ADMINISTRATION REPORT OF THE THANJAVUR MEDICAL COLLEGE, THANJAVUR, FOR 1965-66.

Appointment and Transfers.

Dr. H.D. Singh, M.B.B.S., M.Sc., continued to hold office of the Principal, Thanjavur Medical College, during the year 1965-66.

Dr. S. Sundara Venkatakrishnan, M.S., posted as Reader in Surgery in place of Dr. J. D. Kanakiraj, joined duty on 2nd October 1965.

Dr. E. R. Solomon took the post of Lecturer in Dental Surgery on 1st December 1965.

Dr. (Kum.) Chandra Rajarathnam took charge as Lecturer in Dermatology from 12th June 1965.

Dr. S. R. Sachidanandam, took charge as Senior Assistant Reader in Anatomy from 8th July 1965.

Dr. T. Subramaniam, F.R.C.S., was appointed as Honorary Lecturer in Surgery from 20th September 1965.

Dr. D. Bhoopathy. M.D., took charge as Additional Reader in Medicine from 23rd September 1965.

Dr. Md. Ghouse Mchideen, M.S., D.L.O., Professor of E.N.T. was relieved on transfer on 25th March 1966.

Strength of College in Various Classes.

In the first instance, the annual admission of students to the First Year M.B.B.S., (Integ.) course was 75. It was increased to 100 from the academic year 1961-62 and was further increased to 125 during 1963-64. Library.—Consists of three sections.—Student Library, Staff Library and Departmental Libraries. The Professor of Anatomy is in charge of the library. There are at present over 6,500 volumes of books available. About 320 journals are being subscribed. Back numbers of some important journals are available.

Departments.—All departments of the College, Clinical and pre-clinical have been fully functioning. A primary health Centre at Kabisthalam about 20 miles from here is being utilised for the present for the training of students in Social and Preventive Medicine work. It is proposed to establish two peripheral paediatric clinics in Thanjavur and a Rural Health Centre in Thiruvaiyaru.

Research.—Research grants were sanctioned by the Madras State Research Committee to the departments of Anatomy and physiology and the work is in progress.

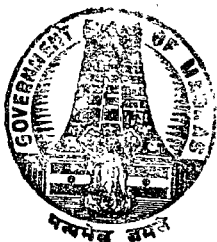

Janardhanan, Additional Director of Medical Services, Madras. Mrs. T. Janardhanan distributed the prizes.

National Cadet Corps.—N.C.C. Training is compulsory for I and II year M.B.B.S., Students. The strength of the cadets is 224. Dr. D. L. Rajasekaran is the Officer Commanding of the three Madras Battalion N.C.C. Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur. Regular training both in military and technical subjects have been given. The activities of the N.C.C. have been quite satisfactory.

Students' Association.—The various Students Association continues to work satisfactorily.

Buildings.—The construction of additional quarters for Assistant Surgeons has been completed. The construction of first floor over the Biochemistry department at a cost of Rs. 2,40,000 to accommodate certain clinical departments and research laboratories is in progress.

The UNICEF has supplied certain equipments and one Bedford personnel carrier to the Paediatrics department.

2. *Admissions and strength.*—The annual admission to I Year Integrated M.B.B.S. course was increased from 125 to 180. Seven hundred and thirty-eight students were on the rolls of the College during the year under report as against 589 students during the previous year. Fifty students were admitted to the Sanitary Inspector's course from 1st March 1966.

3. *Examinations.*—The results in the University Examinations continued to be satisfactory.

4. Research grants were sanctioned by the Madras State Research Committee to the Departments of Anatomy and Physiology and the work is in progress.

5. *Expenditure.*—The net expenditure on the maintenance of the College, during the year under report was Rs. 15,22,906 07, as against Rs. 12,03,780 65 in the previous year.

6. The working of the College on the whole, continued to be satisfactory.
