 parks over a period of last 5 years in addition to the existing 260 parks at an estimated cost of Rs. 108.14 crore. Out of this, work for 176 parks at a cost of Rs.49.40 crore has already been completed.

TOWN PANCHAYATS ADMINISTRATION

- Under NABARD scheme a sum of Rs.531.51 crore has been allocated, and totally 2,153 works covering various sectors such as roads, Water bodies improvement, Construction of sanitary complex, Slaughter house and bridges have been taken up. Out of which 2,118 works have been completed and 35 works are under progress in various stages.
- Under IUDM a sum of Rs.1,099.53 crore has been allocated and totally 7,149 works covering various sectors such as Roads, Drains, Water supply, UGSS, Culvert, Street

lights and solid waste Management etc., have been taken up. Out of which 6,905 works have been completed and remaining 244 works are under progress in various stages.

- During the year 2011-2012, 2012-2013, 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 a sum of Rs.411.91 crore have been released under 13th Finance Commission.
- During the year 2015-2016 a sum of Rs.229.11 crore have been allocated under 14th Finance Commission.
- To eradicate open defecation in Town Panchayats, construction of 1,102 new sanitary complexes and 697 renovation works to existing sanitary complexes have been taken up at a total project cost of Rs.142.58 crore under NABARD, IUDM and General Fund. Out of 1,102, new community toilets, 1,072 community toilets have been completed and remaining 30 are under progress at various stages. Similarly, 697 renovations of toilets have been completed and put into use.
- In order to provide basic infrastructure facilities to Town Panchayats a sum of Rs.201.44 crore has been allotted for taking up of 664 works. Out of which 621 works have been completed and 43 works are under progress in various stages. During 2015-2016 a sum of Rs.65.44 crore has been allotted under this for taking up of 58 works. Of which, 48 works have been taken by Town Panchayats at a cost of Rs.26.10 crore and for this tenders have been called for on 22.01.2016. The rest of 10 works have been under taken by TWAD Board which is in progress.

- To improve the basic infrastructure facilities of the Town Panchayats a sum of Rs.92.75 crore has been allotted for taking up of 476 works. Out of which 461 works have been completed and 15 works are under progress in various stages. During 2015-2016, 43 works have been taken up except electricity charges and water charges at an estimated cost of Rs.21.75 crore and for this tender have been called for on 22.01.2016.
- Under part II schemes Rs.29.66 crore has been allocated. Totally, 644 works such as construction of New Office Building, Water Supply Improvement, Bridges, Purchase of Computer Software and Hardware to Town Panchayats, Solid Waste Management, Construction of Slaughter Houses were taken up in Town Panchayats. Out of which, 640 works have been completed and 4 works are under progress in various stages.
- Under TURIP Rs.232.90 crore for taking up 905 works to a length of 825.78 km roads in Town Panchayats were taken up under this scheme. Out of which 902 works have been completed and remaining 3 works are under progress in various stages.
- Under Environmental Protection and Renewable Energy Fund at a cost of Rs.44.50 crore 181 roads were converted as plastic roads and erection of Shredding Unit in 15 Town Panchayats at an estimated cost of Rs. 1.20 crore has been completed. During the year 2014-2015, 3 water body improvement works at a cost of Rs.4.50 crore has been allotted which is in progress at various stages.
- Renovation of Anganwadies and construction of baby friendly toilets in Town Panchayats at a cost of Rs.4.53 crore have been completed and put into use. During the year 2014-2015, 506 works were taken up at an estimated cost of Rs.3.10 crore for construction of additional rooms in existing Anganwadies, minor repairs along with construction of baby friendly toilets and installation of electrical motors in Town Panchayats. Out of 506 works, 481 works have been completed and remaining 25 works are in progress at various stages.
- As a special programme, construction of 532 Toilets for Differently Abled person at an estimated cost Rs.9.93 crore in 503 Town Panchayats were taken up all works have been completed and put into use.
- In 2013-2014, Rs.43.728 crore has been allotted for solid waste management works in 77 Town Panchayats. Out of which, works in 76 Town Panchayats have been completed. The remaining 1 work at Annur Town Panchayat in Coimbatore District is pending due to court intervention. For the year 2014-2015 a sum of Rs.53.57 crore has been allotted for 214 Town Panchayats under this scheme and for which tenders have been called for on 25.01.2016.
- A sum of Rs.1 crore has been allotted for taking of Bio-methanation plant in Sholingur, Chengam, Uthamapalaiyam, Vathlakundu and Periyannayakkanpalaiyam Town Panchayats and the works are in progress at various stages.

- Under the Satellite City Scheme Rs.123.75 crore has been allocated in Sriperumbudur Town Panchayat, Kancheepuram District, for taking up Water Supply improvement works, Under Ground Sewerage and Solid Waste Management works. Out of which, Solid Waste Management work was completed and Water Supply improvement works and Under Ground Sewerage works are under progress which is being carried out by Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board.
- During the year 2015-2016, 384 road works to a length of 328.11 KM have been taken up in 145 Town Panchayats at an estimated cost of Rs.163.52 crore under the Special Roads scheme. Out of these, 11 works have been completed. The rest of 373 works are under progress in various stages.
- 66 R.O. plant works have been taken up at an estimated cost of Rs.3.96 crore and all works have been completed.
- To convert the Huts / Mud houses / Thatched houses into concrete house with solar light for 20,000 families of Economically Weaker Sections living in Town Panchayats at an estimated cost of Rs.420 crore, beneficiaries list has been approved by the District Level Committee concerned and the same has been sent to the Tamil Nadu Slum Clearance Board.
- Under AMRUT, detailed Project Report (DPR) has been prepared by TWAD Board for providing UGSS to Velankanni Town Panchayat at an estimated cost of Rs.33.21 crore and submitted to Ministry of Urban

Development, New Delhi for appraisal and approval through TUFIDCO.

- The Government of India has launched “Swachh Bharat Mission” (SBM) on 2nd October 2014 with a target, to make the country clean by 2nd October 2019. In the Budget estimate for the year 2015-2016, Rs.50 crore has been allocated under “Swachh Bharat Mission” (SBM) to Town Panchayats. The eligible components under SBM are Individual Household Toilet, Community Toilet, Public Toilets and Solid Waste Management Projects.

Tamil Nadu Water Supply and Drainage Board

- Under Rural Water Supply Programme, Water Supply has been provided to 23,436 Habitations. Besides, the Rural Habitations, Water Supply Schemes to 6,799 Government Schools, 13,454 Anganwadis and 285 Government Hostels have been completed. In addition to the above 3,348 Recharge structures were also constructed for sustainability of Water sources. In total, Rural Water Supply Schemes were completed to benefit a population of 93.71 lakh and at an expenditure of Rs.4,149.83 crore with fund assistance from Government of Tamil Nadu and Government of India.
- Under Major Combined Water Supply Schemes, two CWSS in Virudhu Nagar District, one CWSS in Salem District, one CWSS in Vellore District, One CWSS in Madurai District to cover 1 Corporation, 16 Municipalities, 39 Town Panchayats and 4,751 rural habitations have been completed

at an estimated cost of Rs.2,712 crore, to benefit a population of 62.53 lakh.

- Under Urban Water Supply Schemes, Water Supply to 56 towns, (10 Municipalities and 46 Town Panchayats) were completed at an estimated cost of Rs.295.39 crore to benefit a population of 13.97 lakh.
- Underground sewerage schemes, to Chinnamanur, Maraimalai Nagar, Namakkal, Tiruvannamalai, Ramanathapuram, Dharmapuri, Perambalur, Thiruvallur, Villupuram, Theni-Allinagaram Municipalities and Mamallapuram, Thiruchendur, Orathanadu Town panchayats totaling 13 Towns benefitting a population of 7.44 lakh have been completed at an estimated cost of Rs.350.19 crore.
- Hogenakkal Water Supply and Fluorosis Mitigation Project for providing protected Water Supply to the entire Dharmapuri and Krishnagiri Districts has been inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 29.05.2013 and the total expenditure incurred is Rs.1,678.11 crore. Water supply is effected to 3 Municipalities, 17 Town Panchayats and 7,502 rural habitations benefitting a Population of 33.20 lakh.

CHENNAI METROPOLITAN WATER SUPPLY AND SEWERAGE BOARD

- The construction of 60 MLD Sewage Treatment Plant at Perungudi has been completed at an estimated cost of Rs.61.19 crore.
- The work of providing water supply to Porur area has been completed at a cost of

Rs.12.94 crore and put to use which benefits about 1.30 lakh people.

NEMMELI DESALINATION PLANT

- Nemmeli desalination plant—A 100 MLD desalination plant at Nemmeli constructed at an estimated cost of sRs.805.80 crore with Government of India funding was commissioned by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 22.02.2013.
- The comprehensive water supply schemes to Alandur, Ambattur, Thiruvottiyur, Maduravoyal and strengthening of distribution system at Southern Head works, Anna Poonga and KK Nagar have been completed and commissioned at a total cost of Rs.460.57 crore and put to use which benefits about 17.74 lakh people.

CHENNAI METROPOLITAN DEVELOPMENT SCHEME

- 35 Jet Rodding machines, 30 Super sucker machines, 20 Jetting Cum suction machines and 116 Desilting machines have been procured at a cost of Rs.25.10 crore and put into use. By using these machines, the sewer block complaints and sewage overflow complaints have been considerably reduced.
- In Chennai city with special focus on the newly added areas Rs.583.86 crore have been sanctioned and works such as laying of water supply lines in uncovered areas of slums to supply water to below poverty line families, providing underground tanks and water filling points in newly added areas and replacement of choked water mains/PVC mains have been taken up. The

comprehensive water supply schemes to the 25 newly added areas of Chennai city are also in progress. These are Nolambur, Karambakkam, Ramapuram, Manapakkam, Nandambakkam, Okkiyam-Thoraipakkam, Injambakkam, Sholinganallur, Karapakkam, Edayanchavadi, Sadayankuppam, Kadapakkam, Vadaperumbakkam, Theeyambakkam, Chinnasekkadu, Manali, Pallikaranai, Mugalivakkam, Kottivakkam, Palavakkam, Perungudi, Surapattu, Kathirvedu, Puthagam and Puzhal.

- In Chennai city with special focus on improving infrastructures of basic amenities and sewerage system in the newly added areas, Rs.552.56 crore have been sanctioned. Works including laying of force mains between pumping stations, enlargement of sewage pumping mains, re-routing of sewage pumping mains, insertion of manholes in Mogappair, construction of road side pumping stations with submersible pump sets, improvement to existing sewage pumping stations, and providing UGSS for Meenambakkam area have been completed. The underground sewerage schemes in the newly added areas of Chennai city, Kathivakkam, Ramapuram, Sholinganallur-Karapakkam, Surapattu, Puthagaram-Kadhirvedu Nolambur and Thiruvottiyur (Annai Sivagami Nagar), are also under progress.
- In the Budget 2012-2013, it was proposed to plug 337 sewage outfalls at a cost of Rs.300 crore. This will prevent untreated sewage from entering Chennai city water ways.

