



HOW YOUR NERVOUS SYSTEM WORKS

An incredibly efficient and complex system of communications that dwarfs any made by man-

WE ARE awed by the complicated tangle of wires in a large telephone cable; marvel at the efficiency of a communications system that completes a call from London to Melbourne in a few minutes. But we are inclined to take for granted a communications system that is far more extensive and infinitely more complex-our own nervous system. Day and night millions of messages pour through its billions of cells, telling the heart when to draw in air. But for the links which it provides, our bodies would be more masses of chaotic individual cells, each cell going its own independent way.

Consider the sensory nerves—which tell us whether a steak is tasty, a pice of music pleasing, a view inspiring.

The tongue has 8,000 taste buds, each with its nerve connection to the brain. No one knows exactly how these tastebud receptors work, but present-day thinking suggested that particles of food fit into them like light plugs into sockets, closing circuits and sending electrical impulses to the brain interprets them, then arrives at a judgement: the potatoes need salt, the orange is sour, the lamb chop is delicious.

The ears have 100,000 auditory cells. Minute nerve ends in the inner ear pick up a particular sound frequency and start vibrating—weaving like wheat in the wind. A current is generated. It may be so feedle that it has to be amplified thousands of times before it can be detected; fed into the brain, it is identified as a musical note. Or a medley of sounds may enter at the same time, to be instant-

ly recognized as a friend's voice, a train whistie, the bark of a dog. Thus we hear with our ears but in the brain.

Each eye has 180 million light receptors which send group impresssions to the brain. We see the lovely spring foliage with our eyes, but it is the brain that gives us a feeling of joy and appreciation. Sometimes the eye nerves play strange tricks on us. We bump our head in a dark room and there is a blinding flash of light—we "see stars." What has happened is this: the bump has stimulated the optic nerve to send electrical impulses which the brain interprets as a flash of light.

The skin contains a vast net work of receptorf. If a hot object is pressed against the skin, some of the 30,000 "heat spots" will give warning of danger. The skin has 250,000 cold receptors, and something like half a million tactile (touch) spots. Step under a cold shower and cold receiptors flood the brain with messages: the body starts shivering, skin arteries dilate, a new blood supply hurries to provide more heat. If the room is too hot, heat receptors notify the brain, and three million sweat glands starts a flow of cooling perspiration.

The brain pays little attention to messages from only a few receptors. A hot needle can be pressed against the skin with no great discomfort. But press an equally hot iron against it and a general alarm goes out That's why it's dangerous to test a body's bath-water with only your fingertips. The water may not be too hot for your fingers, but can

be highly uncomfortable when receiptors all over the baby's body may spring into action.

In the main, the function of nerves is to prod muscles into oction. But they also have a mysterious ability to dampen or inhibit motion. Otherwise when we moved a leg to take a step it might continue to rise as if we ware kicking a football. During sleep, apparently, this dampening effect becomes dominant, pervading the entire brain. This accounts for the occasional paralysis of terrer in dreams: we want to cry out but leaden legs refuse to move.

Nerve cells have characteristics which set them apart from all others, Most body cells reproduce themselves by simple division: a cut fingertip heals itself; hair finger-nails and toenails push themselves out constantly as cell division progresses. Nerve cells follow no such pattern. We have our lifetime's supply at birth, and once a nere cell is destroyed it is destroyed for good—although subsidiary nerve channels may establish pathways round the damage.

Individual nerve cells look some-what like tadpoles, with large cellular heads and long filamentous tails. The cellular head is the critical, non-replaceable part of a nerve; the tail can degenerate itself if cut off or injured. Generally, these heads are located in the brain or spinal cord. The tails, or nerve fibres—which may be of microscopic length are as long as three feet—are bundled together, often by the thuusand, into nerve trunks which can be as big in circumference as your themb. From the brain and spinal cord thuse nerve trunks branch out into the extmities of the body.

There are several main divisions of the nervous system. The autonomic branch governs such "automatic" functions as digestion, breathing and the heartbeat. It is divided into two parts: the sympathetic system, which generally stimulates actively, and the parasympathetic, which

generally retards it. If the body were entirely under the control of the sympathetic system, the heart, for example, would race itself to death. If entirely under the parasympathetic, the heart would stop. The two must be in perfect co-ordination. When quick energy is needed in times of stress, the sympathetic gains the ascendancy, speeding up heart and lung activity. In sleep, the parasympathetic lays a calming hand on all bodily activity.

Presents evidence indicates that these two delicately balanced systems are small chemical manufacturing plants. The parasympathetic system products an incredibly potentdrug called acetylcholine. The sympathetic system produces an equally potent drug, adrenalin.

