**ADMINISTRATION REPORT OF THE THANJAVUR MEDICAL COLLEGE,
THANJAVUR, 1964-65.**

I. APPOINTMENTS AND TRANSFERS.

1. Dr. H. D. Singh, M.B.B.S., M.Sc., continued to hold the office as Principal, during 1964-65.

2. Dr. M. V. Bhat, M.S., was appointed as Professor of Operative Surgery, with effect from 11th May 1964 and Dr. M. S. Prakas, M.S., was transferred as Professor of Surgery, Madurai Medical College, Madurai.

3. Dr. M. N. Guruswami, B.A., M.B.B.S., M.S., (Mich), Professor of Pharmacology was relieved on transfer on 19th October 1964 and Dr. (Srimathi) Santa Ramachandran, M.Sc., Assistant Professor was promoted and posted as Reader in Pharmacology.

4. Dr. N. Rengabashyam, F.R.C.S., was appointed as Honorary Lecturer in Surgery, with effect from 11th December 1964.

5. Dr. E. T. Selvam, M.S., D.O., took charge of the Reader in Ophthalmology from Dr. N. S. Venugopal, M.S., D.O. with effect from 28th December 1964.

6. Dr. V. Ramamoorthy, M.B.B.S., D.A., Lecturer in Anaesthesia, was relieved on transfer on 19th December 1964 and Dr. A Venkatasamy, M.B.B.S., D.A., took over charge as Lecturer in Anaesthesia, Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur.

7. Dr. J. D. Kanakaraj, M.S., Assistant Professor in Surgery, Thanjavur Medical College was promoted as Reader in Surgery from 1st January 1965.

8. Dr. J. D. Kanakaraj, M.S., Reader in Surgery died on 4th March 1965.

VIII. ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES.

On abolition of N.C.C.R., the 3 Madras Medical Coy., N.C.C. with 185 cadets was organised to enroll 200 cadets.

Major W. Gordon, Officer Commanding of 26 Madras Bn., N.C.C. held an additional charge of this Coy. also as officiating Officer Commanding; 2/Lt. P. K. Murugan is the Company Commander of the Coy.

Regular training both in Military and technical subjects have been given. The activities of the N.C.C. have been satisfactory.

X. STUDENTS ASSOCIATION.

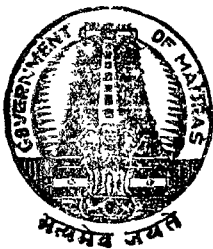

Independance day.—The Independance day was celebrated on August 15, 1964. Dr. H.D. Singh, M.B.B.S., M.Sc., Principal, Thanjavur Medical College hoisted the National Flag; took the salute.

Buildings.—The Government have accorded sanction in their order No. 3348/PWD/23rd December 1964 for construction of first floor over the Biochemistry Department at a cost of Rs. 2,40,000 and the work is in progress.

The construction of six more quarters for Assistant Surgeons was under progress. As the Associated Teaching Hospital was not ready the facilities at the R. M. Hospital, Thanjavur were continued to be utilised to impart clinical instructions to students during the current year also. The construction work of the new hospital is expected to be completed in the course of the next year.

UNICEF aid.—The UNICEF has come forward to supply certain equipments and one Bedford personnel carrier to the Paediatrics Department.