This sewage would be appropriately treated and disposed of. In the first phase, works for plugging 179 of the 337 outfalls were taken up at an estimated cost of Rs.150 crore under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund and the works are in progress. The works will be completed in March 2016. In the second phase, to carry out the balance works for plugging 158 sewage outfalls, Government has sanctioned Rs.163 crore and the work were commenced on 01.09.2015 with respect to Adyar river courses and for the other river courses, tender received and under evaluation.

- The comprehensive sewerage schemes at Madhavaram, Ambattur-Phase-III, Package-I & V have been completed at a cost of Rs.86.04 crore. By implementation of the above schemes about 1.55 lakh people will be benefitted by availing the house service connection.
- Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 15.09.2015 has inaugurated, 120 MLD Sewage Treatment Plant at Koyambedu at a cost of Rs.87.35 crore, Meenambakkam Water Supply and Sewerage Scheme at a cost of Rs.4.70 crore, and 82 new Metro Water office buildings for the quality services of added areas in Chennai city at a cost of Rs.19.62 crore and also 78 common collection centres at a cost of Rs.3.22 crore.
- The Detailed Project Report for setting up the 400 MLD capacity SWRO desalination plant at Perur, in ECR and laying of pipe line has been prepared at a cost of Rs.4,070.67 crore. The DPR has been sent to Department

of Economic Affairs, Government of India through Ministry of Urban Development/ CPHEEO for funding under JICA. Efforts were made by CMWSSB and GoTN for availing the financial assistance from JICA in the current financial year (2015-2016) itself. To evaluate the project proposal and detailed project report, JICA Study team visited Chennai on 13.01.2016 and reviewing the project proposals.

- The Detailed Project Report for setting up 150 MLD capacity desalination plant in the available 10.50 area vacant land of the existing Nemmeli desalination plant with a capacity of 100 HLD has been prepared at a cost of Rs.1,371.86 crore. This includes the product water conveyance main also. The Government of Tamil Nadu have accorded Administrative sanction. The DPR has been sent to Department of Economic Affairs, Government of India through Ministry of Urban Development seeking funds from Government of India and assistance from KfW. In response to this, the KfW Appraisal Mission has visited Chennai during Oct-2015 and discussed the project proposals in detail. On getting concurrence of the KfW for tender documents, tender will be invited.
- To protect and restore water bodies and to meet Chennai's growing drinking water needs, Sustainable Water Security Mission has been formed at an estimate cost of Rs.5 crore and Administrative approval has been accorded. Tenders will be called for shortly.
- To improve the water supply distribution in Chennai city, laying of new water supply

mains in uncovered areas and replacement of choked up water mains for 310 Kms at a cost of Rs.116 crore, the Government of Tamil Nadu have accorded Administrative sanction and tenders were received on 29.12.2015 and are under evaluation.

- To promote the recycling of sewage to meet the water demands other than drinking water and to reuse treated wastewater for industrial purposes in place of fresh water supplied to Industries and Power plants in North Chennai, Manali and Minjur areas it has been proposed to put up 45 MLD TTRO Plant at Kodungaiyur Sewage Treatment Plant at a tentative cost of Rs.255 crore and administrative approval has been accorded by Government of Tamil Nadu. On obtaining clearance from World Bank for bid documents, tenders will be invited.
- To supply treated water to the industries at Irungakattukottai/ Sriperumbudur/ Oragadam etc, a 45 MLD capacity TTRO plant at Koyambedu at a estimate cost of Rs.394 crore has been proposed and tenders were received on and under evaluation.
- The Government of Tamil Nadu have accorded Administrative sanction for construction of 54 MLD capacity of Sewage Treatment Plant at Sholinganallur with infrastructures to generate electricity at a cost of Rs.65.97 crore. Tenders received on 15.12.2015 and are under evaluation.



Better Governance through Management of Human Resources

Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission

- The Online Application system was introduced for all the Examinations conducted by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission.
- The Online applications are Bilingual in format and most user-friendly in nature and will try to capture all the basic particulars and critical data of the candidates.
- Another Major Initiative by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission is to introduce One Time Registration Facility for the candidates in which, anyone can fill their Bio-data particulars and also upload signature and photo by paying a nominal amount (Rs.50/-). This Registration will be valid for a period of Five Years and shall be renewed thereafter.
- The Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission releases the Annual Recruitment Planner each year.
- To prevent any malpractices in the examination halls, all the examination centres are monitored through web-camera / videography. All the proceedings of the Oral Test are being video graphed to ensure transparency.
- In order to facilitate the Differently Abled Candidates, they are accommodated only in the ground floor rooms in all the examination centres for writing the examination. If necessary, scribes will be provided.
- For the speedy and fair selection process, Commission has introduced Computer Based Test.
- The candidates will be permitted to peruse their descriptive type answer scripts in the Commission's office. Further, the copies of objective type answer script are furnished to the candidates concerned, if required.
- To ensure transparency in service / unit allocation, the Commission has introduced the Counselling System. In this method, the vacancy particulars will be published in the website and displayed in wide screen at the time of counselling.
- It has also introduced Single Window System for Departmental Promotion Committee proposals. The salient feature of the scheme is to bring the proposals in person, to hand over the same to the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Office and the proposals will be scrutinised by the Senior Officials of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission on the same day.
- First time in the history of the Commission, 17.06 lakh applications have been received for the posts included in Group-IV Services Examination for year 2013 in which 14.12 lakh candidates were admitted to write the examination.

- As per the annual recruitment planner for the year 2014-2015 3,686 posts are to be notified this year.
 - First time in the history of the Commission, the marks obtained by all candidates and their Rank Status in Group-IV examination (2013) have been published in the Commission website, before counselling.
 - During the period from May 2011 to December 2015, 54,753 persons have been recruited to various posts by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission.
 - The Hon'ble Chief Minister has opened a separate 6 storeyed building on 27.09.2012 to the exclusive use of Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission with a value of Rs.19.86 crore at Frazer Bridge Road, Park Town.
 - During 2013-2014, the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission conducted the Civil Judges Examination (162 vacancies), Combined Civil Service Examination-I (Group-I) (79 vacancies), Combined Civil Service Examination-II (1,064 vacancies), Combined Civil Service Examination-IIA (2,269 vacancies), Village Administrative Officer Examination (2,342 vacancies) and Group-IV examination (4,963 vacancies).
 - During the period from 01.04.2015 to 31.07.2015, the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission has notified the Combined Civil Service Examination-II (2014-2015- Interview post) (vacancies 1,241) on 30.04.2015, Assistant Statistical Investigator Examination (2014) (vacancies 270) on 07.05.2015, Combined Civil Service Examination-I (Group-I) (vacancies 74) on 10.07.2015, Assistant Engineer (Civil) Highways Department Examination (vacancies 213) on 21.07.2015 and Maternal and Child Health Officer Examination (vacancies 89) on 31.07.2015 and Combined Civil Service Examination-II (Group-IIA) (vacancies 1863) on 12.10.2015.
 - During the period from 01.11.2015 to 31.12.2015, the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission has issued notification for Village Administrative Officer Examination, 2015 (vacancies 813) on 12.11.2015 and Research Assistant in Evaluation and Applied Research Department Examination (vacancies 14) on 16.12.2015.
 - Maternity Leave admissible to married women Government servants are enhanced from 90 days to 180 days.
 - 'Bhagawan Vaigundaswamy Birthday' was included as one of the 'Restricted Holidays'.
 - 11 District Inspection Cells are functioning in Tamil Nadu under the control of Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department. For effective functioning of the 11 District Inspection Cells, 11 new Jeeps at a cost of Rs. 85 lakh were given by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 20.02.2013.
 - Modular Kitchen was opened in Bhavani Sagar Centre. 2 Cooking Assistants were appointed as Basic servants.
 - 5 days Refresher Course to the Junior Assistants/Assistants are being conducted by the District Inspection Cell Officers at all the District Headquarters, at a cost of Rs. 10.40 lakh, every year.
- Anna Institute of Management**
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu declared open the New Building constructed

with modern facilities at Chennai at a cost of Rs.10.14 crore for the benefit of the Civil Service aspirants of the State who appear for the Civil Services Preliminary and Main Examinations conducted by the Union Public Service Commission. The new Building was declared open on 12.10.2012.

- During the year 2015-2016 particularly during the months of July 2015 to October 2015 Anna Institute of Management has conducted 178 short term courses and trained 5,700 Government employees and officials through Chennai campus and other three regional centres viz., Madurai, Salem and Trichy. Through these training to develop generic and domain specific competencies for the functionaries for strengthening capabilities to improve the public service delivery in action.

Special Programmes

- In order to the increase the efficiency more than one month training was provided for IAS Probationers of 2014 batch which was attended by 9 IAS Probationers. This programme was well received by the trainees as it provided them with an opportunity to have exposure to the functioning of various departments before they embark on the district training.
- Training programme conducted for Customs and Exercise Department officers as Leadership skills. Training programme on “Office Procedure” was conducted to both teaching and non-teaching staff members of Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore.
- Training programme on “Abolition of Bonded Labour System” in Tamil Nadu for Revenue Department officials.

- Ministry of Environment and Forest sponsored programme on “Leadership Strategic in Forestry” was conducted for the IFS officers.
- Management Principles and Functions was conducted for the Faculty members of Institute of Hotel Management.
- Training programme on “Stress Management” for the officials of Corporation of Chennai was conducted.
- The Right to Information Act 2005 was conducted for the officials of Corporation of Chennai.
- Capacity Building programme on Disaster Management was conducted for Deputy Tahsildars/Tahsildars.
- The Government of India have initiated and sponsored the training programme viz. “Induction Training Programme” exclusively for the employees who are joined the service after 2014. The main objective of the training for the employees is to acquire knowledge on General Administration, Attitudinal change, Personality development and Department oriented subjects. The total duration of training is 12 days and it is conducted by Anna Institute of Management. It has been conducted in five districts viz. Kanniyakumari, Madurai, Trichy, Salem and Dharmapuri. The expected outcome of this training programme is that the employees have to serve citizens better.

‘A’ & ‘B’ Wing Foundation Course Training Institute

- The ‘A’ & ‘B’ Wing Foundational Course Training Institute is functioning at ‘Kanchi’ Building. This Institute imparts foundational training in Course - A and Course – B modules

to the directly recruited and promoted Group A and Group B officers of various departments. Successful completion and securing a pass in the examinations conducted at the end of the training are mandatory for the declaration of satisfactory completion of probation of these officers. This Institute is administered by the District Revenue Officer.

- It has been planned to impart training to 575 Officers in 15 batches during the year 2015 – 2016. In the first quarter of the current year, 154 officers were given training in 6 batches. During the second quarter 92 officers were given training in 4 batches.
- The training modules include the subjects, Law, Office Administration, Financial Administration, Public Administration, Right to Information Act, Principles of Management, Public Finance, Economics, Planning and Development and Usage of Computers. ‘Yoga’ practice is also taught for the benefit of the trainees. The training classes on the above subjects are handled by well experience guest faculties and subject experts. 3,965 candidates were benefited in this training.
- Civil Service Training Institute from June to December 2015 3,965 candidates were trained. 627 candidates in Coimbatore, 666 candidates in Trichy, 742 candidates in Vellore, 740 candidates in Salem and 1,190 candidates in Bhavani Sagar were trained.