We are kept active, breathing, by infinitesimal bits of these to chemicals which, immediately they have served their purpose, are destroyed. This awesome, extraordinarily complex activity all takes place in a twinkling—pehaps a thousandth of a second—every time our eyelids blink.

Motor nerves-the nerves which govern such voluntary actions as walking, talking, chewing-appear to work in another manner. When the brain sends out a message ordering an arm to be lifted, a tiny electric "shiver" starts out from the crain through motor nerves. The impulse is so small that it would never reach the arm but for the fact that every few centimetres along the nerve fibre there is a "relay station" which re-charges the dying current, so that the impulse arrives at its destination with exactly the same value as it had when it left the brain. This elaborate sequence also takes place in a twinkling: messages are transmitted though nerves at over 200 miles per hour

People sometimes complain of "frayed" nerves. Actually, nerves aren't responsible for feelings of tension. Emotional conflicts in the mind are the case. A

troubled brain may send out electrical impulses which result in to large a secretion of stomach acids, leading to ulcers. Or it may order the tightening of muscles in blood-vessel-walls, which leeds to high blood pressure. In these situations the nerves, like telephone wires carrying bad news, are imply acting as a communications system.

Occasionally, however, nerves to get out of order. One of the causes of hiccups, for example, is irritation of the respiratory nerves. Shingles, an accure inflammatory skin dissase, is the result of irritation or infection of the sensory nerves.

As research workers have gathered more and more facts about the nervous system, doctors and surgeons have put this new knowledge to work. Nerve repair is perhaps the most exacting of all surgical arts. In accidents, nerves are often severed and have to be rejoined if a hand, arm or leg is again to be useful. The nerves to be sewn may be no larger than a hair and must be sewn with still

finer suture materials. Working with a magnifying glass and filamentous silk or linen, skilled surgeons are often able to do this job.

When injury is so extensive that nerve ends cannot be pulled together, the answer is a graft, borrowed either from the patient's body or from a "bank". Such grafts do not grow; they merely from a bed on which the nerve fibres regenerate themselves. One of surgery's most rewarding sights is to see life return gradually, over a period of months, to a limb thus repaired.

Research workers still face a host of unanswered questions about nerves. They are unable, for instance, to explain what a tickle is. Nor do they clearly understand some of remarkable reflexes with which we are borne; how the new born

When we reach a complete understanding or the nervous system, we shall be close to understanding a supreme riddle of the universe: how that mass of cells known as man manages to behalf like a human being.

JUST S-Q-UE-E-S-E IT OUT!

ONE OF the lesser known miracles of our modern machine age is the change in fabricating methods that have occurred in many kinds of manufacture. In particular, the enormous use of high-pressure presses for forging, squeeving and extruding metals, bears examination. Few people realise how many items that they use—and will use—depend on a principle best exemplified when you squeeze a toothpase tube and watch the ribbon of paste emerge in the shape determined by the hold in the top of the tube, This same principle applies to metals, exactly!

At present, almost all metals with the exception of certain alloys of steel, can be extruded or squeezed through dies to give them a form and shape. And this can be

done cold! Thus if you want an aluminum beam for aircraft wing-spars, let's say, you just squeeze it out of a huge hydraulic press as you'd squeeze a toothpaste tube! It's that easy.

The Germans, In their re-armament for the Second World War, pioneered in the use of these gigantic metal squeezers. After the war, the Soviets captured and removed the largest hydraulic press in the world, but we also managed to get several huge ones which we've set up here in this country and they're busy turning out components for rockets and planes.

Making shell cases of steel by taking a slug of that metal and punching it a few

THE ORANGE CURTAIN

NE OF Man's most persistent and irrepressible enemies outside of the rat, is the cockroach. This denizen of the insect world can endure almost anything, is repelled by practically nothing, and is extremely hard to destroy. He is exceeded in his voraciousness only by his ugliness. For a long time, scientists have been trying to dislodge him from his eminence in the pest world. Some thinkers have come to respect the power of this insect so, that they have suggested that some time in the distant future after Man has destroyed himself, the cockroach will overcome the will by sheer hardiness. Perhaps they may not be wrong!

A mysterious agent has appeared on the side of the Humans in this neverending war. The Osage orange tree has been known and used for a long time. Bow-makers found it highly valuable for bows, and farmers have long used it as a rough, tough hedge. The Osage orange tree also bears an inedible fruit, a little bigger than an ordinary orange and quite pulpy inside.

