Sir,

I have the honour to state that several of the Corporation schools are situated in localities inhabited by the depressed classes. The strength and attendance of these schools was found to be unsatisfactory and enquiry showed that this was due partly to the poverty of the parents who could not afford to provide the boys with a midday meal unless the boys themselves earned it by work and partly to the difficulty the boys experienced in going home and returning to school in the short afternoon interval. With a view to obviate these difficulties

ensure steadiness in the strength and attendance, the Council at its meeting held on 16th September 1920 resolved to provide such children with a mid-day tiffin at a cost not exceeding one anna per head per day. As an experimental measure, this concession was first tried in the Corporation School, Thousand Lights and as the result was very encouraging the practice has since been extended to two more schools located in Chetput and Mirsahibpet, and it is proposed to extend the concession to 7 other schools.

2. The Examiner of Local Fund Accounts now objects to the above expenditure on the ground that it is not authorised by the Madras City Municipal Act of 1919. As the stoppage of the concession is likely to seriously affect the attendance of the said schools, I request that Government will be pleased to accord special sanction to the expenditure.

Subject: Sanction for the expenditure incurred on the provision of kiffin to school boys in a co-op. Corporation.

Rules 1-10 in Schedule D of the Madras City Municipal Act, 1919, govern the expenditure of the Corporation. Expenditure from the municipal fund on the provision of midday kiffin to school boys is not covered by any of these rules and the Examiner's objection in this case is therefore right, under the law as it stands at present. The law however is being amended. Clause 4(2) of the Amending Bill which was passed by the Council on 11-3-22 enables the Corporation to incur extraordinary charges with the sanction of the Govt & this clause has retrospective effect (para 18 b). The Govt. can thus sanction the expenditure in this case as an extraordinary charge after the Bill which was passed into law at the meeting of the Council held on 14/3/22 is brought into force.