All India Civil Services Coaching Centre

- During the months of November and December 2015, the All India Civil Services Coaching Centre, functioning under the aegis of Government of Tamil Nadu provided all possible support to the 225 IAS & other services aspirants.

- On the days of floods and rainwater inundation, most officials stayed in the campus, without going home and ensured food and safe drinking water to all the resident candidates.
- When the UPSC (Main) Examinations were held from 18.12.2015 to 23.12.2015, this Centre arranged Chartered buses through the Metropolitan Transport, Corporation, Chennai to take the students from the R.A. Puram premises to the Examination Centre at Quaide-Milleth-Government College for women. The Centre provided lunch to the candidates during all five days at the Examination Venue.

Civil Service Training Institute, Bhavanisagar

- The Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu issued orders for modernizing the Civil Service Training Institute in, Bhavanisagar, Erode District by constructing additional buildings and upgrading the training facilities at a cost of Rs.36.23 crore to make it a “Pioneer Institution”. Construction of indoor sports stadium has completed and put into use. The construction and modernisation of auditorium building is under rapid process.
- During the Financial Year 2015-2016 particularly during the months of November and December the Foundational Course Training for Junior Assistant / Assistants in Civil Service Training Institute and four Recruited Schools for Police namely, Vellore, Thiruchirappalli, Coimbatore, Salem have been given to 1,379 officials.

STATE PLAN

- Annual Plan Outlay for four years Rs. 1,94,423 crore.
- Twelfth Five Year Plan (2012–2017) is proposed to be implemented at an outlay of
- Rs. 2,11,250 crore which is 148% higher than the outlay for the Eleventh Five Year Plan.
- The Union Planning Commission approved an amount of Rs.9,129 lakh during the years 2011-2012 to 2014-2015 (Four years) for the implementation of Western Ghats Development Programme. The focus areas are Soil Conservation, Forest, Horticulture, Agriculture, Adi Dravidar Welfare, Tribal welfare, Roads, Tourism, Animal Husbandry, Renewable Energy, Rural Development, Agricultural Marketing and Agri-Business, Khadi and Village Industries, Fisheries, Minor Irrigation, Town Panchayats and Sericulture.
- The GOI Planning Commission allocated Rs.189.21 crore for four years, The focus areas include Soil Conservation, Forestry, Horticulture, Rural Roads, Development of Local Bodies, Welfare of SC/ST, Tourism, Sericulture, Medical and Public Health and Minor Irrigation.
- Revised Administrative Sanction was accorded for Rs.14.50 crore for the

Construction of Resource Centre for Tribal Culture, Udthagamandalam, Nilgiris District for housing an auditorium, exhibition centre cum museum and permanent sales outlet serving tribal interests.

- A sum of Rs.10 crore was sanctioned for the purchase of 62 new Mini Buses for the Nilgiris District for the easy transportation to other areas.
- In view of the present status of the pollution, a sum of Rs.5.50 crore was sanctioned for the Ooty Lake Conservation in the Nilgiris District.
- For undergoing regular Training for Trainees in High Altitude Training Centre (HATC) to improve their potential for going a competitive edge at sea level before taking part in a major competition/Tournament a sum of Rs.2.05 crore was sanctioned for laying Synthetic Athletic Track at Udthagamandalam.
- In the Union Budget 2015-2016, Government of India has announced that, the Hill Area Development Programme will be delinked from the Central Assistance from the year 2015-2016 onwards and stated that the schemes may be continued from the available resources of the State Government. Therefore, in the Budget 2015-2016, the State Government has announced a “new Special Area Development Programme” with an outlay of Rs.75 crore to cover the areas of Hill Area Development Programme and Western Ghats Development Programme. The Guidelines for the new programme are under preparation.

State Balanced Growth Fund (SBGF)

- The State Balanced Growth Fund Scheme is being implemented in 105 most backward

blocks in rural areas and in slums in municipalities and corporations in urban areas. Under the scheme, Rs. 100 crore is allotted every year. So far, 340 schemes have been approved for 105 most backward blocks in rural and urban areas costing Rs.191.96 crore and steps are being taken for implementing these schemes.

Establishment of Tamil Nadu Innovation Initiatives (TANII) and setting up of State Innovation Fund

- “Vision Tamil Nadu 2023” of making Tamil Nadu the “Innovation Hub” of the country, orders were issued for the establishment of the “Tamil Nadu Innovation Initiatives (TANII)” in the State Planning Commission. State Innovation Fund was also set up with a corpus of Rs.150 crore every year to encourage a culture of innovation in Government and Government agencies. An award, “Chief Minister’s Award for Innovation” will be instituted and awarded for the best innovative practices.

Impact Evaluation of Government Programmes

- Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed with the Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab, South Asia (JPSA) to institutionalize an evidence-based approach to policymaking in order to maximize the impact of the anti-poverty programmes. 16 such evaluations have been undertaken.

State Planning Commission

- The State Planning Commission recommended new Schemes for Rs.600 crore till 2014- 2015 covering all the Government departments for improving their infrastructure and Governance.

- “Tamil Nadu Innovation Initiative (TANII)” has been established in the State Planning Commission to promote Innovation in Government and Government Agencies. Accordingly a “State Innovation Fund” has been set up by restructuring the existing part-II schemes (new schemes) from the financial year 2015-2016 with an initial corpus of Rs.150 crore. In the first round, 32 projects with an outlay of Rs.84.84 crore and in the second round 37 projects with an outlay of Rs. 65.67 crore have been recommended. Further for evaluation studies Rs. 5.34 crore were sanctioned to J-PAL.
- The State Balanced Growth fund is implemented in 105 most backward blocks and backward urban slums of Corporation, Municipalities & Town panchayats. Every year a sum of Rs.100 crore has been provided to implement the scheme. The State Planning Commission has so far approved 320 projects worth Rs.210.88 crore under State Balanced Growth Fund programme to address backwardness in all 105 blocks covering 30 Districts.
- Based on the MoU signed with J-PAL the Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs.18,31,020/- for Engaging Women to Improve Breast Feeding outcomes in Tamil Nadu. A sum of Rs.26,12,448/- for Evaluating WIFS (Weekly Iron Folic Acid Supplementation) and a sum of Rs.2,21,86,483/- for Inculcating Healthy Habits to Reduce the Burden of Non-Communicable Diseases to Health & Family Welfare Department. A sum of Rs. 41,89,845/- has been sanctioned to School Education Department for Evaluating Primary School Education Interventions in northern Districts of Vellore, Tiruvannamalai and Krishnagiri. A sum of Rs. 29,72,475/- has been sanctioned to Labour and Employment Department for Improving Youth Labour Market Outcomes through skilling.
- As per the announcement made by the Hon’ble Finance Minister in his 2012-2013 budget speech backward regions which lag in Health Education, single man income, poverty and employment will be identified to remove the ups and downs in their development. An order had been issued for setting up a State-level annual fund of Rs.100 crore and with the help of this fund, backward regions will be identified for removing the backwardness through target-based scheme.
- State Planning Commission organized workshops/seminars and recommendations were documented in the form of booklets and commissioned special studies as required for formulation & implementation of plan projects and findings for the years 2011-2012 to 2014-2016 at an outlay of Rs. 300.63 lakh. In 2015, 13 workshops/ Seminar organized and the recommendations were documented in the form of booklets.
- Under Tamil Nadu State Land Use Research Board (TNSLURB) 32 research studies have been taken up at a total cost of Rs.2.22 crore.
- The State Planning Commission has undertaken the preparation of Human Development Report for the State and all 32 Districts under the State – UNDP UPC funded project “Human Development Bridging Inequalities”. The total outlay of the project is Rs.3.40 crore, out of which State contribution is Rs.2.40 crore and UNDP’s contribution is Rs.1 crore.

Construction of buildings:

- The Government has issued orders for the construction of Additional building for headquarters of the Department of Economics and Statistics in DMS campus at a cost of Rs. 469 lakh. The construction was completed and the building was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 26.06.2014. Out of 322 Block Statistical Inspector Offices to be constructed, construction for the office of 242 Block Statistical Inspectors was taken by Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Department at a cost of Rs. 6.28 crore. Construction work was completed for 228 Block Statistical Inspector Offices. Room space has been provided in the existing Panchayat Union office buildings for 64 Block Statistical Inspector Offices. For the remaining offices construction is to be started shortly.
- Of the two Regional offices, Salem regional office was completed and inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 26.06.2014. Cuddalore and Tirunelveli Regional Offices were completed and occupied. Madurai Regional office is ready for occupation and Coimbatore Regional office construction work is about to start.
- Out of the 42 Divisional Assistant Director offices to be constructed, construction of 28 offices has been completed and the construction is under various stages for remaining offices. Tiruchengode Division office in Namakkal District and Kovilpatti Division office in Thoothukudi District was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 26.06.2014. Out of the 14 District offices to be constructed, 12 offices have been completed and construction is under various stages for remaining offices.

- To enhance the quality of field work and improve the supervisory mechanism in the Districts, the department has purchased Bolero Jeeps for 31 District offices, one Car for Department Headquarters and one Car and one Bolero Jeep for State Statistical Training Institute at a cost of Rs. 187.73 lakh. The vehicles were handed over to the officials concerned by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 20.02.2013.
- Government had accorded a sum of Rs. 2.33 crore for the provision of Furniture and Fixtures to Headquarters and all Regional, District, Division, Block offices. The work order has been placed with TANSI and supply of Furniture and Fixtures for all the offices is nearing completion.

13th Finance Commission Grant-in-aid:

- To empower the existing statistical framework to produce comprehensive, good quality and relevant economic/social data for policy initiatives and decision making and to enhance the quality of District and State statistical systems, the 13th Finance Commission recommended a grant at the rate of Rs. 1 crore per District over its award period of 2010-2015. The Government of India has sanctioned Rs. 31 crore to Tamil Nadu State.
- Estimation of workforce studies and other studies viz., cost of cultivation, Type study, Fisheries, Micro Small Medium Enterprises (MSME), Animal Husbandry, Annual survey of Industries were carried out under 13th Finance Commission grant. Networking of all level offices enabling online data capturing is also undertaken. The very aim of the studies is to fill the gap in sample size of the existing methodologies of State / District income systems. More the sample size more will be standard of precision. In

view of this, an extensive and wide coverage of samples was ensured under the above studies. The information thus captures under various studies above, are being completed and results will be used for estimation of State/District income.

Food Production for Tamil Nadu 2014-2015

- The Department of Economics and Statistics, being “State Agricultural Statistical Authority” (SASA), estimates area, production and yield data for principal crops in Tamil Nadu. The area of the Crops are aggregated from revenue records, while the details regarding productivity (yield) are assessed through 9,276 crop cutting experiments in co-ordination with Agriculture and Horticulture Departments.
- As per the Final Estimates for the year 2014-2015 in respect of Tamil Nadu, the area of food grains is estimated at 36.06 lakh hectares with all time high production of 127.95 lakh metric tonnes.