By chance, a scientist found that corkroaces cannot stand the presence of the Osake orange fruit. Simply bringing a blossom into a room invested with cockroaches, will drive them away into another room. Putting the fruit around other rooms will drive the cockroaches from the entire apartment, Exactly what the mechanism of distate is, is as yet unknown, though it is suspected that a heady vapor or scent emanates from the fruit and literally "tear-gases" the cockroaches away. Some volatile oil causes this no doubt.

Efforts are being made to develop concentrates and distillates of this oil. It should prove a boon to restaurant owners and those who run public establishments everywhere, for the cockroach seems to be a natural seeker of these places. A lot of effort is being devoted these days to destroying the insect world which has taken up arms against Man. And from the

New plant makes sea water drinkable

A new type of distilling plant for producing pure drinking water from the sea has been developed by a British firm.

The plant design is based on an exhaustive ser(es of tests conducted under industrial operating conditions on large-size test rigs, using sea water. Operating methods have been developed which permit the plant to be run continuously without being opened for cleaning and without loss of output due to scaling.

Designs for outputs up to 1,000,000 gallons per day in one unit are available.

An order for a unit of this type has recently been received by the British firm for installation in a refinery in Ecuador, South America.

time in a hydraulic forging press, produces a simple finished product faster than any other way. It is incredible to see a flat slug of steel squeeze up and flow around a die just like so much soft biscuit dough. But it does, Copper, aluminum magnesium and all ihe other relatively soft mteals flow as easily as spaghetti from extruding machines. Working steel is a little harder, but it can be done.

Some time ago we reported on a huge furnace woich produced steel leams and cylinders in almost a finished form. This is another clue to the metals revolution which is taking place, All industrial efforts are tending toward making manufacturing a continuous flow process instead of a unit operation, The idea of the assembly line or continuous chain is stealing into every sort of industry from making pretzels to rocket engines!

HIS TOOLS MEND DAMAGED HEARTS

Karl Kapq's artistry as a toolmaker has made possible successful surgery of a type never befour attempted.

Seen At WORK in his small machine shop, close to the business district in Cleveland, Ohio. Karl A. Kapp would hardly attract a stranger's attention. Ceiling lights pick out the silver in his thinning blond hair, the smudges of grease on his apron, the calluses on his long, thin fingers. He looks much like any other worker.

But heart surgeons in all parts of the world refer to Kapp as "an artist in the creation of surgical tools." Through his work, they say, thousands of persons, who seemed about to die, are now living normol, useful lives.

What is the secret of Kapp's success? How does he differ from other tool-makers?

I had partial answers to these questions from Dr. Claude S. Beck, internationally known professor of cardiovascular surgery at Western Reserve University Medical School. The rest I learned from Kapp himself.

The story has its beginnings in the quaint old city of Tuttlingen, Germany, where Kapp served a four-year apprenties ship with the surgical instrument from of Jetters and Scheerer.

Coming to the United States in 1927 he quickly found work as a grinder and toolmaker. But when the depression struck, jobs become increasingly hard to get. Without work and with no immediate prospects, Kapp opened a shop for the repair of surgical tools in the garage at the rear of his home.

DRUMMING up pusiness was difficult at first. Few haspitals were willing to entrust their repairs to a youthful emigrant who spoke with a strong German accent. To each one, Kapp made but one plea: "Give me a chance. If my work is n't satisfactory, don't pay me."

Gradually, as the quality of Kappus work become known, new orders came in He was well established when he first met Dr. Beck at the Medical School in 1988.

As the months passed, the two men become friends, and Dr. Beck disclosed that he was making experiments with dogs that promised much in the fields of brain and heart surgery. But progress would be slow, he added, if new tools and new techniques were not developed Kapp agreed to work with the surgeon in his spare time.

N THE YEAR that followed, the toolmaker spent many nigets in the laboratory. He would watch Dr. Beck operate on a dog, and than he and the surgeon would discuss the problems that had been encountered, the type of instruments that would be needed if the difficulties were to be overccome.

Kapp's main concern, in the beginning, was the development of a suction tube with a connection that would keep the blood being drawn from a cavity in the brain from flowing too freely. Numerous instruments were made and discarded before Dr. Beck was satisfied that a connection had been perfected that would cause no damage to the brain tissues.

Tried on men and women batients, the instrument proved an instantaneous success. It is now being used widely by brain surgeons everywhere.

From brain surgery, the interest of the two men turned to operations on the heart. Until recent years, the heart was considered a remote and virtually inaccessible organ except at autopsies. Persons with heart disease from malformations at birth or depredations of age had little hop of cure. They were treated with medications and told to limit their activities.

Dr. Beck held to the view that opening the heart to surgical treatment should be as easy as opening the hood of an automobile. Kapp agreed with the surgeon. Togethor they gave of their spare time and cash in perfecting instruments that would help them to meet the problems.