Base Year Shifting

- The compilation of the indices of various economic parameters assumes greater importance as the Socio-Economic scenario undergoes enormous changes which create extensive need for capturing information on emerging trends with higher degree of accuracy. Hence, there is a need to revise their base year. Keeping this in view, elaborate technical exercise has been taken up by this Directorate to shift the Base year for computation of Index of Industrial Production (IIP), Wholesale Price Index (WPI), State Gross Domestic Product (GDP) estimates, to the year 2011-2012, based on the methodology furnished by Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, Government of India.

Special Programme Implementation

Chennai Metro Rail Project

- Chennai Metro Rail Project covering two corridors for a length of 45 km is under implementation of which 24 km is underground and 21 km is elevated.
- 90% of construction work relating to elevated viaducts / metro stations, 65% of construction work relating to underground metro stations and associated tunnels and 100% of construction work relating to Depot have been completed.
- 30 km of tunnel boring out of total 36 Km has been completed utilizing 12 Tunnel Boring Machines.
- The trial run of first train set arrived from Brazil was flagged off by Hon’ble Chief Minister in Koyambedu depot on 06.11.2013.
- The 110 KV / 33KV & 110 KV / 25 KV Receiving Sub Station was commissioned at Koyambedu and the power supply was inaugurated by Hon’ble Chief Minister on 06.11.2013.
- All the train sets from Brazil (9 train sets) and 24 train sets out of 33 from Sri City, Andhra Pradesh, have arrived at Koyambedu Depot.
- Track works in elevated section has been completed for a route length of 14 km. In addition, 10 Km track works in Depot has also been completed. Track works in the underground section from Egmore to Nehru Park is underway.
- The passenger services in the elevated stretch from Koyambedu to Alandur (10.15 Kms) has been inaugurated by Hon’ble Chief Minister on 29.06.2015.

Public (Political Pension) Department

- Freedom fighters Pension has been enhanced from Rs. 10,000/- to Rs. 11,000/- and family pension from Rs. 5,000/- to Rs. 5,500/-.
- Medical Allowance to the Freedom fighters who are getting pension and family pension has been enhanced from Rs. 100/- to Rs.500/- and provision of “A” class facility in Government Hospitals and “pay ward” facility without payment of any charges in

new hospitals.

- Special Pension paid to the descendants of Veerapandia Kattabomman, Maruthupandiar Brothers, Muthuramalinga Vijaya Raghunatha Sethupathy and the descendant of V.O. Chidambaranar Thiru. A.Ulaganathan has been raised from Rs. 4,500/- to Rs. 5,000/-

Public (Ex-Servicemen) Department

- Cash Grants and Cash in lieu of land have

- been enhanced to the recipients of Gallantry Awards and to winners of Distinguished Service Medals from armed forces belonging to Tamil Nadu.
- The monthly Consolidated Pay to the Ex-Servicemen engaged in the Temple Protection Force has been increased from Rs.1,500/- to Rs.5,000/-.
 - The procedures for providing compassionate ground appointments to next of kin of defence personnel killed have been considerably simplified and as a result 177 have been given appointment in Government.
 - 753 Ex-Servicemen have been placed in various Government/Private Organisations during the reporting period through the Directorate of Ex-Servicemen's Welfare.
 - E-Governance has been introduced in the Department of Ex-Servicemen's Welfare, through NIC to streamline registration, placement and administration of welfare measures for Ex-Servicemen.
 - The life time monthly financial grant to the Second World War Veterans was enhanced from Rs.3,000/- to Rs.4,500/- and from Rs.2,000/- to Rs.2,500/- to the widows of Second World War Veterans.
 - Works for the construction of Ex-Services Centre Building at Vellore District after demolishing the damaged building in an expenditure of Rs.2.20 crore have been commenced.
 - New Ex-Servicemen Welfare Offices at Dharmapuri, Namakkal, Tiruvarur, Tiruppur and Ariyalur Districts were formed.
 - Monetary Grants now paid to the Defence and Border Security Forces Personnel who laid their lives/Disabled in war and war like operations have been extended to all the Para Military Force Personnel hailing from Tamil Nadu.
 - Extending Scholarship now paid to the wards of Ex-Servicemen studying in regular colleges in Technical, Professional, Vocational and Arts & Science Education to the wards of Ex-Servicemen studying in Evening Colleges was ordered.
 - Enhancement of the upper limit of the loan availed under Bank Loan Interest Subsidy scheme for individual Ex-Servicemen / Widows / Ex-Servicemen Self Help Groups was ordered.
 - Enhancement of Marriage Grant from Rs.25,000/- to Rs.50,000/- to the daughters of Widows of Battle Casualties/daughters of Disabled Ex-Servicemen whose disability is 50% and above was ordered.
 - Enhancement of Annual Maintenance Grant to the Next-kins of Battle Casualties, War Widows and the War Disabled from Rs.12,000/- to Rs.25,000/- was ordered.
 - Under Tamil Nadu Ex-Services Personnel Benevolent Fund, 23,974 persons were benefited at a cost of Rs.78.95 crore, under Amalgamated Funds 15,069 persons were benefited at a cost of Rs.13.39 crore, under Resettlement Training 148 persons were benefited at a cost of Rs.7.30 lakh, under Pre-Recruitment Coaching Class 529 persons were benefited at a cost of Rs.2.71 lakh, under Hotel Management & Catering

- The Hon'ble Chief Minister has extended/enhanced the following welfare schemes to the 64,277 Sri Lankan Tamil refugees residing in 109 camps as on 31.12.2015

(including 2 special camps) and 36,855 non-camp refugees in the State.

- Extension of welfare schemes to the Sri Lankan Tamil Refugees in the State.
- Extended Monthly Supply of Free Rice: Free rice has been supplied to 19,543 refugee families residing in camps upto 20 kg of the total entitlement as per the norms: i.e Child below 8 years - 6 kg and others -12 kg per month, to each family per month.
- Extended Chief Ministers Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme: This scheme has been extended for both camp and non-camp refugees. So far 25,972 families of camp and non-camp refugees have been issued the ID cards relating to this scheme.
- Extension of Permission to Purchase Ration Commodities: All 19,647 refugee families in camps have been given permission to purchase all other ration commodities including kerosene from the PDS shop as per the norms applicable for Indian citizens.
- Extended Girl Child Protection Scheme: This scheme has been extended to refugee families in camps. Under this scheme, for a family with only one female child, the Government will invest Rs 50,000/- for 20 years and for a family with only two female children the Government will invest Rs. 25,000/- each in FD for 20 years. So far, 122 girl children have been benefited under this scheme.
- Extension of Social Security Scheme: This scheme has been extended to refugees in camps. Under this scheme Monthly pension

at the rate of Rs 1,000/- have been paid to destitute widows, old aged, differently abled, deserted wives and unmarried women. 16,697 refugees are getting benefits under this scheme.

- Extension of Waiver of Tuition Fees for First Graduation Students: Under this scheme tuition fees are waived for first graduation students admitted through single window system and pursuing engineering degree courses.
- Extension of Merit Based Admission in UG and PG courses in Arts and Science Colleges: Under this scheme refugee students are admitted in Arts and Science colleges for UG and PG courses on open quota based on their merit.
- **Extension of Hostel Facilities:** Five seats are created and reserved in each of the hostels meant for SC, ST, BC, MBC and Minority students. A total of 12,660 seats were reserved in 2,532 hostels in the State. 362 students are admitted in these hostels.
- **Enhanced Monthly Cash Dole:** Monthly cash doles have been enhanced from Rs.400/- to Rs.1,000/- for head of the family from Rs.288/- to Rs. 750/- for adults and from Rs. 180/- to Rs. 400/- for children below 12 years for all the refugees in the camps.
- **Enhanced Last Funeral Rites Expenses:** The funeral rites expenses have been enhanced from the existing Rs. 2,500/- to Rs. 5,000/-. So far 882 families have benefited under this scheme.

- **Extension of Revolving Fund for Self Help Groups (SHGs):** Under this scheme 416 women SHGs functioning in camps have been provided with revolving funds at the rate of Rs 10,000/- at a cost of Rs.41.60 lakh.
- **Enhanced Basic Amenities in Camps:** Orders have been issued for constructing 1,655 new durable houses. Of these 1,202 houses have been constructed. The balance Rs. 543.6 lakh has been diverted for repairing the roof of the Sri Lankan Tamils houses.
- Sanction of contingencies fund Rs. 11.40 lakh to meet immediate contingency expenses at the rate of Rs.10,000/- per camp.
- During 2014 and 2016 all Sri Lankan Tamils living in camps were given pongal gift worth Rs. 152/- and Rs. 318/- which included a cash of Rs. 100/-
- **Extension of Free Supply of Sewing Machines:** Under this scheme free sewing machines are supplied to poor refugee women, who have been trained in tailoring. So far 4,085 women have benefited under this scheme.
- **Extension of Educational Kits for College and School Students:** Under this scheme 1,029 refugee students studying in Government and Government aided school have received free laptops.
- Special cash incentives, footwear, bags and geometric box and cycle (886 Nos) at no cost . for SriLankan Tamil students studying in Government / Government aided schools.
- Extension of free supply of Electric Mixie, Fan and Grinder to Sri Lankan Tamil Families in Camps.
- **Extension of Merit Based Admission in Professional Courses Under Lateral Entry System:** Under this scheme refugee students are also admitted in lateral entry scheme in BE/B.Tech./MBA/ MCA/ M.Tech. / M.Arch. courses under open quota.
- **Enhanced Dr.Muthulakshmi Reddy Maternity Financial Assistance Scheme:** The maternity assistance for mothers have been enhanced from the existing Rs. 6,000/- to Rs. 12,000/-. So far 3,046 mothers benefited under this scheme.
- **Enhanced Moovalur Ramamirtham Ammaiyar Memorial Women Marriage Assistance Scheme:** Under this scheme women with graduate/diploma qualification will get Rs.50,000/- + 4g gold and other women will get Rs.25,000/- 4g gold. So far 390 women have benefited under this scheme.
- **Enhanced Chief Minister's Sri Lankan Refugees' Relief Fund :** The Chief Minister's Sri Lankan Refugees' Relief Fund for accidental deaths have been enhanced from the existing Rs.15,000/- to Rs.25,000/. So far 22 families (13 in Rs.15,000/- + 9 in Rs.25,000/- category) have benefited under this scheme.
- The financial assistance for damages due to natural calamities like fire and flood has been enhanced from Rs. 2,000/- to Rs.5000/- for fully damaged huts and from Rs.1,000/- to Rs. 2,500/- for partly damaged huts.

- From the current academic year (2015-2016) Sri Lankan Tamil students are permitted to join Government ITIs.
- **Prizes and Awards** : Sri Lankan Tamil students living in camps who secure first three State ranks in 10th and 12th standard Government Public examination will be given a total incentive for Rs.3.2 lakh from the year 2015-2016. Orders have been issued for the same.
- **Supply of Utensils**: Eight type of cooking utensils, costing Rs.250/-, are supplied to each family at free of cost through co-operative stores, once in two years.
- **Supply of Clothes**: Free clothing materials are supplied as per norms fixed to each of them every year, at free of cost through co-optex. Blankets are also given to them once in two years.
- **Scholarships to Refugee Students**: Under this scheme scholarships ranging from Rs.850/- to Rs.4,700/-, depending on the course, are paid per annum for refugee students pursuing higher education. 1,592 students are benefited under this scheme.
- **Creation of Migrant Resources Centre**: Creation of a new “Migrant Resources Centre” (MRC) in Chennai for the welfare of Non-Resident Tamils. State Government’s expenditure Rs. 15 lakh per year.
- **Revolving Fund**: Orders have been issued to sanction of Rs. 1 crore as revolving fund, to incur expenditure for the transportation of mortal remains of the deceased Non-Resident Tamils and for repatriation of Tamil Nationals in distress / medical invalidation by Commissioner of Rehabilitation.

WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

- The Final Orders of the Cauvery Water Disputes Tribunal has been published in the Gazette of the Government of India on 19.02.2013, thereby fulfilling the long felt dream of the farmers of Cauvery Delta and restoring the rights of the State.
- Action is being taken for formation of the Cauvery Management Board and Cauvery Regulatory Authority.
- In Mullai Periyar Dam, the water level reached 136 ft. on 31.10.2014 and the level of 142 ft. on 21.11.2014 and 08.12.2015, which is a historic event, after almost a span of 35 years. The rights of farmers and the people of Tamil Nadu to store water in the Dam initially to 142 ft. have been restored after a long legal battle and because of the persistent and the timely efforts taken by the Government.
- Tamil Nadu has to receive 12 TMC ft. of Krishna Water, for Chennai city drinking water supply every year. Due to the persistent efforts of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, maximum quantity of Krishna Water has been received by Tamil Nadu during the past four years, totaling to 23.990 TMC ft.
- Under the World Bank loan assisted IAMWARM project, Rehabilitation of 2,830 tanks, 370 Anicuts and 4,539.32 km length of supply channels were taken up, at a cost of Rs.1,069.14 crore.
- Under the Master Plan Artificial Recharge Scheme, 522 artificial recharge structures such as Check Dams, percolation ponds and recharge shafts were constructed in the

areas having recharging potential, at a cost of Rs.164.04 crore.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

- Immediate Relief amount of Rs.1.50 lakh sanctioned to the cases of death due to Natural Calamities enhanced to Rs.4 lakh. Relief for loss of Cow / Bullock and Sheep / Goat has been enhanced from Rs.20,000/- to Rs.30,000/- and from Rs.2,000/- to Rs.3,000/- respectively. Likewise for the loss of poultry relief has been enhanced from Rs.30 to Rs.100/-.
- Relief Assistance to crops under assured irrigation has been enhanced from Rs.7,500/- to Rs.13,500/-per hectare.
- Relief Assistance to perennial crops has been enhanced from Rs.12,000/- to Rs.18,000/- per hectare.
- Rs.60 crore sanctioned for restoration of damages caused during North East Monsoon 2014.

Drought Relief

- The Hon'ble Chief Minister announced that all the Districts except Chennai were declared as drought affected.
- For Delta and Non Delta Districts, the Honourable Chief Minister has announced drought relief to the tune of Rs.2,281.77 crore.
- A High Level Committee under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Finance Minister with Senior Ministers and Officials as Members have been formed to assess the drought situation in the state and to suggest remedial measures to the Government.
- Relief assistance of Rs.541.50 crore at Rs.15,000/- per acre for 3,61,000 acres have been sanctioned to the farmers of Delta Districts, whose crop loss is more than 50% and a sum of Rs.524.25 crore has been disbursed to 3,52,613 farmers.
- Relief assistance of Rs.804.24 crore has been sanctioned to the Non Delta District farmers.
- Rs.857.78 crore has been sanctioned towards to tackle drinking water supply to Delta and non Delta Districts.
- For all the districts, except Chennai, the ceiling of number of working days under MGNREGS has been enhanced from 100 days to 150 days.
- As a relief measure to provide fodder to cattles and for formation of farm ponds in Delta Districts, works to the tune of Rs.47.85 crore have been taken up.
- Considering the difficulties faced by the farmers due to drought, the crop loans availed by the farmers from the Co-Operative Banks have been rescheduled.
- Rs.6 crores has been sanctioned towards dry fodder for Animal Husbandry Department.
- Due to the deficit rainfall during the year 2012-2013, Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs. 492.37 crore from the ongoing schemes and from the General funds of the local bodies to tackle drinking water scarcity and a sum of Rs.189.16 crore have been sanctioned from SDRF for tackling drinking water scarcity.
- During the year 2014-2015, eight districts has received deficient rain fall. To mitigate drinking water scarcity, the Government have sanctioned a sum of Rs.66.50 crore to Districts and Rs.29 crore.
- Moreover, in respect of Chennai District, an additional amount of Rs.52.20 crore has been sanctioned to Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board.
- About 671 pilgrims from Tamil Nadu were stranded in the flash floods / landslides that occurred in Uttarkand. Of this, 657 pilgrims were safely rescued and brought back. Relief to the families of 14 missing persons was disbursed to the tune of Rs.7lakheachbywayofchequebytheHon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 23.12.2013.
- In order to assist the Tamil Nadu State Disaster Management Authority, Government constituted the Tamil Nadu State Disaster



rescue team to carry out rescue operations. Further, financial assistance of Rs.1 lakh each to the kin of the 17 deceased persons was disbursed immediately.

- A 11 storeyed building under construction in Moulivakkam Village in Sriperumbudur Taluk of Kancheepuram district collapsed. A sum of Rs.50,000/- has been disbursed from Chief Minister Public Relief Fund to each of 27 injured persons. The Hon'ble Chief

Minister distributed cheques for Rs.98 lakhs as relief at Rs. 7 lakh to each of the families of the 14 deceased persons belonging to Tamil Nadu. Moreover, a sum of Rs.2 lakh each has been sanctioned of total Rs.92 lakh from the Chief Minister Public Relief Fund to the families of the 46 deceased persons of other States.

Capacity Building for Disaster Response

- In order to improve the capacity of Revenue Officials in Disaster Management, training

has been imparted to 8,447 officials at a cost of Rs.2.5 crore.

North East Monsoon 2015

Unprecedented Rains and Floods

- The Northeast Monsoon made its onset in the State of Tamil Nadu on 28.10.2015. Since then, there has been heavy, very heavy and extremely heavy rainfall over few districts of Tamil Nadu due to upper air cyclonic circulation and formation of low pressure area. The unprecedented rainfall with great intensity marooned large parts of Cuddalore, Chennai, Tiruvallur, Kancheepuram and Thoothukudi Districts causing extensive damage. The Hon'ble Chief Minister conducted series of meetings with the Hon'ble Ministers and higher officials to review the flood situation in the State and geared up the relief and restoration measures.
- As per orders of Hon'ble Chief Minister High Level teams of Ministers and Senior IAS Officers were deputed to various flood affected districts to monitor the rescue and relief operations. The Hon'ble Chief Minister visited the flooded areas on 16.11.2015 and also undertook an aerial survey of the flood affected areas in Chennai on 03.12.2015.
- Six teams of the State Disaster Response Force, Six teams of the Coastal Security Group, 1,400 personnel of the Fire and Rescue Services Department, 30,000 personnel of the Tamil Nadu Special Police and in all more than 80,000 persons from the Government's side were involved in round the clock rescue and relief operations. That apart 1,920 NDRF personnel, 1,200 Army personnel and 600 personnel from Navy and Coast Guard were engaged in rescue and relief operations and as a result thousands of people were safely rescued.
- Six helicopters of Air Force and two helicopters each of Navy and Coast Guard were deployed in rescue operations in marooned areas and airdropping of food material and drinking water.
- 23.51 lakh people living in low lying areas were safely evacuated and accommodated in 7,244 relief camps.
- 1.36 crore food packets were distributed to the inmates of the camps and to the flood affected people outside the camps.
- 36,840 Medical Camps were organized and 44.08 lakh persons were treated in these camps.
- 8,025 Animal Husbandry Camps were conducted and 24.69 lakh animals have been vaccinated and provided medical treatment.
- 690 tonnes of Milk Powder was distributed to the flood affected areas and 1.42 lakh text books / note books have been issued to the students who have lost their text books and note books due to floods. Further, 37,136 students have been provided with uniform sets.
- Rs.1,274 crore was disbursed for the inundated houses during Northeast Monsoon 2015.



- A sum of Rs.450 crore was disbursed to the farmers who suffered crop loss of 33% and above.
- Sarees, Dhoties and 10 kg Rice were disbursed to 30,41,868 flood affected families during Northeast Monsoon 2015.
- 1,25,571 petitions were received and 57,000 petitions were disposed during 112 Special camps conducted.
- As per the orders of the Hon'ble Chief Minister totally a sum of Rs.2,300 crore was sanctioned by the Government towards immediate relief and restoration measures.

Issuance of Certificate to School Students

- It was order that certificate of Community, Income and Nativity for 6th, 10th and 12th standard students should be issued in their

schools itself. Till 31.03.2015, 39.65 lakh students have benefited by this measure.

Coastal Disaster Risk Reduction Project (CDRRP)

- In order to reduce the vulnerability of coastal districts to disasters, a new scheme called 'Coastal Disaster Risk Reduction Project' is being implemented at an outlay of Rs.1,481.80 crore. Construction of 14,346 multi hazard multiple resilient permanent houses with disaster resistance features was completed in the vulnerable coastal districts.
- To protect people in coastal areas, it has been planned to construct 121 Multi-purpose evacuation centres with 143 signages to evacuation centres at a cost of Rs 25 crore. So far 22 shelters had been completed at a cost of Rs.315 crore.

Installation of Early Warning System (Rs. 50 crore):

- The coast of Tamil Nadu is vulnerable to cyclones and floods. It was proposed to establish an Early Warning System (EWS) or Disaster Warning Announcement System (DWAS) which is centrally monitored for fault free functioning, in order to deliver the warning alerts and messages to the target coastal community, as and when needed, on 24 x 7 basis. It is first of its kind in India to integrate the system with the coastal community with the assistance of the Community Based Disaster Risk Management.
- Installation of Early Warning Systems in 444 coastal villages in 13 coastal districts of Tamil Nadu has been planned, which are known as DWAS-R. These DWAS-R will be controlled by DWAS-C, which will be installed at the Revenue Administrative Commissioner's office in Chennai. An alternative system known as DWAS- DRC has been planned to set up in Tirunelveli.
- The Tamil Nadu State wide area Network (TNSWAN) with High Frequency VHF Radio waves for the last mile connectivity and GSM/GPRS Mobile network at the redundant communication networks.
- In the first phase state control room (DWAS-C) will be installed, in the second phase DWAS-D will be installed at the District Collectorate and in the third phase DWAS-R will be installed in panchayat

union headquarters with linkages to susceptible villages.

Conversion of overhead lines in Nagapattinam, Cuddalore and Velankanni towns (Rs. 360 crore)

- The TANGEDCO has proposed conversion of overhead electrical (HT<) lines into underground cables in Cuddalore, Nagapattinam & Velankanni town.