First success came to them in developing threaded needles, some extremely pliable, that would repair leakage of the heart. After numerous experiments with dogs, Dr. Beck invited Kapp to witness an operation on a middle-aged man.

STANDING UNDER the brilliant light above the operating table, the tool designer watched the surgeon open up the left side of the patient's chest. He leaned forward anxiously as Dr. Beck began sittching the break in the damaged organ. When the operation was completed, the surgeon caught the eye of his associate and nodded briefly. It was the signal Kapp had been waiting for. In that moment he knew, as Dr. Beck knew, that medical history had been made in the past hour.

Of even greater interest to surgeons are the operations by Dr. Beck in grafting the aorta to the sinus, thus bringing red blood back into blood-starved veins in the heart. To make the operation possible, Kapp developed a plunger-type instrument with a revolver-like trigger that makes a clean round hole when its pointer comes in

contact with flesh. Dr. Beck makes holes in the vein and artery and stitches the two together where the holes meet.

Latest instrument to be developed by Kapp is a cutting device that resembles a thimble and fits over the index figure. Surgeons use it in clearing away the heart's mitral valve of excess calcium. They simply put pressure on the thimble and allow the teeth on its under side to cut through the barrier.

For all of these achievements, Dr. Beck has won acclaim throughout the world. But what of Kapp? How much of the credit should be shared by the quiet-spoken, rather shy tool designer?

Said Dr. Beck: "I couldn't have gotten along without Kapp. His skillful work has made it possible to perform operations that were never attempted previously."

Then, after a moment's pause, he added: "Few persons realize it, but surgeons are as dependent on the development of new tools as industry. I only wish it were possible to set up a fund that would enable Kapp to devote his full time to research in designing surgical tools."

Nearly all heart specialists in the United States use Kapp's instruments, and they are increasingly popular in Canada and Europe.

Within the past year he has sent full kits to haspitals in Montreal, Paris, Copenhagen' London, Havana, Edinburgh, and Berlin.

Asked if it didn't give him a great deal of satisfaction to see his instruments going out over the world, Kapp looked away toware an open window and quietly remarked:

"I'm happy to think that I can be of some small service to others. That is all that really matters."

I'd found the key to the humble tool-maker's success.

FAMALE SNAKES STORE LIVE SPERM

Female snakes are far ahead of the scientists who have recently discovered how to store semen at low temperatures for artificial breeding. The cold-blooded reptiles store it at body temperature.

The practice of snakes to bear young for years following their isolation from males has been known to biologists for a long time, but they could never understand how it was possible. The technique has been called "delayed fertilization."

Now a professor of anatomy has revealed that a female snake has specialized structures in her reproductive tract which apparently act as semen storage receptacles. Dr. Wade Fox, of the Louisiana State University School of Medicine, reprited that large numbers of these receptacles, which have the form of tiny, multiple-lobed sacs, open into the anterior ends of the oviducts by small canals-

"In many of the snakes that have been examined each of these small sacs has been found to contain sperm lined up in orderly fashion with all of the heads in

the same direction," he said.

PROPER SPACING HELPFUL

New Delhi: The spacing between pineapple plants and between rows differs in different areas, depending upon the method of planting adopted.

Experience points out that the most convenient spacing to adopt is at least three feet between plants and six feet

between rows.

Such a spacing gives a chance for full development of the plants, and also makes cultural oparations and the subsequent

picking of fruits easier.

In a closely planted plantation, particularly with varieties like Queen which suckers profusely, the gathering of fruits becomes a difficult and painful work. Also, proper spacing facilitates re-planting of the interspaces which is to be done after every four or five years.—ICAR

RAINDROP CLOSES WINDOW

Ever dream about a window that would close itself when it rains? If so, Micro-Moisture Controls, Mineola, N. Y., has something to tell you. Its Weathervane Venetian window is of the jalousie type and is equipped with a simple grid connected to that electrical circuit in the home. The first raindrop to strike the grid closes a circuit that causes the window to close automatically. When the rain stops and the misture on the grid has dried, the window re-opens.—Commerce

SELF-HONING SAW BLADE

Skil Corporation, manufacturer of portable power tools, has placed on the market a new self-honing saw blade. The blade cuts two ways—in either direction of rotation. The two-way cut and self-honing result from a new design in saw tooth form.

The blade is used in one direction of rotation until the cutting edges of the teeth become dull. The blade is then reversed in the saw. As the blade cuts in the new rotation, the cutting edges used in the original rotation are automatically honed to a new sharpness. It is made in sizes of $5_8^{\pi\prime\prime}$, $7_4^{\prime\prime\prime}$ and $8_4^{+\prime\prime}$.