Fisheries Department

Infrastructural and Livelihood Works

- The main works of Reconstruction and Modernisation of Fishing Harbour in Nagapattinam and Pazhayar in Nagapattinam District, has been completed and Sewage Treatment Plant works are in progress.
- The main works of Construction of Two New Fish Landing Centre at Nagore in Nagapattinam District and Parangipettai-Annankoil Village in Cuddalore District, has been completed and STP works are in progress.
- Permanent Opening of Two bar-mouths viz. Across Uppanar River and Vellar River were completed and put into use.
- The construction of Tube ice plant at Chinnamuttom in Kanniyakumari District has been completed.
- Action is being taken to start the work of Modernisation of Mallipattinam Fishing Harbour in Thanjavur District, Stabilisation of Bar-mouth at Punnakayal in Thoothukudi District and Conducting studies for New

Fishing Harbour Projects at 7 areas in 6 coastal districts.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS -II FIMSUL-II)

- Under this sub-component, Action is being taken to implement various activities to enhance the Livelihood of fishermen by providing financial and Technical assistance, promote Co-Management initiatives for better management of Marine Fisheries, impart training to fishers on fishing livelihood methodologies/practices, best management practices and thus alleviate them from their sufferings.

Capacity Building in Disaster

Risk Management

- Action is being taken to set up a GIS cell & GIS platform to assist in decision making with an outlay of Rs.17.50 crore.
- In order to generate greater awareness among the school students, The Curriculum on Disaster Management has been introduced in the schools and same has been included in the text books.

Community Based Disaster Risk Management (CBDRM)

- This programme has been designed to help communities to better utilize risk mitigation infrastructure and work together with local governance system while mobilizing themselves to be better prepared as well as respond to any disaster event and

implemented through SIRD at a cost of Rs.15 crore.

The major activities to be taken up under this are:

- a) Risk and Vulnerability Assessments,
- b) Community Mobilization and Capacity Building,
- c) Linking Communities to DWAS and Evacuation Shelters and
- d) Capacity Strengthening for Emergency response.

Objectives of CBDRM

- To reduce vulnerabilities to communities' and strengthen their ability to proactively cope with disasters and natural hazards, through preparation of Village Disaster Risk Reduction Plans.
- People in Coastal areas will be educated on how to keep the infrastructure developed under the disaster mitigation programme in their villages and also how to utilise the assets usefully during emergency.

Integrated Coastal Zone Management Plan [ICZMP]

- This component has been implemented by the Environment Department with the objective of protection and judicious use of natural resources in a sustainable manner and includes the preparation of Integrated Coastal Zone Management Plan [ICZMP], preparation of coastal vulnerability maps and preparation of Training modules for entire coast of Tamil Nadu.

- Under Community based disaster risk management programme, disaster-related training is being given to create awareness about disaster preparedness among the coastal community.
- Master Plan Complex have been constructed in Thanjavur, Tiruppur and Cuddalore Districts at a cost of 323.21 crore. The Government have also issued orders for construction of additional buildings for Collectorates in Coimbatore, Ramanathapuram, the Nilgiris, Kanniyakumari. The Government have issued orders for construction of buildings for 6 Revenue Divisional offices at Tambaram, Udumalaipet, Srirangam, Ambattur, Iluppur Divisions and construction of 64 Taluk offices, 19 Taluk offices have been completed and inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu. The Government have issued orders for construction of 54 Revenue Inspector office cum Quarters and 54 Firka Revenue Inspector Office cum Quarters at a cost of Rs.7.31 crore and construction of 231 Village Administrative Offices at a cost of 14.33 crore. Out of this construction of 13 Revenue Inspector office cum Quarters and 142 Village Administrative offices have been completed and inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister.
- The Government, for the first time, decided to renovate all the Village Administrative Officer offices in the State at a cost of Rs.50,000/- each and sanctioned Rs.40 crore to take up the renovation of 8,000 Village Administrative Offices and 4,773 Village Administrative Offices have been renovated.
- In NPR – Biometric capturing enumeration work, viz. Photography, Finger Prints and its images (Biometric) of the individuals (5 years and above 5 years has been taken up in a phased manner. This work is being executed through 640 permanent NPR centres. Aadhaar generation is Rs.5.76 crore.
- As per the orders of Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Amma Thittam is being implemented by the Revenue Department from 24.02.2013. Main priority of Amma Thittam is reaching Public and redressing their grievances on the spot, camps were held in three stages and out of 50.84 lakh petitions received, 49.45 lakh petitions were disposed of.
- The Chief Minister's Best Practices Award for Improvement of Quality Delivery System Ensuring Good Governance was awarded to the Revenue Administration and Disaster Management and Disaster Mitigation Departments and given to Hon'ble Revenue Minister, Additional Chief Secretary / Revenue Commissioner, Revenue Secretary.
- Priceless Sarees and Dhoties are being distributed to poor people every year for Pongal festival. In the past ten years, 6.81 crore priceless Sarees and 6.77 crore priceless Dhoties have been distributed to beneficiaries. The Government have sanctioned an amount of Rs.486.36 crores for the supply of 167.26 lakh Priceless

Sarees and 166.73 lakh Priceless Dhoties to the eligible beneficiaries for Pongal 2016.

Social Security Schemes

- Hon'ble Chief Minister ordered raising of pension from Rs. 500/- to Rs. 1,000/- to old age persons, destitute widows, deserted widows, unmarried women above age 50, destitute agriculture labourers and physically challenged persons, under Social Security Schemes. During the last five years, there is an increase of 29 percentage in the number of beneficiaries under Social Security Pension Schemes. The allotment of funds raised from Rs.1,207/- crore to Rs.4,198.05/- crore during the last five years.
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister has launched the scheme of disbursement of pension through banks by using Biometric Smart Cards first of its kind in India. Under this scheme pension was disbursed to 21.42 lakh beneficiaries at their door steps. Further 9.10 lakhs beneficiaries are getting pension through post offices at their door steps. So far 30,52,575 people are benefited.

Indira Gandhi Old Age Pension Scheme (IGNOAPS)

- Indira Gandhi National Widow Pension Scheme (IGNWPS), Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme (IGNDPS), Destitute Widow Pension Scheme (DWPS), Destitute/Deserted Wives Pension Scheme (DDWPS), Unmarried Woman Pension Scheme (UWPS) Unmarried Woman 50 years of age, Destitute Differently Abled Pension Scheme (DDAPS), Chief Minister's

Uzhavar Padukkappu Thittam (CMUPT), Srilankan Refugees Old Age Pension. All the social security pension schemes are being monitored online through OAP Website.

Distribution of Priceless Fan / Induction Stoves, Mixie And Grinder to Women Beneficiaries

- Scheme of distribution of priceless Electric Fans, Mixies and Grinders to women beneficiaries was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief minister on September 15.09.2011 at Kakkalur, Tiruvallur District. Under this scheme 1.85 crore priceless Fan, Mixie, grinder were given to 1.56 crore people.
- Order to bifurcate 62 taluks for creation of new taluks based on 2011 census figures.
- In the past five years, 4 Revenue Divisions and 49 taluks have been newly created and are functioning as such. The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu announced under Rule 110 to form 16 new taluks and 5 new Revenue Divisions have been formed and functioning for the year 2015-2016.

FAST TRACK PATTI TRANSFER

- The Hon'ble Chief Minister inaugurated the Fast Track Patti Transfer Scheme on 18.07.2011. From the inception of the scheme, 61.15 lakh number of patti transfer orders have been issued till 15.12.2015. The Government have fixed a total target of 10,50,000 house site pattas. By exceeding the above target, a total number of 11,89,875 free house-site pattas have been issued.
- 21,08,959 Sub Division Pattas, 36,245

Number of Natham Pattas, 6,14,749 Number of Urban Pattas and 2,312 Hill village Pattas have been issued by Settlement operations to the Public during the period 2011 – 2015.

- Orders have been issued by the Government for engaging 2 Data Entry Operators in each Taluk office to assist the staff in patta transfer work and their monthly remuneration has been raised from Rs.5,000/- to Rs.7,500/- by this Government.
- Web-based Software for Online Management of Land Records has been developed and Rural Land Records of 132 Taluks have been brought online so far. The Land Records of remaining Taluks will be brought online before 15.02.2016.
- Through this new system SMS will be automatically sent to the applicants directly from the system on receipt of Patta Transfer applications (acknowledgement), date of field inspection of Firka Surveyors and on approval of Patta / rejection of applications by Tahsildars / Deputy Tahsildars.
- In order to bring all types of Land Records online Computerization of Land Records of various types has been expedited. 93.65% of Natham Land Records, 99% of Urban Land Records and 60.86% of FMS have been computerized so far. Action has been taken to bring the computerized Land Records online.
- Under Chief Minister's Farmer's Security Scheme a sum of Rs.3,018.91 crore has been given to 37.18 lakh beneficiaries.

Government have extended the benefit to the children even after the death of the farmer member, under the scheme.

- In order to avail the assistance continuously, 72,40,387 tokens have been distributed to the beneficiaries under this scheme.
- 1,59,58,265 persons have been enumerated as members and 1,17,49,934 persons have been enumerated as dependent members.
- Concluding long pending cases, the lands declared as surplus during this period under the Land Reforms Act to an extent of 633 acres has been assigned to 507 persons.
- The disputes between cultivating tenants and landowners (including temple lands) were being settled by 6 Revenue Courts in the State. The Hon'ble Chief Minister announced in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly during the Budget Session of 2012-2013, creation of 4 additional Revenue Courts. These are functioning from 21.01.2013 at Lalgudi, Mannargudi, Tirunelveli and Nagapattinam to dispose of the long pending tenancy cases. As on 01.06.2011, there were 9,806 Cases pending in various Revenue Courts and 27,568 cases were received from 01.06.2011 to 30.11.2015 totaling 37,374 cases and out of this, 29,192 cases were disposed of during the period from 01.06.2011 to 30.11.2015 and as on 30.11.2015, 8,182 cases are pending in Revenue Courts.
- For expediting the work related to Patta transfer, two sets of Computer, Computer Table and Chair One Laserjet Printer,

- One UPS; and a Multifunction device (Minicopier-cum Scanner-cum-Printer) have been supplied to each of 220 taluk offices.
- Necessary arrangements have been made to facilitate issuance of village Maps to Public on request.
 - Out of Total Number of vacancies in the posts of Surveyors and Draftsman, 1,404 vacancies have been filled up through Compassionate ground, TNPSC and conversion.
 - Training has been imparted to the staff of this Department by drafting in Technically qualified persons through C-Star in Modern Surveying and Computerised mapping.
 - Digitized Field Measurement Sketches into usage and to facilitate online management of land records, Laptops have been provided to 600 Firka Surveyors. The total cost of the Laptops is Rs.159.88 lakh.
 - To facilitate easy communications related to Patta transfer work and also for close monitoring of disposal of Patta transfer applications, SIM Cards have been provided to Firka Surveyors, Inspector of Survey, Deputy Inspector of Survey, Sub Inspector of Survey and also to the officers of this department under Closed User Group (CUG) facility. 1,600 nos. of SIM Cards were provided at the total cost of Rs.21.66 lakh.
 - Computerization of Town Survey Land Records was pursued in Chennai District and Data entry of 3.76 lakh land records in Chennai has been completed.
 - In order to benefit the landowners 1,01,747 single pattas were issued to the landowners.
 - To expedite Fast Track Patta transfer Scheme, photocopies of Field Measurement Sketches (FMS) were provided to Firka Surveyors at a total cost of Rs.30 lakh.
 - An area of 9.35 sq.km. has been surveyed in Sholinganallur and Madhavaram taluk of under Natham Survey Scheme.
 - An Area of 31.60 sq.km. has been surveyed under Town Survey system in Chennai and Tiruppur Corporations.
 - Modern survey scheme offices (MSSO) have been established in 8 districts and provided facilities like GPS and Total Station to take up modern survey in newly upgraded third grade municipalities in these districts. So far 10.27.5 Sq.km has been surveyed.
 - With a view of providing all the services in Taluk offices to the public through a single window, Land Records Management Centres (LRMC) are being created in Taluk Offices. LRMCS are being created in 60 Taluks so far and Computers and accessories have been provided. Work is in progress in 18 Taluk offices.
 - Advanced training in Modern Survey and Mapping has been imparted to 82 persons, Fundamental training in using GPS and Total Station and fundamental and refreshment training has been imparted to 1,172 persons.
 - In order to give easy accessibility of surveyors to public, office-cum-residential quarters are built and provided in to 100 Firka Surveyors

on pilot basis. The total cost of the buildings in Rs. 12.71 crore.

- About 68,189 sq. metre of valuable Government land has been fenced at a cost Rs 18 lakh with a view to protect them, keeping in mind their future use for public purposes.
- Rs.2,08,61,765 has been collected by regularization of 2,94,929.29 Sq.ft. lands in 45 cases under Innocent Buyer scheme under Tamil Nadu Urban Land (Ceiling and Regulation) Act.
- Rs.655.35 lakh has been collected towards Urban Land Tax under Tamil Nadu Urban Land Tax Act.
- The office of the Commissioner (Urban Land Ceiling) and Urban Land Tax has been modernized at a cost of Rs. 30 lakh and linked with the sub-registrars' offices

in Chennai and in other districts with the headquarters by providing internet facility.

- The Honourable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu has inaugurated Office cum Residential Quarters in 96 Firkas.
- Construction is in progress in the remaining 4 Firkas.
- For monitoring and implementing online Patta Transfer system orders have been issued for providing Laptops to 50 Higher Officials of the Department and action is being pursued for providing Laptops.
- The Chamber of the Commissioner, Urban Land Ceiling and Urban Land Tax was modernized at the cost of Rs. 5 lakh.

- During 2013-2014, to facilitate the Financial Inclusion 3,176 Business Correspondents

(BCs) have been appointed from among member of SHGs in all the Districts by various banks.

- Out of 385 Blocks in the State, Tamil Nadu State Rural Livelihoods Mission is being implemented in three phases in 265 Blocks excluding 120 Blocks which are covered under Tamil Nadu Pudhu Vaazhvu Project.
- In the first phase 2,388 VPRCs have been formed and 3,538 VPRCs have been formed in the second phase. Enrolment Trend

- Due to the effective measures taken by the Government the Net Enrolment Rate (NER)

at primary level has increased from 99.60% in 2010-2011 to 99.85% in 2014-2015. The NER at upper primary level has increased from 98.84% in 2010-2011 to 99.10% in 2014-2015.

- The Gross Enrolment Rate (GER) in the secondary sector has increased from 82.30% in 2010-2011 to 91.17% in 2014-2015. At higher secondary level the GER increased from 55.92% in 2010-2011 to 76.77% in 2014-2015.

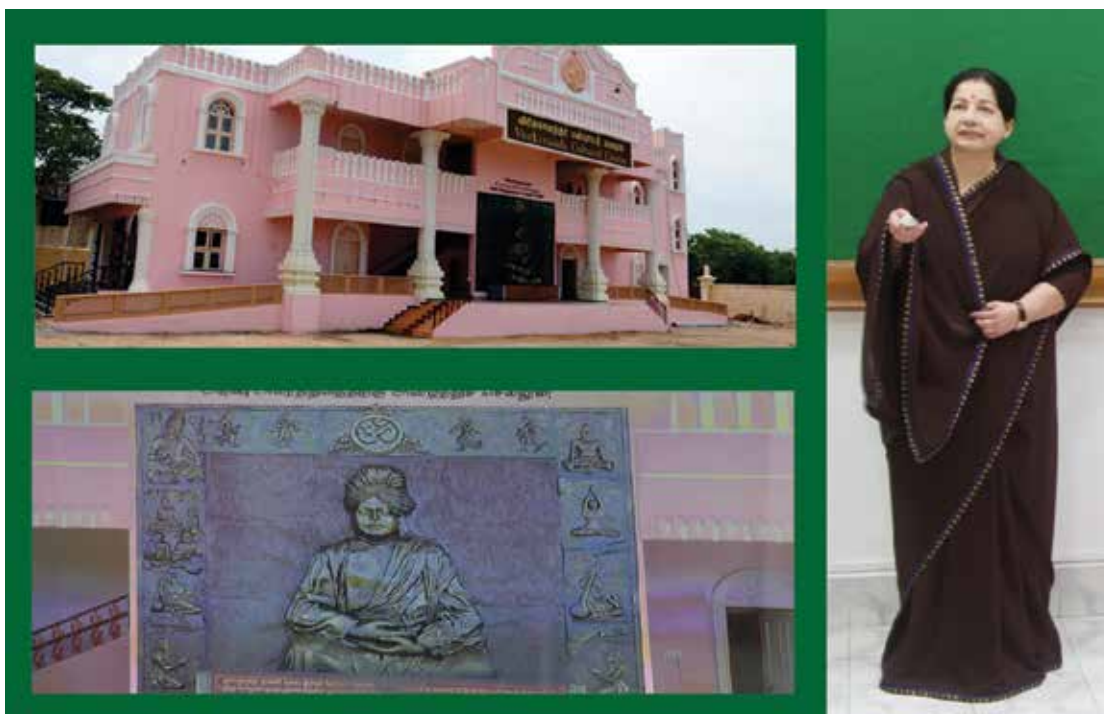

- For the benefit of native and foreign researchers and students the Government Oriental Manuscripts Library and Research Centre is functioning in the premises of the University of Madras.
- To improve the infrastructure at Government Oriental Manuscripts Library and Research Centre a sum of Rs. 119.32 lakh was sanctioned and the works were completed by Public Works Department.
- For the implementation of the Micro filming of rare Manuscripts of Government Oriental Manuscripts Library and Research Centre the Government have allotted a sum of Rs. 3.54 crore.
- Steps are taken to include the historical monuments and archaeological sites of this department in the Tourism Map of Tamil Nadu and the same had been included.
- Totally 47 Department books were published (9 Epigraphy books, 6 Students Monographs, 7 Excavation Reports, 3 Museum Guide books, 6 Archaeological Guide Books, 5 General and 11 Kalvetu Quarterly Journal).
- Under Part II Schemes for the year 2011-2012 a sum of Rs. 54.55 lakh has been sanctioned to carry out the installation of Lightning Conductors, purchase of digital cameras, Fire Extinguishers in the monuments and works were completed.

- Excavation work at Alambarai, Cheyyur Taluk of Kancheepuram District (2011-2012), yielded cannon balls, copper slag, potteries etc. An exhibition was conducted with the unearthed artefacts for the benefit of the general public. Excavation Reports was also published.
- Hon'ble Tamil Nadu Chief Minister has sanctioned a sum of Rs. 10 lakh under Discretionary Fund for the maintenance of Monuments, to upkeep and improve the Archaeological Site Museums and to carry out educational activities, for conducting the events like seminars, lectures, archaeological function of the department. In this regard, a sum of Rs. 10 lakh have been sanctioned every year.
- Under Part II Schemes for the year 2012-2013 a sum of Rs. 61.50 lakh has been approved for the implementation of digitalization of publications, Negatives and Slides, Publication of Epigraphy Books, Upgradation of Library, Purchase of chemicals for conservation and construction of building for Marine Archaeological site Museum at Poompuhar, Nagapattinam District. The new building was opened by Hon'ble Chief Minister through video conferencing on 27.06.2014 for the benefit of the general public.
- 684 inscriptions have been copied Sivagangai and Salem Districts.
- Under Registration of Antiquities schemes 844 art objects have been registered and certificates have been issued.
- Under the Thirteenth Finance Commission Grants (2011-2015), a total sum of Rs. 970.70 lakh had been earmarked for this department for the conservation and infrastructures facilities for 30 temple monuments in which a sum of Rs. 5.95 crore for the year 2011-2012 had been sanctioned for 5 temple monuments for the year 2012-2013 for the conservation and infrastructures facilities for 16 temple monuments. For the year 2013-2014 a sum of Rs.3.57 crore sanctioned for the conservation of 9 temple monuments. All the works were completed.
- Three Typists, one Steno-Typist and One Junior Assistant were directly recruited through Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission. one Junior Assistant and one sweeper were also appointed under Compassionate Grounds. Similarly, One photographer and one Office Assistant were also appointed through District Employment Office in this department.
- 13 Technical vacant posts in Archaeology Department have been filled up through Employment Exchange on purely temporary basis on a consolidated pay of Rs. 10,000/- per month.
- The amount of Rs. 1 crore has been sanctioned by the Hon'ble Chief Minister for conservation and restoration of Mukyachaleshwara Temple, Perumkkal of Villupuram District. The work is in progress.
- The amount of Rs. 50 lakh has been sanctioned for digitization of 15,000 inscriptions from Estampages in Tamil Nadu. The works were entrusted to ELCOT and is in progress, till date 14,000 estampages were scanned and documented.

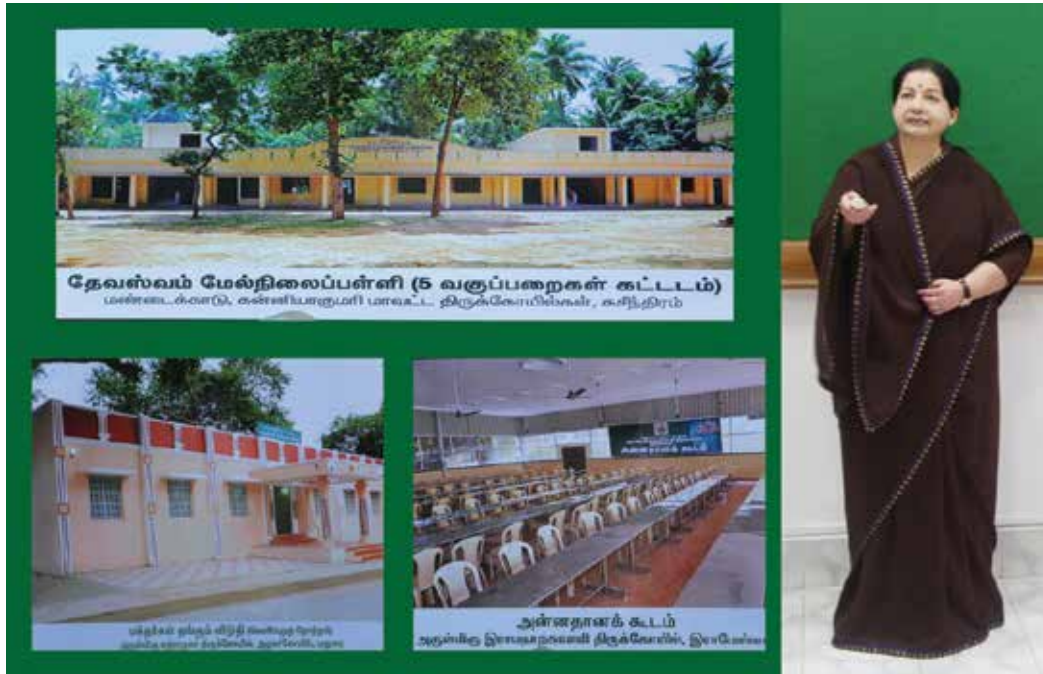

- Sanction accorded to conduct cultural excavation at Sri Ranganathar Temple, Srirangam in Trichy District at a cost of Rs. 5 lakh and the excavation works had been completed.
- Under the Part II Schemes for the year 2014-2015 a total sum of Rs. 6 lakh had been sanctioned for the excavation works at historical sites Alagankulam, Ramanathapuram District and Ukirankottai, Tirunelveli District. The excavation works were completed.
- In the year 2014-2015 "Rock Painting, Tamil Brahmi Inscriptions, Jain beds, cave temple" at Tirumalai Village in Sivagangai Taluk of Sivagangai District were declared as protected monument and published in the Tamil Nadu Gazette in May 2015.
- As a first of this nature in the country, The Tamil Nadu State Department of Archaeology conducted a short term six week course on "Heritage Conservation and Restoration of Monuments" from 3rd December 2014 to 13th January 2015 for 22 engineers of Temple and Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments Department. This course was very useful for the engineers for conserving and restoration of the ancient temples with the archaeological principle. The second batch [22 Engineers] was inaugurated on 19.03.2015 and the courses were successfully completed.
- Scanning, e-publishing and uploading the Sanskrit palm leaf manuscripts of the Government Oriental Manuscripts Library and Research Centre on the website at a cost of Rs. 50 lakh was sanctioned and the works are being carried out through ELCOT.
- Reprinting of 6 volumes of Sapta Rishi Naadi namely Mesham, Rishabam,

Mithunam, Kadagam, Simmam and Kanni Lagnams preserved in Government Oriental Manuscripts Library and Research Centre have been released by the Hon'ble Chief Minister through video conferencing on 15.09.2015 for the benefit of the scholars and general public.

- Under the Hon'ble Minister Announcement for the year 2015-2016, four new schemes have been announced.
- Conducting archaeological excavation at Pattaraiperumumbudur in Tiruvallur District at a cost of Rs. 10 lakh.
- Short term six week course on "Heritage Conservation and Restoration of Monuments" for the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowment Department Engineers at a cost of Rs. 25 lakh.
- Short term four week course on "Heritage Conservation and Restoration of Monuments" for the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowment Department Executive Officers at a cost of Rs. 20 lakh.
- Providing high end LED TV, inverter, media supports, along with infrastructure and adequate accessories for modernization the five site museums at a cost of Rs. 20 lakh.

DEPARTMENT OF MUSEUMS

- Twenty seven persons were appointed in the various vacant posts in Chennai and 20 District Museums.
- Construction of the balance portion of Heritage Compound Wall for a length of 88.5 meters has been taken up at a cost of Rs.95 lakh and the works have been completed.
- Renovation of the Children's Museum by providing Granite flooring with suitable amenities has been taken up and completed by incurring an expenditure of Rs.36 lakh.
- Re-organization of the Wood Carving Gallery has been completed by incurring an expenditure of Rs.2.83 lakh.
- Renovation of the Rock & Cave Art Gallery has been completed by incurring an expenditure of Rs.35 lakh.
- A Walk – through Sculpture Garden was established at a cost of Rs.9.4 lakh.
- Reserve Display (Visual Storage) of the remaining Amaravati Sculptures have been completed at an estimated cost of Rs. 43 lakh.
- Renovation of the centenary Exhibition Hall has been completed at an estimated amount of Rs. 57.5 lakh.
- Laying of the internal roads of the Government Museum, Chennai have been completed by incurring an expenditure of Rs.19 lakh.
- Erection of 5 Generators for supply of uninterrupted power supply has been completed at a cost of Rs.1 crore.

- A sum of Rs. 1 crore sanctioned for Construction of Visual Storage facility for the Museum objects that are kept in reserve to be displayed at the Government Museum, Chennai.
- A sum of Rs.10 lakh sanctioned for Putting up attractive signages and direction boards for the convenience of visitors at the Government Museum, Chennai.
- A sum of Rs.2 crore sanctioned for setting up of Fossil Museum at Ariyalur.
- A sum of Rs.2 lakh Sanctioned for e-publishing the digitized dilects and speeches of the Tribals of South India which were recorded in gramophone records and for digitizing the glass negatives of the Government Museum, Chennai.
- As an outreach programme Conservation and Restoration of Mural Paintings found in the Sri Parthasarathy Temple, Triplicane, Chennai, Sri Varadaraja Swamy Temple, Kancheepuram were conserved and restored.
- The portrait paintings of the erstwhile judges of the High Court, Madras were being conserved and restored.
- International Museum Day Celebration --'Special Exhibition on Museums and Galleries of Tamil Nadu', inaugurated on 18.05.2015.
- Inauguration of 41st Refresher course on Care of Museum Objects was held on 01.07.2015.
- Rare exhibits have been displayed as 'Exhibit of the Month'.

- Digitization of all the publications of the Department of Museums is under progress.
- Hon'ble Minister for School Education, inaugurated the 41st refresher course on "Care of Museum Objects" with special reference to manuscripts on 01.07.2015 and in the Valedictory Function on 04.08.2015. Eight participants from all over India participated.
- Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu has inaugurated a Visual Storage building of 2400 sq.ft area at the Government Museum, Egmore, Chennai, and released the Museum publications namely 1.'Compilation on Amaravati Sculptures and Conservation and reorganization of the Amaravati Gallery in the Government Museum, Chennai. 2.Tiruppudaimarudur Murals and Woodcarvings, 3.Manual on the Bronzes on 15.09.2015 through video conference from Secretariat, Chennai.
- Two Murals, damaged and vandalized with cement plaster in Arulmigu Parthasarathy Swamy Temple, Chennai have been discovered and conserved as per the archaeological norms as an Out Reach Work in September 2015.
- 100 Portrait paintings of yester year Justices of Hon'ble Madras High Court have been accepted to be restored through the Chemical Conservation and Research Laboratory, Government Museum, Chennai. Out of this, 30 Portraits have been completed till October 2015 and the remaining will be completed before March 2016.
- The Bronze Gallery of the Government Museum, Chennai is world renowned.

German typeshow-cases have been erected in 2003 to display the Bronze collections. The existing illumination of showcases are proposed to be modernized by replacing with L.E.D. illumination along with suitable panels at a cost of Rs.50 lakh. The same arrangements are also proposed to be extended for the Contemporary Art Gallery where Contemporary paintings and Raja Ravi Verma paintings are displayed. A sum of Rs.30 lakh for the Bronze Gallery and Rs.20 lakh for the Contemporary Art Gallery, in total Rs.50 lakh is proposed.

HR & CE DEPARTMENT

- Patta has been transferred in the name of temple from that of private individuals for lands belonging to 694 temples, measuring 4,185.98 acres.
- For lands measuring 563.91 acres belonging to 118 temples names of private persons found entered in the computerized chitta was identified and steps were taken to change the pattas in the name of temple.
- After this Government took charge, 1,940.33 Acres land, 311 grounds and 2,233 sq.ft. sites and 138 ground 1,483 sq.ft. buildings belonging to temples which were under encroachment have been retrieved. The value of the assets retrieved is roughly Rs.2,391.75 crore. Of these, in 2015-2016, the possession of cultivable lands measuring an extent of 53.54 acres, sites measuring an extent of 7 grounds 16.38 sq.ft. buildings measuring extent of 14 grounds 0457 sq.ft. have been brought in temples possession. Total value is approximately Rs.54.20 crore.



- The Annadhana Scheme, which is implemented in 518 Temples, 100 temples and 106 temples have been added to the scheme in 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 respectively. In addition to these, the scheme is implemented for whole day for the benefit of devotees in Arulmigu Sri Ranganatha Swamy Temple, Srirangam and Arulmigu Dhandayuthapani Swamy Temple, Palani. Now the above Scheme is implemented in 724 temples.
- A Government grant of Rs.2.63 crore is allocated for Special rejuvenation camps for elephants. Special rejuvenation camp for 37 elephants was conducted during 2011-2012

at Mudhumalai Theppakadu. Special rejuvenation camp for 35 elephants was conducted in 2012-2013 and for 33 elephants during 2013-2014 at Thekampatti, Coimbatore District. For the year 2014-2015 special rejuvenation camp for 30 elephants was held at the same venue. For 2015-2016, elephants rejuvenation camp for 30 elephants is being held From 07.01.2016 and 23.02.2016 for 48 days at Thekampatti, Coimbatore District.

- “Oru Kaala Pooja Scheme” is being implemented for temples lacking funds even for one kaala pooja. Now, the scheme is in implemented in 12,504 temples in total with a deposit of Rs.125.04 crore, Rs.1,00,000/- for each temple.
- For the benefit of the differently abled and aged who visit the temples with large campus, 12 battery cars are in use in 9 temples.
- Renovation work and Kumbabishekam have been performed in 8,499 temples (upto 31.12.2015)
- Every year Rs.22.50 crore is given to 250 ancient temples for renovation without changing their antiquity. Rs.90 crore has been already disbursed.
- 143 Temple cars have been renovated.
- 611 temple tanks have been renovated at the cost of Rs.3.31 crore.
- For the renovation of small temples situated in the habitations of Adi Dravida and Tribal People Rs.25,000/- for each temple has been

raised to Rs.50,000/- Rs.13.18 crore was granted for 2,636 temples. Rs.5.02 crore financial assistance sanctioned to 1,004 Temples for the year 2015-2016 and the amount to be released.

- A Government Grant of Rs.12 crore was given for the renovation of 166 Temples. In Two years, 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 the grant given every year has been raised from Rs.3 crore to Rs.6 crore and given to 96 temples. For 2013-2014, this Government grant of Rs.6 crore was given to 70 temples.

- Free Marriage for 1,006 Hindu couples below poverty line was conducted on

18.6.2012, by the Hon'ble Cheif Minister, at Thiruverkadu.

- 'Pavai vizha' is conducted every year in every district. Till now, 17,783 school students have participated and prizes were given to 2,910 participants. Further Spiritual Classes have also been conducted for 25,920 students.

differently abled students who are studying 10th, 11th and 12th standard in Government and Government aided institutions, a cash incentive of Rs.1,500/- for 10th and 11th Standard students and Rs.2,000/- for 12th Standard students are given. 1,400 students benefitted at the cost of Rs.22.34 lakh.
